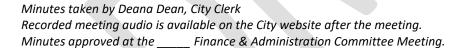

Subject: CLAIMS REPORT

Approval of payments for the period: February 28, 2023 through March 15, 2023

BACKGROUND

Per RCW 42.24.080, all claims presented against the city by persons furnishing materials, rendering services, or performing labor must be certified by the appropriate official to ensure that the materials have been furnished, the services rendered, or the labor performed as described, and that the claims are just, due, and unpaid obligations against the city, before payment can be made. Expedited processing of the payment of claims when certain conditions have been met allows for the payment of claims before the legislative body has acted to approve the claims when: (1) the appropriate officers have furnished official bonds; (2) the legislative body has adopted policies that implement effective internal control; (3) the legislative body has provided for review of the documentation supporting the claims within a month of issuance; and (4) that if claims are disapproved, they shall be recognized as receivables and diligently pursued. The City of Snoqualmie meets all requirements of this state law.

Pursuant to Snoqualmie Municipal Code (SMC) Chapter 3.85, all Claims, Demands and Vouchers against the city, provides that the Finance Director or her designee will examine all claims prior to payment and provide periodic reporting of the payments to the City Council for final approval. Per SMC 3.85.040, to meet these requirements, the Finance Director schedules payment of claims and payroll for monthly Finance & Administration Committee review followed by full City Council approval on the consent agenda. Per SMC 3.85.050, documentation supporting claims paid and the Finance Director's written report are made available to all city council members at City Hall for 48 hours prior to the Finance & Administration Committee meeting. Following the 48-hour review period, the Finance & Administration Committee considers the claims as part of its regular agenda and recommends to the full city council whether to approve or disapprove the claims. Consistent with these requirements, this report seeks City Council approval of payment of claims and payroll batches summarized in the table below.

ANALYSIS

All payments made during these periods were found to be valid claims against the city. Details are available in documentation provided for City Council review prior to the Finance & Administration Committee meeting. The City's internal controls include certification of the validity of all expenditures by the appropriate department and an internal audit conducted by designated finance department staff who review all claims and payroll payments. Staff performs system validation and exception reviews to validate payroll records. The Finance Director performs a random sampling review of supporting documentation for claims payments to ensure validity, as well as regularly reviews its processes to ensure appropriate internal controls are in place.

The City issues disbursements for claims and payroll via the following methods:

- Warrant: paper negotiable instruments, very much like, although legally distinct from, checks
- Commercial Credit Card: as authorized by Financial Management Policy
- Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT). EFTs are electronic banking transactions (no paper instrument) of two basic

types: (1) Automated Clearing House (ACH) for Electronic Fund Transfer (EFT) and (2) Wire Transfers a dire transfer between bank accounts

SUMMARY

INTRODUCTION

This agenda bill recommends adoption of Resolution No. 1640. The Resolution would amend the Snoqualmie Personnel Policies by rescinding and repealing Policy No. 2.33, which establishes a qualification of employment requiring that all City employees be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 with a vaccine authorized by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control.

LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

The following enactments comprise the City of Snoqualmie legislative history relevant to this agenda bill:

Emergency Proclamation dated March 6, 2020
Mandatory COVID-19 Vaccination and Masking Directives dated August 19, 2021
Revised Mandatory COVID-19 Vaccination and Masking Directive dated January 17, 2022
Resolution No. 1619, adopted June 14, 2022
Recission of Emergency Proclamation effective October 31, 2022

BACKGROUND

On February 29, 2020, Governor Jay Inslee issued Proclamation 20-05 declaring a state of emergency in all counties of the state related to the spread of the Covid-19 virus. One week later, on March 6, 2020, then-Mayor Matthew R. Larson issued an Emergency Proclamation declaring the existence of an emergency within the City of Snoqualmie related to the significant health risks posed by the Covid-19 virus. On March 23, 2020, Governor Inslee issued a "Stay Home – Stay Healthy" order intended to reduce the spread and transmission of the Covid-19 virus, and subsequently issued many additional proclamations and orders related to COVID-19.

Among the additional proclamations was Proclamation 21-14, which required all State of Washington employees, on-site independent contractors, volunteers, goods and services providers, and appointees of designated state agencies to be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 on or before October 18, 2021. At the time of issuance of Proclamation 21-14, Governor Inslee called upon other state and local leaders to impose similar mandatory vaccination requirements in their local governments and organizations. King County Executive Dow Constantine and Seattle Mayor Jenny Durkan did so, and also imposed mandatory vaccination requirements for all County and all City of Seattle employees, respectively (subject to requirements for medical and religious exemptions and reasonable accommodations). On August 19, 2021, then-Mayor Matthew R. Larson issued the Mandatory COVID-19 Vaccination and Masking Directives dated August 19, 2021, which imposed as a qualification of employment the requirement that all City of Snoqualmie employees and City volunteers, including volunteer firefighters and health care providers, be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 with a vaccine authorized by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control. The mandatory vaccination requirements were imposed in light of continued surging rates of infection, hospitalization and death from COVID-19, driven at that time by the Delta variant, but subsequently by the Omicron and offshoot variants, including BA.5, BQ.1 and BQ.1.1.

Subsequently, on June 14, 2022, the Snoqualmie City Council adopted Resolution No. 1619, which incorporated the City's mandatory COVID-19 vaccination qualification of employment as Policy 2.33 of the Snoqualmie Personnel Policies. In light of the significant vaccination rates within Washington State, the availability of bivalent COVID-19 boosters and treatments like antivirals, and the determination by health experts and epidemiological modeling experts, on October 28, 2022, Governor Inslee rescinded Proclamation 21-14 and the mandatory vaccination requirement for Washington State employees and independent contractors. Following the Governor's lead, effective October 31, 2022 Mayor Ross rescinded the prior Emergency Proclamation adopted by Mayor Larson. The City's vaccination requirement, however, remains in place, due to its incorporation as Policy 2.33 in the Snoqualmie Personnel Policies.

ANALYSIS

Circumstances have changed since the August, 2021 adoption of the Mandatory Vaccination COVID-19 Vaccination and Masking Directives. The rate of vaccination in City of Snoqualmie residents, and other East King County jurisdictions, is high. According to King County data, in the area including Sammamish, Duvall, Carnation, Snoqualmie and North Bend, and unincorporated areas east to the Cascade Crest, 90.1% of all residents have completed the primary series of COVID-19 vaccinations, and 68.8% have received the original booster. In the cities of Bellevue, Issaquah and Mercer Island, the rates are 91% and 67.4%, respectively. All current City of Snoqualmie employees have been vaccinated, and many have also received boosters. The City

has only 10-12 vacancies among existing FTE positions, of which a number are in the hiring process and have been advertised as being subject to the current vaccination requirement. Meanwhile, data collected by the Washington Department of Health ("DOH") demonstrates a significant decrease in the rates of hospitalization and death per 100,000 people since the fall of 2021.

For example, the September 29, 2021 "COVID-19 Cases, Hospitalizations and Deaths By Vaccination Status" report indicates that the incidence of COVID cases per 100,000 people were 4-6 times higher in unvaccinated than vaccinated individuals across all age groups; hospitalization rates per 100,000 people were 10-26 times higher in unvaccinated than vaccinated individuals across all age groups (and 20-26 times higher for ages 35-64 and 65+); and deaths per 100,000 people occurred at a rate 9 times higher in unvaccinated then vaccinated individuals in the 65+ age group. See Exhibit 3.

By contrast, the February 13, 2023 DOH report "COVID-19 Cases, Hospitalizations and Deaths By Vaccination Status in Washington State" indicates that for the period January 5 - February 1, 2023, hospitalization rates per 100,000 people were 2.6 - 5.5 times higher in unvaccinated than vaccinated individuals across all age groups, and death rates per 100,000 people were 2.8 - 6.0 times higher in unvaccinated than vaccinated individuals across all age groups. See Exhibit 4.

In addition to the above, since the fall of 2021, bivalent COVID-19 boosters have become readily available for people 5 years and older and, COVID-19 vaccines have been approved for children 6 months and older, and antiviral treatments such as Paxlovid are also available for early treatment of individuals who may contract COVID-19.

The above change in circumstances were part of what led Governor Inslee to declare that "although Department of Health statistics reflect the continued persistence of COVID-19 in the state, including continued hospitalizations and deaths due to COVID-19, health experts and epidemiological modeling experts believe that as a state we have made adequate progress against COVID-19 to end the state of emergency," and that, therefore, the Governor could terminate the State's COVID-19 vaccination requirements. See Exhibit 5.

Based on the information set forth above, the Administration agrees with Governor Inslee that, although Department of Health statistics reflect the continued persistence of COVID-19 in the state, the decreased differential in rates of hospitalizations and deaths between vaccinated and unvaccinated individuals, and other factors outlined above demonstrate that sufficient progress has been made against COVID-19 to end the requirement as a qualification of employment that City employees be fully vaccinated against COVID-19. And, while for those persons who are able to be vaccinated, getting fully vaccinated and remaining up to date with all recommended boosters remains the most effective tool to protect themselves, their families, and their communities, all current City employees are already vaccinated, and existing City policy offers an incentive to unrepresented employees and employees in at least one collective bargaining unit to obtain a COVID-19 booster if they have not already received one by the time they commence employment with the City. Resolution 1640 does not change the booster incentive.

RESOLUTION NO. 1619

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SNOQUALMIE, WASHINGTON, AMENDING THE PERSONNEL POLICIES

WHEREAS, on November 13, 2012, the Snoqualmie City Council adopted Resolution No. 1174, which adopted amended Personnel Policies of the City of Snoqualmie; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the City to adopt additional amendments to City of Snoqualmie Personnel Policies, in order to update the Policies as required by law and to incorporate certain Policy changes made on an emergency basis during the COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that it is also in the best interest of the City to delegate to the Mayor and City Administrator authority to make certain, limited additional amendments to the Personnel Polices in order to enable the efficient and consistent administration of personnel matters; and

NOW, THEREFORE, be it hereby **RESOLVED** by the City Council of the City of Snoqualmie, Washington as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. <u>Personnel Policies Amended</u>. Certain identified Policies of the City of Snoqualmie Personnel Policies are hereby amended as set forth below:

SECTIONS 1.3 EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY.

1.3.1

The City is an equal employment opportunity employer. The City employs, retains, promotes, terminates and otherwise treats all employees and job applicants on the basis of merit, qualifications, and competence. This policy shall be applied without regard to the employee's or applicant's Discrimination based on an individual's sex, race (inclusive of traits historically associated or perceived to be associated with race, including hair texture and hairstyle), creed, color, religion, national origin, citizenship or immigration status, age, marital status, sexual orientation, gender identity, pregnancy, or disability, veteran's status, or any other base prohibited by applicable federal, state, or local laws is prohibited.

1.3.2

The City reasonably accommodates employees with a sensory, physical or mental impairment. It is the responsibility of the applicant or employee to request accommodation for any disability. If an applicant or employee has a disability that limits his/her ability to perform the essential elements of the job, please inform the department director and/or Human Resources of the disability and a request for reasonable accommodation. In order to provide reasonable accommodation, the City may seek to communicate with the applicant / employee and his/her medical providers to gain a better understanding of the limitations and the means by which an accommodation would allow the employee to perform the essential functions of the position. Such communications with medical providers will only occur after the employee or applicant has given written consent.

- 1.3.3 The City complies with its duty to provide reasonable accommodation of any applicant's or employee's sincerely held religious beliefs, unless the City determines granting an accommodation would create an undue hardship, cannot be granted due to contractual commitments that cannot be or will not be waived, or is contrary to law or the City's commitment to diversity. For example, if an employee seeks a certain work schedule, or to dress or attire himself/herself in a way that varies from any dress code adopted by the City, the employee will inform the department director of the religious practice and a request for reasonable accommodation.
- 2.33 VACCINATION. As a qualification of employment, all City
 employees and City volunteers, including volunteer firefighters and
 health care providers, are required to be fully vaccinated against
 COVID-19 with a vaccine authorized by the U.S. Centers for
 Disease Control. To be considered fully vaccinated, prospective
 employees must provide proof of the following prior to the date of
 hire:
 - Completion of two doses of an authorized mRNA vaccine (Pfizer, Moderna or equivalent); or
 - Completion of one dose of a Johnson & Johnson / Janssen or equivalent authorized single-dose vaccine.

Proof of vaccination includes providing to Human Resources a CDC Covid-19 Vaccination Record Card, WA State Certificate of Covid-19 Vaccination, WA State Immunization Information System

printout, or a verified electronic medical record printout from a medical provider, as well as signing and returning to Human Resources a Proof of Vaccination Form.

Prospective employees with a sincerely held religious belief or a medical condition that prevents them from getting vaccinated may request an exemption and reasonable accommodation from the above COVID-19 vaccine requirement. See Policy 1.3.3 above.

Unless specifically otherwise designated, any holiday that falls on a Saturday, shall be observed on the preceding Friday. Holidays that falls on a Sunday shall be observed

on the following Monday.

If any of the above holidays are designated state holidays and federal I holidays but are observed on different dates, only the state holidays shall be observed.

6.1.2

6.1.1

6.1.3

If an employee is required by the employee's Department Head to work on a recognized holiday, the employee shall receive compensation at the rate of time and one-half for time worked, in addition to the employee's regular straighttime hourly rate.

6.1.4

Holidays, which occur during vacation or sick leave, shall not be charged against such leave.

6.1.5

An employee shall receive two personal/floating holidays each calendar year, as noted above, provided:

- A. The employee has been continuously employed by the City for more than four months.
- B. The employee has prior supervisory approval; and
- C. The number of employees selecting a particular day off does not prevent the City from providing effective public service.
- D. Personal holidays must be taken during the calendar year, or entitlement to them will lapse, except when an employee has requested a personal holiday and the request has been denied. An employee shall not be paid in lieu of taking the holiday under any circumstances.

6.1.6

If an employee's religious beliefs require the observance of a holiday not included in the basic holiday schedule, the employee may, with the employee's Department Head's approval, take the day off using a personal holiday, vacation, compensatory time, or leave without pay.

6.1.7

An employee who receives a COVID-19 vaccine booster shot after the date of hire, and provide proof of vaccination booster to Human Resources, will be eligible to receive a single, one-time additional floating holiday. An employee who receives a booster shot before their date of hire is not eligible to receive the one-time additional floating holiday.

6.3 SICK LEAVE

6.3.1 For all regular, full-time employees, paid sick leave shall accrue at the rate of one day of leave for each month of continuous full-time

service. For all regular, part-time employees who work at least 20 hours per week, paid sick leave shall accrue at the rate of one day of leave for each month of continuous part-time service, multiplied by the fraction x/40, where "x" equals the number of hours worked per week. A maximum of 90 days (720 hours) of earned but unused sick leave may be carried over from one calendar year to the next. Employees are eligible to use sick leave for the following reasons and/or during the following circumstances:

- A. Personal illness or physical disability.
- B. Quarantine <u>or isolation</u> of an employee by a physician for exposure to <u>or infection with</u> a contagious disease, <u>when an employee is</u> <u>directed by their supervisor to return home or not to report to work</u>, where reporting to <u>or remaining at work poses a substantial risk of would-jeopardizingze</u> the health of others, as determined by the physician or supervisor.
- C. Bona fide medical or dental appointments for the employee, <u>family</u> member or dependent child <u>residing with the employee</u>, provided that the employee makes a reasonable effort to schedule such appointments at times which are least disruptive to the work day.
- D. Absence due to use of a prescription drug which impair job performance or safety.
- E. Actual periods of temporary disability related to pregnancy or childbirth (see Section 6.4, Disability/Maternity Leave).
- F. To attend the birth of and/or to care for an employee's newborn child (see Section 6.5, Family Leave).
- G. To care for a member of the employee's immediate family who has a health condition requiring supervision or treatment or who has been exposed to an infectious agent, biological toxin, or hazardous material and has been requested or recommended to self-quarantine, and where the employee's reporting to work could pose a substantial risk to the health of others, as determined by the employee's physician or supervisor.
- H. When the school, place of care, or caregiver of an employee's child or immediate family member residing with the employee is closed/unavailable due for a health-related reason. For purposes of this policy, "health-related reason" means a serious public health concern that could result in bodily injury or exposure to an infectious agent, biological toxin, or hazardous material. Health-related reason does not include closures for inclement weather.
- I. When the employee or a member of the employee's immediate family has been deemed in the judgment of a public health official to be at "high risk" of contracting an infectious disease and said risk may be exacerbated by to the employee's potential workplace

exposure to an infectious agent, biological toxin, or hazardous material; due to the nature of the employee's work, the employee is not able to telecommute or utilize other alternate work arrangements; and the employee has requested and received permission from their supervisor and the Human Resources Director to not report to work in order to reduce the risk of contracting an infectious disease. The supervisor and/or Human Resources Director may request documentation from the employee's physician of potential risk.

Section 2. Implementation. The Mayor, and City Administrator if directed by the Mayor, is hereby authorized and directed to update the City of Snoqualmie Personnel Policies, to carry out the provisions of this resolution. The Mayor, and City Administrator if directed by the Mayor, is also authorized to make such future additional amendments to the Personnel Policies as may be necessary to: (a) make the Policies consistent with federal or state law, rules or regulations and (b) provide for a more efficient, equitable, uniform and consistent administration and management of personnel matters; provided, that amendments to Personnel Policies that increase employee wages, compensation (including compensated absences) or benefits, create new employee positions, or prescribe the duties, qualifications or compensation of appointed officers specified by Ch. 2.64 of the Snoqualmie Municipal Code shall require approval by the Mayor and City Council by resolution.

Section 3. Superseding Provisions; Severability. In cases where these Personnel Policies conflict with Federal or State law, rules or regulations, the Snoqualmie Personnel Policies shall be deemed superseded. In all other cases the amended Personnel Policies shall apply. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this resolution or section of the City of Snoqualmie Personnel Policies adopted hereby should be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity of any other section, sentence, clause or phrase of this resolution or the adopted section.

COVID-19 Cases, Hospitalizations, and Deaths by Vaccination Status

Summary

Unvaccinated 12-34 year-olds in Washington are

- 6 times more likely to get COVID-19 compared with fully vaccinated 12-34 year-olds.
- 26 times more likely to be hospitalized with COVID-19 compared with fully vaccinated 12-34 year-olds.

Unvaccinated 35-64 year-olds are

- 5 times more likely to get COVID-19 compared with fully vaccinated 35-64 year-olds.
- 20 times more likely to be hospitalized with COVID-19 compared with fully vaccinated 35-64 year-olds.

Unvaccinated 65+ year-olds are

- 4 times more likely to get COVID-19 compared with fully vaccinated 65+ year-olds.
- 10 times more likely to be hospitalized with COVID-19 compared with fully vaccinated 65+ yearolds.
- 9 times more likely to die of COVID-19 compared with fully vaccinated 65+ year-olds.

Background

Vaccination is a critical tool for containing the COVID-19 pandemic. COVID-19 vaccines are highly effective and greatly reduce the risk of severe illness, hospitalization, and death from COVID-19. Approximately two-thirds of the eligible Washington population is fully vaccinated and protected from experiencing these serious outcomes. However, many remain unvaccinated and case rates are currently very high. Vaccination rates also vary across the state and between age and demographic groups, leaving some populations particularly vulnerable.

Although COVID-19 vaccines work well to prevent severe illness and death among those exposed to the virus, a small percentage of fully vaccinated people will still get COVID-19. Even highly effective vaccines cannot prevent all infections. However, because the vaccine offers strong protection against the most serious outcomes of COVID-19, increasing vaccination rates is key to limiting severe COVID-19 cases and saving lives.

This report provides an overview of confirmed and probable COVID-19 cases, hospitalizations, and deaths by vaccination status. The purpose is to provide a comprehensive look at the impact of

vaccination on COVID-19 in Washington state. This report breaks vaccination status into three categories:

- **Fully vaccinated:** those who have reached 2 weeks after receiving the final recommended dose of an authorized COVID-19 vaccine.
- **Partially vaccinated:** those who have received one or more doses of an authorized vaccine but have not reached the full 14 days after the final dose.
- **Unvaccinated:** those who have not received any dose of a COVID-19 vaccine.

Individuals are not considered fully vaccinated until two weeks have passed since receiving their final dose because of the time required for the body to build protection. Use of 'fully vaccinated' in this report differs from 'breakthrough' used elsewhere in Washington State Department of Health reports. Additional details on these differences are provided in the methods section at the end of this report.

With the emergence of the Delta variant as the dominant COVID-19 strain in Washington and the U.S., and with additional variants appearing worldwide, it is more urgent than ever to ensure that everyone who is eligible gets vaccinated against COVID-19. As of September 20, 2021, 26.4% of eligible Washingtonians had not yet initiated vaccination. The percentage of fully vaccinated individuals is now increasing only modestly, rising by less than 1% from September 13- September 20, 2021.

Trends in COVID-19 case and hospitalization rates by vaccination status and age group

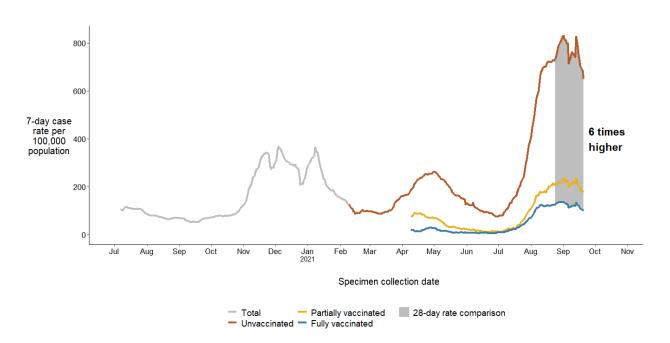
The following graphs show the 7-day COVID-19 case, hospitalization and death rates by age group for people who are unvaccinated, people who are partially vaccinated, and people who are fully vaccinated. The difference between rates in the unvaccinated population compared to the fully vaccinated population during the grayed out 28-day time period is shown in text on each graph.

There is a large difference in cases and hospitalizations between unvaccinated and fully vaccinated populations across all age groups. This difference has become greater since July of this year. The rapid increase in cases in July 2021 correlates to several events that occurred in a close time frame from the end of June to the beginning of July, including:

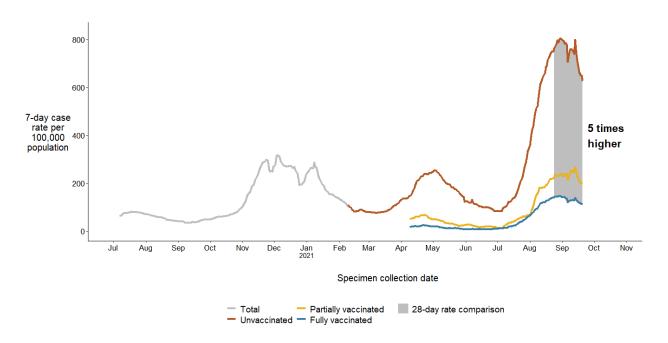
- The Delta variant became the predominant strain in Washington state
- Statewide recommendations were relaxed for gatherings and mask use in public places, and
- Gatherings increased in size and number because of the heat wave and summer holiday celebrations.

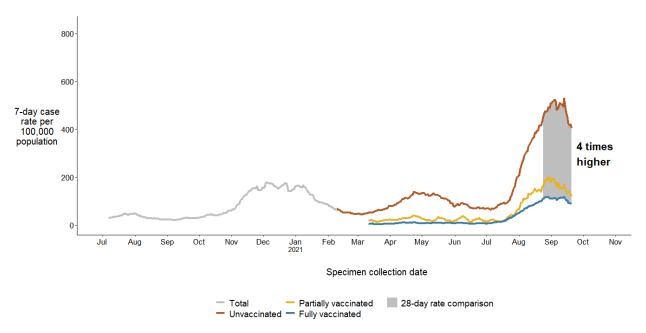
COVID-19 case rates among 12-34 year-old individuals are 6 times higher in the unvaccinated population than in the fully vaccinated population

COVID-19 case rates among 65+ year-old individuals are 4 times higher in the unvaccinated population than in the fully vaccinated population

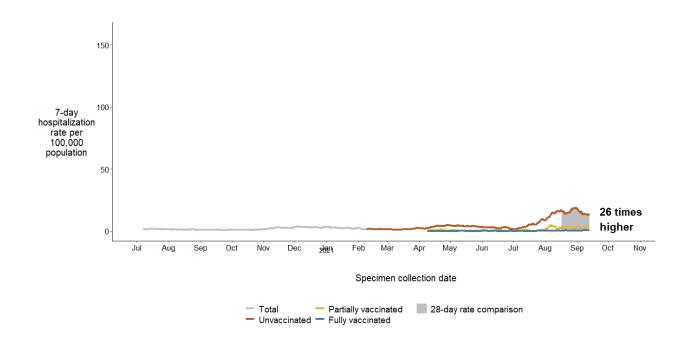

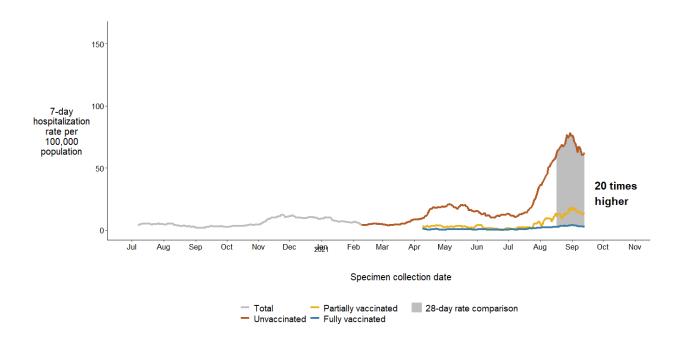

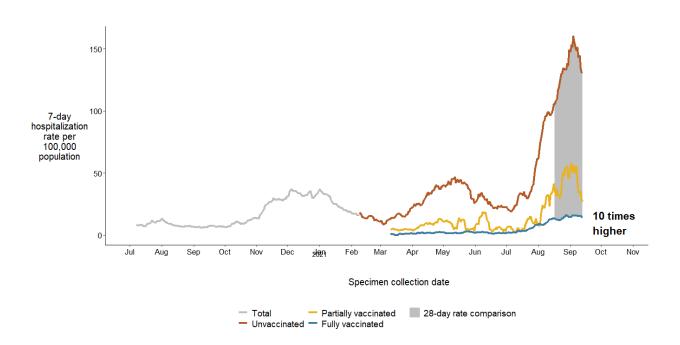
COVID-19 hospitalization rates among 12-34 year-old individuals are 26 times higher in the unvaccinated population than in the fully vaccinated population

COVID-19 hospitalization rates among 65+ year-old individuals are 10 times higher in the unvaccinated population than in the fully vaccinated population



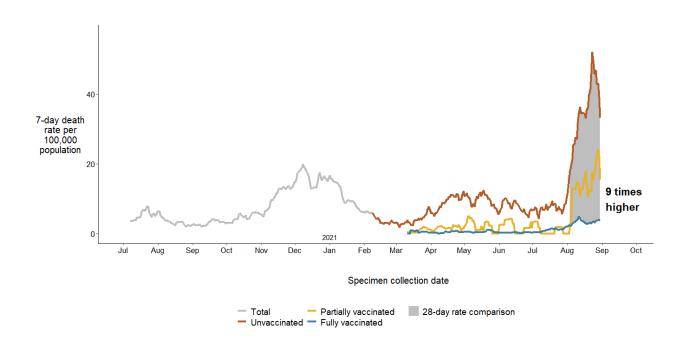

COVID-19 cases, hospitalizations, and deaths in individuals who are fully vaccinated and unvaccinated by age

The tables below show cases, hospitalizations, and deaths in unvaccinated and fully vaccinated individuals through the last complete month of data. The tables highlight the difference between those who do not have any vaccine protection and those with full vaccine protection. The population that is partially vaccinated is not represented in these tables.

- The proportion of cases, hospitalizations, and deaths in unvaccinated individuals is lowest among older age groups (65 years and older). This is most likely due to a higher percentage of fully vaccinated persons in this age group compared with other age groups.
- As the percent of fully vaccinated individuals in other age groups increases, the percent of cases among those who are unvaccinated is expected to decrease.
- If the exposure to COVID-19 stays the same, as more individuals are vaccinated, more cases, hospitalizations, and deaths will be in vaccinated individuals, as they will continue to make up more and more of the population. For example, if 100% of the population was vaccinated, 100% of cases would be among vaccinated people.
- An increase in the proportion of cases among fully vaccinated individuals will result in a decrease in the proportion of cases among unvaccinated individuals.
- A similar situation will occur as the percent of fully vaccinated individuals in other age groups increases.

Methods

Data sources

There are three data sources for these metrics:

- Washington Disease Reporting System (WDRS)
- Washington Immunization Information System (WAIIS)
- Washington Health and Life Events System (WHALES) WDRS receives case, hospitalization, and death information for all COVID-19 cases in Washington residents. WAIIS collects COVID-19 vaccination data from healthcare providers for people vaccinated in Washington. Not all federal correction facilities and federal healthcare organizations (e.g., Department of Defense and Veterans Administration facilities) submit data to WAIIS. WAIIS may not include vaccination data from all tribal health facilities.

All rates presented in this report are calculated using the Washington state population distribution based on the Office of Financial Management's (OFM) April 1, 2020 population estimates. To better reflect the true rates of COVID-19 cases, hospitalizations, and deaths in this report, calculations include only the 12 and older population because they are eligible to be vaccinated.

Definitions

All case, hospitalization, and death data reported are based on positive molecular or antigen test results. A fully vaccinated COVID-19 case is a person with a positive molecular or antigen test result and a specimen collection date two or more weeks after receiving the final dose of an authorized COVID-19 vaccine. An individual is considered fully vaccinated two weeks after their second dose in a two-dose series, such as the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines, or two weeks after a single-dose vaccine, such as Johnson & Johnson's Janssen vaccine.

A COVID-19 hospitalization is a Washington resident who has been identified using case investigation data in WDRS or links with Rapid Health Information Network (RHINO) records as hospitalized with confirmed or probable COVID-19.

Deaths are reported to the state by health care providers, medical examiners or coroners, local health departments, or others to the official vital records database, WHALES. COVID-19 deaths included in this report are identified in WHALES where the cause of death was confirmed or suspected to have been COVID-19.

Fully vaccinated versus breakthrough cases:

- For reporting purposes, DOH and CDC use strict criteria to classify breakthrough cases, including
 requiring information about the vaccine lot number and other details. The SARS-CoV-2 Vaccine
 Breakthrough Surveillance and Case Information Resource (wa.gov) report has information
 about cases that meet the breakthrough case definition. The report is updated every
 Wednesday.
- Because the purpose of this report is to provide a more comprehensive look at the impact of vaccines on COVID-19, it therefore uses a broader definition of 'fully vaccinated' rather than

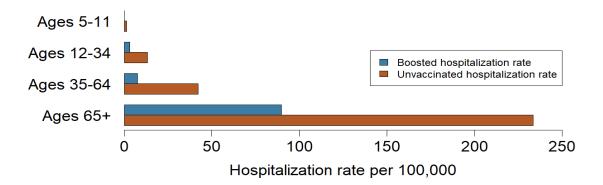

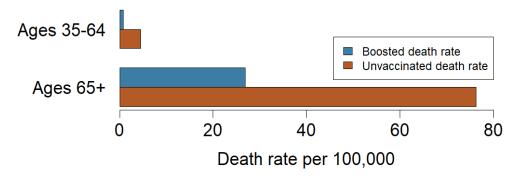

Summary

From January 05 to February 01, 2023, unvaccinated individuals were between 2.6 and 5.5 times more likely to be *hospitalized* with COVID-19 compared to those who received at least one booster dose*



From December 14 to January 10, 2023, unvaccinated individuals were between 2.8 and 6 times more likely to *die* from COVID-19 compared to those who received at least one booster dose*,**



^{*}Booster here includes additional doses or monovalent booster doses (excluding bivalent booster doses authorized on September 1, 2022)

^{**}Due to a small number of COVID-19 deaths, death rates in certain age groups may be unstable. Resulting rate ratios should be interpreted with caution.

Background

Vaccination is an important tool for controlling the COVID-19 pandemic. COVID-19 vaccines are safe and effective at reducing the risk of severe infections, being hospitalized, and dying from COVID-19. Approximately 70% of the Washington population ages 6 months and older has completed the primary COVID-19 vaccine series and over half of the population has received at least one booster dose (shot). Unvaccinated Washingtonians are at risk of serious outcomes such as being hospitalized and dying due to COVID-19. Because vaccination rates vary across the state between different age and demographic groups, some populations may be more vulnerable to these serious outcomes.

Although COVID-19 vaccines work well to protect against severe infections, being hospitalized, and dying from COVID-19, some people who are vaccinated with the primary series or who have received a booster dose will still get COVID-19 if they are exposed to the virus. As more individuals become vaccinated it is natural to see more vaccinated individuals get COVID-19, and even be hospitalized or die from COVID-19. However, because people who have completed the primary series and received at least one booster dose are much less likely to be hospitalized or die compared to those who are unvaccinated, increasing vaccination rates remains important to protect Washingtonians from severe COVID-19 infections and save lives.

This report shows the impact of vaccination on COVID-19 in Washington by describing rates of COVID-19 hospitalizations and deaths among people with different vaccination statuses. This report breaks vaccination status into three categories:

- Unvaccinated: those who have not received any dose of an authorized COVID-19 vaccine.
- **Completed primary series:** those who have reached two weeks after receiving the final recommended dose of the primary series of an authorized COVID-19 vaccine.
- **Boosted:** those who have reached two weeks after receiving at least one booster dose or additional dose of a monovalent COVID-19 vaccine. Individuals are not considered to have full protection from the monovalent booster dose until two weeks have passed since receiving the dose because of the time required for the body to build protection. COVID-19 vaccines categorized as "monovalent" are the initial COVID-19 vaccines that were approved by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA). Doses used for the primary series are monovalent vaccines. These are different from the new booster doses authorized by the FDA for use beginning September 1, 2022, which are referred to as "bivalent" vaccines. Data about doses of bivalent boosters are not included in this report.

PLEASE NOTE:

- Information about bivalent boosters is not included in this report in order to avoid confusing the impact of the bivalent boosters with the impact of the monovalent boosters. Individuals who received a bivalent booster after August 31, 2022 are removed from the analyses presented here. Information about the impact of bivalent boosters will be included in future iterations of this report once a sufficient percentage of the Washington population has received the booster.
- Immunocompromised individuals are eligible for an additional dose following the primary series before being eligible for a booster dose. Because DOH has very limited data about whether someone is immunocompromised, all doses received after the primary series is completed are categorized as "booster doses".

Impact of vaccination on COVID-19 hospitalization and death rates

The following graphs show the 28-day COVID-19 hospitalization and death rates by age group for people with different vaccination statuses. There are several important things to know when looking at the data. First, individuals who have received at least one booster dose (represented by the blue line in the following graphs) are less likely to be hospitalized or die of COVID-19 compared to those who are unvaccinated (red line) as well as those who completed the primary series (yellow line). However, because even very effective vaccines cannot prevent all infections, some individuals who have received at least one booster dose may still get sick, be hospitalized with, or die from COVID-19. There may also be other reasons these individuals experience serious outcomes even after receiving at least one booster dose, including:

- Decreasing protection from the vaccine as more time passes from when individuals received their most recent dose
- The spread of variants that are more contagious and that current vaccines are not as protective against
- Individuals and society changing behaviors such as masking, social distancing, and seeking testing

Interpreting the data is challenging because of several factors that are hard to measure in the population, including:

- The number of unvaccinated individuals with some protection from COVID-19 because of a previous infection
- The use of at-home tests and information about people who test positive not being reported to the Washington State Department of Health
- Individuals with underlying health conditions potentially being more likely to both get vaccinated and boosted, and also experience severe outcomes from COVID-19
- The potential for people who are vaccinated and boosted to be more likely to be tested

These limitations have a larger impact on case data compared to hospitalization and death data and have also become more relevant in recent months. Therefore, case data are no longer included in this report.

Trends in COVID-19 hospitalization and death rates by vaccination status and age group

The following graphs show the 28-day COVID-19 hospitalization and death rates by age group for people who are unvaccinated, people who have completed the primary series, and people who have received at least one booster dose. The difference between rates in the unvaccinated population compared to the population of those who have received at least one booster dose during the grayed out 28-day time period is shown in text on each graph.

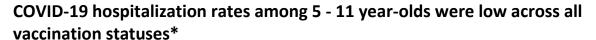

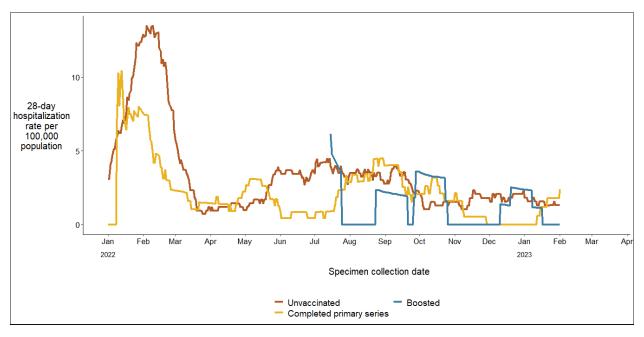

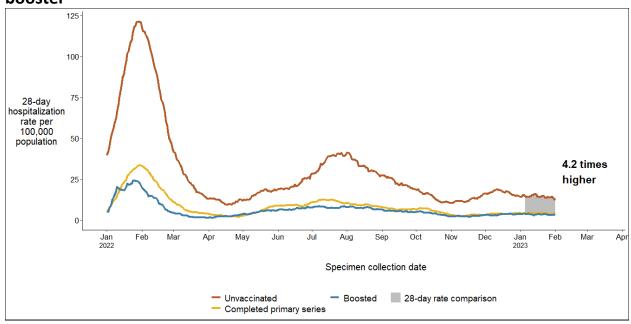

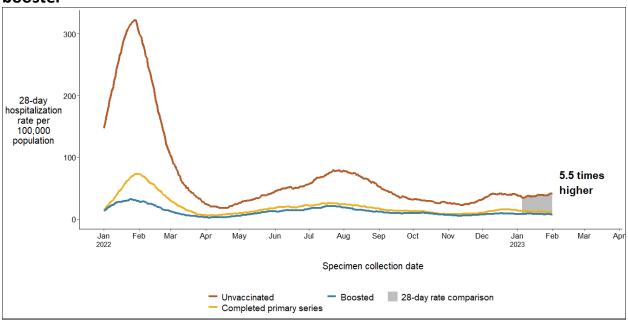

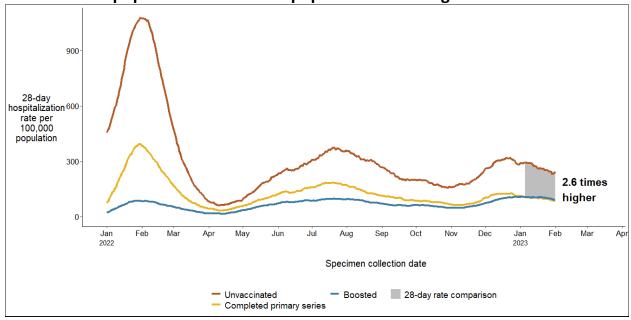
COVID-19 hospitalization rates among 12 - 34 year-olds are 4.2 times higher in the unvaccinated population than in the population receiving at least one booster

COVID-19 Deaths

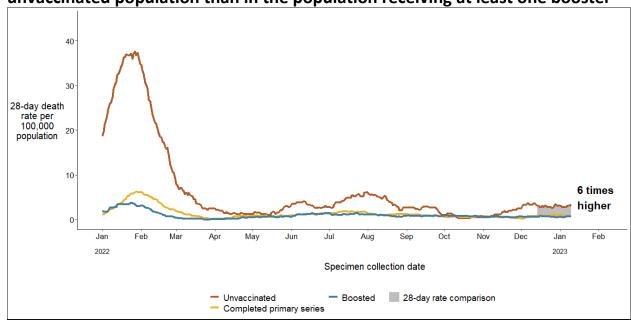
Deaths are only shown for Washingtonians ages 35 years and older due to the relatively small number of deaths in other age groups and associated instability in rates when assessing by vaccination status.

COVID-19 death rates per 100,000 population by age and vaccination status, December 14 to January 10, 2023**

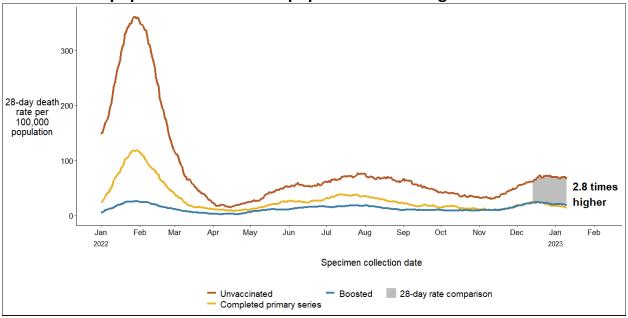

Methods

Data sources

There are three data sources for these metrics:

- Washington Disease Reporting System (WDRS)
- Washington Immunization Information System (WAIIS)
- Washington Health and Life Events System (WHALES)

WDRS receives case, hospitalization, and death information for all COVID-19 cases in Washington residents reported to the Washington State Department of Health. WAIIS collects COVID-19 vaccination data from healthcare providers for people vaccinated in Washington, as well as Washington residents vaccinated outside of the state. Not all federal correction facilities and federal healthcare organizations (e.g., Department of Defense and Veterans Administration facilities) submit data to WAIIS. WAIIS may not include vaccination data from all tribal health facilities.

All rates presented in this report are calculated using the Washington state population distribution based on the Office of Financial Management's (OFM) April 1, 2020 population estimates. To better reflect the true rates of COVID-19 hospitalizations and deaths in this report, calculations include only the 5 years and older population because they were eligible to receive booster doses during the assessment period.

Definitions

All case, hospitalization, and death data reported are based on positive molecular or antigen test results. A person classified as a COVID-19 case who received at least one booster dose is defined as a person with a positive molecular or antigen test result and a specimen collection date two or more weeks after their first booster dose of a monovalent COVID-19 vaccine is administered. An individual is considered to have received a booster dose two weeks after an age-appropriate booster dose is administered.

A COVID-19 hospitalization is a hospitalization of a Washington resident with COVID-19 who has been identified using case investigation data in WDRS or links with Rapid Health Information Network (RHINO) records as hospitalized with confirmed or probable COVID-19.

Deaths are reported to the state by health care providers, medical examiners or coroners, local health departments, or others to the official vital records database, WHALES. COVID-19 deaths included in this report are identified in WHALES where the cause of death was confirmed or suspected to have been COVID-19, and require a known positive test result.

Timeframes

It takes up to 10 days from specimen collection date for DOH to receive information about 90% of reported cases, 10 days for DOH to identify hospitalizations, and 32 days to identify deaths. For this reason, we report time periods differently for hospitalizations and deaths to ensure we are reporting the most complete data.

Linking methods

All information on COVID-19 cases, hospitalizations, and deaths in this report use WDRS data linked to WAIIS COVID-19 vaccination data. The method to link data was updated in July 2022 to include more robust linking methods. The links are based on a comparison of the following demographic information present in both WDRS and WAIIS:

- first name
- last name
- middle initial
- date of birth
- sex at birth
- phone number
- zip code

The new methodology identifies matches even when there are slight variations in the spelling of names or small errors in other demographic information between the two data sources. This method is a more robust method of linking data than the previous method, which required exact matches of first name, last name, and date of birth for records to be considered a match. COVID-19 cases with vaccines not reported to WAIIS as described above are considered unvaccinated in this report.

28-day rate calculations

Rates are calculated as the total number of hospitalizations or deaths within the specified vaccination and age groups with a specimen collection date during the 28-day period divided by the population that falls in the same age group with the same vaccination status at the beginning of the 28-day period.

For example,

28-day COVID-19 hospitalization rates per 100,000 population among 12 - 34 year-old individuals who received at least one booster dose =

Number of hospitalizations in 12 - 34-year-old individuals who received at least one booster dose with a specimen collection date August 1 - August 28

X 100,000

Number of 12 - 34-year-old individuals in Washington who received at least one booster dose as of August 1

To compare rates in the population of individuals who received at least one booster dose to the unvaccinated population, the rates for the most recent four-week (i.e., 28-day) period is calculated. The 28-day rate in the unvaccinated population is divided by the 28-day rate in the population of individuals who received at least one booster dose to calculate a rate ratio.

For example,

The rate ratio for the boosted and unvaccinated COVID-19 hospitalization rates per 100,000 population among 12 - 34 year-old individuals on August 28 =

28-day (August 1 - August 28) hospitalization rate for unvaccinated 12 - 34-year-old individuals

28-day (August 1 - August 28) hospitalization rate for 12 - 34-year-old individuals who received at least one booster dose



PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR AMENDING PROCLAMATIONS 20-05 and 21-14, et seq.

21-14.6 COVID-19 VACCINATION REQUIREMENT Termination of Emergency Order

WHEREAS, on February 29, 2020, I issued Proclamation 20-05, proclaiming a State of Emergency for all counties throughout Washington State as a result of the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) outbreak in the United States and confirmed person-to-person spread of COVID-19 in Washington State; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the continued worldwide spread of COVID-19, its significant progression in Washington State, and the high risk it poses to our most vulnerable populations and our health care system, I have subsequently issued several amendatory proclamations, exercising my emergency powers under RCW 43.06.220 by prohibiting certain activities and waiving and suspending specified laws and regulations; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 vaccines are effective in reducing infection and serious disease, and widespread vaccination is the primary means we have as a state to protect everyone, including persons who cannot be vaccinated for medical reasons, young children who are not eligible to receive a vaccine, immunocompromised individuals, and vulnerable persons including persons in health care facilities, long-term care facilities and other congregate care facilities; and

WHEREAS, it is the duty of every employer to protect the health and safety of employees by establishing and maintaining a healthy and safe work environment and by requiring all employees to comply with health and safety measures; and

WHEREAS, to further our individual and collective duty to reduce the spread of COVID-19 in our communities, I issued Proclamation 21-14 requiring all employees, on-site independent contractors, volunteers, goods and services providers, and appointees of designated state agencies to be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 on or before October 18, 2021; and

WHEREAS, on July 12, 2021, I issued Proclamation 20-12.4 prohibiting institutions of higher education from providing in-person instruction unless the institutions comply with specific requirements related to vaccination, masking, and operations; and

WHEREAS, some employers have chosen to implement a vaccination requirement as a condition of employment, subject to all applicable exemptions and accommodations required by law, even after the COVID-19 State of Emergency is lifted; and

WHEREAS, although the COVID-19 disease continues to persist as an ongoing and present threat in Washington, the measures we have taken together as Washingtonians over the past 31 months, including the willingness of Washingtonians to take advantage of the remarkable, life-saving vaccines being administered throughout the state, have made a difference and have altered the course of the pandemic in fundamental ways; and

WHEREAS, while COVID-19 appears to be here to stay, recent advances in medicine, including the availability of bivalent COVID-19 boosters for people 5 years and older and vaccines for children 6 months and older, as well as treatments like antivirals, are reasons to be hopeful that we will have the tools to protect ourselves and communities from severe disease and death to the greatest extent possible; and

WHEREAS, although Department of Health statistics reflect the continued persistence of COVID-19 in the state, including continued hospitalizations and deaths due to COVID-19, health experts and epidemiological modeling experts believe that as a state we have made adequate progress against COVID-19 to end the state of emergency; and

WHEREAS, for those persons who are able to be vaccinated, getting fully vaccinated and remaining up to date with all recommended boosters remains the most effective tool to protect themselves, their families, and their communities.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jay Inslee, Governor of the state of Washington, as a result of the above noted situation and pursuant to Emergency Proclamation 20-05.1, and under Chapter 43.06 RCW, do hereby rescind and terminate Proclamation 21-14 et seq., effective October 31, 2022, at 11:59 PM.
