Call to Order

Mayor Jeremy Grimm called the special meeting of the Sandpoint City Council to order at 5:30 p.m. on Wednesday, March 12, 2025, in Council chambers at City Hall, 1123 W. Lake St., Sandpoint, Idaho.

Pledge of Allegiance

Mayor Grimm led all present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Workshop

Mayor Grimm explained that this special meeting had been called for the purpose of a workshop, requested by City Council, to review plans for the Cedar Street Reconstruction Project, noting that it was identified on the agenda as an action item for any recommendations or changes Council may request during the meeting.

Following the Mayor's introduction, Public Works Director Holly Ellis provided a presentation, followed by Council discussion and questions fielded by Mayor Grimm, Ms. Ellis, City Engineer Brandon Staglund, Police Chief Corey Coon, and Fire Chief Gavin Gilcrease. Council members sought changes to the proposed plans and concurred on the following features for this project:


- 10.5' travel lanes;
- 5' sidewalk on the north side of Cedar Street;
- 6-7' planter strip on the north side of Cedar Street;
- 7' planter strip on the south side of Cedar Street;
- 10' shared-use path on the south side of Cedar Street;
- Minimize, to the extent possible, removal of sidewalk on the south side of Cedar Street;
- Minimize, to the extent possible, removal of existing trees; and
- Determine the cost to save the established silver maple tree that exists in the 1600 block of Cedar Street.

Staff recommended that, given all the changes, the plans should move back to the public review and engagement step and noted that it will most likely not be possible to undertake this project this construction season.

Adjourn

With no further business on the agenda, the meeting was adjourned at 7:33 p.m.
