

# COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE MINUTES REGULAR REMOTE MEETING

# **DISCUSSION ITEMS**

2. Affordable Housing Committee Discussion.

The Committee reviewed prior discussions about the Affordable Housing Committee, including that this Committee would be an ad hoc committee of the City Council, consisting of three members appointed by the Mayor Pro-Tem and confirmed by the Council; the Affordable Housing Committee could have advisors from staff and other organizations as needed; meetings would be public and follow the same process as any other committee under the Council Rules of Procedure; recommendations need to identify specific actions, and would be to the full Council; and that as an ad hoc committee the Affordable Housing Committee would have a term until December 31, 2023. The Committee also discussed how the Affordable Housing Committee can work along parallel paths.

3. Economic Development Commission letter.

Kelly Coughlin presented the letter from the Economic Development Commission to the Committee. The letter asks the City Council to allocate additional funding to targeted efforts to support the business community. The Committee discussed the letter and how to consider the request as part of the larger 2023-24 biennial budget discussions.

4. 2023-24 Budget Presentation.

The Community Development Director and Budget Manager presented information about the Community Development Department's portion of the proposed 2023-24 Budget. The Committee discussed 2021-22 actual expenditures, proposed 2023-24 budget appropriations, and the proposed staffing plan.
