The regular City Council meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Mark Vogel.

Robinson asked for more information on the cannabis application approved on the Consent Agenda. City Clerk Wida explained that they had received a cannabis license from Duggout LLC, DBA St. Francis Dispensary. She noted that they have already been pre-approved for the State. She added that they do not yet have a parcel for their business; however, they are looking to purchase property that meets all of the zoning requirements.

5. MEETING OPEN TO THE PUBLIC

Jeremiah Willard, 22792 Poppy Street, came forward and shared his concerns from the recent discussion around water rates and the levy. He said that there is currently a petition signed by 176 residents in the City who are upset with what is happening in the City. He noted that there is a growing concern that residents will be leaving the City. He urged the Council to really think about what decisions they want to make. He said he is very passionate about St. Francis, and he hates to see people struggling enough as it is, then also see them struggle with the potential increases to water rates and taxes. He added that he has another growing concern with development in the City. He said he has heard that they are selling City land to developers for very small amounts. He noted that these land sales should be voted on by the Council, not the EDA. He urged the Council to think and pray about every decision they make and how it will impact the residents. He thanked the Council for serving.

Derek Lind with the Anoka County Elections Integrity Team (ACEIT) came forward and discussed City autonomy. He noted that the County is trying to take some of the power and decision-making away from cities in terms of elections. He stated that the County is trying to make a decision whether or not any cities can use paper poll pads. He noted that poll pads are not currently mandated by the State, but the County is still trying to control this for the cities.

Patty Cardy-Heffner, 3657 234th Avenue NW, HOA President for the Twin Homes of Rum River Terrace Townhomes Association, came forward and shared that their townhomes back up to where the CUP is proposed. She noted that this would drastically affect the owners in this area. She added that they are also worried about the integrity of the trees being removed without a buffer between the homes. She said they also have irrigation lines that run across Woodbine and their properties. She explained that in a previous project, the developer destroyed these irrigation lines, and it was a very long time before they were repaired. She said they support the growth of the City; however, they also look at the integrity of the

homes that will border this project. She added that they also want confirmation that the sidewalk on Woodbine will stay on the west side of Woodbine. City Planner Richmond shared that there will be a public hearing for this road this evening.

Cynthia and Brian Opp, owners of Opp Family Chiropractor, came forward and shared that they own the commercial building at the southwest corner of Highway 47 and Ambassador Boulevard. She said they have operated their chiropractic business for over 20 years and purchased this building in 2013 to expand their clinic and lease the remaining space. She shared that they are requesting to rezone this property to a B-2 general business zoning so they can be a commercial, multi-tenant site consistent with the original zoning. She explained that this was originally zoned B-3 when they bought the building, and they crafted their plans for the future around this zoning. She shared that during their plans, they were informed that the property had been rezoned to I-1 industrial in 2020. She noted that they could get a medical use only ordinance amendment; however, this would limit them from being able to lease their additional office space to any other retail tenants. She said they have already lost qualified tenants because of this uncertainty. She explained that by allowing a mixed use of tenants, this would strengthen the tax base and stabilize this corner of Highway 47 and Ambassador, while also keeping jobs and services in town. She shared that the Planning Commission already unanimously recommended approval of this rezoning and requested that the Council do the same later this evening.

Mike Powell, 23045 Ambassador Boulevard NW, came forward and asked what power the EDA has without Council approval. He asked if the TIF request for the new apartment building had been officially denied. City Administrator Thunstrom explained that the EDA is a legal authority, and they have certain statutes that identify what they can and cannot do. She noted that the EDA owns property, and they can sell this property or acquire other property. She stated that when it comes to what can be built on the property, this has to go through a site plan process, which is approved by the Council. She added that if a developer were also to request a City-based subsidy like TIF or a tax abatement, then this would also have to go through the Council. She noted that the apartment building land was acquired from the EDA, which did not need Council approval; however, they requested TIF, which did require Council approval. She explained that at the last EDA meeting, they voted to extend the purchase agreement for the apartment building property. She noted that if this purchase agreement falls through, then the EDA would put the property back on the market.

Mr. Powell asked how many times the EDA can extend the purchase agreement. Thunstrom said they can extend until they no longer wish to.

Mayor Vogel explained that once the TIF request was denied by the Council, the developer went back to the drawing board and is currently coming up with a plan that will not require TIF if they want to move forward.

Tina Carroll, 23045 Ambassador Boulevard, came forward and asked how the EDA got started to begin with and how these community members were given the authority to spend the City's money on properties. She said the EDA needs to be stopped. She asked why EDA members get a six-year term when Councilmembers only get four-year terms. She explained that they have been told that if they want the water prices to decrease, then they need more homes throughout the City; however, 26 new homes were built in 2024, and asked if the addition of these homes was taken into account when looking at the water prices. She asked why the pricing for the water filters went from \$60,000 to \$800,000. She asked why the City has to pay for the developer's engineering costs as part of the payment of claims approved earlier this evening. Thunstrom explained that they pay several engineers for different work and projects throughout the City. She noted that they do not pay any project development engineers, as these are all paid by the applicants themselves.

Sandra Schear, 22957 Rum River Boulevard NW, came forward and asked what the new parking lot that was just built is for. Mayor Vogel said this is for park and City Hall overflow parking.

Ms. Schear asked who approved this. Mayor Vogel said the Council did.

Ms. Schear noted that if they want to save money on taxes, then they need to look at cutting back on Staff, with too many employees making over \$100,000 who are not even St. Francis residents.

7. PUBLIC HEARINGS

A. Dalton River Villas

Resolution 2025-46 approving variances for the Dalton River Villas Development

Resolution 2025-47 approving a conditional use permit for the Dalton River Villas Development for the construction of a public road within the Rum River Management District

Richmond reviewed the Staff report in regard to the Dalton River Villas Development Richmond reviewed the Staff report in regard to the Dalton River Villas requests for variances, a CUP, and a preliminary plat. She reviewed the changes and provisions made after the comments received at the Planning Commission meeting about the removal of vegetation in the wetland area. She shared the Planning Commission's recommendation for approval of all requests.

Faanes asked if the applicant for the project is asking for TIF. Richmond said no.

Faanes asked if this land is currently privately owned. Richmond said yes.

Faanes asked if the cost of putting in the road would fall on the City. Richmond

said no and noted that the road would be funded and constructed by the applicant.

Faanes asked who would be responsible for clearing the trees on the property. Richmond said the applicant would be responsible.

Robinson asked who would follow up with the tree removal after it is done. Richmond shared that the City is responsible for enforcing its code, and they are working internally to establish a process for this.

Robinson asked if the City would need to periodically check up on these properties to ensure they are still in compliance. City Attorney Schaps explained that if they received reports that vegetation in the area had been removed, then an investigation would take place, and if they were found to have removed any vegetation unlawfully, then they would prosecute the property owner under City Code.

Thunstrom shared that they have been working with Richmond, the DNR, the Police Department, and Public Works, and there are a lot of boundaries that they have set when it comes to code enforcement. She explained that if someone removed a bunch of trees over a weekend, then they would open an investigation and follow a set process to ensure that what was removed was done unlawfully. She added that anyone who was cited for this would have to work with the DNR for restoration efforts.

Robinson asked if SAC and WAC would be charged for these units. Richmond said yes.

Muehlbauer asked about the setback amount that Ms. Cardy-Heffner mentioned earlier in the meeting. Richmond explained that this development is proposed to take place within the existing boundaries of this private property. She said they will be working within the public right-of-way and the private site. She noted that the lots on the southside would have a five-yard setback, which is the requirement for lots with garages in the City Code.

Robinson asked if tracer lines are put in when irrigation systems are installed. Public Works Director Carpenter said no.

Mayor Vogel shared that he is not excited about the idea of having trees removed in this area; however, it is private property, and this is a part of the development process.

Mayor Vogel opened the Public Hearing at 6:58 p.m.

Juli Murillo, 23539 Ambassador Boulevard, came forward and shared that she is supportive of the development; however, she wants to make sure that the riverbank is safe. She noted that some of the homes proposed do not meet the

requirements of the City. She asked why they need a variance for so many homes, and why they cannot just change their design to require fewer variances. She said she lives in this area and her property is very restricted when it comes to what she can and cannot build, while they are allowing so many variances on these new homes. She asked if they have worked with the applicant on a plan for smaller or fewer homes so that so many variances are not needed.

Mayor Vogel asked if this is a large number of requested variances compared to other similar projects. Richmond noted that every site and project is very different. She said the main variance request for this proposal is for the lot size. She added that they have worked with the developer to reduce the number of lots that are undersized. She said the setbacks are unique due to the river. She stated that she does not see these variance requests as excessive.

Robinson asked if they would be able to meet the requirements with eight lots instead of 16. Richmond explained that these lots are held to the urban standards in the Comprehensive Plan, so they are required to be able to put two to three units per net acre on this site. She said they would not be able to propose only a few lots on this property, as the City would not support it.

Ms. Cardy-Heffner asked about the plat map for lots #2, #3, and #19, as it shows that these have five-foot setbacks. Richmond shared that all of the garages of these properties are located on the north side of the lot, which would have the setback be five feet on the north side and 10 feet on the south side.

Ms. Cardy-Heffner noted that their main irrigation line is through Woodbine abutting lots #2, #3, and #19, as well as outlot B. She noted the irrigation lines are currently marked with blue flags.

Tim Pomerleau, the developer, came forward and shared that they will still be leaving six acres of trees in the northeast area. He added that they will not be touching anything in the bluff area. He said that he is not interested in making the homes any smaller.

Robinson noted that another neighborhood in the area mimics this development.

Mayor Vogel closed the Public Hearing at 7:17 p.m.

10. MEETING OPEN TO THE PUBLIC

Ms. Murillo asked how the City will be notified about what the Council decides for enforcement after business hours for unlawfully trimming or tree removal in the wetland area of the river. Thunstrom shared that when they have an established process, they have considered mailing a notice to all of the homeowners along the river to notify them. She said there will still be a lot of work and planning that needs to be done before they are able to get to this point.

Mr. Willard asked about the process of making the Mayor's term longer. He said that Mayor Vogel has done a great job, and he thinks it makes sense to have the Mayor's term be as long as the Council terms. Thunstrom shared that they have discussed this with the Charter Commission and the Council, and they have talked about placing a question on the ballot for the next Presidential election.

11. REPORTS

A. City Administrator's Report

Thunstrom shared that the search is continuing for a new Community Development Director. She said they are close to launching the new website. She added that Staff continues to work on the budget and the Fire District agreements. She noted that they are also taking care of some housekeeping items. She shared that the Highway 47 project continues to move forward, and they have seen some informal designs and will be discussing them with the State this week.

12. COUNCIL MEMBER REPORTS

The Council shared the meetings and events they attended in the past few weeks, as well as highlighting upcoming events.

Robinson thanked the residents who had taken the time to come and share their opinions with the Council. He encouraged this continued involvement from residents.

Faanes agreed and shared that she is so happy to see so many residents coming

and interacting with the Council.

Muehlbauer thanked Mr. Willard for what he is trying to do on Facebook. He encouraged him to meet with Mulvihill to help him better understand the financial aspects of the City. He encouraged any residents who are concerned with the City's spending to meet with Mulvihill to get more information directly from her. He noted that someone has put on Facebook that the City has a \$15,000,000 water budget; however, in conversations with Mulvihill, he was told that this is the overall budget for all funds in the City.

Udvig thanked Police Chief Schwieger and the Police Department for all of their work with what has been going on with the School District over the past few days.

Mayor Vogel thanked Schwieger for his work at the School District during his personal time. He also thanked Mr. Willard for organizing community meetings. He shared that he is always happy when residents call him; however, if they have questions that they are looking for answers to, Staff would be the best to contact as they are very knowledgeable and approachable. He added that he has had some preliminary discussions with potential buyers for the hardware store. He noted that he also met with ACEIT and Anoka County.

DATE: October 20, 2025

OVERVIEW:

Attached is Pay Estimate No. 3 for the 2025 Street Reconstruction Project. This project includes:

- The reconstruction of Woodbine Street from Bridge Street and Rum River Boulevard and 229th Lane from Ambassador Boulevard to Rum River Boulevard.
- The construction of a new 37 stall city owned parking lot off Woodbine Street.
- Street surface improvements on 233rd Avenue from Highway 47 to Ambassador Boulevard and 229th Avenue from Highway 47 to Ambassador Boulevard. These two streets also include construction of two new valves and valve repair of existing valves.
- Improvements to the liquor store parking lot.

This pay estimate includes payment for all work items completed to date, less a 5 percent retainage. This estimate recommends payment of \$190,753.69. The payment is summarized by funding source below.

ACTION TO BE CONSIDERED:

Consider approval of Pay Estimate No.3 for the 2025 Street Reconstruction Project.

BUDGET IMPLICATION:

Woodbine Street, 229th Lane, 229th Avenue, and 233rd Avenue are on the City's Municipal State Aid System therefore costs for these streets are eligible for reimbursement from the City's Municipal State Aid account. All costs associated with watermain and parking lot improvements will be financed with local city funds. The funds discussed above are available and appropriate for this project. The cost breakdown per funding source for this pay estimate is as follows:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 2-2-3 OF THE CITY CODE REGARDING COUNCIL PROCEDURE AT REGULAR MEETINGS

THE CITY OF ST. FRANCIS ORDAINS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Code Amended. That all previously adopted versions of this section are deleted and Section 2-2-3, Second Series shall hereby be added to read as established in Exhibit A.

<u>Section 2.</u> Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect thirty days after publication or as noted in the amendment.

2-2-3. Council procedure at regular meetings.

- A. This Council procedure at regular meetings will apply to the extent that the Council does not provide for a different procedure by resolution. The City Council is authorized to establish different procedure by resolution.
- B. The City Administrator or designee shall prepare the following items: (1) an agenda for the forthcoming meeting; (2) a compiled list of all claimants who have filed verified accounts claiming payment for goods or services rendered the City since the last regular meeting of the Council, such list to be called the "Claim Report" and bearing headings "Claimant" and "Amount"; (3) a copy of all minutes to be considered; and, (4) copies of such other proposals, communications, or other documents as the City Administrator or designee deems necessary or proper for advance consideration by the Council. The City Clerk shall forthwith cause to be mailed or delivered to each member of the Council copies of all said documents. Roberts' Rule of Order (Newly Revised) shall govern all Council meetings as to procedural matters not set forth in the Charter or City Code. At the appointed time for the regular meeting of the City Council, the meeting shall be called to order by the Mayor and in the Mayor's absence, by the Mayor Pro Tempore. If a quorum is present, the City Council shall then proceed with the business in the following order:
 - Call to Order/Pledge of Allegiance.
 - 2. Roll Call.
 - 3. Approval of Adopt Agenda.
 - 4. Consent Agenda, including but not limited to Approval of Minutes; Reports from Boards and Commissions; Payment of Claims; and Approval for payment of Clams and Appropriations. (All items falling under "Consent Agenda" are considered to be routine and non-controversial by the Council and will be approved by one motion. There will not be separate discussion of these items unless a member of the council or a citizen so requests, in which case the items will be removed from the Consent Agenda. Items removed from Consent Agenda approval will be taken up as the next order of business.
 - 5. Meeting Open to the Public Meeting Opened Persons Requesting to Appear Before Council. Persons who wish to appear before the Council must submit a written request to the City Clerk prior to the commencement of the meeting, which lists their name and address, and states their business (or identifies on behalf of whom they wish to speak). Persons requesting to appear before the Council will be recognized during the meeting in the order in which they submitted the written request. The presiding officer may advise any person appearing as to the amount of time allowed prior to his speaking, or later limit such time. Persons speaking shall give their name, address, and state their business for identify on behalf of whom they are speaking.
 - 6. <u>Special Business Petitions, Requests, Applications.</u>
 - 7. Public Hearing Ordinances and Resolutions.
 - 8. <u>Old Business Reports of Staff Members.</u>
 - 9. New Business Reports of Council members.
 - Meeting Open to the Public Report from Mayor. Persons who wish to appear before the Council must submit a written request to the City Clerk prior to the commencement of the meeting, which lists their name and address, and states their business (or identifies on behalf of whom they wish to speak). Persons requesting to appear before the Council will be recognized during the meeting in the order in which they submitted the written request. The presiding officer may advise any person appearing as to the amount of time allowed prior to his speaking, or later limit such time. Persons speaking shall give their name and state their business for identify on behalf of whom they are speaking.

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- 11. Reports Old Business.
- 12. Council Member Reports New Business.
- 13. Upcoming Events Adjournment
- 14. Adjournment.
- C. Matters inappropriate for consideration at a meeting, or not in the order specified, shall not be considered except (1) with the unanimous consent of the members of the Council, or (2) scheduled public hearings or bid lettings at the time stated in the notice. All claims for payment must be filed at or before 12:00 p.m. on the Wednesday preceding the regular Council meeting at which it is to be considered.
- D. Varying Order. The order of business may be varied by the Mayor, but all public hearings shall be held at the time specified in the notice of the hearing.

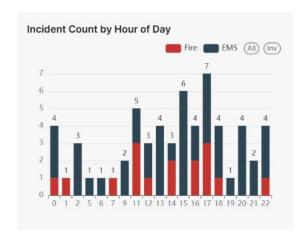


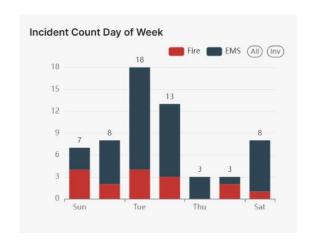
Current Incident Volume Projected YoY Change (YTD)

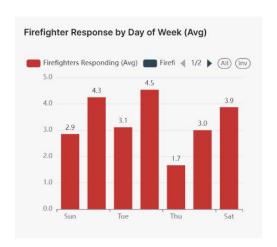

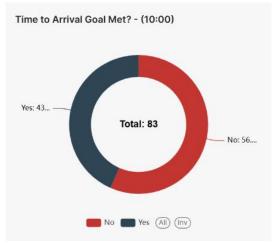

It was a busy and active summer for the police department. Officers and staff hosted and/or participated in several summer events including National Night Out, Cone with a Cop, and Stay Home Safe For Kids Program. These events help the police department maintain great relationships with the public which is vital to keeping St. Francis a safe and enjoyable place to live and visit. Thank you to all the officers and staff who contributed and to all the community members for attending.

Overall, there were 1,760 calls for service during the 3rd quarter, which is a slight decrease from the 2nd quarter. There were 36 Group A offenses which include offenses such as burglary, damage to property, fraud, theft, robbery etc. There were 960 Group B offenses which include offenses such as disorderly conduct, DWI, trespassing, and all other offenses which would include vehicle accidents, medicals, ordinance-related calls, welfare checks etc.

Over the summer officers participated in numerous Toward Zero Deaths (TZD) initiatives within St. Francis in efforts to reduce traffic crashes, injuries, and deaths on Minnesota roads. These initiatives included speed, DWI, Move Over Law, and seatbelt enforcement waves. When not participating in TZD initiatives officers are staying very proactive in enforcing traffic laws within the city. In total officers stopped 764 vehicles during the third quarter and issued 165 citations.

The dedicated professionals of the St. Francis Police Department work hard to serve the St. Francis Community and as always want to thank the City Council for their continued support.

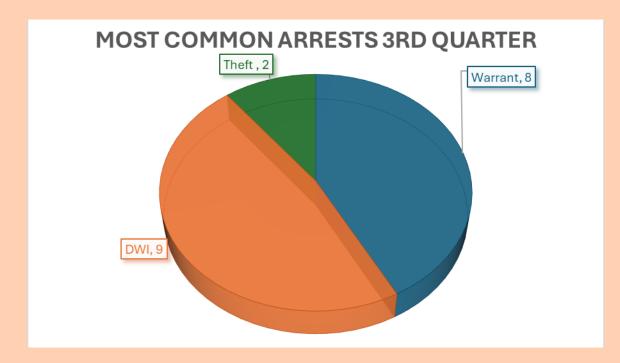

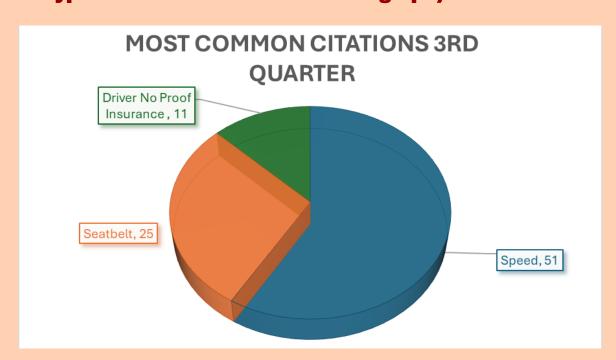
