#### CALL TO ORDER/ROLL CALL

Mayor Farley called the meeting to order at 6 P.M.

Councilmen Mark Morgan Jr., Bill Hayes, Brian Brooks, and John Rambo were in attendance. Tim Pettigrew was absent.

City Officials present included City Manager Lindsay Koskiniemi, City Attorney Charlie Stevenson, Mayor Jeff Farley, City Secretary Kaydi Smith, Finance Director Karla Wilson, Public Works Director Ross Aguirre, Water Treatment Plant Operator Kevin Eskridge, Public Works Supervisor Mark Niemeyer, and Police Chief Brad Caudle

- 3. Minutes of the Regular Session February 21, 2023

Mark Morgan Jr. made the motion to accept the minutes of the Regular Session held on February 21, 2023. Bill Hayes seconded. All in favor. Motion Carried.

4. Discussion and action on review and approval of minutes of the Special Meeting - March 09, 2023

Mark Morgan Jr. made the motion to accept the minutes of the Special Session held on March 9, 2023. John Rambo seconded. All in favor. Motion carried.

#### **REGULAR AGENDA**

- Discuss/ Take Action on proposed Re-plat at 1101 Avenue B City Secretary explained the owners of 1101 Avenue B currently have two separate lots adjoining and are requesting to combine into one property. John Rambo made the motion to approve the proposed replat at 1101 Avenue B. Mark Morgan Jr. seconded. All in favor. Motion carried.
- 6. Discussion and possible action to any follow up information received regarding independent water samples taken and tested the week of March 06, 2023. City Manager addressed all regarding the coloration of the water. Results from the independent samples taken from Water Utility Services, Inc. and Envirodyne Laboratories, Inc., as well as the TCEQ samples have been received. The independent samples do show an elevation in manganese. This does increase the coloration in the water but is safe for consumption. City staff will be working closely with TCEQ with the received results. Discussion ensued and questions from the public were addressed by the City Manager, Water Treatment Plant Operator, Public Works Director, Supervisor, and Council. Per the City Manager, water sample results will be attached to the meeting minutes for viewing. Councilman Rambo did state they would definitely consider looking at the water rates possibly at the next meeting. Brian Brooks made the motion to provide updates to the city's Facebook page with any communications from TCEQ regarding the Public Water in Sweeny. Bill Hayes seconded. All in favor. Motion carried.
- 7. Variance requested to exceed maximum height of a flagpole at the Sweeny Fire Department, located at 222 Pecan.

City Secretary stated that the fire department is requesting a variance to the height of a proposed newly installed flag pole. Current ordinance states twenty (20) feet is the maximum and the proposed requested variance is for ten (10) feet additional, making the pole thirty (30) feet tall.

Mark Morgan Jr. made the motion to approve the variance of the flagpole. Bill Hayes seconded. Councilman Hayes did state he thought the fire department wanted the flags to be seen from Main Street. Discussion was held about the height of the flagpoles at the Veterans Park Memorial in which they believe to be twenty-two (22) to thirty (30) foot tall. All in favor. Motion carried.

 Discussion and possible action on approval of a resolution in support of the Sweeny Beautification Committee-sponsored parades to be held along FM 524, more commonly known as Main Street for the next five (5) years.

Councilman Rambo stated the City of Sweeny hosted the Veterans parade last November and TxDot required this information for DOT approvals. We are trying to get ahead by completing five years of parades within one resolution in order to pursue the multiyear agreement with TxDot. Attorney Stevenson stated there are three parades a year by Beautification and Txdot requires a resolution to complete their agreement. This would suffice for the next five years instead of approving a resolution for each parade throughout the year.

John Rambo made the motion to approve the resolution in support of the Sweeny Beautification Committee sponsored parades to be held along FM 524, more commonly known as Main Street for the next five (5) years. Mark Morgan Jr. seconded. All in favor. Motion carried.

 Discussion and possible action on approval of a multi-year agreement with Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) concerning the closure of FM 524 better know as Main Street, a TxDot right of way, for upcoming parades.

The resolution previously voted on in item number eight (8) is required in order to complete the multiyear agreement with TxDot. The multiyear agreement is required per TxDot for all parades as Main Street is a TxDot roadway.

John Rambo made the motion to approve the multiyear agreement with TxDot concerning the closure of FM 524 better known as Main Street, a TxDot right of way, for upcoming parades. Mark Morgan Jr. seconded. All in favor. Motion carried.

10. Discuss/ Take Action on re-scheduling the Regular Session Council Meeting from April 18, 2023 to April 25, 2023.

City Manager stated she will be out of town at a governmental finance training for continuing education the week of the regularly scheduled April council meeting and is requesting approval to change the date of the April council meeting to April 25, 2023.

Brian Brooks made the motion to reschedule the Regular Session Council Meeting from April 18, 2023 to April 25, 2023. John Rambo seconded. All in favor. Motion carried.

11. Discussion and action on a request to recognize significant contributions of Pastor Larry Lamb at Chick Anderson Park consistent with a proposed ordinance on City parks naming rights. Caniel "Shawn" Massey of the Parks and Recreation Board is wanting approvals to honor those individuals that have made significant contributions to the city. He is requesting council's approval to make recognition of those individuals on city property. Years ago, Larry Lamb made contributions to Chick Anderson Park, known as Gazebo Park. The Parks and Recreation Board is wanting to honor him for those contributions. They are proposing something similar to the standing plaques in Backyard Park.

Bill Hayes made the motion to allow the Parks and Recreation Board to proceed in gathering information of the plaque and to move forward with the recognition of Pastor Larry Lamb at the Chick Anderson Park. Brian Brooks seconded. All in favor. Motion carried.

12. Discussion and action on a recommendation to City Council concerning a naming rights policy ordinance.

City Manager stated the city does not currently have a policy for naming rights. The proposed ordinance is a naming rights policy for standard processing going forward and requirements to be met prior too naming.

John Rambo made the motion to adopt the naming rights policy ordinance. Brian Brooks seconded. Discussion by Mark Morgan Jr. was raised on the risks proceeding without an ordinance. City Manager stated the policy would just provide a standard process for selection of naming. Bill Hayes asked who would make the final determinations. Per the ordinance proposed, Mayor stated Council shall have final authority. All in favor. Motion carried.

13. Discuss and act (as needed) choosing a contractor for road and utility expansion of Calvie Brown road at the Industrial Park Nina Christie, EDC President, stated that three contractors submitted bids for the roadway and utility expansion at the Industrial Park down Calvie Brown Road. The three bids received were by RollCon, Southern Gulf Solutions, and Tindol Construction. All bidders were in attendance. The request for bids were requested by Colby Lowery with Altamira, EDC's engineering firm.

Bids received were not all the same. Discussion ensued regarding each bid, timing for completion, and property concerns.

Brian Brooks made the motion to award the turnkey bid to Tindol construction. John Rambo seconded. All in favor. Motion carried.

14. Discuss and act (as needed) financing for road and utility extension of Calvie Brown road at the Industrial Park

Nina Christie, EDC President, stated EDC is requesting approvals to move forward with pursuing financing options for the utility and roadway expansion at the Industrial Park. John Rambo made the motion to approve EDC to pursue financing for the road and utility extension of Calvie Brown Road in the amount of \$1,385,950.00. Mark Morgan Jr. seconded. All in favor. Motion carried.

15. Discussion and possible action on city services to the Bennet Outlar Park Complex. Councilman Brooks stated he is wanting the Sweeny Little League to offer Softball to allow all children the opportunity to play ball in Sweeny. He is recommending that if the Little League Baseball and Girls Softball Association cannot come to an agreement that the City of Sweeny cut ties with their in-kind contributions currently provided to the Sweeny Little League. The City Manager stated the city currently provides water, wastewater, electrical, and trash services at no cost to the complex. Brooks proposed to allow two (2) months for both sides to come to an agreement or have the city cut ties on the donated services.

Brian Brooks made the motion to table for two (2) months to consider severing ties. Discussion was made regarding the two-month time frame. All in favor. Motion carried.

16. Discuss and act as needed on city owned property adjacent to Bennett-Outlar baseball fields and complex.

City Manager stated that Councilman Pettigrew had asked for this item to be on the agenda as he feels the property owned by the City of Sweeny, due to its location, poses a risk of injury and/or liability claims.

John Rambo made the motion to table until Councilman Pettigrew is in attendance. Mark Morgan Jr. seconded. All in favor. Motion carried.

17. Discussion and possible action on a 2023 Consumer Price Index (CPI) Adjustment to Municipal Telecommunication Right-of-Way Access Line Rates. City Manager stated the Consumer Price Index Adjustment to Municipal Telecommunication Right of Way Access Line Rates is an annual adjustment provided to council for determination. The new 2023 CPI adjusted maximum rates proposed are: residential \$0.61, non-residential \$1.30 and point to point \$1.90. The default rates for 2023 would be the same as the 2022 rates if not raised, and they are: residential \$.54, non-residential \$1.18, and point to point \$1.74. Attorney Stevenson stated that previously the fees were collected and paid thru franchise fees from the provider but have since changed. Councilman Rambo stated that this is a tax that would raise rates on citizens and then in turn be paid to the city.

John Rambo made the motion to leave the CPI at the 2022 rate. Mark Morgan Jr. seconded. All in favor. Motion carried.

 Discussion and action on proposal to Assess an Annual Membership and/or One Time Usage Fee for Groups Utilizing of the Seniors Building and possible amendment reflective on Master Fee Schedule

City Manager is proposing to assess an annual membership fee and/or a one-time usage fee for groups utilizing the Seniors Building in order to recoup janitorial supplies and cleaning expenses. Proposal is for assessing a one-time annual fee of \$250.00 for those groups that use

it on a regular basis/weekly. The proposal of a one-time \$50.00 fee would be for those one-time users. Discussion ensued. *Item died for lack of motion.* 

19. Discuss and act as necessary in the matter of following up with residents within 3 business days after a work order is created from resident complaint or request. Councilman Rambo stated he previously touched on this request but is wanting to address it again in order to mitigate problems that are reported to the city. John Rambo made the motion that after a resident calls to make a complaint, or request something to be looked at, or a work order created, within three (3) business days, they (complainant) are followed-up with communication with a resolution or with ongoing work being done. Mark Morgan Jr. seconded. City Manager did state that the city does use a work order system to assist in complaints. Council stated they want responses to complaints monitored more closely and for the city manager to police this. Discussion ensued on the system currently used and processes followed. All in favor. Motion carried.

The City Manager addressed the Council about the ongoing water issue, spike in complaints received, and external sources the city has reached out too for assistance. Michael Gonzales, Professional Water Consultant, and Keyur Gorji, President of Water Equipment and Treatment Services (WETS), addressed the council on findings and options for repairs. The consultants do believe the major problem is the filters and resin inside the softeners, known as media. The polyphosphate and water project are likely to still have a minimal impact on discoloration, but by completing the replacements of the two filters and media, a majority of the manganese and iron coloration will be alleviated.

Councilman Bill Hayes arrived at 4:07 p.m.

Discussion ensued on the current operations of the water plant as well as future upgrades needed that will need to be discussed in the upcoming Capital Improvements Projects Planning Session. David Jordan, retired Public Works Director for the City of Brazoria, agreed with the professionals and their course of action. Quote received for two softeners and media will total \$93,700.00. The project would be congruent with the allowances for usage of the 2019 Certificate of Obligation. There are also funds available that were recently moved into the investment pools, TexStar and Logic, from the Enterprise Fund. This would require a budget amendment to be presented at the next Regular Council Meeting for formalization.

Brian Brooks made the motion to declare this an emergency purchase, for the public's health and safety, and to award the contract with-out bids, to replace the media and two filters in the amount of \$93,700.00. Bill Hayes seconded. All in favor. Motion Carried.

### **Executive Summary**

The attached report is required by the Public Funds Investment Act to be reported on and presented to City Council on a quarterly basis. Total investment interest revenue for January, February and March 2023 is \$41,463.83 and for the fiscal year total from October to March 2023, the total investment interest revenue earned is \$75,481.15.

The interest rates continue to climb, and the US Federal Reserve will meet six (6) more times this year to discuss rate increases. 

### **Executive Summary**

At the special City Council meeting held on April 10, 2023, the City Council voted to rehab 2 of 3 water softeners after staff and consultants found that the condition of the softeners required repair to operate. The softeners were taken offline and bypassed. TCEQ was notified, and regular water treatment has continued.

At the most basic level, the water softeners operate by removing naturally occurring metallics in the water, such as iron and manganese, and replaces it with sodium. This process works inside the softeners using resin also referred to as media to attract the unwanted substances and remove them.

The water softeners were determined to need resin replacement and work on the internal filters. Water Equipment and Treatment Services (WETS) arrived onsite to begin work on Saturday, April 15, 2023 and found the third softener, which was not used on a consistent basis, is also in need of the same repair. No work has been approved for the 3<sup>rd</sup> softener – only Softeners 1 and 2. To use Softener 3, it would need to be rehabbed and included in an approved corrosion control study to gain authorization from TCEQ to put online.

The replacement media was ordered on Monday, April 17, 2023 and is anticipated to arrive within a few weeks.

Of note, the City is still undergoing construction on the water main line replacement project and does not have authorization to use polyphosphate from TCEQ, the regulatory agency charged with public water system oversight. Once the softeners are repaired and back online, we do not believe that will completely eliminate the observed water coloration. The City is awaiting a response from TCEQ to use a treatment substance called orthophosphate.

#### § 74.01 DANGEROUS CROSSING.

The City Council hereby determines, based upon evidence before it, that street crossings of railroad tracks which are not protected by signals and which have railroad engines, cars, motor cars or railroad equipment standing or parked on sidings near the main line of the railroad and within 300 feet of the street intersection of the street right-of-way line with the railroad is a dangerous crossing exposing the traveling public to harm and damage to their property and their persons and exposes the train crew to injury.

#### § 74.02 PARKING NEAR INTERSECTION.

#### Lindsay,

I have done a few quiet zones in the past, both studies to determine the viability, as well a full construction and implementation. I'm currently working on a study in Laredo for over 30 crossings on the KCS railroad. Most of the easier quiet zones were done years ago. The remaining towns that would like to implement quiet zones will have a much more difficult time, though not impossible.

The main requirements to establish a quiet zone include ensuring all crossings inside the corridor have flashing lights and gates and constant warning time circuitry (CWT). Not all crossings have CWT, which detects the speed of the train and adjusts the crossing gates closure accordingly. Many older crossings only have timers that are based on average speed, so they will not close at the proper time if a train is going much slower or much faster than the average posted speed. You also cannot have a corridor that skips crossings. In the case of Sweeny, there are only 2 at grade crossings inside the City Limits. MLK and FM 524 are the only two crossings that would need to be included in the quiet zone. You could include CR 332, west of town if you wanted to, but it wouldn't be required.

There are a few different ways to establish quiet zones, but our recommended approach is to install supplemental safety measures (SSMs) at each and every crossing included in the quiet zone. This ensures that each crossing should generally be as safe or safer than before silencing the horns. SSMs include many options, but the most frequent are plastic delineators, concrete curb medians or installing quad gate crossings. At each crossing, you can install delineators or a concrete curb from the end of the crossing gate arm to a minimum of 60ft along the centerline of the roadway. If possible, they want you to extend that to 100 ft. This should prevent cars from trying to drive around the gates while they are down.

In our experience, the plastic delineators, while cheapest of all options, do not deter drivers from going around the gates. They are hit frequently and need frequent replacement. It becomes a maintenance hassle and does not do much to prevent drivers from making unsafe detours around the gates. Typically, we have designed 12 inch tall concrete curb medians. This is an effective deterrent to people trying to drive around the gates. Even with larger vehicles in Texas, it is still difficult to drive over a 12" curb.

The one drawback to the curb or delineator approach is if you happen to have a cross street or commercial driveway within this 60-100ft. This is why so many towns are finding it hard to implement a quiet zone. Many towns have roadways that run parallel to the tracks and are 10-30ft from the tracks. By having a cross street intersect the SSM median, you don't get credit for the safety measure. It also impacts traffic paths. In Sweeny, the north side of the tracks on MLK has 3rd St. intersecting close to the tracks, but it may be far enough away to fit a 60ft median. On the south side, there is a residential driveway that is only 30ft from the gates. They would not be able to turn left and head north from their driveway once the medians are installed. FM 524 should not have any issues with cross streets or driveways, thought the railroad does have an access road directly adjacent to the crossing arm.

Another option is to install a quad gate crossing. This replaces the two crossing gates with 4 gates (2 per each side). They close together and completely block the crossing to vehicular traffic. While this is the safest option, it also tends to be the most expensive. The railroad will do all the design and installation of the new gate system, but they will pass the cost onto the City. I haven't gotten recent quotes lately for quad gates, but they can easily be over \$500,000 per crossing. There are a few other SSMs that we could discuss if you are interested, but these are the most common and cost effective.

The final obstacle is the railroad upgrade cost. In many cases, the crossings do not currently have CWT or even gates. The railroad will need to upgrade this. Once again, they will do the design and construction but they will want the City to pay for this. Both crossings in Sweeny include lights and gates, but we would need to talk with the railroad to determine if CWT is installed. They also will sometimes use quiet zone projects as an excuse to upgrade their crossing equipment. We had a City move forward with a 7 crossing quiet zone where BNSF required the crossings to be upgraded to their newest standards (LED lights, electronic bells, new control circuitry, etc). This is not required by the quiet zone rule, but the RR does try to pass on these upgrades as necessary safety improvements.

While the construction costs for concrete medians may be fairly inexpensive, it is typically the railroad costs that kill these projects. In one instance, the safety measure costs were only about \$150k, but the railroad costs could be as much as \$3-4 million. We typically do a study for Cities looking to establish a quiet zone. We can go into more depth in researching what the railroad has at each existing crossing, begin discussing the railroad upgrade costs with their engineering department and determine if significant traffic rerouting is necessary to implement the new medians. If the City of Sweeny would like to pursue this quiet zone, I would recommend we do a study to determine its viability.

It is a long process to establish one of these quiet zones, but again, not impossible. I have a more formal presentation that we've given to a few groups in the past if you think that would be helpful. I don't point all this out to discourage Cities from pursuing these project, just want to be open and realistic up front.

### **Executive Summary**

This agenda item is a request for discussion and possible action from Council Member, John Rambo, concerning an adjustment to the City's utility fees and / or a credit for utility fees.

Typically, cities that charge for services never reduce rates, however, this agenda request is in response to the coloration in the water observed by water account holders. Several city water users have reported damage to clothing and other household items because of the observed coloration of the manganese in the water.

While considering this item, the Council is encouraged to think about how a reduction in utility rates would affect the city. Currently, the City's revenue earnings from water, sewer, and gas are down for the year. Revenue from proprietary funds, such as utility sales, impact the City's ability to pay for debt and other infrastructure needs. Further reducing the amount of potential revenue could adversely affect the city's ability to make debt payments and provide services. Reducing rates could also adversely affect the City's credit rating.

The current credit rating for the City of Sweeny is A+, which equates to an upper mid-grade municipal credit rating. ### **Executive Summary**

On January 17, 2023, the City Council unanimously voted on a resolution to approve the City of Sweeny's preliminary application for Texas Department of Transportation's 2023 Transportation Alternative Call for Projects. Sweeny was selected to continue in the process to submit a detailed application for consideration of a cost match (80/20) reimbursement project for the provision of a 10' shared use path along N. Hackberry from Ashley Wilson to 6<sup>th</sup> Street and a 4' sidewalk from N. Hackberry to N. Elm along Ashley Wilson.

The City obtained approval from the Sweeny Independent School District on April 11, 2023 for a letter of support to grant easement to the City to complete the detailed application. This application is due by June 5, 2023, and TXDOT anticipates awarding applicants in August 2023. While there is no guarantee that this project will be selected, City staff and SISD officials feel it is in the best interest of the safety of students to pursue this project. Currently, there is no safe route to walk to and from school along N. Hackberry, as there are no existing sidewalks or shoulders.

This call for projects is a reimbursement cost match funding arrangement, which means the City will be reimbursed 80% of the engineering and construction costs of the project. The City intends to use the fund balance of the Sidewalk Fund of approximately \$270,000 to help meet the City's 20% match obligation.

The attached document is a proposed resolution in support of the project and must be included with the detailed application.







## **Executive Summary**

The Office of the Governor of Texas offers a certification program for cities to certify as "Film Friendly." Certification as a film friendly city is an economic development activity that promotes film production using cities as filming destinations to increase revenue.

The process to certify as film friendly and be added to the certified cities database for film production companies to review is a three-step process that requires applicant cities to: 1) attend a film friendly certification workshop, 2) adopt film friendly guidelines and permitting for filming, and 3) submit several photos of 'the good, the bad, and the ugly" within and around the city that can be used in film production.

On April 4, 2023, the city manager attended a film friendly workshop in pursuit of applying for film friendly certification for the City of Sweeny. This agenda item is a request to adopt the attached guidelines and permitting for completion of the city's application. Additionally, the city manager would like to ask for the community's help in getting photos to add to the city's film-friendly portfolio to help attract film producers.


Other cities in the greater-Houston metro area film friendly certification include: Houston, Mont Belvieu, Anahuac, Pearland, Alvin, League City, Seabrook, Galveston, and Bat City. None of our nearest neighbors are certified, so this is a great opportunity for Sweeny to attract a film production.

Fees provided in the attached documents, if the film friendly guidelines are adopted will need to be incorporated into the City's fee schedule, which will come back to Council for discussion and action to update the fee schedule at a later meeting on consent agenda.

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## **Guidelines for Filming in City of Sweeny, Texas**

#### I. PURPOSE

The Guidelines contained in this policy are intended to create a program for promoting economic development activity within the **City of Sweeny** and the vicinity of the City. The following Guidelines are also intended to protect the personal and property rights of **City of Sweeny**, Texas residents and businesses, and to promote public health, safety and welfare. The City Manager reserves the right to impose additional regulations in the interest of public health, safety, and welfare, or if otherwise deemed appropriate by the City Manager.

These Guidelines cover requests for commercial use of City-owned property (including but not limited to streets, rights-of-way, parks, and/or public buildings), commercial use of private property which may affect adjacent public or private property, and the use of City equipment and personnel in all types of motion picture production, including, but not limited to, feature films, television programs, commercials, music videos and corporate films.

#### **II. CITY CONTROL/CITY MANAGER AUTHORITY**

The City Manager may authorize the use of any street, right-of-way, park, or public building, equipment, or personnel for commercial uses in the filming or taping of movies, television programs, commercials, or training films and related activities. In conjunction with these uses, the City Manager may require that any or all the conditions and/or remuneration herein and as specified on the application be met as a prerequisite to that use.

The Applicant agrees that the **City of Sweeny** shall have exclusive authority to grant the Applicant the use of public streets, rights-of-way, parks and public buildings of the City, as well as authority to regulate the hours of production and the general location of the production. The City reserves the full and absolute right to prohibit all filming or to order cessation of filming to promote public health, safety, or welfare.

The Applicant shall allow City departments (e.g., Police, Fire, Building) to inspect all structures, property, devices, and equipment to be used in connection with the filming and taping, as deemed appropriate by the City Manager.

#### **III. PERMIT REQUIREMENTS**

Before filing an application for filming in the **City of Sweeny**, the Office of the City Manager must be contacted to discuss the production's specific filming requirements and the feasibility of filming in the **City of Sweeny**, TX.

Any commercial producer who desires to undertake a commercial production within the **City of Sweeny** is required to complete and return the attached application for filming to the Office of the City Manager, within the time frames below:

• Commercials or episodic television: a minimum of two (2) business days prior to the commencement of filming or any substantial activity related to the project.

• Feature films: a minimum of five (5) business days prior to the commencement of filming or any substantial activity related to the project.

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### **IV. APPLICATON FEE**

A suggested application processing fee of \$25.00 should accompany each application for filming in **City of Sweeny**.

The City Manager may waive this fee upon proof of an organization's non-profit status or for any other reason deemed appropriate by the City Manager.

#### V. USE OF CITY EQUIPMENT AND PERSONNEL

The Applicant shall pay for all costs of any Police, Fire, Public Works, or other City personnel assigned to the project (whether or not specifically requested by the production). Remuneration rates for the use of any City equipment, including police cars and fire equipment, will be established on a case-by-case basis as determined by the City Manager. The Applicant shall pay all costs in full within ten (10) days after receipt of an invoice for said costs. The City Manager may, at his/her discretion, require an advance deposit for all costs related to City personnel and/or the use of City equipment.

The City Manager, in consultation with the Chief of Police and/or Fire Chief, shall have the authority to stipulate additional fire or police requirements and level of staffing for same, at any time during a film project if it is determined to be in the best interest of public health, safety and welfare, which cost shall be borne entirely by the Applicant.

Off-duty police officers and firefighters shall be paid by the production company at a rate no less than one and one-half times their hourly rate.

#### VI. USE OF CITY-OWNED REAL ESTATE

The City Manager may authorize the use of any street, right-of-way, park or public building, use of **City of Sweeny**, Texas name, trademark or logo and/or use of City equipment and/or personnel for commercial uses in motion picture production. In conjunction with these uses, the City Manager may require that any or all of the conditions and/or remuneration as specified herein and on the application be met as a prerequisite to that use. A security or damage deposit may be required at the discretion of the City Manager.

The Applicant shall reimburse the City for inconveniences when using public property. Following is the rate schedule:

ACTIVITY <sup>2</sup>	Cost per calendar day:
Total or disruptive use (regular operating hours) of a public building, park, right-of-way, or public area	\$500
Partial, non-disruptive use of a public building, park, right-of-way, or public area	\$250
Total closure or obstruction of public street or right-of-way, including parking lots and on- street parking	\$50
Partial closure or obstruction of public street or right-of-way, including parking lots and on-street parking	\$25
Use of City parking lots, parking areas, and City streets (for the purpose of parking film trailers, buses, catering trucks, and other large vehicles)	\$50

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The Applicant acknowledges and agrees that the **City of Sweeny**, Texas, possesses and retains exclusive authority to grant the Applicant a revocable license for the use of its name, trademark, and logo, public streets, rights-of-way, parks and buildings of the City as well as control over the hours of production and the general location of the production. The City reserves the full and absolute right to prohibit all filming or to order cessation of filming activity to promote public health, safety and/or welfare.

In order to leave the City-owned property in as good condition as when received, the Applicant is responsible for and must provide professional cleaning and/or sanitation services upon completion of work, if the City requests such cleaning and/or sanitation services at any time. Upon such a request by the City, the Applicant must obtain approval from the City of the Applicant's arrangements for cleaning and/or sanitation services (which will not be unreasonably withheld). The City may require such approval before use of the City-owned property for Production Activity begins.

#### **VII. VEHICLES AND EQUIPMENT**

The Applicant shall provide a report listing the number of vehicles and types of equipment to be used during the filming, including proposed hours of use and proposed parking locations. Such locations will need to be specifically approved by the City Manager. On-street parking or use of public parking lots is subject to City approval.

The use of exterior lighting, power generators, or any other noise- or light-producing equipment requires on-site approval of the City Manager.

#### **VIII. HOURS OF FILMING**

Unless express written permission has been obtained from the City Manager in advance, and affected property owners, tenants and residents have been notified, filming will be limited to the following hours:

Monday through Friday: 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.

Saturday, Sunday and holidays: 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

### **IX. NOTIFICATION OF NEIGHBORS**

The Applicant shall provide a short, written description, approved by the City Manager, of the schedule for the proposed production to the owners, tenants, and residents of each property in the affected neighborhood(s). The Applicant, or his or her designee, shall make a good faith effort to notify each owner, tenant and resident of all such property, and shall submit, as part of this application, a report noting owners, tenants and/or residents' comments, along with their signatures, addresses and phone numbers. Based upon this community feedback, and other appropriate factors considered by the City Manager, the City Manager may grant or deny the filming application.

### X. CERTIFICATE OF INSURANCE

The Applicant shall attach a valid certificate of insurance, issued by a company authorized to conduct business in the state of Texas, naming the **City of Sweeny** and its agents, officers, elected officials, employees and assigns, as additional insured, in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 general liability, including bodily injury and property damage with a \$1,000,000 umbrella; and automobile liability (if applicable) in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 including bodily injury and property damage.

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### XI. DAMAGE TO PUBLIC OR PRIVATE PROPERTY

The Applicant shall pay in full, within ten (10) days of receipt of an invoice, the costs of repair for any and all damage to public or private property, resulting from or in connection with, the production, and restore the property to its original condition prior to the production, or to better than original condition.

#### XII. HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT

The Applicant shall sign the following Hold Harmless Agreement holding the City harmless from any claim that may arise from their use of designated public property, right-of-way, or equipment in conjunction with the permitted use:

I certify that I represent the firm which will be performing the filming/taping at the locations specified on the attached permit application. I further certify that I and my firm will perform in accordance with the directions and specifications of **City of Sweeny**, Texas, and that I and my firm will indemnify and hold harmless the **City of Sweeny**, Texas and its elected officials, officers, servants, employees, successors, agents, departments and assigns from any and all losses, damages, expenses, costs and/or claims of every nature and kind arising out of or in connection with the filming/taping and other related activities engaged in pursuant to this Application.

I further certify that the information provided on this Application is true and correct to the best of my knowledge, and that I possess the authority to sign this and other contracts and agreements with the **City of Sweeny**, Texas on behalf of the firm.

## **Executive Summary**

This agenda item is a request to discuss what action has been taken and what remains to address the long-standing water leaks observed along 2<sup>nd</sup> Street in the vicinity of the Second and Hackberry Streets intersection.

Several residents have reported observing a major water leak in the area with running water in the culverts and ditches in the described area. While this has been a problem for a long time, staff recognizes the importance of identifying the leaks and making the needed repairs to stop the water intrusion. We also recognize this is an issue that could adversely impact drainage.

As of April 20, 2023, at the time this item was written, Public Works staff has been onsite since Wednesday, April 19, 2023 locating ditches and culverts with observed running water and began excavating to locate leaks. What we know as of 4/20/2023, at 5:30 p.m., is there could be several leaks causing the ditches and culverts to be full of water. So far 2 leaks have been unearthed with one leak located under a residential driveway and repaired.

We anticipate finding more leaks as work continues. For now, TXDOT has been notified of emergency water leak repairs in the area along the TXDOT right of way.

## **Executive Summary**

On November 15, 2023 City Council acted on and unanimously approved a request to change City Hall hours of business to close at noon on Fridays. Previously, City Hall staff worked a 9/80 schedule, meaning staff members were working 80 total hours over a period of 9 days and took off every other Friday. The difficulty staff ran into under the 9/80 schedule was coverage on Fridays. Furthermore, when we went to an automated payroll and direct deposit system, we found the 9/80 schedule was inconsistent with timekeeping.

This agenda item is a request from Council Member Brooks to change City Hall working hours to Monday through Friday from 8am to 5pm with one hour lunch breaks.

Currently, the City Hall business hours are 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. This allows staff members to process beginning and ending day reports, count petty cash, count drawers, and prepare bank deposits. These actions are recommended to be completed outside of business hours for the safety of staff handling money.

### **Recommended Action**

Staff recommends City Council take into consideration the time staff needs to safely handle cash consistent with best management practices and act in the best interest of the City.
