**Citizen Comment 5: Carl Wright** – Spoke about JBR traffic. The potholes are getting worse. Is in support of mixed use development. Need to get vacant buildings taken care of. Caboose is falling apart.

**Citizen Comment 6: Andrew Zonneveld –** voiced concerns of 978 Main Street. Rejects the Stone Mountain Cemetery as a tourist attraction. Mentioned John B. Gordon. Wants to remove the racist monument.

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Citizen Comment 7: Waini Buggs - Concerns regarding the 911 calls and the amount of time it took to give information to the operator. Too many break-ins are occurring and there are still problems in Garden Walk.

Citizen Comment 8: Susan Leisure – Brought up the parking lot not having a business license or sign permit. Businesses have gone down 30% and customers are being charged. Urged the city to take action.

Citizen Comment 9: Clint Monroe - Gave compliment to Councilmember Marianos on his attire. Spoke on concerns of the millage rate of 16 mill. February 12<sup>th</sup> a property tax appraisal appeal seminar will be held from 6-8 p.m.
