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24 City Attorney, Angela Couch, gave an overview of the meeting guidelines.

25 City Manager, Maggie Dimov, reviewed the outline of the Millage Rate scenarios based on the preliminary  
26 digest provided by Dekalb County.  
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28 *Mayor Linder opened the public hearing.*  
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31 **Public Comment 1: Vanessa Cummings** – Provided the definition of Millage and compared different  
32 counties Millage Rates. Expressed that the City's budget comes out of the citizens' pockets. Discussed  
33 the budget allocated for 2026 and how the employees are being overpaid.

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35 **Public Comment 2: Joan Monroe** – Expressed that the City Attorney does multiple jobs and inquired at  
36 what cost and feels it is unethical. Inquired what the job description of the City Manager is, if the City is  
hiring qualified individuals and asked who's in charge of hiring. Also expressed that 1.5 million could be

37 decreased from the budget, how the population has not increased, services have diminished, taxes have  
38 increased, and funds have been mishandled.

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40 **Public Comment 3: William Galloway** – Expressed the importance of quality-of-life improvements, that  
41 everyone is trying to reach the same goal and urged Council Members to set a good example for the  
42 people in the City. Feels that multiple votes from the governing body weren't unanimous at the last  
43 meeting but that the disagreements were of good will.

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45 **Public Comment 4: – Denise Phillips** – Expressed that the 2024 reserves have been overtaxing citizens  
46 since 2018, how the burden needs to be taken off taxpayers and how the facilities are at a \$90,000 deficit.  
47 Discussed Blight and inquired if we are charging homeowners and businesses. Provided budget cut  
48 suggestions and inquired if City cars are being factored into the budget. Urged the governing body to get  
49 creative regarding the budget.


