UNFINISHED BUSINESS

At the May 9 meeting, it was decided that Acting Secretary Millard would prepare a proposed set of Tenino Civil Service Rules in order that the Commissioners may have a template from which to craft a set of Civil Service Rules that will work for the City of Tenino.

Acting Secretary Millard averred that he has not been able to produce a draft set of proposed Civil Service Rules, but will have them available for the next meeting. This item shall be brought forward to the August 8 meeting.

NEW BUSINESS

The City announced the vacancy opened by the resignation of Commissioner Lucas. Three applications have been received and are being considered by Mayor Fournier (Ms. Lauraine Carlson, Ms. Donna

Wilson, Ms. Ronna Barnes)

The Commissioners spent some time reviewing the applications in order that they may make recommendations to the Administration for consideration and await his decision.

3. The City implemented an electronic meeting management system designed to standardize the preparation of the agendas, packets, and minutes of each of the City's Councils, Commissions, and Committees. Acting Secretary Millard will demonstrate how this system works and what the potential advantages and disadvantages are to the Civil Service Commission.

Acting Secretary Millard demonstrated the City's electronic meeting management system (Muni Meetings) and then entered into a dialog with the Commissioners regarding their preferred way of producing the agendas, packets, and minutes of the Tenino Civil Service Commission.

It was agreed that Acting Secretary Millard would accept input from either the Mayor or any of the Civil Service Commissioners in the same manner as described in the City's "Agenda Management Policy" recently published by the City.
