# a. Trap Club Lease Agreement

Austin Bernert, Vice Chair, and Andy Lawrence, Chairman of the Trap Club stated the current Trap Club Lease Agreement for the old dump grounds property expires in June of 2023. He stated the trap club are not recommending any changes to the current lease and the Trap Club have filed as a 501C3 and have reestablished their board of directors and are pursing getting trap club in the schools and getting grants. Clerk/Treasurer Chamberlin stated the agreement would be a 10-year lease with a payment to the City of Sidney of \$25.00 each year and city staff is also recommending no changes to the agreement.

Chief Kraft provided the April 2023 Police Department Report. He stated himself and Lt. Zeiler went to Laurel for the Police Memorial Parade, which sadly was not attended as well as the one hosted in Sidney.

#### 15. Public Works Director

# a. April 2023 Public Works Report

PWD Hintz presented the April 2023 Public Works report. He stated they have the canopy in place at the pool and have done some deck work and misc. concrete work. He stated Swim Team assisted in cleaning the pool and they are ready to start filling the pool this week, and a pump will be replaced at the splash deck that was budgeted for. He stated they are filling potholes and sweeping the streets, with asphalt work coming soon when the plant is up and running.

# b. Phase 3 Water Project-Pay Application #1 and ARPA Competitive Grant Draw #1 for \$419,756

PWD Hintz presented the Phase 3 Water Project pay application #1 and ARPA Competitive Grant Draw #1. He stated the Lincoln area of the project should be completed this week and they will start moving on with the project. He stated he understands it is causing traffic issues, but they are moving as quickly as they can.

Motion was made to approve pay application #1 and ARPA Competitive Grant Draw #1 for \$419,756.

**c.** West Holly Final Draw Request #8B for \$78,766 (invoices totaling \$88,506.06-difference \$9,740.06 out of cash or Phase 3 loan)

PWD Hintz presented the final draw request for the West Holly Water Project for \$88,506.06. There is \$78,766 available to draw down on the SRF loan, the remaining \$9,740.06 they are recommending paying out of cash.

# d. 200K Gallon Water Tank Lining Bid Approval

PWD Hintz stated they held a bid opening and had 4 qualified bids presented, which are in the City Council packet. He stated there was a low bid of \$154,650 from Color Dynamics and the second bid was Advanced Pump and Equipment (Advanced Linings) of \$204,266. He stated the lowest bidder does not use the product in the specs and cannot apply the correct product so they are recommending taking the second bid from Advanced Pump and Equipment (Advanced Linings). He stated they do not believe the product supplied by the lowest bidder would work for what the City is looking for and for long term use. Mr. Mayer stated the other product also takes upwards of 2-weeks to set instead of one day like the product in the specs.

Motion was made to approve accepting the bid from Advanced Pump and Equipment (Advanced Linings) of \$204,266.

Clerk/Treasurer Chamberlin stated the Fairview School District is requesting to have their building permit fees of \$2,903.35 waived. She stated they would still be required to pay the \$1,016.17 in plan review fees that the City has to pay Kyle Harlan. She stated FM/BI Rasmussen has not issue with waiving the building permit fees, as he does not feel it will extensive work for his position that isn't covered in the plan review fees.

#### 1. **New Business**

# a. Vacant Buildings

Clerk/Treasurer Chamberlin presented the sample ordinance provided by Alderwoman Godfrey on the vacant buildings in Anaconda. FM/BI Rasmussen stated he reached out to the Compliance Officer in Anaconda on the success and he stated they have a few buildings they are trying to use this code on but they are just starting to utilize it. He further stated he has concerns on who will police and monitor it since the City of Sidney does not have a compliance department or officer and he has concerns on the City becoming liable for these properties. He stated Billings is pursuing something similar also and have also reached out to Anaconda.

PWD Hintz stated he does not feel this is the appropriate tool to take care of vacant buildings. Alderwoman Rasmussen stated she agrees there is a liability question for the City to take this on with current staff, such as building codes do not apply to this. Fm/BI Rasmussen stated our current building codes do not apply and the city would more than likely have to hire a structural engineer to say the building is not safe.

Clerk/Treasurer Chamberlin stated she has concerns with the fees being able to be refunded and the accounting that would take, the 30 day vacancy would mean snow birds and many other households who travel frequently would have to register and pay, and she has questions how the fees would be decided to be spent on these properties. FM/BI Rasmussen stated the fees can only go to abatement of these buildings.

PWD Hintz stated there are vacant buildings that are in horrible shape in the community. He stated we do need a tool to make sure these properties are taken care of, but this ordinance does

not actually force property owners to make the necessary improvements. Alderwoman Rasmussen asked if it would be better to look into the nuisance code to take care of such properties and Mayor Norby agreed that is the route that could be taken.

Clerk/Treasurer Chamberlin stated city staff would like to opportunity to look into adding to the city nuisance code with City Attorney Kalil and how staffing will handle this additional work and report back to the City Buildings/Street Lighting Committee. Alderwoman Rasmussen stated she would like to see the current nuisance code being enforced and running appropriately before adding more and more to it. FM/BI Rasmussen stated with the newest changes of the nuisance code and the streamlining of the process, we might be able to take care of these properties already.

Motion was made to recommend approval of City Staff looking into the current nuisance code if the inclusion of vacant buildings in it is appropriate or needed and report back to the Committee at a future date.

### 1. New Business

# a. Improvements to Moose Park

Mr. Sturgis stated there are items with field maintenance they are trying to get improved at Moose Park including infield material, Woodgroup donated a 6-foot by 8-foot Conex that has been installed for the pitching machine that is placed close to the batting cage that they need approval of and there is a dead tree by the batting cage they would like to remove and install a 6-foot 30 to 40-foot T-net for a bull pen station. He stated they would like to fence off the bull pens and batting cages for protection of others present. He stated they would also like to put another batting cage in by the current and put one in by the shed/garage for the visiting teams. He stated everything including labor has been or will be donated.

PWD Hintz stated he doesn't want the Conex close to residences, rather more up against the fence more. He stated he doesn't have a concern with the small Conex but he does have concerns with so many of them being put on City property that will make property owners want to put them on their properties. PWD Hintz stated they use the area by the shed/garage for sweeping dirt and asked if that would interfere with the visitor batting cage and Mr. Sturgis stated it wouldn't as they could make it shorter than the others if needed. Alderman DiFonzo stated they should put it closer to fence in the corner by the shed/garage instead of in the parking lot area behind it and Mr. Sturgis stated they could do that.

PWD Hintz asked why they cannot t-off into the batting cages instead of having a t-net and Mr. Sturgis stated so they can have more stations for practice.

Alderman DiFonzo stated the changes will give them more opportunity to have more going on and that he doesn't see any issues with the changes. Mr. Sturgis stated the number of kids coming out

for baseball this year has prompted them wanting to make these changes and the possibility of having a showcase tournament or more tournaments in general.

Motion was made to recommend the approval of the requested changes with the condition they work with PWD Hintz and follow the drawing as provided with the change of the location of the visitor's batting cage and Conex.

Motion made by Christensen, Seconded by Godfrey. Voting Yea: DiFonzo, Godfrey, Christensen

Meeting was adjourned at 5:45pm.

# AGREEMENT BETWEEN OWNER AND CONSULTANT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

THIS IS AN AGREEMENT effective as of [June 5, 2023] ("Effective Date") between [City of Sidney, Montana] ("Owner") and Peaks Planning LLC ("Consultant").

Owner's Project, of which Consultant's services under this Agreement are a part, is generally identified as follows: [On Call Planning Services] ("Project").

Consultant's services under this Agreement are generally identified as follows: [On Call Planning Services] ("Services").

Owner and Consultant further agree as follows:

#### 1.01 Basic Agreement and Period of Service

- A. Consultant shall provide or furnish the Services set forth in this Agreement. If authorized by Owner, or if required because of changes in the Project, Consultant shall furnish services in addition to those set forth above ("Additional Services").
- B. Consultant shall complete its Services within a reasonable period of time, or as directed by Owner.
- C. If, through no fault of Consultant, such periods of time or dates are changed, or the orderly and continuous progress of Consultant's Services is impaired, or Consultant's Services are delayed or suspended, then the time for completion of Consultant's Services, and the rates and amounts of Consultant's compensation, shall be adjusted equitably.

### 2.01 Payment Procedures

- A. Invoices: Consultant shall prepare invoices in accordance with its standard invoicing practices and submit the invoices to Owner on a monthly basis. Invoices are due and payable within 30 days of receipt. If Owner fails to make any payment due Consultant for Services, Additional Services, and expenses within 30 days after receipt of Consultant's invoice, then (1) the amounts due Consultant will be increased at the rate of 1.0% per month (or the maximum rate of interest permitted by law, if less) from said thirtieth day, and (2) in addition Consultant may, after giving seven days written notice to Owner, suspend Services under this Agreement until Consultant has been paid in full all amounts due for Services, Additional Services, expenses, and other related charges. Owner waives any and all claims against Consultant for any such suspension.
- B. *Payment:* As compensation for Consultant providing or furnishing Services and Additional Services, Owner shall pay Consultant as set forth in Paragraphs 2.01, 2.02 (Services), and 2.03 (Additional Services). If Owner disputes an invoice, either as to amount or entitlement, then Owner shall promptly advise Consultant in writing of the specific basis for doing so, may withhold only that portion so disputed, and must pay the undisputed portion.
- 2.02 Basis of Payment—Direct Labor Costs Times a Factor, Plus Reimbursables
  - A.—Owner shall pay Consultant for Services as follows:

- 1. An amount equal to Consultant's Direct Labor Costs times a factor of 3.0 for services of Consultant's employees engaged in the Project, plus reimbursable expenses. Reimbursable expenses include accommodations, meals plus gratuity associated with work on the Project.
- 2.<u>A. Sub-consultants shall be reimbursed at the rate of 115% of actual invoiced costs including-reimbursables-set forth in the attached Exhibit A.</u>
- A. The portion of the compensation amount billed monthly for Consultant's Services will be based upon Consultant's estimate of the percentage of the total Services actually completed during the billing period.
- 2.03 Additional Services: For Additional Services, Owner shall pay Consultant an amount equal to the cumulative hours charged in providing the Additional Services by each class of Consultant's employees, times a multiplier for each applicable billing class; plus reimbursement of expenses incurred in connection with providing the Additional Services and Consultant's consultants' charges, if any.

#### 3.01 Termination

- A. The obligation to continue performance under this Agreement may be terminated:
  - 1. For cause,
    - a. By either party upon 30 days written notice in the event of substantial failure by the other party to perform in accordance with the Agreement's terms through no fault of the terminating party. Failure to pay Consultant for its services is a substantial failure to perform and a basis for termination.
    - b. By Consultant:
      - 1) upon seven days written notice if Owner demands that Consultant furnish or perform services contrary to Consultant's responsibilities as a licensed professional; or
      - 2) upon seven days written notice if the Consultant's Services are delayed for more than 90 days for reasons beyond Consultant's control, or as the result of the presence at the Site of undisclosed Constituents of Concern, as set forth in Paragraph 5.01.1.
    - c. Consultant shall have no liability to Owner on account of a termination for cause by Consultant.
    - d. Notwithstanding the foregoing, this Agreement will not terminate as a result of a substantial failure under Paragraph 3.01.A.1.a if the party receiving such notice begins, within seven days of receipt of such notice, to correct its substantial failure to perform and proceeds diligently to cure such failure within no more than 30 days of receipt of notice; provided, however, that if and to the extent such substantial failure cannot be reasonably cured within such 30 day period, and if such party has diligently attempted to cure the same and thereafter continues diligently to cure the same, then the cure period provided for herein shall extend up to, but in no case more than, 60 days after the date of receipt of the notice.
  - 2. For convenience, by Owner effective upon Consultant's receipt of written notice from Owner.

In the event of any termination under Paragraph 3.01, Consultant will be entitled to invoice Owner and to receive full payment for all Services and Additional Services performed or furnished in accordance with this Agreement, plus reimbursement of expenses incurred through the effective date of termination in connection with providing the Services and Additional Services, and Consultant's consultants' charges, if any.

#### 4.01 Successors, Assigns, and Beneficiaries

- A. Owner and Consultant are hereby bound and the successors, executors, administrators, and legal representatives of Owner and Consultant (and to the extent permitted by Paragraph 4.01.B the assigns of Owner and Consultant) are hereby bound to the other party to this Agreement and to the successors, executors, administrators, and legal representatives (and said assigns) of such other party, in respect of all covenants, agreements, and obligations of this Agreement.
- B. Neither Owner nor Consultant may assign, sublet, or transfer any rights under or interest (including, but without limitation, money that is due or may become due) in this Agreement without the written consent of the other party, except to the extent that any assignment, subletting, or transfer is mandated by law. Unless specifically stated to the contrary in any written consent to an assignment, no assignment will release or discharge the assignor from any duty or responsibility under this Agreement.
- C. Unless expressly provided otherwise, nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to create, impose, or give rise to any duty owed by Owner or Consultant to any Constructor, other third-party individual or entity, or to any surety for or employee of any of them. All duties and responsibilities undertaken pursuant to this Agreement will be for the sole and exclusive benefit of Owner and Consultant and not for the benefit of any other party.

Consultant or sub-consultants shall not at any time supervise, direct, control, or have authority over any Constructor's work, nor shall Consultant or sub-consultants have authority over or be responsible for the means, methods, techniques, sequences, or procedures of construction selected or used by any Constructor, or the safety precautions and programs incident thereto, for security or safety at the Project site, nor for any failure of a Constructor to comply with laws and regulations applicable to such Constructor's furnishing and performing of its work. To the fullest extent permitted by law, Owner and Consultant (1) waive against each other, and the other's employees, officers, directors, members, agents, insurers, partners, and consultants, any and all claims for or entitlement to special, incidental, indirect, or consequential damages arising out of, resulting from, or in any way related to this Agreement or the Project, and (2) agree that Consultant's total liability to Owner under this Agreement shall be limited to \$2,000,000 or the total amount of compensation received by Consultant, whichever is greater.
- H. Neither Party shall be considered to be in default of this Agreement if delays in or failure of performance are due to forces beyond the reasonable control of the nonperforming Party, the effect of which the nonperforming Party could not avoid by the exercise of reasonable diligence. Such forces include, but are not limited to: fire, acts of God, flood, earthquake, storm, lightning, tornados, epidemic, war, riot, civil disturbance, sabotage, strike, work slowdown, or other labor disturbances, judicial restraint, action or inaction of any Government entity in either its sovereign or contractual capacity, quarantine restrictions, freight embargoes, delays in long lead time items and severe weather. Any changes to the terms of this agreement impacted by a Force Majeure event shall be documented in an Amendment to the Agreement.
- I. The parties acknowledge that Consultant's Services do not include any services related to unknown or undisclosed Constituents of Concern. If Consultant or any other party encounters, uncovers, or reveals an unknown or undisclosed Constituent of Concern, then Consultant may, at its option and without liability for consequential or any other damages, suspend performance of Services on the portion of the Project affected thereby until such portion of the Project is no longer affected, or terminate this Agreement for cause if it is not practical to continue providing Services.
- J. Owner and Consultant agree to negotiate each dispute between them in good faith during the 30 days after notice of dispute. If negotiations are unsuccessful in resolving the dispute, then the dispute shall be mediated. If mediation is unsuccessful, then the parties may exercise their rights at law.

- K. This Agreement is to be governed by the law of the state in which the Project is located.
- L. Consultant's Services and Additional Services do not include: (1) serving as a "municipal advisor" for purposes of the registration requirements of Section 975 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act (2010) or the municipal advisor registration rules issued by the Securities and Exchange Commission; (2) advising Owner, or any municipal entity or other person or entity, regarding municipal financial products or the issuance of municipal securities, including advice with respect to the structure, timing, terms, or other similar matters concerning such products or issuances; (3) providing surety bonding or insurance-related advice, recommendations, counseling, or research, or enforcement of construction insurance or surety bonding requirements; or (4) providing legal advice or representation.
- M. Consultant shall abide by the requirements of 41 CFR 60-1.4(a), 60-300.5(a) and 60-741.5(a). These regulations prohibit discrimination against qualified individuals based on their status as protected veterans or individuals with disabilities, and prohibit discrimination against all individuals based on their race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national origin. Moreover, these regulations require that covered prime contractors and subcontractors take affirmative action to employ and advance in employment individuals without regard to race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, national origin, disability or veteran status.

#### 6.01 Total Agreement

A. This Agreement (including any expressly incorporated attachments), constitutes the entire agreement between Owner and Consultant and supersedes all prior written or oral understandings. This Agreement may only be amended, supplemented, modified, or canceled by a duly executed written instrument.

# 7.01 Definitions

- A. Constructor—Any person or entity (not including the Consultant, its employees, agents, representatives, and consultants), performing or supporting construction activities relating to the Project, including but not limited to contractors, subcontractors, suppliers, Owner's work forces, utility companies, construction managers, testing firms, shippers, and truckers, and the employees, agents, and representatives of any or all of them.
- B. Constituent of Concern—Asbestos, petroleum, radioactive material, polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs), hazardous waste, and any substance, product, waste, or other material of any nature whatsoever that is or becomes listed, regulated, or addressed pursuant to (a) the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act, 42 U.S.C. §§9601 et seq. ("CERCLA"); (b) the Hazardous Materials Transportation Act, 49 U.S.C. §§5101 et seq.; (c) the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, 42 U.S.C. §§6901 et seq. ("RCRA"); (d) the Toxic Substances Control Act, 15 U.S.C. §§2601 et seq.; (e) the Clean Water Act, 33 U.S.C. §§1251 et seq.; (f) the Clean Air Act, 42 U.S.C. §§7401 et seq.; or (g) any other federal, State, or local statute, law, rule, regulation, ordinance, resolution, code, order, or decree regulating, relating to, or imposing liability or standards of conduct concerning, any hazardous, toxic, or dangerous waste, substance, or material.

The Purpose of this Agreement is to set forth the respective responsibilities and duties of the Parties associated with the installation and maintenance of the Project Specific Features within the above referenced MDT right-of-way, a commission-designated highway system, per the approved plans (Attachment B) received from the Developer. This Agreement sets forth terms regarding the City's maintenance responsibilities for the Project that the City must meet for MDT to provide the Developer the necessary Encroachment Permit to install the Project Specific Features. Any Encroachment Permit granted to the Developer by this Agreement is explicitly subject and subordinate to the rights and title of MDT and the State of Montana and the attached General Terms and Conditions.

# **AGREEMENT**

# ARTICLE I. GENERAL OBLIGATIONS OF MDT

- 1. If the City does not fulfill their maintenance requirements as stated herein, MDT may complete the required maintenance and seek compensation from the City. In doing so, MDT must first provide notice to the City allowing 60 days to complete any such maintenance. If MDT performs such maintenance under this section, it must provide detailed invoices of such costs to the City.
- 2. MDT may complete any maintenance required due to public emergency and seek compensation from the City for any costs incurred. In doing so, MDT may first provide notice to the City, when possible, allowing time to complete any such maintenance. If MDT performs maintenance under this section, it must provide detailed invoices of such costs to the City.

# ARTICLE II. GENERAL OBLIGATIONS OF THE CITY

- 1. The City agrees that no fixture, building, structure, or other permanent installation will be constructed or placed within commission designated right-of-way without prior written approval from MDT.
- 2. The City agrees any maintenance within MDT right-of-way that requires lane closure or equipment must be reviewed and approved by MDT maintenance staff prior to initiation of the maintenance.
- 3. The City shall complete the necessary environmental processes for modification to the state highways and roadways and demonstrate that all, if any, environmental issues associated with the proposed project have been identified and mitigated. The City agrees it will prepare and file any required environmental documents and apply for and obtain any permits required by other governmental agencies at no expense to MDT prior to maintenance taking place within commission designated right-of-way.
- 4. The City agrees to be responsible for any and all damages to facilities within commission designated right-of-way caused by the City, the City's staff or contractors, or resulting from the City's operations. The City must repair any and all damages, at its sole expense, after notification of damage by MDT and approval of repair work needed, method of repair, and schedule for repair.
- 5. If the City fails to perform or cause to be performed, the maintenance obligations as required by this agreement within 60 days of written notification from MDT, MDT may complete the required maintenance and the City shall be required to compensate MDT for its performance of said maintenance.
- 6. MDT may complete any maintenance required due to a public emergency without prior notice to the City. The City agrees to be responsible for and to reimburse MDT for said maintenance, including Indirect Costs.

# ARTICLE III - PROJECT SPECIFIC FEATURES

- 1. Landscaping/Irrigation Equipment
  - a. Upon completion of the Project, the City agrees that it is responsible, at no cost to MDT, to service, maintain and repair the landscaping and irrigation equipment installed as part of this project.
  - b. For the purposes of this Agreement, "maintenance of landscaping and irrigation system," is defined as: mowing, watering, debris removal, weed control, fertilizing, tree/shrub trimming including removal, replacement and maintenance of sight triangles, the repair and replacement of fences, and maintenance of all features in compliance with ADA/PROWAG. The irrigation system shall be fully operational, free of leaks, with heads selected and adjusted to reduce water waste.

c. If the City is not able to complete the maintenance on the landscaping and irrigation system as per this Agreement, the improvements may become the property of MDT, without reimbursement. If landscaping or irrigation become MDT property, MDT will maintain the property as it sees fit and may remove the landscaping and irrigation system without City approval. MDT may seek compensation for the maintenance or removal of the landscaping and irrigation system from the City.

# 2. Sidewalks/Curb

- a. Upon completion of the Project, the City agrees that it is responsible, at no cost to MDT, to service, maintain, repair, and pay the cost of operating the sidewalk/curb within the project limits, such that it does not negatively impact the operation of the sidewalk or the safety of the traveling public. If all or part of the Project becomes unsafe for use, the City agrees to restrict access to the affected area until the condition has been remedied.
- b. For the purposes of this Agreement, "maintenance of a sidewalk" is defined as: grinding or milling down displacements; surface patching; crack sealing; sweeping; cleaning; washing; replacing portions of damaged sidewalk; removal of snow and ice; repair of chipped, fractured, or broken surface from any cause, including but not limited to frost heaving, landscaping, tree roots, or encroachments; removal of debris and other obstructions or impediments to safe pedestrian travel; and any and all other normally accepted maintenance practices.

# 3. Sidewalk Benches/Bike Racks/Other Sidewalk Amenities

a. Upon completion of the project, the City agrees that it is responsible, at no cost to MDT, to service, maintain and repair the benches, bike racks, planters, tree grates, and other sidewalk amenities installed as part of this project.

b. For the purposes of this Agreement, "maintenance of benches, bike racks, planters, tree grates, and other sidewalk amenities," is defined as: regular inspection to ensure the safety and functionality of the amenity, and that the hardware is intact, fasteners are made flush with surfaces, and seats and backings are smooth with no protrusions or sharp edges. The placement must allow for a clear approach area adjacent to the furnishing and meet pedestrian access route requirements consistent with ADA (PROWAG) requirements.

# 4. Shared-Use Path

- a. Upon completion of the project, the City agrees that it is responsible, at no cost to MDT, to service, maintain, repair, and pay the cost of operating the path within the project limits, such that it does not negatively impact the operation of the path or the safety of the traveling public. If all or part of the shared use path becomes unsafe for use, the City agrees to restrict access to the affected area until the condition has been remedied.
- b. For the purposes of this Agreement, "maintenance of a shared-use path" is defined as: grinding or milling down displacements; surface patching; crack sealing; sweeping; cleaning; washing; replacing portions of damaged path; removal of snow and ice; repair of chipped, fractured, or broken surface from any cause, including but not limited to frost heaving, landscaping, tree roots, or encroachments; removal of debris and other obstructions or impediments to the safe travel of pedestrians or other path users; maintenance of all associated drainage features; maintenance of path-related signs; and any and all other normally accepted maintenance practices.
- c. For the purposes of this Agreement, "maintenance of shared-use path signs," is defined as: the inspection, cleaning, repair and replacement of signs damaged through weathering, vandalism, wind, and other means.

### 5. Bulb-outs

- a. Upon completion of the project, the City agrees that it is responsible, at no cost to MDT, to maintain the bulb-out installed as part of this project and the improvements placed within it (e.g. sidewalks/paths, landscaping, irrigation, and/or other amenities).
- b. For the purposes of this Agreement, "maintenance of a sidewalk or path" is defined as: grinding or milling down surface displacements; surface patching; crack sealing; sweeping; cleaning; washing; replacing portions of damaged path or sidewalk; removal of snow and ice; repair of chipped, fractured, or broken surface from any cause, including but not limited to frost heaving, landscaping,

- tree roots, or encroachments; removal of debris and other obstructions or impediments to safe pedestrian travel; and any and all other normally accepted maintenance practices.
- c. For the purposes of this Agreement, "maintenance of landscaping and irrigation system," is defined as: mowing, watering, debris removal, weed control, fertilizing, tree/shrub trimming including removal and replacement, and the repair and replacement of fences. The irrigation system shall be maintained such that it is fully operational, free of leaks, with heads selected and adjusted to reduce water waste.
- d. For the purposes of this Agreement, "maintenance of other amenities," is defined as: regular inspection to ensure that the safety and functionality of the amenity and that the hardware is intact, fasteners are flush with surfaces, and seats and backings are smooth with no protrusions or sharp edges. The placement must allow for a clear approach area adjacent to the amenity and meet pedestrian access route requirements consistent with ADA (PROWAG) requirements.

## 6. Lighting

- a. Upon completion of the project, the City agrees that it is responsible, at no cost to MDT, to service, maintain, repair and pay the costs of operating (including utility costs) the decorative and/or pedestrian lighting installed as part of this project.
- b. For the purposes of this Agreement, "maintenance of street lighting", is defined as: the inspection of the lighting system for operation, cleaning lamps, lenses and reflectors, stocking of replacement parts, bulb replacement, and repairs to and replacement of damaged fixtures.
- c. Any major repair costs for lighting damage not recoverable from third parties shall be the responsibility of the City.
- d. If the cost of energy is raised by the utility company, the City, town or special improvement district shall pay their proportionate share of the rate increase.

# ARTICLE IV - GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. <u>Term</u> The term of this Agreement shall be ten (10) years. After the initial ten (10) year term, this Agreement will renew automatically, for successive one (1) year terms, unless superseded by a new Agreement between the parties.
- 2. <u>Termination</u> This Agreement may be terminated by MDT if the City has violated or breached any term, condition or article of this Agreement and the City has failed to correct the same within 60 days of receiving notice in writing addressed to the City at the addresses shown above, from MDT of such violation or breach of any term condition or article of this Agreement. If this Agreement is terminated, the improvements become the property of MDT, without reimbursement. MDT will maintain the Project as it sees fit and may remove it without City approval. MDT may seek compensation for maintenance or removal of the Project from the City.

### 3. Hold Harmless & Indemnification

The City agrees to protect, defend, indemnify, and hold MDT, its elected and appointed officials, agents, and employees, while acting within their duties as such, harmless from and against all claims, liabilities, demands, causes of action, and judgments (including the cost of defense and reasonable attorney fees) arising in favor of or asserted by the City's employees or third parties on account of personal or bodily injury, death or damage to property, arising out of the acts or omissions of the City, its agents, or sub-contractors, under this Agreement, except the negligence of MDT.

The State and Department of Transportation agrees to protect, defend, indemnify, and hold the City, its elected and appointed officials, agents, and employees, while acting within their duties as such, harmless from and against all claims, liabilities, demands, causes of action, and judgments (including the cost of defense and reasonable attorney fees) arising in favor of or asserted by the MDT's employees or third parties on account of personal or bodily injury, death or damage to property, arising out of the acts or omissions of MDT, its agents, or sub-contractors, under this Agreement, except the negligence of the City.

#### 4. Insurance

- a. General Requirements: Each party shall maintain for the duration of this Agreement, at its own cost and expense, insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property that may arise from or in connection with the performance of the duties and obligations in this Agreement by each party, its agents, employees, representatives, assigns, or sub-contractors. This insurance shall cover such claims as may be caused by any negligent act or omission.
- b. General Liability Insurance: Each party shall purchase and maintain occurrence coverage with combined single limits for bodily injury, personal injury, and property damage of \$1 million per occurrence and \$2 million aggregate per year to cover such claims as may be caused by or arising out of any negligent acts or omissions in work or services performed under this Agreement, or as established by statutory tort limits as provided by a public entity self-insurance program either individually or on a pool basis as provided by Mont. Code Ann. Title 2, Chapter 9.
- c. General Provisions: All insurance coverage must be with a carrier licensed to do business in the State of Montana or by a public entity self-insured program either individually or on a pool basis. Each party must notify the other immediately of any material change in insurance coverage, such as changes in limits, coverage, change in status of policy, etc. Each party reserves the right to request complete copies of the other party's insurance policy or self-insured memorandum of coverage at any time.
- d. Workers' Compensation Insurance: The City must maintain workers' compensation insurance and require its contractors and its contractor's sub-contractors to carry their own workers compensation coverage while performing work within MDT right-of-way in accordance with Mont. Code Ann. §§39-71-401 and 39-71-405. Neither the contractor nor its employees are employees of MDT. This insurance/exemption must be valid for the entire Agreement period.

## 5. Public Safety

If any repairs to the elements of the Project must be performed to address or prevent a public hazard, the City will immediately protect the area from public access, and make reasonable and timely effort to correct or repair the hazard.

# 6. Invoicing and Indirect Cost (IDC)

If MDT incurs any costs as a result of a public emergency that necessitates action on MDT's part concerning the maintenance or repair of the Project back to its original state, MDT shall be compensated for such costs by the City, and the City shall pay the same within thirty (30) days of its receipt of such invoices.

Section 17-1-106, MCA, requires any state agency, including MDT, which receives non-general funds to identify and recover its indirect costs (IDC). These costs are in addition to direct project costs. MDT's IDC rate is determined annually as a percentage of the project's direct costs to cover the project's share of MDT's IDC as defined by 2 CFR Part 200, Appendix VII. If the work occurs or extends beyond the current fiscal year the IDC rate will be charged at the rate agreed to by MDT and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA).

#### Choice of Law and Venue

This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of Montana. The parties agree that any litigation concerning this Agreement must be brought in the First Judicial District Court, in and for the County of Lewis and Clark, State of Montana, and each party shall pay its own costs and attorney fees, except as otherwise noted in this Agreement on Indemnification. In case of conflict between the terms and conditions of this Agreement and the laws of the State of Montana, the laws of the State of Montana shall control.

- 8. <u>Binding Effect</u> The benefits and obligations set forth in this Agreement shall be binding upon, and inure to the benefit of, their respective successors, administrators and assigns of the Parties.
- 9. <u>Relationship of Parties</u> Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be deemed or construed (either by the Parties hereto or by any third party) to create the relationship of principal and agent or create any partnership joint venture or other association between the Parties.

- 10. Non-Discrimination The City will require that during the performance of any work arising out of this Agreement the City, for itself, assignees, and successors shall comply with all applicable non-discrimination regulation set forth in Attachment "A" attached hereto and made part of this Agreement.
- 11. <u>ADA</u> MDT requires that any construction or maintenance resulting from this Agreement must include appropriate pedestrian facilities that meet or exceed current MDT standards for accessibility as set forth by the United States Department of Justice 2010 ADA Standards for Accessible Design, United States Access Board Proposed Guidelines for Pedestrian Facilities in the Public Right-of-Way (2011 PROWAG), and MDT's Detailed Drawings, 608 series.
- 12. <u>Audit</u> The Legislative Auditor and the Legislative Fiscal Analyst may, without prior notice and during normal business hours, audit, at their own cost and expense, all records, reports, and other documents the City maintain in connection with this Agreement.
- 13. Access and Retention of Records The City agrees to provide the State, Legislative Auditor, or their authorized agents access to any records necessary to determine compliance with this MOA (Mont. Code Ann. §18-1-118). The City agrees to create and retain records supporting this Agreement for a period of three years after the completion date of this Agreement or the conclusion of any claim, litigation or exception relating to the Agreement taken by the State of Montana or a third party.
- 14. <u>Highway Modifications</u> If MDT modifies or improves the highway or roadway facilities, the City will modify, upon reasonable notice at no expense to MDT, the Project accordingly.
- 15. <u>Revocation</u> This Agreement is revocable by MDT in the event that the Project facilities within the right-of-way cease to be used by the City for a period of one year or abandoned otherwise. Upon revocation or abandonment, the system facilities must be removed in compliance with this Agreement.
- 16. <u>Utilities</u> The right of any private or public utility now lawfully occupying the right-of-way to operate and maintain utility facilities supersedes any right granted by this Agreement to the City. Copies of existing utility permits may be obtained from the MDT District Utility Agent.
- 17. Amendment and Modification The Parties may modify or amend this Agreement only by a written Addendum signed by the Parties. In addition to the terms and conditions contained herein, the provisions of any Addendum may be incorporated and made a part hereof by this reference in the terms of the amendment so provided. In the event of any conflict between the terms and conditions hereof and the provision of any Addendum, the provision of the Addendum shall control, unless the provisions thereof are prohibited by law.

# 18. Representatives

- a. <u>City's Representative</u>: The City's Representative for this Agreement shall be the City Manager or designee or such other individual as City shall designate in writing. Whenever approval or authorization from or communication or submission to City is required by this Agreement, such communication or submission shall be directed to the City's Representative and approvals or authorizations shall be issued only by such Representative; provided, however, that in exigent circumstances when City's Representative is not available, MDT may direct its communication or submission to other designated City personnel or agents.
- b. MDT's Representative: The MDT Representative for this Agreement shall be the District Administrator or Maintenance Chief or such other individual as MDT shall designate in writing. Whenever direction to or communication with MDT is required by this Agreement, such direction or communication shall be directed to MDT's Representative; provided, however, that in exigent circumstances when MDT's Representative is not available, City may direct its direction or communication or submission to other designated MDT personnel or agents.
- 19. <u>Counterpart Execution</u> This Agreement may be executed in two or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original but all of which together shall constitute one and the same Agreement. The counterparts

of this Agreement may be executed and delivered by facsimile or other electronic signature by any of the parties to any other party and the receiving party may rely on the receipt of such document so executed and delivered by facsimile or other electronic means as if the original had been received.

For the duration of this contract/agreement, the PARTY agrees as follows:

(1) Compliance with Regulations: The PARTY (hereinafter includes consultant) will comply with all Acts and Regulations of the United States and the State of Montana relative to Non-Discrimination in Federally and State-assisted programs of the U.S. Department of Transportation and the State of Montana, as they may be amended from time to time, which are herein incorporated by reference and made a part of this contract.

# (2) Non-discrimination:

- a. The PARTY, with regard to the work performed by it during the contract, will not discriminate, directly or indirectly, on the grounds of any of the protected classes in the selection and retention of subcontractors, including procurements of materials and leases of equipment, employment, and all other activities being performed under this contract/agreement.
- b. The PARTY will provide notice to its employees and the members of the public that it serves that will include the following:
  - i. A statement that the PARTY does not discriminate on the grounds of any protected classes.

- (4) Solicitation for Subcontracts, Including Procurement of Materials and Equipment: In all solicitations, either by competitive bidding, or negotiation, made by the PARTY for work to be performed under a subcontract, including procurements of materials, or leases of equipment, each potential subcontractor or supplier will be notified by the PARTY of the PARTY's obligation under this contract/agreement and all Acts and Regulations of the United States and the State of Montana related to Non-Discrimination.
- (5) Information and Reports: The PARTY will provide all information and reports required by the Acts, Regulations, and directives issued pursuant thereto and will permit access to its books, records, accounts, other sources of information and its facilities as may be determined by MDT or relevant US DOT Administration to be pertinent to ascertain compliance with such Acts, Regulations, and instructions. Where any information required of a contractor is in the exclusive possession of another who fails or refuses to furnish the information, the PARTY will so certify to MDT or relevant US DOT Administration, as appropriate, and will set forth what efforts it has made to obtain the information.
- (6) Sanctions for Noncompliance: In the event of a PARTY's noncompliance with the Non- discrimination provisions of this contract/agreement, MDT will impose such sanctions as it or the relevant US DOT Administration may determine to be appropriate, including, but not limited to:
  - a. Withholding payments to the PARTY under the contract/agreement until the PARTY complies; and/or
  - b. Cancelling, terminating, or suspending the contract/agreement, in whole or in part.
