## Tenino

- Code of Ordinances
- Title 14. REVENUE AND FINANCE
- Chapter 14.20. GAMBLING TAX

### • § 14.20.020. Levied; rate.

• -

Latest version.

- There is levied upon all persons, associations and organizations conducting or operating within the city any of the activities listed in this section a tax in the following amounts, to be paid to the city:

(1)

Bingo, in the amount of gross receipts therefrom, less the amount awarded as cash or merchandise prizes during the taxable period, multiplied by the rate of **ten five** percent; provided, however, that no tax shall be imposed on bingo when such activity is conducted by any bona fide charitable or nonprofit organization as defined in RCW 9.46.0209, which organization has no paid operating or management personnel and has gross receipts from bingo not exceeding \$5,000.00 per year, less the amount awarded as cash or merchandise prizes.

(2)

Raffles, in the amount of gross receipts therefrom, less the amount awarded as cash or merchandise prizes during the taxable period, multiplied by the rate of **ten five** percent; provided, however, that no tax shall be imposed on raffles when such activity is conducted by any bona fide charitable or nonprofit organization as defined in RCW 9.46.0209, which organization has no paid operating or management personnel and has gross receipts from raffles not exceeding \$10,000.00 per year, less the amount awarded as cash or merchandise prizes.

~~Pull tabs and punch boards, in the amount of gross receipts therefrom, less the amount awarded as cash or merchandise prizes during the taxable period, multiplied by the rate of 6½ percent. Said rate applies to bona fide charitable or nonprofit organizations as well as commercial stimulant operations.~~

Punchboards and pull-tabs for bona fide charitable or nonprofit organizations in the amount of gross receipts therefrom, less the amount awarded as cash or merchandise prizes during the taxable period, multiplied by the rate of ten percent. Punchboards and pull-tabs for commercial stimulant operators in the amount of gross receipts therefrom, multiplied by the rate of five percent.

### 12. Outside Agency

1) Chamber of Commerce: Mayor Watterson read the report of George Sharp into the record.

The Chamber launched the Experience Tenino Campaign May 20th. Tenino Chamber Lunch Forum, June 18th, 2025, Noon at the Sandstone Café. They are excited to support Jessica Reeves-Rush with the Creative Arts Walk Thursday June 14, 2025. The EDC will be opening their satellite office at the AG Park as soon as the furniture arrives in the next two weeks. "STEDI" will be held June 20th, 2025 at the Bucoda Community Center.

### 13. 13. Committees/Commissions

2) Finance Committee: Next meeting is June 10, 2025. Mayor Watterson reported that the year end report is close to being done.

3) Planning Commission: Planning Commissioner Adam Carney stated that the Planning Commission voted to recruit Valerie Roberts to Chair Position 5. The Planning Commission made full recommendation. During the recent meeting on 5/14 the Community Survey was reviewed and discussed. Commissioner Carney went over the bullet points of the housing preferences and community changes and improvements the community would like to see occur. Most important issues were for a safe community, people like the historic identity, parks and low crime. Housing preferences are single family homes. The survey reflected people would like to see more sidewalks and crosswalks preferably a safe crossing near/at the Market. Many people in the survey are planning to stay in Tenino long term. They state it will depend on taxes, and affordability.

5) Public Works Committee: Issued the bid to Lakeside for the Old Hwy 99 overlay project. They have been working on the Quarry Pool and warranty work. There was discussion regarding the feedback and questions that have come through regarding the bus stop and the concern of it not being ADA compliant. Mayor Watterson commented that he has reached out to Rural Transit regarding these concerns as they were whom requested the stops placement. PW director Cannon recommends the bus stop being at the City Park where there is shelter and better accommodations. The Lifeguards for the Quarry Pool summer have been hired. Pickleball and Basketball court are going in. The screens at the sewer plant need replaced, they will look into the emergency grant from Department of Ecology. The paving project was bid at almost half of what the project was estimated for, the thought is that PW could potentially pave a further distance than originally planned, they will look into the option.

**14. 14. Staff**

- 1) Chief of Police: No officers attended but Mayor Watterson reported that he authorized to hire another officer.
- 4) PARC Specialist: Deliberation on potentially implementing a process for memorials at the City Park.
- 5) Clerk/Treasurer: Chad is ready to close 2024. Working on grants with Ronna and Jessica and getting details on grants progress. Councilmember Eisel requested a 5 year plan, C/T Reddick stated that she has started but will require the 2024 year to be closed before being able to proceed accurately.
- 6) Mayor: Mayor Watterson and C/T Reddick will attend the AWC conference, and they asked the Mayor to speak on grants. Mayor Watterson stated we are just trying to get the budget settled and everyone in the office is doing great work. He spoke on the court changes, we received notice that our Prosecutor has turned in their resignation. We now have a solid candidate for the position. He is still awaiting word back from the County regarding taking over the Court for Tenino.

On May 14<sup>th</sup>, 2025, at 10:00 am, three bids were opened and publicly read for the above referenced project. The low bid was submitted by Lakeside Industries of Centralia, Washington in the amount of \$262,180.00. The total bids ranged from \$262,180.00 to \$295,225.00, and the Engineer's estimate for the project was \$409,800.00. Please see the attached bidder's tabulation.

Gibbs & Olson reviewed the bids and found that Lakeside Industries correctly completed the required forms included in the Bid Package. Gibbs & Olson has verified that Lakeside Industries has an active contractor's license and has no summons or complaints against them.

Gibbs & Olson recommends that the City of Tenino award a contract in the amount of \$262,180.00 to Lakeside Industries of Centralia, Washington for the Old Highway 99 Overlay project. Concurrence has been received from the Transportation Improvement Board. We also recommend that you consult with your attorney to verify concurrence with Gibbs & Olson's recommendation for the contract award.
