SUBJECT: Reactivating Personnel

MEETING: Public Works Committee Meeting - 15 Dec 2020

DEPARTMENT: Public Works **STAFF CONTACT:** Nick Williams

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends reactivating the previously frozen positions for Construction Supervisor and Construction Technician.

BACKGROUND:

The positions for a Construction Supervisor and a Construction Technician were created by transferring existing positions within the Water Department to Utilities Administration. The newly-named positions were budgeted for FY18-19.

In March of 2019, staff proposed the Construction Supervisor and one of two Construction Technician positions to remain on-hold / frozen for the duration of the Eastside Sewer Lift Station project in order to secure the services of a qualified Resident Project Representative (RPR) to oversee the project construction.

The Eastside Sewer Lift Station project was accepted by council on December 1, 2020.

FISCAL IMPACT SUMMARY:

When the positions were frozen, the intent was to use existing, budgeted personnel salaries to pay for expert RPR services for the lift station project and then to unfreeze those two existing positions at the conclusion of the lift station project.

The construction inspection services for the lift station were completed at the contract amount of \$209,000.

The compensation allocated for the Construction Supervisor and the Construction Technician positions, including benefits, equated to just over \$125,000 annually in FY18-19 and again in FY19-20.

In FY18-19, the full \$125,000 was used to pay for the RPR services with a net zero dollar impact to the FY18-19 budget.

The first eight (8) months of FY19-20 was used to pay the remaining \$84,000 of the RPR contract (\$209k - \$125k = \$84k). The personnel savings for FY19-20, achieved by keeping the positions frozen for the four (4) remaining months of FY19-20, was approximately \$41,000.

The Construction Supervisor and one Construction Technician were inadvertently excluded in the FY20-21 budget.

Agenda Item A: Eastside Sewer Lift Station - Project Inspection Services

Discussion: The proposed agreement with Parkhill, Smith and Cooper (PSC) to provide on-site construction

inspection services for the Eastside Sewer Lift Station project was discussed. It was confirmed that placing the vacant Construction Supervisor and Construction Technician positions on hold for the duration of the lift station construction would pay for the cost of the inspection services and still leave a positive balance in excess of \$40,000 after the \$209,000 not-to-exceed amount was reached.

It was also confirmed that PSC had bought out Schrickel, Rollins & Associates (SRA) and that the full Eastside Sewer project is under the direction of a new PSC project manager not associated with SRA.

Committee Action: Following discussion, a motion was made by Mr. McClinton, seconded by Mr. Huckabee, to

recommend to the full council the approval of the PSC agreement as presented.

Recommendation: The committee voted unanimously to recommend approval of the agreement with PSC as presented

to the full council.

Agenda Item B: TXDOT SH 108 / Graham Avenue 2020 Pavement and Utility Coordination – Burns & McDonnell Professional Services Agreement

Discussion:

The proposed agreement with Burns and McDonnell Engineering Company, Inc. to provide design services for utility infrastructure replacements in Graham Avenue in coordination with TXDOT's 2020 pavement reconstruction project discussed. It was noted that this firm has been retained by TXDOT and that coordinating the projects would provide a significant savings in the design as well as the full surface restoration cost during the construction of the project.

The funding is recommended to come from unrestricted fund balance. Funding methodologies were also discussed for the construction. Design services will provide opinions of probable cost, but preliminary construction costs are estimated at approximately \$1.2 million. It was noted that the design plans are a necessity for the project and alternative funding sources would be pursued.

Committee Action: Following discussion, a motion was made by Mr. McClinton, seconded by Mr. Huckabee, to

recommend council approve the professional services proposal with Burns and McDonnell

Engineering Company, Inc.

Recommendation: The committee voted unanimously to recommend approval of the proposed professional services

agreement with Burns & McDonnell Engineering Company, Inc. to complete the design for utility infrastructure replacements in Graham Avenue in coordination with TXDOT's 2020 pavement

reconstruction project.

SUBJECT: Eastside Sewer Project – Construction Inspection Services

MEETING: Public Works Committee Meeting - 11 Feb 2019

DEPARTMENT: Public Works **STAFF CONTACT:** Nick Williams

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends entering into an agreement with Parkhill, Smith and Cooper, Inc. (PSC) for resident project representation (a.k.a. on-site inspection) services for the Eastside Sewer Lift Station Project construction with a net zero dollar fiscal impact on the FY18-19 budget.

BACKGROUND:

The budgeted positions for a Construction Supervisor and a Construction Technician were posted in January of 2018. The positions remain vacant, as the applications received have lacked the necessary experience and expertise, with the exception of one candidate where the compensation demands could not be successfully negotiated.

PROJECT:

The lift station project is the critical first step of the overall Eastside Sewer Project. Inspection of the lift station construction is moderately complex and requires a specific expertise with oversite of construction projects.

FISCAL IMPACT SUMMARY:

PSC proposes to provide the on-site, construction inspection services for an amount not to exceed \$209,000 over the course of the 14-month project schedule.

The compensation allocated for the Construction Supervisor and the Construction Technician positions, including benefits, equates to over \$125,000 annually. Because the budgeted positions have remained unfilled this fiscal year, the full \$125,000 is available and can be used for the inspection services with a net zero dollar impact to the FY18-19 budget.

When FY19-20 begins in October, the use of approximately eight (8) months of the position salaries (approximately \$83,336) is projected to be necessary to complete the inspection services for the lift station, which would leave a positive balance in excess of \$40,000.

Staff proposes the Construction Supervisor and the Construction Technician positions remain on-hold / frozen for the duration of the Eastside Sewer Lift Station project.

An additional benefit to utilizing a Certified Construction Manager, as proposed by PSC, is the ability to provide mentorship to city staff in building the city's construction inspection division.

XIII. MONTHLY BUDGET REPORT

Monica Harris, Director of Finance

Monthly Budget Report for the Period Ending January 31, 2019

Monica Harris, Director of Finance, gave the following report:

In reviewing the financial statements ending January 31, 2019, the financial indicators are as or better than expected.

- Property Tax We received \$2.88 million in property taxes in the month of January, resulting in a \$292K or 5.4% increase over funds collected through January last year.
- Sales Tax We received \$518K in sales tax in January, resulting in \$8K under the target budget for January. We received \$42K or 2.3% more than last year.
- HOT Funds -We received \$44K in Hotel Occupancy Tax revenue through January. Last year
 we received \$74K in Hotel Occupancy Tax revenue due to more early payments. We spent
 \$53K in Hotel Occupancy Tax funds through January as compared to \$22K last year due to
 wages and advertising.
- Revenue (Budgetary comparison) -The target budget for operating revenue is \$8.5 million.
 We received \$11.9 million in revenue through January, resulting in \$3.4 million over budget. This is a result of property taxes; which were due by January 1st and delinquent if not paid by January 31st.
- Expenditures (Budgetary comparison) The target budget for operating expenditures is \$6.8 million. We expended \$6.3 million through January, resulting in \$499K under budget.
- Revenue (Prior year comparison) Operating revenue received last year was \$11.3 million
 as compared to the current year's \$11.9 million, resulting in a \$519K increase due to
 property taxes, sales taxes, and investment interest.
- Expenditures (Prior year comparison) Operating expenditures last year were \$6.1 million
 as compared to the current year's \$6.3 million, resulting in a \$152K increase. Additional
 expenditures included the Balanced Scorecard Training, the salary survey, the special
