


Rural Mobility Study

Rural Transit Improvements




- Postcard mailout to all addresses adjacent to rT routes with the intent to inform people of the service, that it's fare-free, and to send them to the website for additional information



I-5 at Risk









Council Meeting April 26 2022

Good Evening Council and Mayor, sorry that I'm not attending council meeting tonight. There is not a lot to report on from the last council meeting.

WWTP: Ruben, our new WWTP operator is doing an awesome job. He has gotten our plant running great. The goal is to get the EQ basin empty and that is going well, the plant is taking about 20,000 gallons per day from the EQ basin to the WWTP. Right now, the EQ basin is holding 600,000 gallons of liquid at 20,000 gallons a day going back into the plant. It will take 30 days to empty the basin. That is perfect timing to start the dewatering of the sludge pond. The water from the belt press will be put into the EQ basin then slowly put into the Plant.

Collection System: There was a check valve that went bad in the station behind the Sandstone café parking lot. The guys worked on that Monday and finished Tuesday.

Park: Met with the Playground installers last week to move and install the old Toys across from Parkside elementary. They will be here next week to get started moving the Play structure, Play dome, and the swings.
