Approval of Minutes for January 27, 2019: (Dalton/Gourley) Motion passed.

Committee Reports:

Health Fair Committee: Bob Dalton reported the committee will meet in March. Bob Dalton also reported additional subcommittee members are needed. The Committee will create a “hand off” list for instructions. The Health Fair is scheduled for the third Saturday in August.

Western University Project: Di Lacy spoke at the SHHS to 40 students.

There is one psychologist on board who is able to write prescriptions, however there is no medications on board. Adult Services team will complete the action plan.

Health Van: The City will donate an old ambulance for outreach efforts of the Health Van which is in Sweet Home on Tuesday.

Good of the Order: Lisa Gourley shared she is on a national panel for the American Federation of Teachers to help spread mental health education to classified staff in rural school districts. She has submitted and application for rural projects.

Dick Knowles discussed 2020 Community Health Summit: Generational Poverty which is to be held Thursday, April 16, 9am until 3pm at the Lebanon Samaritan Community Hospital.

Kate Hall with OCWCOG stated Adult Protective Services does not visit Wiley Creek Community often, which is good news.
