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29 The applicant came forward to speak regarding the property. The owner, Jean- Claude Mondesir,
30 stated that it has been almost a year since the purchase of the home. The applicant expressed a desire
31 to add value to the neighborhood and noted that they have developed strong relationships with
32 neighbors.

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36 **Public Comment 1: Nolan Joss** – Expressed that he has met the owner and understands their desire
37 to improve the property's interior and exterior; however, he does not support the use of the property as
38 an Airbnb rental.

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40 **Public Comment 2: Theresa Thomas** – Thanked Council Member Jordan for speaking on behalf of the
41 community and expressed concern that the residence had not been occupied for over a year without
42 code enforcement visiting the property. She stated that short-term renters often park on lawns or block
43 neighboring driveways and noted that she does not support the use of the property as an Airbnb.

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45 **Public Comment 3: Eileen Smith** – Expressed that the property is part of a larger issue in Stone
46 Mountain, noting that construction on the home had already been completed before violations were
47 identified. She stated that the City is not doing an adequate job with code enforcement and identifying
48 issues before they reach this point.

The applicant came forward to state her case and explained that she was unaware the home was located within a historic district until after renovations had begun, including the installation of board-and-batten siding on the exterior and new interior flooring. She stated that she was later penalized by code enforcement and was unable to obtain permits due to the Historic Preservation Commission's decision, requiring her to wait for an appeal before the City Council.

The Council discussed how much of the project had been completed prior to being stopped by code enforcement. Council Member Nunez shared that she had experienced a similar situation and stated that the process should be amended to ensure buyers are informed when a home is located within a historic district.
