Commissioner Michele Hollist welcomed everyone to the Electronic Planning Commission Meeting.

Chair Hollist motioned for a short recess while staff worked through IT issues. Commissioner Gedge seconded the motion; vote was unanimous in favor.

Chair Hollist motioned to reconvene the meeting once the issues were fixed. Commissioner Bevans seconded the motion; vote was unanimous in favor.

Planner Andrew McDonald reviewed background information from the Staff Report.

Commissioner Nathan Gedge asked about the need and reason for a Conditional Use Permit in this open space area for recreational use, and whether this could be improved in the future by removing the need for the permit.

Planner McDonald responded that the zone is relatively new.

Chair Michele Hollist asked why this application doesn't fall under the recent ordinance change waiving certain requirements when the city is applying to itself for projects.

Planner McDonald responded that this doesn't apply because it is a rezone.

Chair Hollist asked about potential restrictions on reserving that pavilion or facility.

Deputy City Engineer Jeremy Nielson responded that this is a smaller "pocket park," which was previously an HOA park that was turned over to the city; he doesn't believe the space is available for reservations. It's always possible that a group could be interested in reserving the park for an event or competition, but it was intentionally engineered not to draw things like big

competitions and avoid cars on the road. It is being engineered to be more of an amenity for the local neighborhood, users on the Welby Canal Trail, etc.

Commissioner Trevor Darby asked about any legal liability for the city in terms of injuries at these kinds of parks.

Assistant City Attorney Greg Simonsen noted that, aside from the fact that there would be hoops to jump through because the city is a governmental entity, the city can be liable for negligence like any other property owner.

Chair Hollist opened the public hearing for comments.

Kenneth Duquett (Resident) – I live two houses down from Highpoint park, and on a side note Highpoint Park Pavilion is not reservable. It is used by the individuals in the cul-de-sac quite a bit, but I have tried to reserve it for a birthday party and you can't. It seems like I went to the wrong meeting, I should have gone to the one before, but I was curious about what the parking would be. Finding out that it's not supposed to bring a lot of car traffic sounds great, as my kids play in that cul-de-sac. Is there a way to see what the second phase is planning on right now?

Chair Hollist closed the public hearing.

Engineer Nielson noted that, regarding a Phase 2, there is only funding for the currently presented Phase 1. Potentially in the future there is an opportunity to add a jump line, and it's shown on the images in the Staff Report for the potential Phase 2. The city is trying to be very sensitive to this community, and at this point in time there is no plan to add that jump line or money set aside for that.

Commissioner Laurel Bevans asked about the anticipated time for completion and details on the construction.

Engineer Nielson responded it shouldn't take more than a few months, with a completion possibly in June.

Commissioner Catmull asked who the target area of the zone is in terms of location, and how they will address pedestrian safety in the area as roads and traffic change in the future.

Engineer Nielson responded that is the reason for this being close to the Welby Canal Trail, encouraging the use of that fairly new trail and taking advantage of the connectivity it offers. The goal is to create connections between the local parks and amenities for those traveling through the trails and to these destinations.

Commissioner Gedge motioned to forward a positive recommendation to the City Council on File No. PLZBA202300163, Rezone from Agricultural (A-1) to Park Open Space (OS-P) Subdistrict, based on the Staff Report and discussion this evening. Chair Hollist seconded the motion.

Staff Recommendation (Motion Ready): I move that the Planning Commission **approve** application PLSPR202300174 to allow for construction of a wetland educational center on property generally located at 947 W. Shields Ln.

STANDARD OF REVIEW:

All proposed commercial, office, industrial, multi-family dwelling or institutional developments and alterations to existing developments shall meet the site plan review requirements outlined in this chapter and the requirements of the individual zone in which a development is proposed. All provisions of this title, title 17 of this Code, and other City requirements shall be met in preparing site plan applications and in designing and constructing the development. Building permits may not be obtained nor shall any site work be performed prior to site plan approval. The Planning Commission shall receive public comment regarding the site plan and shall approve, approve with conditions or deny the site plan.

BACKGROUND:

The proposed Mystic Springs educational wetland center is generally located at 947 W. Shields Ln. The proposed center will be located on the west bank of the Jordan River, immediately abutting the Jordan River Parkway trail from the west. The center is situated on an approximately 16 acre City-owned parcel. A portion of the parcel's north side is already developed as a parking lot and a trailhead for the Jordan River Parkway trail. The proposed center will be located to the south of that facility.

The center will offer both recreational and educational opportunities. It will feature walking trails, a shade structure and a couple of observation platforms. The majority of the trail will be finished in concrete along with some portions being dirt trails and other portions being wood boardwalks that cross over the wetlands. The proposed trail will eventually connect to the existing Jordan River Parkway trail.

The center will feature new landscaping that will consist of trees, bushes and grasses. The majority of the plantings will be installed along the western edge of the project to buffer

neighboring residents from the project. Other native plantings will be installed at the north end of the project with a few more scattered around the project.

Lighting will be provided for safety around the proposed wetland center. Three- to four-foot-tall bollards will be placed along the trail system within the project.

The educational opportunities will consist of various signage in and around the wetland center. The majority of the signage will be placed and installed along the trail system at intervals, while some of the signage will also be installed around the built structures.

STAFF FINDINGS, CONCLUSIONS & RECOMMENDATION:

Findings:

- The proposed center is listed as a permitted use in the OS-N zone (§17.23.170: Permitted Uses in the OS-N Subdistrict)
- The proposed center is a joint venture between the City and Salt Lake County. The project cost will be split evenly between the two agencies, although the City will own and maintain the park.
- The City and the County signed and executed an interlocal agreement regarding the project in spring of this year.

Conclusion:

• The proposed wetland educational center meets the City Code requirements, and as such, the project should be approved.

Recommendation:

• Based on the Findings and Conclusions listed above, Staff recommends that the Planning Commission take comments at the public hearing and **approve** the Application, unless, during the hearing, facts are presented that contradict these findings or new facts are presented, either of which would warrant further investigation by Staff.



INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT

between

SALT LAKE COUNTY for its Department of Community Services

and

CITY OF SOUTH JORDAN

THIS INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT (this "Agreement") is entered into by and between SALT LAKE COUNTY, a body corporate and politic of the State of Utah, for and on behalf of its Department of Community Services ("County") and the CITY OF SOUTH JORDAN, a municipal corporation of the State of Utah ("City"). County and City may each be referred to herein as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties."

RECITALS:

- A. The County is a county existing pursuant to Article XI, Section 1 of the Utah Constitution, and the Department of Community Services is a department of the County pursuant to Salt Lake County Ordinances, § 2.06B.020.
- B. The County receives funds ("<u>TRCC Funds</u>") pursuant to the Tourism, Recreation, Cultural, Convention, and Airport Facilities Tax Act, Utah Code Ann. §§ 59-12-601 *et seq.* (the "<u>TRCC Act</u>"). The TRCC Act provides that TRCC Funds may be used, among other things, for the development, operation, and maintenance of publicly owned or operated recreation, cultural, or convention facilities.
- C. The City is a municipality and a political subdivision of the State of Utah as provided for in Utah Code Ann. §§ 10-1-201 & 202, 1953 as amended.
- D. The City has requested TRCC Funds from the County to help it fund the project described in its application attached hereto as **EXHIBIT A** (the "Project"). More specifically, the City requested TRCC Funds to help fund Phase 1 of the Mystic Springs Nature Park. The County Council appropriated TRCC Funds for this purpose in the 2023 Salt Lake County Budget.
- E. The Parties are "public agencies" as defined by the Utah Interlocal Cooperation Act, Utah Code Ann. §§ 11-13-101 *et seq*. (the "Interlocal Cooperation Act"), and, as such, are authorized by the Interlocal Cooperation Act to enter into this Agreement to act jointly and cooperatively in a manner that will enable them to make the most efficient use of their resources and powers. Additionally, Section 11-13-215 of the Interlocal Cooperation Act authorizes a county, city, town, or other local political subdivision to share its tax and other revenues with other counties, cities, towns, local political subdivisions, or the state.

F. The Parties have determined that it is mutually advantageous to enter into this Agreement and believe that the County's assistance under this Agreement will contribute to the prosperity, moral well-being, peace, and comfort of Salt Lake County residents.

<u>**A G R E E M E N T**:</u>

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and in compliance with and pursuant to the terms hereof and the provisions of the Interlocal Cooperation Act, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

1. COUNTY'S CONTRIBUTION.

A. <u>Contribution of TRCC Funds</u>. County agrees to reimburse three hundred and one thousand three hundred and eighty-nine dollars (\$301,389.00) to the City from its 2023 TRCC Funds—all on the terms and subject to the conditions of this Agreement.

2. CITY'S OBLIGATIONS AND REPRESENTATIONS.

A. <u>Acknowledgement</u>. The City acknowledges that the TRCC Funds provided to the City under this Agreement are County public funds received pursuant to the TRCC Act and Salt Lake County Code of Ordinances §3.10.030, 3.10.040, and 3.10.051, and therefore must be used for the development, operation, and maintenance of publicly owned or operated recreation, cultural, or convention facilities.

B. Allowable Uses and Limitation on Use.

- (i) The City shall use the TRCC Funds provided under this Agreement solely to cover costs incurred by the City to develop the Project as described in EXHIBIT A, (application) and EXHIBIT B, (project budget).
- (ii) The City shall not expend any TRCC Funds on: (a) fund-raising expenditures related to capital or endowment campaigns, grants or re-grants; (b) direct political lobbying, (c) bad debt expense, (d) non-deductible tax penalties, (e) operating expenses that are utilized in calculating federal unrelated business income tax; or (f) in any other manner that would be inconsistent with the use stated in Paragraphs 2A and 2B of this Agreement.
- C. <u>Match Requirement</u>. If the City's Application attached hereto as **EXHIBIT A** and/or budget attached as **EXHIBIT B** indicate that the City will make a matching contribution toward the purpose for which TRCC Funds will be used by the City under this Agreement, the City shall make the matching contribution so indicated in the amount specified in the City's Program Application. If the City fails to make and expend such a matching contribution prior to **March 31, 2025**, the County may require repayment of TRCC Funds from the City for noncompliance with this provision.

- D. <u>Deadline to Expend TRCC Funds</u>. The City shall expend all TRCC Funds received under this Agreement in accordance with Paragraph 2B above prior to **March 31, 2025**. Additionally, if the City uses any portion of the TRCC Funds for anything other than for the purposes identified in Paragraph 2B above, the City shall immediately pay to the County an amount equal to the amount of TRCC Funds spent for purposes other than those identified in Paragraph 2B.
- E. <u>Request for Reimbursement</u>. City shall furnish to County the TRCC Reimbursement Form, which can be found at https://slco.org/community-services/trcc-support-program/, together with such invoices or other supporting documentation as County may reasonably require.
- F. <u>Deadline to Request Reimbursement of TRCC Funds</u>. All requests for reimbursement under this Agreement shall be made on or before **March 31, 2025**.
- G. <u>Reporting Requirements</u>. The City shall submit to the County a completed copy of the TRCC Project Status Report, which can be found at https://slco.org/community-services/trcc-support-program/, no later than **December 31**, **2023**, **December 31**, **2024** and **March 31**, **2025**.
- H. <u>Recordkeeping</u>. The City agrees to maintain its books and records in such a way that any TRCC Funds received from the County will be shown separately on the City's books. The City shall maintain records adequate to identify the use of the TRCC Funds for the purposes specified in this Agreement. The City shall make its books and records available to the County at reasonable times.

I. Public Funds and Public Monies:

- (i) The City agrees that the TRCC Funds are "public funds" and "public monies," meaning monies, funds, and accounts, regardless of the source from which they are derived, that are owned, held, or administered by the State or any of its boards, commissions, institutions, departments, divisions, agencies, bureaus, laboratories, or similar instrumentalities, or any county, city, school district, political subdivision, or other public body. The terms also include monies, funds or accounts that have been transferred by any of the aforementioned public entities to a private contract provider for public programs or services. Said funds shall maintain the nature of "public funds" while in the City's possession.
- (ii) The City, as the recipient of "public funds" and "public monies" pursuant to this and other agreements related hereto, expressly agrees that it, its officers, and its employees are obligated to receive, keep safe, transfer, disburse and use these "public funds" and "public monies" as authorized by law and this Agreement for TRCC qualifying purposes in Salt Lake County. The City understands that it, its officers, and its employees may be criminally liable under Utah Code Ann. § 76-8-402 for misuse of public funds or monies. The City expressly agrees that the County may monitor the expenditure of TRCC Funds by the City.

- (iii) The City agrees not to make TRCC Funds or proceeds from such funds available to any public officer or employee or in violation of the Public Officers' and Employees' Ethics Act, Utah Code Ann. §§ 67-16-1, *et seq.* (1953, as amended).
- J. <u>Right to Verify and Audit</u>. The County reserves the right to verify application and evaluation information and to audit the use of TRCC Funds received by City under this Agreement, and the accounting of such use. If the County requests an audit, the City agrees to cooperate fully with the County and its representatives in the performance of the audit.
- K. <u>Noncompliance</u>. The City agrees that the County may withhold TRCC Funds or other funds or require repayment of TRCC Funds from the City for noncompliance with this Agreement, for failure to comply with directives regarding the use of public funds, or for misuse of public funds or monies.

L. Representations.

- (i) <u>No Officer or Employee Interest</u>. The City represents and agrees that no officer or employee of the County has or shall have any pecuniary interest, direct or indirect, in this Agreement or the proceeds resulting from the performance of this Agreement.
- (ii) Ethical Standards. The City represents that it has not: (a) provided an illegal gift in connection with this Agreement to any County officer or employee, or former County officer or employee, or to any relative or business entity of a County officer or employee, or relative or business entity of a former County officer or employee; (b) retained any person to solicit or secure this Agreement upon an agreement or understanding for a commission, percentage, brokerage or contingent fee, other than bona fide employees of bona fide commercial agencies established for the purpose of securing business; (c) breached any of the ethical standards in connection with this Agreement set forth in State statute or Salt Lake County Code of Ordinances § 2.07; or (d) knowingly influenced, and hereby promises that it will not knowingly influence, in connection with this Agreement, any County officer or employee or former County officer or employee to breach any of the ethical standards set forth in State statute or Salt Lake County ordinances.

3. GENERAL PROVISIONS:

- A. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement and the documents referenced herein, if any, constitute the entire Agreement between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof, and no statements, promises, or inducements made by either Party, or agents for either Party, that are not contained in this written Agreement shall be binding or valid; and this Agreement may not be enlarged, modified or altered, except in writing, signed by the Parties.
- B. <u>Term of Agreement.</u> This Agreement will become effective immediately upon the completion of the following: (i) the approval of the Agreement by the governing bodies of

the County and the City, including the adoption of any necessary resolutions or ordinances by the County and the City authorizing the execution of this Agreement by the appropriate person or persons for the County and the City, respectively, (ii) the execution of this Agreement by a duly authorized official of each of the Parties, (iii) the submission of this Agreement to an attorney for each Party that is authorized to represent said Party for review as to proper form and compliance with applicable law, pursuant to Section 11-13-202.5 of the Interlocal Cooperation Act, and the approval of each respective attorney, and (iv) the filling of a copy of this Agreement with the keeper of records of each Party (the "Effective Date"). This Agreement shall terminate upon the City's full expenditure of the TRCC Funds received under this Agreement and upon the City's completion of the associated reporting requirements described in Paragraph 2E above, unless terminated earlier as provided in Paragraphs 3H, 3I, and 3J below. However, the City's obligations in Paragraphs 2F, 2G, 2H and 2I above and Paragraph 3F below shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

- C. <u>Interlocal Cooperation Act</u>. In satisfaction of the requirements of the Interlocal Cooperation Act in connection with this Agreement, the Parties agree as follows:
 - (i) This Agreement shall be authorized as provided in Section 11-13-202.5 of the Interlocal Cooperation Act.
 - (ii) This Agreement shall be reviewed as to proper form and compliance with applicable law by a duly authorized attorney on behalf of each Party pursuant to and in accordance with Section 11-13-202.5 of the Interlocal Cooperation Act.
 - (iii) A duly executed original counterpart of this Agreement shall be filed immediately with the keeper of records of each Party pursuant to Section 11-13-209 of the Interlocal Cooperation Act.
 - (iv) The term of this Agreement shall not exceed fifty (50) years pursuant to Section 11-13-216 of the Interlocal Cooperation Act.
 - (v) Except as otherwise specifically provided herein, each Party shall be responsible for its own costs of any action done pursuant to this Agreement, and for any financing of such costs.
 - (vi) No separate legal entity is created by the terms of this Agreement and no facility or improvement will be jointly acquired, jointly owned, or jointly operated by the Parties under this Agreement.
 - (vii) Pursuant to Section 11-13-207 of the Interlocal Cooperation Act, the County Mayor and the City Mayor are hereby designated as the joint administrative board for all purposes of the Interlocal Cooperation Act.
- D. <u>No Obligations to Third Parties</u>. The Parties agree that the City's obligations under this Agreement are solely to the County and that the County's obligations under this Agreement are solely to the City. The Parties do not intend to confer any rights to third parties

unless otherwise expressly provided for under this Agreement.

E. <u>Agency</u>. No officer, employee, or agent of the City or the County is intended to be an officer, employee, or agent of the other Party. None of the benefits provided by each Party to its employees including, but not limited to, workers' compensation insurance, health insurance and unemployment insurance, are available to the officers, employees, or agents of the other Party. The City and the County will each be solely and entirely responsible for its acts and for the acts of its officers, employees, or agents during the performance of this Agreement.

F. Governmental Immunity, Liability, and Indemnification.

- (i) <u>Governmental Immunity</u>. Both Parties are governmental entities under the Governmental Immunity Act of Utah, Utah Code Ann. §§ 63G-7-101 *et seq*. (the "<u>Immunity Act</u>"). Neither Party waives any defenses or limits of liability available under the Immunity Act and other applicable law. Both Parties maintain all privileges, immunities, and other rights granted by the Immunity Act and all other applicable law.
- <u>Liability and Indemnification</u>. The County and the City agree to be liable (ii) for their own negligent acts or omissions, or those of their authorized employees, officers, and agents while engaged in the performance of the obligations under this Agreement, and neither the County nor the City will have any liability whatsoever for any negligent act or omission of the other Party, its employees, officers, or agents. However, the City shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the County, its officers, employees and agents (the "Indemnified Parties") from and against any and all actual or threatened claims, losses, damages, injuries, debts, and liabilities of, to, or by third parties, including demands for repayment or penalties, however allegedly caused, resulting directly or indirectly from, or arising out of (i) the City's breach of this Agreement; (ii) any acts or omissions of or by the City, its agents, representatives, officers, employees, or subcontractors in connection with the performance of this Agreement; or (iii) the City's use of the TRCC Funds. The City agrees that its duty to defend and indemnify the Indemnified Parties under this Agreement includes all attorney's fees, litigation and court costs, expert witness fees, and any sums expended by or assessed against the County for the defense of any claim or to satisfy any settlement, arbitration award, debt, penalty, or verdict paid or incurred on behalf of the County. The Parties agree that the requirements of this Paragraph will survive the expiration or sooner termination of this Agreement.
- G. <u>Required Insurance Policies</u>. Both Parties to this Agreement shall maintain insurance or self-insurance coverage sufficient to meet their obligations hereunder and consistent with applicable law.

H. Non-Funding Clause.

(i) The County has requested or intends to request an appropriation of TRCC Funds to be paid to the City for the purposes set forth in this Agreement. If TRCC Funds are not appropriated and made available beyond December 31 of the county fiscal year in which this Agreement becomes effective, the County's obligation to contribute TRCC

Funds to the City under this Agreement beyond that date will be null and void. This Agreement places no obligation on the County to contribute TRCC Funds to the City in succeeding fiscal years. The County's obligation to contribute TRCC Funds to the City under this Agreement will terminate and become null and void on the last day of the county fiscal year for which funds were budgeted and appropriated, except as to those portions of payments agreed upon for which funds are budgeted and appropriated. The Parties agree that such termination of the County's obligation under this Paragraph will not be construed as a breach of this Agreement or as an event of default under this Agreement, and that such termination of the County's obligation under this Paragraph will be without penalty and that no right of action for damages or other relief will accrue to the benefit of the City, its successors, or its assigns as to this Agreement, or any portion thereof, which may terminate and become null and void.

(ii) If TRCC Funds are not appropriated and made available to fund performance by the County under this Agreement, the County shall promptly notify the City of such non-funding and the termination of this Agreement. However, in no event, shall the County notify the City of such non-funding later than thirty (30) days following the expiration of the county fiscal year for which TRCC Funds were last appropriated for contribution to the City under this Agreement.

I. Termination.

- (i) Event of Default. The occurrence of any one or more of the following constitutes an "Event of Default" as such term is used herein:
 - (a) Failure of the City to comply with any of the terms, conditions, covenants, or provisions of this Agreement that is not fully cured by the City on or before the expiration of a thirty (30)-day period commencing upon the County's written notice to the City of the occurrence thereof.
 - (b) The City no longer qualifies for receipt of TRCC Funds under the laws of the State of Utah or under Salt Lake County ordinances or policy.
 - (c) The County's determination to contribute TRCC Funds to the City under this Agreement was based upon the submission of erroneous information, or the County reasonably determines that any representations made by the City under this Agreement are untrue.
- (ii) <u>County's Remedies in the Event of Default</u>. Upon the occurrence of any Event of Default, the County may, in its sole discretion, and in addition to all remedies conferred upon the County by law or equity and other provisions of this Agreement, pursue any one or more of the following remedies concurrently or successively, it being the intent hereof that none of such remedies shall be to the exclusion of any other:
 - (a) Withhold further contributions of TRCC Funds to the City; and/or

- (b) Seek repayment of any TRCC Funds previously paid to the City under this Agreement; and/or
 - (c) Terminate this Agreement.
- (iii) <u>Termination Prior to Disbursement</u>. The County may terminate this Agreement for convenience by providing thirty (30)-day's written notice specifying the nature, extent and effective date of the termination. However, the County may not terminate this agreement once the TRCC Funds have been provided to the City and have been expended by the City for the purposes set forth by this Agreement.
- J. <u>Force Majeure</u>. Neither Party will be considered in breach of this Agreement to the extent that performance of their respective obligations is prevented by an Event of Force Majeure that arises after this Agreement becomes effective. "<u>Event of Force Majeure</u>" means an event beyond the control of the County or the City that prevents a Party from complying with any of its obligations under this Agreement, including but not limited to: (i) an act of God (such as, but not limited to, fires, explosions, earthquakes, drought, tidal waves and floods); (ii) war, acts or threats of terrorism, invasion, or embargo; or (iii) riots or strikes. If an Event of Force Majeure persists for a period in excess of sixty (60) days, the County may terminate this Agreement without liability or penalty, effective upon written notice to the City.
- K. <u>No Waiver</u>. The failure of either Party at any time to require performance of any provision or to resort to any remedy provided under this Agreement will in no way affect the right of that Party to require performance or to resort to a remedy at any time thereafter. Additionally, the waiver of any breach of this Agreement by either Party will not constitute a waiver as to any future breach.
- L. <u>Compliance with Laws</u>. The Parties shall comply with all applicable statutes, laws, rules, regulations, licenses, certificates and authorizations of any governmental body or authority in the performance of its obligations under this Agreement, including, but not limited to, those laws requiring access to persons with disabilities as well as the laws governing non-discrimination against all protected groups and persons in admissions and hiring.
- M. Records. Financial records, supporting documents, statistical records and all other records pertinent to this Agreement and the TRCC Funds provided under this Agreement must be kept readily available for review by the County from time to time upon the County's request. Such records must be retained and maintained for a minimum of three (3) years after the end of a budget period. If questions still remain, such as those raised as a result of an audit, records must be retained until completion or resolution of any audit in process or pending resolution. Such records may be subject to the Utah Government Records Access and Management Act, Utah Code Ann. §§ 63G-2-101 et seq.
- N. <u>Assignment and Transfer of Funds</u>. The City shall not assign or transfer its obligations under this Agreement nor its rights to the contribution under this Agreement without prior written consent from the County. The City shall use the TRCC Funds provided pursuant to this Agreement exclusively and solely for the purposes set forth in the Agreement.

- O. <u>Amendments</u>. This Agreement may be amended, enlarged, modified or altered only by an instrument in writing signed by both Parties. If the amendment or modification is material, the instrument shall be: (i) approved by the governing bodies of the County and the City, including the adoption of any necessary resolutions or ordinances by the County and the City authorizing the execution of any amendment, change, modification or alteration of this Agreement by the appropriate person or persons for the County and the City, respectively, (ii) executed by a duly authorized official of each of the Parties, (iii) submitted to an attorney for each Party that is authorized to represent said Party for review as to proper form and compliance with applicable law, pursuant to Section 11-13-202.5 of the Interlocal Cooperation Act, and executed by each respective attorney, and (iv) filed with the keeper of the records of each Party.
- P. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this Agreement is found to be illegal or unenforceable in a judicial proceeding, such provision will be deemed inoperative and severable, and, provided that the fundamental terms and conditions of this Agreement remain legal and enforceable, the remainder of this Agreement will remain operative and binding on the Parties.
- Q. <u>Governing Law and Venue</u>. The laws of the State of Utah govern all matters arising out of this Agreement. Venue for any and all legal actions arising hereunder will lie in the District Court in and for the County of Salt Lake, State of Utah.
- R. <u>Warrant of Signing Authority</u>. The person or persons signing this Agreement on behalf of the City warrants his or her authority to do so and to bind the City. The County may require the City to return all TRCC Funds paid to the City based upon a breach of warranty of authority.
- S. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts and all so executed will constitute one agreement binding on all the Parties, it being understood that all Parties need not sign the same counterpart. Further, executed copies of this Agreement delivered by facsimile or email will be deemed an original signed copy of this Agreement.

Each Party hereby signs this Interlocal Cooperation Agreement on the date written by each Party on the signature pages attached hereto.

The City of South Jordan is one of the fastest-growing cities in Salt Lake County. As of January 2021, the population was estimated at 79,200 with a buildout population estimated at 120,000 residents.

According to the most current South Jordan Parks Master Plan*, the City of South Jordan has a total of 291.2 acres of public parks, 44.5 miles of recreation and regional trails, 25 playgrounds, 3 fishing ponds, and many facilities including the Jordan Community Center and Senior Center, Mulligans Golf and Games, and Gale Center of History and Culture.

Jordan River Open Space is located along the shores of the Jordan River and includes the site of the future Mystic Springs Nature Park which will be located along the Jordan River Parkway Trail on the west side of the Jordan River at approximately 947 W and 10000 South. It is primarily a passive open space associated with the river environment. The areas to the east of the Jordan River are classified as a restricted "no-human" location to protect the marshlands and wildlife in the area. The Mystic Springs Nature Park will consist of a walkable educational nature preserve and a trail system that is connected to the existing Jordan River Parkway Trail. The walkway will offer minimum impact on the environment and serve as an educational setting for the public in conservation and wildlife preservation.

Construction estimate is \$547,980 plus 10% Administrative Overhead of \$54,798. The Mystic Springs Nature Park is included In the City's 5-year CIP plan and the City will be budgeting \$301,389 in Fiscal Year 2023-24 and seeks a match of \$301,389 by TRCC Support Program, for a total project cost of \$602,778.

South Jordan City Residents Surveys

As per the 2016 Master Plan Survey* conducted by Y2 Analytics, 66% of residents said they use South Jordan parks, trails, and open spaces to meet their needs, and these city resources have the highest average importance ranking. In addition, 58% of surveyed residents state the Jordan River Parkway Trail is the trail they use most often, most commonly using it for walking/jogging. Residents also feel that walking and biking trails are a high funding priority.

The 2022 South Jordan Community Survey conducted by Y2 Analytics found that 86% of residents rated South Jordan's performance "Good" or "Excellent" in creating accessible parks, trails, recreation, and open spaces.

The City aspires to maintain an 82% or higher rating for Parks & Open Space. The 2022 Annual Community Survey conducted indicated an 81% rating.

Staff Recommendation (Motion Ready): Based on the findings in this report, I move that the Planning Commission forward a recommendation to the City Council to **approve** File # PLZBA202300163; Rezoning from A-1 to OS-P, via Ordinance No. 2023-04-Z.

ACREAGE: Approximately 8.26 (acres)

CURRENT ZONE: A-1

FUTURE LAND USE PLAN: OS (Open Space)

NEIGHBORING ZONES: North – OS-P, R-M-5, & R-M-8

South – R-M-6 & Bangerter Hwy

East – Bangerter Hwy & R-M-8

REZONE REVIEW STANDARDS:

The rezoning of property may not be considered if the proposed zoning does not conform to the general plan. The following guidelines shall be considered in the rezoning of parcels:

- A. The parcel to be rezoned meets the minimum area requirements of the proposed zone or if the parcel, when rezoned, will contribute to a zone area which meets the minimum area requirements of the zone.
- B. The parcel to be rezoned can accommodate the requirements of the proposed zone.
- C. The rezoning will not impair the development potential of the parcel or neighboring properties.

The Planning Commission shall receive public comment at the public hearing regarding the proposed rezoning and make a recommendation on the rezoning to the City Council.

BACKGROUND:

The City would like to develop some vacant property, which has a land use designation of Open Space (OS) in the General Plan, into what will be called the "Rushton Bike Park." The purpose of the application is to make the subject properties consistent with the zoning of other adjacent parcels owned by the City, and City Code requirements. This application involves four City parcels: 27-17-377-006, 27-17-377-010, 27-17-377-009 and 27-17-377-007.

The largest parcel involved is currently serving as a storm water retention basin for the neighboring R-M zoned subdivisions. The retention basin area of the parcel will not be developed as part of the project. The proposed zoning is consistent with another City owned parcel in the same vacant field, which is already zoned OS-P. A concept plan for the project is included (see supporting materials).

The other parcels are between Bangerter Hwy. and the Welby-Jacob Canal. These parcels are adjacent to each other and currently zoned A-1. City Code §17.18.060 defines the proposed use as "Outdoor Recreation," which is not permitted in the A-1 Zone. The Park Open Space (OS-P) Subdistrict allows the Outdoor Recreation use as a conditional use.

The Engineering and Public Works Parks Division hosted a Public Open House Event on September 21, 2023 at the High Pointe Park Pavilion. This event was noticed to the same notice recipients as the public hearing (see attached Notice of Public Open House). Written public comment has been received from a nearby resident (see attached Public Comment Received).

There was an issue with Public Noticing that resulted in this item being rescheduled for the Planning Commission. Public Notices for this meeting are included (see supporting materials). The City Council will be presented this application on Tuesday October 17, 2023. If approved, the Site Plan and CUP will be on the October 24, 2023 Commission meeting.

STAFF FINDINGS, CONCLUSION & RECOMMENDATION:

Findings:

- The application meets the rezone standards of review.
- Rezoning the property will place the Rushton Bike Park in compliance with City Code requirements.
- The rezone from A-1 to OS-P is consistent with the General Plan.
- The Welby and High Pointe trail system provides pedestrian and bicyclist access to the project area. Rushton Park will serve as an amenity to the trail system.
- Oceano Dune Court provides additional access and vehicle parking. The cul-de-sac is built larger than City Standard, and can accommodate up to 10 vehicles. Engineering staff feels that this will allow sufficient parking on the cul-de-sac for the short duration of time visitors are using the park.

- Residents and visitors are able to walk from the cul-de-sac to the project area using a paved walkway that bridges the canal.
- The High Pointe Park Pavilion is not able to be privately reserved.
- Engineering is not anticipating Rushton Park attracting large crowds and use by surrounding mountain biking teams and clubs. Rushton Park is not designed or situated to meet the needs and demands of those groups.
- The project is designed to be sensitive to the neighboring subdivisions.
- The construction timeframe is anticipated to be between April and June 2024.

Conclusion:

The rezone is with the General Plan, and City Code §17.20.030.

Recommendation:

Based on the findings and conclusions listed in this report, Staff recommends that the Planning Commission take comments at the public hearing and **approve** the application, unless, during the hearing, facts are presented that contradict these findings or new facts are presented, either of which would warrant further investigation by Staff.

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
