Anoka County Flock Camera Pilot Program	
<b>Executive Summary</b>	
Chief Antoine will provide the City Council with an update on a pilot program that the Joint Law Enforcement Council is exploring to expand the Flock camera system county-wide.	
<b>Background</b>	
Flock plans to pilot a program that increases the number of cameras in Anoka County from 89 to 152 (including enhanced camera coverage in Spring Lake Park). The agreement spans 10 years, with the first year free. In the second year, costs will be covered by the Anoka County Sheriff's Office. From the third year onward, expenses will be distributed according to the JLEC super-formula.	
<b>Board/Commission Review</b>

<b>Financial Impact</b>	
Possible \$6,000 reduction in years 1-2, with cost increasing to \$16,500 in following years. JLEC is studying whether some of the cost of this program can be included in the Anoka County Public Safety Levy.
