Cost: \$150,000 home valuation - \$57.02

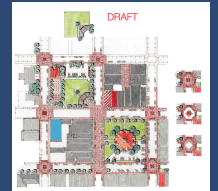
\$8 million to design, construct, and equip a combined use facility to house a library, senior citizens center, and recreation center

Cost: \$150,000 home valuation - \$15.54

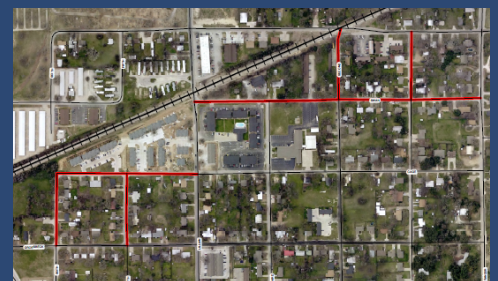
\$2.16 million for improvements to Belknap Street, from the Fort Worth and Western Railroad to Mason Street

Cost: \$150,000 home valuation - \$26.72

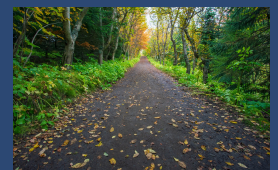
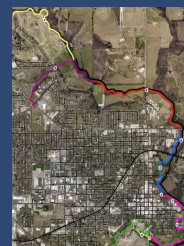
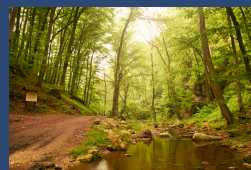
\$3.73 million for improvements to First, Second, Fifth, Sixth, Cage, and Swan Streets
