> ORDINANCE NO. 2022-1487 BOROUGH OF TINTON FALLS COUNTY OF MONMOUTH

AN ORDINANCE RELEASING THE AFFORDABILITY CONTROLS ATTACHED TO THE AFFORDABLE HOUSING UNITS FOR THE TINTON PINES DEVELOPMENT

WHEREAS, the Borough of Tinton Falls has met its constitutional obligation to provide for its fair share of affordable housing from the time periods established by the Council on Affordable Housing ("COAH") as its First, Second and Third Round obligations dating from 1987 through 2025 through the entry of Judgments of Repose and Compliance by the Superior Court (Rounds 1 and 3 and the granting of Substantive Certification by COAH (Round 2); and

WHEREAS, Borough has included a project known as Tinton Pines in its affordable housing strategy since the Planning Board granted Final and Amended Site Plan Approval dating back to 1988 for the Tinton Pines Development which included one hundred twenty-two condominium units (garden apartments and townhouses) of which 17 units were designated as *Mt. Laurel* deed restricted affordable housing units (nine units were designated for moderate income households and eight units were designated for low-income households); and

WHEREAS, West End Plaza Corp recorded the Tinton Pines Master Deed on or about August 11, 1988, recorded at Deed Book 4874-0065 through Deed Book 4874-0214 and which confirmed that 17 of the 122 condominium units were designated as affordable housing rental units for low and moderate-income households for a period of at least twenty (20) years; and

WHEREAS, Tinton Pines maintained the affordable housing controls on its affordable housing rental units for a period of at least thirty years and it seeks the Borough's concurrence to release the affordability controls on the units designated as such which now includes the properties designated on the Borough Tax Map as Block 124.49, Lots 93, 96-103, and 120-127 (the "Tinton Pines Affordable Housing Units"); and

WHEREAS COAH's regulations at N.J.A.C. 5:80-26.11 (e) provides that each restricted rental unit shall remain subject to affordability controls until the Borough elects to release the units from such controls through the execution of a Quitclaim Deed Releasing Unit from Affordability Controls; and

WHEREAS, since the Borough has received 34 affordable housing credits, including rental bonus credits, from the Tinton Pines Development and the Tinton Pines owner continued those affordability controls for a period of at least ten years beyond what was required of them, the Borough Council believes it is fair, just and in the best interest of the Borough to formally release the affordability controls on the Tinton Pines Affordable Housing Units.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Tinton Falls, County of Monmouth, and State of New Jersey that it hereby approves the release of the affordable housing deed restrictions on the Tinton Pines Affordable Housing Units and the Borough Administrative Agent is hereby authorized to execute a Quitclaim Deed Releasing Unit from Affordability Controls.
