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### REPORT OF MAYOR/COUNCIL/ADMINISTRATION

### **Borough Engineer – Thomas Neff**

Mr. Neff commented on Resolution R-20-180 to approve a State contract purchase for playground equipment at Traditions Park which is at the south end of town currently under construction with Shore Top Construction. Purchases

under State contract provides the Borough some savings. Resolution R-20-187 which is also for purchase under State contract for playground equipment at Hockhockson Park which is replacing existing playground equipment. At the next meeting there will be another resolution for this park replacing the rubber safety surface. He reported the County Road Paving program will include Shrewsbury Avenue to Newman Springs Road down to Rt. 35. They will be starting approximately October 14<sup>th</sup> at night with milling and paving on Shrewsbury Avenue.

### Director of Finance/ Acting Borough Administrator- Thomas Fallon

Mr. Fallon reported on the 2021 budget schedule stating the budget process has started. The departmental budget hearings will be held November 23<sup>rd</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup>. The Mayor's budget will then begin and will be sent to Council for review in February or early March with introduction in late March or early April. Also, the 2020 Best Practices Inventory has been released by the State. This assesses each municipality's compliance with various laws and evaluates implementation for fiscal and operational best practices. The filing deadline is November 3<sup>rd</sup>. Mr. Fallon will report on the results and expects the Borough to do well as in past results.

### **Director of Law- Kevin Starkey**

Mr. Starkey commented on Resolution R-20-179 renewal of distribution liquor license for Spirits Unlimited which closed, and we are renewing it as an inactive license currently held by a bankruptcy trustee. We will renew for one more year as required by law.

### Mayor's Report- Vito Perillo

Mayor Perillo applauds the comments of Council President regarding the ongoing operations of the Borough because of the people running it. He stated that enough is not said about the wonderful things all of the departments accomplish on a daily basis, and he wanted to recognize them for their work.

### Borough Clerk- Mrs. Hesler - No report

### Council's Report

- -Mrs. Clay commented on Resolution 20-178 Declaring October 4<sup>th</sup> thru October 10<sup>th</sup> Fire Prevention Week. She wanted to recognize our four fire departments who have more than 140 volunteer fire fighters. They do outstanding work and over the past three years they have collectively gone on 6,700 calls which included more than 300 structural fire calls which are dangerous and challenging. She thanked them for their service.
- -Mr. Nesci reported the Planning Board meeting on October 14<sup>th</sup> will hear the application for Amazon delivery center at 1251 Jumping Brook Road. He also gave an update on the senior housing near Park Place II. The Board has approved remote meeting technology for this application. Planning Board procedures are different, and the State has confirmed they should be conducted in person, but a component can be done remotely. We will comply so that people can be present remotely and will be performed according to the guidelines and the law. The next meeting will be a hybrid meeting. Board members and applicants will be present, but any other attendees can attend from home.
- -Mr. Siebert No report
- -Ms. Buckley reported as liaison to the Environmental Commission which meets the fourth Thursday of the month. She stated that at the September 24<sup>th</sup> meeting there was a high-level discussion regarding the revised storm water ordinance provisions that will be required by the NJDEP and the recommendations of Association of New Jersey Environmental Commission. Ms. Buckley advised that the next remote meeting is October 22<sup>nd</sup>.

Ms. Buckley replied that a steel pole manufacture is having product delays due to COVID-19 and the estimated delivery date is now mid-November. Mr. Neff concurred and stated once the poles are in place the process should be completed rather quickly.

**WHEREAS**, Tinton Falls is protected by an all-volunteer force of firefighters, who train and dedicate their time and efforts to our community admirably and with great distinction; and

**WHEREAS,** fire is a serious public safety concern both locally and nationally, and homes are the locations where people are at greatest risk from fire; and

**WHEREAS**, home fires killed more than 2,630 people in the United States in 2017, according to the National Fire Protection Association® (NFPA®), and fire departments in the United States responded to 357,000 home fires; and

**WHEREAS**, cooking is the leading cause of home fires in the United States where fire departments responded to more than 173,200 annually between 2013 and 2017; and

**WHEREAS**, two of every five home fires start in the kitchen, with 31% of these fires resulting from unattended cooking; and

**WHEREAS,** more than half of reported non-fatal home cooking fire injuries occurred when the victims tried to fight the fire themselves; and
