City of St. Helens RESOLUTION NO. 2000

A RESOLUTION TO SUBMIT TO THE ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF ST. HELENS THE QUESTION OF ADOPTION OF A 5-YEAR LOCAL OPTION LEVY NOT TO EXCEED THE AMOUNT OF \$0.52 PER \$1,000 OF ASSESSED PROPERTY VALUE FOR POLICE PROTECTION SERVICES STAFFING BEGINNING FISCAL YEAR 2024-2025

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the City of St. Helens, Columbia County, Oregon, (the "City") hereby determines that the City should submit to its voters the question of authorizing the City to levy local option taxes of \$0.52 Per \$1,000 of assessed property value each year for five years, beginning in fiscal year 2024-2025 to provide funds for police protection services staffing, and an estimated five-year total of \$3,273,686 would be levied, i.e., \$604,411 for the first year, \$628,587 for the second year, \$653,731 in the third year, \$679,881 in the fourth year, and \$707,076 in the fifth year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY THAT:

- **Section 1.** A measure election is hereby called for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of the City the question of authorizing the local option levy described in the attached Exhibit A.
- **Section 2.** The measure election hereby called shall be held in the City at the May 2024 election, in accordance with the Oregon Law.
- **Section 3.** The Common Council hereby authorizes the City Recorder to submit a notice of measure election (Exhibit B) and explanatory statement (Exhibit C) to the Elections Officer of Columbia County, Oregon.
- **Section 4.** The City Administrator and City Recorder are authorized and directed to execute all documents, and publish all notices required by law to carry out the intent of this resolution.

Summary: (175 words)

The City's current tax revenues cannot support quantity of officers needed to protect and serve our city.

The City will use the levy to create an Enhanced Law Enforcement Operating Fund. This will be used exclusively for increasing law enforcement presence throughout St. Helens and increasing police officer presence within the city. This fund would add three additional officers, necessary equipment, necessary training, and enable the police to continue to provide 24/7 law enforcement coverage in St. Helens as well as reduce response times.

In order to provide these basic services, the City is requesting a new five-year levy to a rate of \$0.52 Per \$1,000 assessed property value. The City will use the tax revenue from this measure to fund additional police officers.

The levy will raise approximately \$604,411 in 2024-25; \$628,587 in 2025-26; \$653,731 in 2026-27; \$679,881 in 2027-28; and \$707,076 in 2028-29. The levy would then expire.

For a home assessed value of \$200,000 the annual cost of this levy would be an estimated \$104 per year.

The estimated tax cost for this measure is an ESTIMATE ONLY based on the best information available from the County Assessor at the time of the estimate and may reflect the impact of early payment discounts, compression, and the collection rate.

The City of St. Helens has a permanent tax ate of \$1.9078. This rate was set in 1997 and has not risen despite increases in all expenses. There is an annual cap of 3% that can be added yearly on property taxes to help these increased expenses. This is not enough to cover all services needed by our City to function.

The City of St. Helens has less than half the national average for law enforcement coverage per person. The national average is 3.5 police officers to 1,000 citizens. The City of St. Helens is 1.38. The City of St. Helens Police Department is understaffed.

Our police officers are under increasing demands due to increased population and the decriminalization of drugs. This increase in property and violent crimes severely impacts the citizens of St. Helens.

This measure would create an Enhanced Law Enforcement Operating Fund to be used exclusively for increasing law enforcement presence in the city. It would add three additional officers, necessary equipment, necessary training, and enable the police to continue to provide 24/7 law enforcement coverage in St. Helens as well as reduce response times.

If approved, this levy would raise approximately \$3,273,686 for police protection services over the 5-year period.

Estimated annual cost:

The approximate rate for the operating fund is \$0.52 per \$1,000 of assessed value. For a home assessed at a value of \$200,000 the annual cost of this levy would be \$104 per year or \$0.28 per day.

Notice is hereby given that the City Council of the City of St. Helens is referring to the voters, for approval at the May 21, 2024 General Election, a measure requesting to impose a city tax for police protection services staff funding.

Such petition must be filed no later than 5:00 p.m. on Monday, February 4, 2024.
