Richmond explained that they are adding the parking lot on the side and it will be a principal use, so it will not be between the building and the street, which is the language being cleaned up in the code revisions. She stated that the dental clinic is currently under-parked and is not compliant with the number of parking spaces that they have.

C. 2024 to 2028 Financial Plan

Finance Director Mulvihill reviewed the Staff report and the 2024 to 2028 finance plan for St. Francis. She highlighted the future department requests, property tax levy, utility rates, capital improvement plan and debt services, and the overall financial plan.

Udvig shared that this plan was covered very well in several work sessions. She thanked Mulvihill for walking them through this plan.

Bauer noted that it is a flexible plan and that the residents can see the numbers from the general levy is a large spending cap. He encouraged residents who would

like to come speak at a Council meeting about where these dollars are being spent to come and talk about their requests.

Robinson agreed with Bauer. He emphasized that this is a flexible plan. He noted that this was a 10 year plan that they condensed to a 5 year plan. He noted this these are all projected numbers and they are anticipating lots of growth in the City over the next few years. He stated that this plan can change over the years and can be adjusted as needed. He shared his appreciation for Mulvihill and her work on this plan. He added that this was thoroughly discussed in work sessions.

Mayor Pro Tem Muehlbauer noted that this is a fluid document and will be adjusted as needed. He stated that they will be looking at the needs and growth of the City to adjust this plan. He added that many hours have been spent on this plan. He thanked Staff for all of their work.

11. REPORTS

A. Fire Department Monthly Report - April 2023

Fire Chief Schmidt reviewed the Fire Department report for April 2023. He highlighted the average response time of 7 minutes and 56 seconds, a total of 70 calls, and 6.2 firefighters per call for service. He noted that the fire and EMS run distribution was similar to the past with 53 EMS runs and 17 fire runs. He noted the variance uses were steady for the month and mentioned that they are no longer tracking COVID-19 calls. He shared that there were 6 ambulance response times over 20 minutes for the month. He added that there were 2 fire inspections and no reinspections for the month of April.

Bauer said it was a good report and asked Schmidt to explain how EMS runs are dispatched out. Schmidt explained that in the past, the dispatch delineates calls as either high priority, things like difficulty breathing, seizures, and other life threatening concerns, or not-high priority, which would be all other concerns. He stated that there were changes in this in 2018. He explained that they just absorbed all of the EMS calls as the Fire Department is the highest trained and cheapest labor unit in the City for EMS response. He noted that this also frees up the Police Department. Bauer asked if an Assistant Chief is needed and how this helps with reducing call volumes. Schmidt explained that not just one value is assigned to each position and a new Assistant Fire Chief would not just help with call volumes as the Department also does code enforcement, training, planning review and

many other things that go into the job.

Robinson asked how dispatch knows when the ambulance response time is greater than 12 minutes. Schmidt explained that when a call gets sent to the Anoka County dispatch and it is a medical call, they transfer the call to Allina dispatch which has a system where they can tell what kind of response time there will be from the starting point of the ambulance. Robinson asked how many other departments have the skillset that the firefighters have been trained to have. Schmidt stated that they are likely the highest trained EMS related Fire Department in the County with the exception of Coon Rapids. Robinson shared that he sits on the board for the discussions with Bethel. He stated that there is a need for an Assistant Chief. He added that this is what the citizens pay for, their needs, which includes fire. He asked how things are going with Bethel with 6 months left in the project. Schmidt stated that as part of Bethel's capital planning they have set aside funds to continue their contract. He stated that he does not know the duration of the next contract. He explained that there will likely be adjustments to the contract to compensate for Bethel's growth. Robinson asked if there is someone who would be able to fill the Assistant Chief who will be leaving at the end of the year. Schmidt stated that there are many internal candidates for this role.

Udvig stated it was a great report and thanked Schmidt and his Staff for the great job that they do.

Mayor Pro Tem Muehlbauer stated that he liked the report. He added that he would like to see a part-time Chief.

12. COUNCIL MEMBER REPORTS

Robinson congratulated the Chamber of Commerce for Pioneer Days. He thanked all of the volunteers and Staff for their help. He thanked the citizens for their support of the event.

Udvig shared that she attended the St. Francis Elementary Family Fun Night and noted that there was a great presence with the Police and Fire Departments. She added she also attended the St. Francis Ambassador Golf Tournament. She stated that she was asked to be a part of the mock interviews to get the ambassadors ready for their interviews with the judges. She noted that she was also at Pioneer Days and wanted to congratulate Miss St. Francis and Little Miss St. Francis.

Bauer stated that the Pioneer Days parade was great. He said there was a great turn out for participants. He noted that the park was very nice as well. He shared that he is hopeful that this event will continue to grow. He encouraged everyone to come out and participate in the future.

Mayor Pro Tem Muehlbauer shared that he was able to participate in Pioneer Day and stated that it was a great turnout. He thanked Staff for all that they did for the event. He asked Liquor Store Manager Schmidt for an update on the Liquor Store.

Schmidt explained that they were to meet with the MMBA on June 1 but there were scheduling conflicts and this meeting has been moved to June 7 and he will have more information after that meeting. Mayor Pro Tem Muehlbauer stated that the social media posts for the store have been great.

Mayor Pro Tem Muehlbauer shared a message from Mayor Feldman, who wanted to thank Staff and show his appreciation for the great work with Pioneer Days. He shared that Mayor Feldman also wanted to note that they are still waiting on bids from the building and if the costs are too high they will not be moving forward.

The St. Francis Fire Dept. is temporarily being moved to the 4020 building at the Police/Public Works location until the new City Hall/Fire Station is finished. The 4020 building is in need of some upgrades in order to properly fit he needs of the fire department as the building has not had any updates since it was built in the early 90's. Public Works has prepped the building for Stahl to provide their services to update the office and restroom space to accommodate the Fire Department.

All carpet shall be rolled goods or carpet tiles. No 'disco' patterns:-). All paints shall be neutral colors that will go with the carpet selections. The carpets are NOT required to be the same at all rooms. Stahl will select carpet & paint for Owner's review before proceeding.

Stretch goal (ALTERNATE) would be for new base at toilet room while everything is off the floor and to seal the floor at the same time before toilet and vanity.

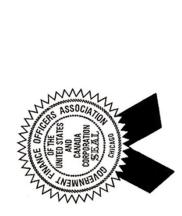

SUBJECT: Interim Ordinance for Cannabis Products

DATE: June 20, 2023

OVERVIEW:

The 2023 Legislature recently approved a new law to expand the legalization of types of THC and cannabis products and also the types of THC and cannabis businesses permitted.

The updated laws have further complicated the process by creating 15 types of licensing, creating minimum distances from certain businesses, taking over the regulation of low dose CBD, identifies limits on cities licensing and land use.

Updated laws provided cities the ability to place a moratorium on sales within the City with mention in the law they are going to assist cities in developing ordinances. Staff will work with legal and any state assistance to creating 15 license and fee structures as outlined with State Statute.

ACTION TO BE CONSIDERED:

- 1. Complete a Public Hearing
- 2. Council is requested to discuss and approve the Interim Ordinance

ORDINANCE NO. 320

CITY OF ST. FRANCIS COUNTY OF ANOKA, STATE OF MINNESOTA

AN EMERGENCY INTERIM ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE SALE, TESTING, MANUFACTURING, CULTIVATING, GROWING, TRANSPORTING, DELIVERY, AND DISTRIBUTION OF CANNABIS PRODUCTS IN THE CITY OF ST. FRANCIS.

The City Council of the City of St. Francis does ordain:

SECTION 1. BACKGROUND.

- A. By enacting 2022 Session Law Chapter 98, Article 13, the Minnesota Legislature amended Minn. Stat. §151.72 and permitted the sale of edible and nonedible cannabinoid products that contain no more than 0.3% of Tetrahydrocannabinol, commonly known as THC ("THC Products").
- B. The 2023 Legislature recently approved a new law to expand both the legalization of types of THC and cannabis products and also the types of THC and cannabis businesses permitted.
- C. This new law establishes a regulatory framework for adult-use cannabis, as well as the lower potency hemp edibles; moves the medical cannabis program under a newly created state agency called the Office of Cannabis Management; establish taxes on regulated products; create grants to assist individuals entering into the legal cannabis market; amend criminal penalties; provide for expungement and resentencing of certain convictions; provide for temporary regulation of hemp-derived edible cannabinoid products; reschedule marijuana; and appropriates money.
- D. The State licensing agency will become effective July 1, 2023, and is directed in the new law to establish a model ordinance for cities, which the City of St. Francis would benefit from reviewing and analyzing before making any decisions related to cannabis businesses and products in the City.
- E. The law specifies what distance restrictions cities can put in place under their zoning power. The City would benefit from having time to study and analyze acceptable time, place and manner restrictions that would be feasible for the City of St. Francis, which are specifically mentioned as a basis of regulation in the new law.
- F. Additionally, St. Francis City Council passed Ordinance No. 298 on August 1, 2022, which made it illegal for any individual, establishment, organization, or business to sell, test, manufacture, or distribute THC Products for twelve (12) months. The City would benefit from taking time to analyze and study the impact of the new law on the City's prior ordinance and any necessary modifications to the prior ordinance, if applicable.

- G. Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 462.355, subd. 4, the City is authorized to enact by ordinance a moratorium to regulate, restrict or prohibit land uses within its jurisdiction to protect the public health, safety, and welfare. Specifically, the City is authorized to enact a moratorium ordinance to allow it to undertake a study to determine whether to adopt any regulations or restrictions, including siting and location of uses, related to the sales, testing, manufacturing, cultivating, growing, transporting, delivery and distribution of Cannabis Products.
- H. Pursuant to its general police powers, both under its Charter and also set forth in Minn. Stat. § 412.221, subd. 32, the City may enact and enforce regulations or restrictions on Cannabis Products within the City to protect the public safety, health, and welfare, including restrictions and a moratorium on the sales, testing, manufacturing, cultivating, growing, transporting, delivery and distribution, during the pendency of a study to determine the need for police power regulations, including but not necessarily limited to any additional licensing and permitting that may be allowed, if any, by the State.
- I. Pursuant to the language of the new law, cities, as soon as the law becomes effective, have authority to adopt an interim ordinance to prohibit a cannabis business from opening until January 1, 2025, to conduct studies or consider adopting or amending allowed restrictions on the operation of a cannabis business. Because the effective date of the law is not until July 1, 2023, the City cannot take advantage of this authorization until on or after that date. Accordingly, any action by the City Council on an interim ordinance before that date should be pursuant to its statutory and Charter authority which allow moratoriums for up to one year. If the City needs more time to complete its study and analysis, the City Council can take additional action to extend the interim ordinance to January 1, 2025 pursuant to the new law.

SECTION 2. FINDINGS.

- A. The City Council finds there is a need to study (i) cannabis products, including products: using any part of the genus Cannabis plant; containing cannabis concentrate; infused with cannabinoids (including but not limited to tetrahydrocannabinol); extracted or derived from cannabis plants or cannabis flower; synthetically derived cannabinoids; and any lower potency hemp edibles that contain more than 0.3% of Tetrahydrocannabinol, (ii) cannabis businesses related thereto, and (iii) the impact of those businesses and products as related to allowed land uses and zoning, in order to assess the necessity for and efficacy of regulation and restrictions relating to the retail sales, wholesale sales, testing, growing, cultivating, manufacturing, transporting, delivery of or distribution of any of the products referenced herein, including through zoning ordinances or licensing, if allowed, in order to protect the public health, safety, and welfares of its residents.
- B. The study will allow the City Council to determine the appropriate changes, if any, that it should make to the St. Francis City Code, including any necessary zoning changes.

- C. The time will allow for the Office of Cannabis Management which will be licensing cannabis businesses to rule make and adopt its model ordinances which will further aid the Council in studying and considering restrictions on the operation of cannabis businesses and the use of the products listed in Section 1, paragraph A above.
- D. The City Council, therefore, finds that there is a need to adopt a city-wide moratorium on the retail sale, wholesale sale, testing, growing, cultivating, manufacturing, transporting, delivery of, and distribution of Cannabis Products, including products: using any part of the genus Cannabis plant; containing cannabis concentrate; infused with cannabinoids (including but not limited to tetrahydrocannabinol); extracted or derived from cannabis plants or cannabis flower; synthetically derived cannabinoids, or lower potency hemp edibles that contain more than 0.3% of Tetrahydrocannabinol, within the City while City staff studies the issue.

SECTION 3. MORATORIUM.

A. No individual, establishment, organization, or business may engage in the retail sale, wholesale sale, testing, growing, cultivating, manufacturing, transporting, delivery of or distribution of Cannabis Products, including products using any part of the plant of the genus Cannabis plant; containing cannabis concentrate; infused with cannabinoids (including but not limited to tetrahydrocannabinol); extracted or derived from cannabis plants or cannabis flower; synthetically derived cannabinoids, or lower potency hemp edibles that contain more than 0.3% of Tetrahydrocannabinol, for twelve (12) months from the effective date of this ordinance.

- B. Planning or zoning applications related to any of the products listed in Subsection A of Section 3 herein or applications from individuals, establishments, organizations, or businesses involved in the proposed sale, testing, growing, cultivating, manufacturing, transporting, delivery of or distribution of Cannabis Products within the City of St. Francis shall not be accepted or considered for twelve (12) months from the effective date of this ordinance.
- C. Should, at the end of the year, Council deems it necessary to continue to study the need for local regulation regarding the retail sale, wholesale sale, testing, growing, cultivating, manufacturing, transporting, delivery or distribution of Cannabis Products listed in Section 3(A), Council shall extend this Moratorium by adoption of an interim ordinance pursuant to the new 2023 law if so allowed under that law.
- D. This moratorium does not apply to the selling, testing, manufacturing, or distributing of Cannabis Products related to the Medical Cannabis Program as administered by the Minnesota Department of Health, provided that such activity is done in accordance with the regulations and laws of Minnesota regarding Medical Cannabis.
- E. This moratorium does not apply to the sale of THC Products allowed under the 2022 Legislation, which includes edible and nonedible cannabinoid products that contain no more than 0.3% of Tetrahydrocannabinol.

SECTION 4. STUDY. The City Council directs City staff to study the need for local regulation regarding the retail sale, wholesale sale, testing, growing, cultivating, manufacturing, transporting, delivery or distribution of Cannabis Products listed in Section 3(A) herein within the City of St. Francis. Staff must also study the need for creating or amending zoning ordinances, licensing ordinances, as allowed by the state, or any other ordinances, as allowed and not preempted by the state, to protect the citizens of St. Francis from any potential negative impacts. Upon completion of the study, the City Council will consider the advisability of adopting new ordinances or amending its current ordinances.

SECTION 5. ENFORCEMENT. The City may enforce this Ordinance by mandamus, injunctive relief, or other appropriate civil remedy in any court of competent jurisdiction. The City Council hereby authorizes the City Administrator, in consultation with the City Attorney, to initiate any legal action deemed necessary to secure compliance with this Ordinance. A violation of this Ordinance is also subject to the City's general penalty listed in St. Francis City Code § Sec. 1-1-3.

SECTION 6. TERM. Unless earlier rescinded by the City Council, the moratorium established under this Ordinance shall remain in effect until twelve (12) months from its effective date, at which point, it will either automatically expire or be extended pursuant to other statutory authority until January 1, 2025.

SECTION 7. **EFFECTIVE DATE**. This Ordinance shall become effective 24 hours after its adoption and posted in three (3) conspicuous places in the newspaper, or until the Ordinance has been published in the official newspaper.

OVERVIEW:

The City received a request to amend City Code Section 10-67-02 Parking Facility of the Zoning Code to allow privately-owned parking lots as an interim principal use in the B-1 Zoning District. 10-67-02. - Parking facility.

- A. The parking facility shall be publicly-owned and available for use by the general public. A privately-owned and operated parking facility may be allowed as a principal use in the B-1 district with approval of an interim use permit.
- B. The use shall be screened from all adjacent residentially-zoned property, including any properties directly across the street from the facility.

<u>Section 2.</u> This Ordinance shall take effect and be enforced from and after its passage and publication according to law.

SUBJECT: Code Revisions – B-1 Uses and Design Standards; Signage – 2nd Reading

DATE: June 20, 2023

OVERVIEW:

Following the site plan review of the new City Hall/Fire Station, Staff identified several areas of the Zoning Code which would benefit from clarification, particularly related to the incorporation of standards related to the Bridge Street Design Guidelines. The proposed Code amendments relate to the uses allowed in the B-1 district and their standards, the B-1 site dimensions and district design standards, and signage. The City Council reviewed and approved the 1st reading of the requested Code amendment ordinances on June 5, 2023.

ACTION TO BE CONSIDERED:

Because Council approved the 1st reading of Ordinances 317-319 at the June 5, 2023 meeting, Staff has prepared a 2nd reading of each ordinance and summary resolutions allowing for publication by summary for Council's review. The following timeline will apply:

<u>Section 3.</u> Section 10-44-05 B-1 Design Standards of the St. Francis Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

10-44-05 B-1 design standards.

- A. Purpose. The purpose of the B-1 Design Standards is to enhance the district's role as a key destination in St. Francis and surrounding communities. These standards represent the minimum requirements to enhance design of the district as explored within the Bridge Street Design Guidelines, adopted in 2019.
- B. Site Design Standards.
 - 1. Parking Lot Location. Parking lots shall be prohibited in the front yard. between Bridge Street and the front of any principal building.
 - 2. Driveway Access.
 - a. Properties that are both located on Bridge Street and west of the Rum River: Driveways/accesses shall be limited to a side street or alley; existing driveways/accesses on Bridge Street may continue to be used or be relocated on Bridge Street, per County approval, but no new curb cuts shall be added.
 - b. All other properties shall be required to meet driveway access standards in compliance with the rest of the City Code and any applicable County or State access standards.
 - 3. Trash and Loading Location. Trash receptacles and loading areas shall be limited to the rear of the building. These areas shall be fully screened from the right-of-way and adjacent properties, in compliance with Part 10-73-00
- C. Building Design Standards.
 - 1. Building Frontage. At least No less than 70 percent of the ground floor frontage on Bridge Street shall be used for publicly-accessible, non-residential, active use purposes including but not limited to storefronts, business lobbies, and meeting areas. a commercial purpose. This provision shall apply to the first 30 feet behind the building façade on Bridge Street.; beyond the first 30 feet behind the building facade, any permitted principal and accessory use is allowed on any floor.
 - 2. Entries.

- a. Properties on Bridge Street. The primary entrance shall orient towards Bridge Street; this entrance's placement may be at the corner of the building to also orient towards a side yard parking lot, if applicable.
- b. All other properties. The primary entrance shall orient towards the front yard/front lot line; this entrance's placement may be at the corner of the building to also orient towards a side yard parking lot, if applicable.
- 3. Rooftops. All rooftop mechanical equipment, including stair towers and elevators, shall be fully screened from view from the public right-of-way and adjacent properties.
- 4. Façade Articulation and Details. Buildings shall be designed so that building material, color, or massing changes at least every 60 linear feet for all street facing sides of the building. Massing changes may be accomplished through use of articulation details such as cornices, molding, columns, pilasters, or other ornamentation as well as vertical recess or projections of the wall face.
- 5. Windows/Transparency.
 - a. All street-facing building walls shall be at least 30% transparent.
 - b. Windows shall be installed at regular intervals along the length of the building.
- 6. Awnings/Canopies.
 - a. Awnings/Canopies shall have a minimum clearance of eight (8) feet above the ground level unless projecting over a vehicular right-of-way, in which case clearance shall be 14 feet.
 - b. In no event shall an awning/canopy extend more than three (3) feet into a public right-of-way if the building façade on which it is placed abuts a public right-of-way.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect and be enforced from and after its passage and publication according to law.

- A. Exclusive of required entrances, the residential use and any parking may occupy no portion of the front one-half of the first story floor area. For corner or through lots, the standard shall be applied to one (1) street frontage as determined by the Zoning Administrator in consultation with the applicant. As permitted in Table 10-44-1 Principal Use Table Business and Industrial Districts, non-residential uses allowed as part of this use in the front one half of the first story floor area-include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - 1. Retail sales;
 - 2. Personal services;
 - 3. Business and technical services:
 - 4. Food and beverage services.
- B. For any part of a rear building line located within 100 feet of a public parking lot, no residential use may occupy the rear one-half of the first story floor area.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ST. FRANCIS, ANOKA COUNTY, MINNESOTA, ORDAINS:

Changes in the following sections are denoted with an underline for new text or a strikethrough for deleted language.

<u>Section 1.</u> Section 10-91-05 District Regulations of the St. Francis Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

10-91-05. - District regulations.

The following signs are permitted in their respective Zoning District:

- A. A-1, A-2, and UR Districts:
 - 1. All signs not requiring permits as set forth in this Part Division.
 - 2. One (1) monument sign per subdivision or development, not to exceed 32 square feet in sign area and six (6) feet in height. The monument sign shall not be placed outside the applicable subdivision or development.
 - 3. For legally established non-residential uses, one (1) freestanding sign not to exceed 32 square feet and six (6) feet in height, shall be permitted. One (1) wall sign, not to exceed 20 square feet, shall also be permitted. The freestanding sign and wall signage shall be placed on the same premises as the business which it identifies.

B. RR District:

- 1. All signs not requiring permits as set forth in this Part Division.
- 2. One (1) monument sign per subdivision or development, not to exceed 32 square feet in sign area and six (6) feet in height. The monument sign shall not be placed outside the applicable subdivision or development.
- 3. For legally established non-residential uses, one (1) freestanding sign not to exceed 32 square feet and six (6) feet in height, shall be permitted. One (1) wall sign, not to exceed twenty (20) square feet, shall also be permitted. The freestanding sign and wall signage shall be placed on the same premises as the business in which it identifies.

C. R-1, R-2, and R-3 Districts:

1. All signs not requiring permits as set forth in this Part Division.

- 2. One (1) monument sign per subdivision or development, not to exceed 32 square feet in sign area and six (6) feet in height. The monument sign shall not be placed outside the applicable subdivision or development.
- 3. For legally established institutional uses, one (1) freestanding sign per street frontage shall be permitted. The freestanding sign shall not exceed 60 square feet in sign area and 10 feet in height. One wall sign, not to exceed 20 square feet in sign area, shall be permitted for each structure.

D. B-1 District:

- 1. All signs not requiring permits as set forth in this Part Division.
- 2. One (1) monument sign per development, not to exceed 32 square feet in sign area and six (6) feet in height shall be permitted. The monument sign shall not be placed outside the applicable subdivision or development.
- 3. One (1) freestanding sign per lot is permitted. The total area of the freestanding sign shall not exceed 64 square feet for lots with a lot width of 100 feet or more and 36 square feet for lots with a lot width of less than 100 feet. The maximum height of a freestanding sign shall be 20 feet.
- 4. For legally established institutional uses, one (1) freestanding sign per street frontage shall be permitted. The freestanding sign shall not exceed 60 square feet in sign area and 10 feet in height.
- 5. One (1) wall sign <u>per street frontage</u> shall be permitted according to the following: The total area of all wall signs on any wall of a building shall not exceed 15 percent of the wall area of that wall when said wall area does not exceed 500 square feet. When said surface area exceeds 500 square feet, provided that the maximum sign area for any wall sign shall be 300 square feet. Wall area shall be computed individually for each tenant in a multi-tenant building based on the exterior wall area of the space that tenant occupies.
- 6. One (1) sign displaying electronic, scrolling text-based messages provided that the electronic message board component of any sign is no greater than 40 square feet in area.
- 7. One (1) window sign per window provided each sign does not occupy more than 75 percent of the window area.

E. B-2 and BPK Districts:

- 1. All signs not requiring permits as set forth in this Part Division.
- 2. One (1) monument sign per development, not to exceed 32 square feet in sign area and six (6) feet in height, shall be permitted. The monument sign shall not be placed outside the applicable subdivision or development.
- 3. One (1) freestanding sign per street frontage is permitted. The total area of a freestanding sign for a building having one street frontage shall not exceed 80 square feet. Where a building site has two (2) or more street frontages, only one (1) freestanding sign of the above size shall be permitted. Each permitted freestanding sign in excess of one (1), shall have a sign area not to exceed 36 square feet. The maximum height of a freestanding sign shall be 25 feet.

- 4. For legally established institutional uses, one (1) freestanding sign per street frontage identifying said institution or institutional complex shall be permitted. The freestanding sign shall not exceed 60 square feet in sign area and 10 feet in height.
- 5. One (1) wall sign per street frontage shall be permitted according to the following: The total area of all wall signs on any wall of a building shall not exceed 15 percent of the wall area of that wall when said wall area does not exceed 500 square feet. When said surface area exceeds 500 square feet, then the total area of such wall sign shall not exceed 75 square feet plus five (5) percent of the wall area in excess of 500 square feet, provided that the maximum sign area for any wall sign shall be 300 square feet. Wall area shall be computed individually for each tenant in a multi-tenant building based on the exterior wall area of the space that tenant occupies.
- 6. One (1) sign displaying electronic, scrolling text-based messages provided that the electronic message board component of any sign is no greater than 40 square feet in area.
- 7. One (1) window sign per window provided each sign does not occupy more than 75 percent of the window area.

F. I-1 District:

- 1. All signs not requiring permits as set forth in this **Part Division**.
- 2. One (1) monument sign per development, not to exceed 32 square feet in sign area and six (6) feet in height. The monument sign shall not be placed outside the applicable subdivision or development.
- 3. One (1) freestanding sign per street frontage is permitted. The total area of a freestanding sign for a building having one (1) street frontage shall not exceed 80 square feet. Where a building site has two (2) or more street frontages, only one (1) freestanding sign of the above size shall be permitted. Each permitted freestanding sign in excess of one (1) shall have a sign area not to exceed 36 square feet. The maximum height of a freestanding sign shall be 25 feet.
- 4. One (1) wall sign <u>per street frontage</u> shall be permitted according to the following: The total area of all signs on any wall of a building shall not exceed 15 percent of the wall area of that wall when said wall area does not exceed 500 square feet. When said surface area exceeds 500 square feet, then the total area of such wall sign shall not exceed 75 square feet plus five (5) percent of the wall area in excess of 500 square feet, provided that the maximum sign area for any wall sign shall be 300 square feet. Wall area shall be computed individually for each tenant in a multi-tenant building based on the exterior wall area of the space that tenant occupies.

G. I-2 District:

- 1. All signs not requiring permits as set forth in this **Part Division**.
- 2. One (1) monument sign per development, not to exceed 32 square feet in sign area and six (6) feet in height, shall be permitted. The monument sign shall not be placed outside the applicable subdivision or development.
- 3. One (1) freestanding sign per street frontage is permitted. The total area of a freestanding sign for a building having one street frontage shall not exceed 80 square feet. Where a building site has two (2) or more street frontages, only one (1) freestanding sign of the above size shall be permitted. Each permitted freestanding sign in excess of one (1) shall have a sign area not to exceed 36 square feet. The maximum height of a freestanding sign shall be 25 feet.
- 4. One (1) wall sign per street frontage shall be permitted according to the following: The total area of all signs on any wall of a building shall not exceed 15 percent of the wall area of that wall when said wall area does not exceed 500 square feet. - 2. Signage requirements shall be established at the time the PUD is approved by the City.

<u>Section 2.</u> Section 10-91-08 Non-Conforming Signs of the St. Francis Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

Any sign legally existing on the effective date of this Part which does not conform to the requirements set forth in this Part shall become a non-conforming sign. No non-conforming sign shall be enlarged or altered in such a fashion that increases its non-conformity. Non-conforming signs shall be subject to the requirements of Part 10-145-00 of this Ordinance.

<u>Section 3.</u> This Ordinance shall take effect and be enforced from and after its passage and publication according to law.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY OF PROPOSED DEBT

Proposed Issue:

\$13,000,000 General Obligation Capital Improvement Bonds ("CIP"), Series 2023A ("Bonds").

Purposes:

The proposed, tax-exempt, fixed-rate issue will fund the construction of a joint City Hall and Fire Station facility ("Project") for the City of St. Francis, Minnesota ("City"). The City will pay debt service from ad valorem property tax revenues.

Authority:

The Bonds will be general obligations of the City for which its full faith, credit and taxing powers are pledged. The City will issue the Bonds pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 475.521, Capital Improvement Authority.

The bonding authority requires the City to draft a five-year CIP, hold a public hearing and submit to a 30-day reverse referendum period. Consistent with these requirements, the City drafted the five-year CIP and held a public hearing on October 3, 2022. The reverse referendum period ended on November 2, 2022, without a petition requesting a vote on the issuance of the proposed Bonds.

Under Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 475, the Bonds will count against the City's statutory Net Debt Limit, which may not exceed three percent of the City's current Estimated Market Value ("EMV") of the taxable property for the City, or \$947,640,700. Therefore, the total amount of debt outstanding may not exceed \$28,429,221. As of this Pre-Sale Report, the City has \$4,945,000 of applicable, outstanding debt (excluding the proposed Bonds). After the proposed issue, the City will still have \$10,484,221 of capacity remaining within the statutory limit.

In addition, Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 475 limits the total amount of principal and interest payable in a single year on all CIP Bonds to no more than 0.16% of the EMV of the City. Using the above EMV, the City may authorize a maximum annual debt service of \$1,516,225. As of this Pre-Sale Report, the City has \$465,181 of debt service subject to this limit. For the proposed Bonds, the estimated highest principal and interest payment will be approximately \$875,188. As such, the City will remain about \$175,586 below the statutory limit.

Term/Call Feature:

The Bonds are being issued for a term of 30 years. Principal on the Bonds will be due on February 1 in the years 2026 through 2053. Interest is payable every six months beginning August 1, 2024. The Bonds will be subject to prepayment at the discretion of the City on February 1, 2032 or any date thereafter.

Bank Qualification:

Because the City is issuing more than \$10,000,000 in tax-exempt obligations during the calendar year, the City will be not able to designate the Bonds as "bank qualified" obligations.

Credit Rating:

The City's most recent bond issues were rated by S&P Global Ratings. The current rating on those bonds is "AA." The City will request a new rating for the Bonds.

If the winning bidder on the Bonds elects to purchase bond insurance, the rating for the issue may be higher if the bond rating of the insurer is higher than that of the City.

Basis for Recommendation:

Based on your objectives, financial situation and need, risk tolerance, liquidity needs, experience with the issuance of Bonds and long-term financial capacity, as well as the tax status considerations related to the Bonds and the structure, timing and other similar matters related to the Bonds, we are recommending the issuance of Bonds as a suitable option.

Method of Sale/Placement:

We are recommending the Bonds be issued as municipal securities and offered through a competitive underwriting process. Through this process, the City will solicit competitive bids, which we will compile on your behalf, for the purchase of the Bonds from underwriters and banks.

An allowance for discount bidding will be incorporated in the terms of the issue. The discount is treated as an interest item and provides the underwriter with all or a portion of their compensation in the transaction. If the Bonds are purchased at a price greater than the minimum bid amount (maximum discount), the unused allowance may be used to generate additional proceeds for the facility project.

Premium Pricing:

In some cases, investors in municipal bonds prefer "premium" pricing structures. A premium is achieved when the coupon for any maturity (the interest rate paid by the issuer) exceeds the yield to the investor, resulting in a price paid that is greater than the face value of the bonds. The sum of the amounts paid in excess of face value is considered "reoffering premium." The underwriter of the bonds will retain a portion of this reoffering premium as their compensation (or "discount" as described above) but will pay the remainder of the premium to the City.

The amount of the premium varies, but it is not uncommon to see premiums for new issues in the range of 2.00% to 10.00% of the face amount of the issue. This means that an issuer with a \$13,000,000 offering may receive bids that result in proceeds of \$13,260,000 to \$14,300,000.

For the proposed Bonds, Ehlers will determine, in consultation with City staff, after receiving the bids whether to use any net premium to reduce the size of the issue or increase the net

proceeds for the project. The resulting adjustments may slightly change calculated the true interest cost of the issue, either up or down.

The amount of premium can be restricted in the bid specifications. Restrictions on premium may result in fewer bids but may also eliminate large adjustments on the day of sale and unintended impacts with respect to debt service payments. Ehlers will identify appropriate premium restrictions for the Bonds intended to achieve the City's objectives for this financing.

Review of Existing Debt:

We have reviewed all outstanding indebtedness for the City and find that there are no viable refunding opportunities available at this time. We will continue to monitor the market and the call dates for the City's outstanding debt and will alert you to any future refunding opportunities as they arise.

Continuing Disclosure:

Within the proposed terms of the Bonds, the City will be agreeing to provide certain updated Annual Financial Information and its Audited Financial Statement annually, as well as providing notices of the occurrence of certain reportable events to the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board (the "MSRB"), as required by rules of the Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC").

The City is already obligated to provide such reports for its existing bonds and has contracted with Ehlers to prepare and file the reports.

Arbitrage Monitoring:

The City must ensure compliance with certain sections of the Internal Revenue Code and Treasury Regulations ("Arbitrage Rules") throughout the life of the issue to maintain the tax-exempt status of the Bonds. These Arbitrage Rules apply to amounts held in construction, escrow, reserve, debt service account(s), etc., along with related investment income on each fund/account.

IRS audits will verify compliance with rebate, yield restriction and records retention requirements within the Arbitrage Rules. The City's specific arbitrage responsibilities will be detailed in the Tax Certificate (the "Tax Compliance Document") prepared by your Bond Attorney and provided at closing.

The Bonds may qualify for one or more exception(s) to the Arbitrage Rules by meeting 1) small issuer exception, 2) spend down requirements, 3) bona fide debt service fund limits, 4) reasonable reserve requirements, 5) expenditure within an available period limitations, 6) investments yield restrictions, 7) de minimis rules, or; 8) borrower limited requirements.

An Ehlers arbitrage expert will contact the City within 30 days after the sale date to review the City's specific responsibilities for the Bonds.

Investment of Bond Proceeds:

As a registered Investment Advisor, Ehlers can assist the City in developing a strategy to invest Bond proceeds until the funds are needed to pay Project costs. The City has contracted with Ehlers to invest the proposed Bond proceeds in concert with the arbitrage rules referenced above.

Risk Factors:

The City anticipates the City Council will consider awarding contracts for the Project and approving the sale of the proposed Bonds on August 7, 2023. If the bids and subsequent contracts exceed the expenditures authorized by the approved CIP bonding authorization of \$13,000,000, the City will need to contribute cash to the Project or explore alternative financing strategies. Alternatively, the City Council could reject the bids, cancel the sale of the proposed Bonds, and reconsider the Project at some point in the future.

We understand that the City has identified alternative funds available to fund a cash contribution, if necessary

Other Service Providers:

This debt issuance will require the engagement of other public finance service providers. This section identifies those other service providers, so Ehlers can coordinate their engagement on your behalf. Where you have previously used a particular firm to provide a service, we have assumed that you will continue that relationship. Fees charged by these service providers will be paid from proceeds of the obligation, unless you notify us that you wish to pay them from other sources. Our pre-sale bond sizing includes a good faith estimate of these fees, but the final fees may vary. If you have any questions pertaining to the identified service providers or their role, or if you would like to use a different service provider for any of the listed services, please contact us.

RESOLUTION 2023-34

AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT BONDS, SERIES 2023A, IN THE PROPOSED AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$13,000,000

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of St. Francis, Minnesota (the "City"), as follows:

Section 1. <u>Findings; Determinations</u>.

- 1.01. The City is authorized by Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 475, as amended, including Section 475.521 (the "Act"), to finance certain capital improvements under an approved capital improvement plan by the issuance of general obligation bonds of the City payable from ad valorem taxes. Capital improvements include acquisition or betterment of public lands, buildings or other improvements for the purpose of a city hall, library, public safety facility and public works facilities (excluding light rail transit or any activity related to it, or a park, road, bridge, administrative building other than a city hall, or land for any of those activities).
- 1.02. On October 3, 2022, the City Council of the City (the "City Council") held a duly noticed public hearing (the "Public Hearing") and adopted a resolution approving a five (5) year capital improvement plan for the years 2023 through 2027 (the "Capital Improvement Plan") and the issuance of general obligation capital improvement plan bonds in the maximum principal amount of \$13,000,000 thereunder. The Capital Improvement Plan authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds to provide for the undertaking of certain capital improvements described in the Capital Improvement Plan, including but not limited to the City Hall and Fire Station project (the "Capital Improvements").
- 1.03. No petition for a referendum on the issuance of bonds pursuant to the Capital Improvement Plan was received within thirty (30) days after the date of the Public Hearing in accordance with the Act.
- 1.04. The City proposes to issue its General Obligation Capital Improvement Bonds, Series 2022A (the "Bonds"), in the proposed aggregate principal amount of \$13,000,000, pursuant to the Act, to finance the construction of the Capital Improvements.
- 1.05. As required by the Act, the City has determined that (i) the expected useful life of the project to be financed with the proceeds of the Bonds will be at least five (5) years; and (ii) the amount of principal and interest due in any year on all outstanding bonds issued by the City under the Act, including the Bonds, will not exceed 0.16 percent of the estimated market value of property in the City for taxes payable in 2023.

- 1.06. The City is authorized by Section 475.60, subdivision 2(9) of the Act to negotiate the sale of the Bonds, it being determined that the City has retained an independent municipal advisor in connection with such sale. The actions of the City staff and the City's municipal advisor in negotiating the sale of the Bonds are ratified and confirmed in all aspects.
- Section 2. <u>Sale of Bonds; Terms</u>. The City Council finds it necessary and expedient to the sound financial management of the affairs of the City to issue the Bonds in the proposed aggregate principal amount of \$13,000,000, pursuant to the Act, to provide financing for the Capital Improvements. The Bonds will be issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with the Terms of Proposal to be prepared in connection with the offering and the sale of the Bonds.
- Section 3. <u>Authority of Municipal Advisor</u>. Ehlers and Associates, Inc. (the "Municipal Advisor") is authorized and directed to negotiate the Bonds. The City Council will meet at 6:00 p.m. on Monday, August 7, 2023 (or such other date as the City Council shall deem appropriate) to consider proposals for the purchase of the Bonds and to take any other appropriate action with respect to the Bonds.
- Section 4. <u>Authority of Bond Counsel</u>. The law firm of Kennedy & Graven, Chartered, as bond counsel for the City ("Bond Counsel"), is authorized to act as bond counsel and to assist in the preparation and review of necessary documents, certificates, and instruments relating to the Bonds. The officers, employees, and agents of the City are hereby authorized to assist Bond Counsel in the preparation of such documents, certificates, and instruments.
- Section 5. <u>Covenants</u>. In the resolution awarding the sale of the Bonds, the City Council will set forth the covenants and undertakings required by the Act.
- Section 6. <u>Official Statement</u>. In connection with the sale of the Bonds, the officers or employees of the City are authorized and directed to cooperate with the Municipal Advisor and participate in the preparation of an official statement for the Bonds and to deliver it on behalf of the City upon its completion.
- Section 7. <u>Reimbursement</u>. The City has or may have incurred certain expenditures with respect to the Capital Improvements that were financed temporarily from other sources but are expected to be reimbursed with proceeds of the Bonds. The City hereby declares its intent to reimburse certain costs of the Capital Improvements from proceeds of the Bonds (the "Declaration"). This Declaration is intended to constitute a declaration of official intent for purposes of the Section 1.150-2 of the Treasury Regulations promulgated under the Code.
