

- **Website Migration:** Duplication between old and new website during interim period, and copying over missing content from old to new website before go live date
- **TMDL Stormwater Pollution Prevention Video with Engineering:** Working with Engineering to produce an educational video for youth on stormwater pollution prevention; fulfills DEQ program requirements
- **TMDL Temperature and Mercury Communications Requirements:** Need to fulfill new TMDL temperature mandates from DEQ for communications and community engagement along with ongoing mercury TMDL requirements.
- **St. Helens Transportation System Plan Project:** Communications support for project milestones in the City's TSP update
- **Spring/Summer Event Highlights:** Promos leading up to events
- **Side by Side Ordinance Communications:** Build informational website, work with Engineering team on signage and communication needs
- **Budget Cuts Impacts:** Due to 32-hour work weeks (20% staff time reduction) and possible additional staffing reductions requiring support work for non-communications tasks, communications will need to pivot to immediate needs only. Completing projects with state or federally required communications mandates will take priority, along with essential/emergency communications during working hours. The following tasks and programs/projects will likely be impacted or discontinued/paused indefinitely due to time constraints:
 - **Emergency and community PSA information:** Delayed or no release of information to the public during a critical incident if outside 32-hour work window such as an infrastructure main break with a boil water notice, significant road closure traffic alerts due to a prolonged emergency incident, emergency water shut off for water main repair to a business or residential section of town, police incident with a shelter in place or avoid area, missing elder or youth, natural disaster, severe weather impacts, etc.
 - **Coverage of City community events:** No photography or video during events, no social media posts during the beginning of events to showcase activities happening, no after-event recaps shared with the community. This will impact

coverage of Community Day in the Park, Independence Day 250th Celebration, 13 Nights on the River, and St. Helens Christmas in the Plaza and Christmas Ships, with no Spirit of Halloweentown highlights targeted to St. Helens community.

- **City booths/entries in community events:** No City entries at community events. This includes our annual CCSO Trunk or Treat booth, Community Day in the Park booth, and Kiwanis Community Parade entry.
 - **Cooling Center:** No City cooling center during extreme heat events due to minimum City staffing requirements and coordination time required with other agencies to secure supplies, call for volunteers, etc. The Communications Division has acted as the organizer/facilitator of the Columbia County inter-agency Extreme Weather Group which coordinates resources and communications during extreme heat events between the City, County, and other community organizations such as the Senior Center, CCMH, C.A.T., Care Oregon, United Way of Columbia County, etc. The group also meets to review Winter Weather resources and messaging. Due to the limited timeframe of how the NWS determines and declares extreme weather events before they happen, there will also be a large reduction in communications to the public regarding unofficial cooling location options or resources.
 - **Media response:** No response to media inquiries after hours, on furlough days, or during weekends, holidays, etc.
 - **St. Helens Civic Explorer Activity Handbook for youth:** On hold indefinitely. Booklet is 50% completed and was being created as an activity booklet to engage kids with hands on activities that teach them about City of St. Helens government services inspired by the NPS Junior Ranger program.
 - **Weekly Library Newsletter: The Reading River:** Possibly placed on hold indefinitely.
 - **Take Your Child to Work Day:** On hold indefinitely due to time constraints. Program previously organized through Communications Division as an enrichment activity for City employees and their children
 - **Weekly Roundup:** Potential to be placed on hold indefinitely due to time constraints. For a year+, the comms team have been showcasing a weekly list of projects, trainings, collaborations, etc. on social media that highlights each City division on a rotating basis
 - **Special event/meeting coverage:** No communications coverage after hours or furloughed hours, including community awards and presentations, proclamations, etc. at Council regular sessions; ribbon cutting ceremonies; community open houses or special sessions; Recreation or Library special program highlights

TIMBER MARKET ANALYSIS

Current Sawlog Market

Current Prices

In March 2026, *small Douglas-fir saw log* (5 to 15-inch diameter) delivered prices in the local area range from **\$650-\$800** per MBF. This price range is the same as this time last year.

Current Trend


Log prices remain below the five-year average but seem to be trending up as the housing market appears to be improving. There is a limited supply of logs, which props prices up, even in a basic housing market and a tough overall economy. Mills interested in St Helens timber mostly produce dimension lumber (2x4, 2x6, etc) that is widely used in the construction industry and driven by the housing market.

It is important to understand log supply challenges in the Pacific Northwest when looking at future log markets. As a net importer of lumber, the United States is not getting the supply from Canada it has historically, so there is more pressure on domestic producers to fill this gap. Billions of board feet of timber were lost in the Labor Day fires of 2020 and most of the salvageable logs have been processed. In 2024, additional harvest regulations were imposed on Oregon forests, further reducing the amount of timberland available for harvest. All that being said, with a limited supply of logs available, prices should remain solid even in a lumber economy that features basic demands.

The current inventory of City of St Helens timber features mostly small Douglas-fir saw logs. In the current market, Douglas-fir stumpage prices for City of St Helens timber would range from **\$400-\$550** per MBF.

MANAGEMENT PLANNING

Recent Harvest History

2018-2026 (Includes current 'Section-20' timber sale)

After a four-year break following the harvest of the majority of the remaining merchantable timber in 2014; from 2018-2026 we harvested 450-acres from six timber sales – an average of 50-acres per year, which is just over our sustainable goal of 46-acres per year (based on a 45-year rotation in which 1/45th of the available forestland is harvested annually). The sustainable harvest level is a rolling average over time, and considerable added value has been captured during this period by harvesting greater than 50-acres during years that featured historic peaks in the log market.



Future Outlook

City of St Helens Forest Composition

The Milton Creek Watershed contains 2,075-acres of Commercial Forestland. The oldest available stands of timber are now 40 to 50 years of age. There are roughly 240-acres of timber greater than age 40. Within 5 to 10 years, roughly 700-acres will move into the 40+ year category.


Age Distribution of City of St Helens Forestland That is Available for Harvest



Current Harvesting Options

The City currently has roughly 100-acres of readily available merchantable timber. (See Map on Page-6) Given the current market and our sustainability goals, I recommend deferring harvest for a year or two and timing the next harvest with a peak in the log market.







SDC methodology

- Water, wastewater, and stormwater SDCs are driven by the “improvements approach” which is based on a specific list of planned capacity increasing capital improvements.



Who Pays SDCs

- New Development
- Charged at time of permit issuance
- Consists of three components:
 - ✓ Reimbursement fee
 - ✓ Improvement fee
 - ✓ Compliance fee

Use of SDCs

- SDCs are “restricted revenues” under Oregon budget law
- Cannot be spent on operations or maintenance
- Must be spent on capacity expanding capital expenditures
- Annual reporting required on receipts, expenditures, and cash balances





PROJECTED CAPITAL PLAN(S) FUNDING SOURCES




Wastewater (\$76.3 million)


Changes in Forecasts of Future Demand Units (i.e., population)




Have to Balance Both Variables to Reach a Recommended Rate

FORECAST OF SINGLE-FAMILY SDCS




