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#### Public Hearing - Open Space Grant Application - Hockhockson Park Synthetic Turf Baseball/Softball Field

Mr. Pak offered a motion to open the floor for the Open Space Grant Application Hearing, seconded by Ms. Fama.

Council President Mr. Baldwin turned the floor over to Borough Engineer Mr. Neff to summarize the application.

Mr. Neff explained the Borough can apply for a Monmouth County Municipal Open Space Grant and is requesting the maximum amount of \$250,000. There is a 50% match requirement for the Borough. The Borough is proposing to convert the existing Hockhockson Park Field #1 from natural grass to synthetic turf. The total cost for the project is estimated to be \$626,225. This includes grading, drainage pipes and stone, synthetic turf and infill, resetting the fences

and backstop, and sidewalks. The turf has a 10 year warranty. The cost to replace just the turf would be approximately \$200,000. The Little League has requested the improvements and is in support of the project.

The benefits of the project are that the turf is not impacted by rain and can be played on right after rain events, instead of waiting hours or days for the field to dry. Games will no longer have to be cancelled because of field conditions from weather. This will increase the usability of the field and allow additional boys and girls teams to play at the field. The turf will also drastically cut down on the labor and maintenance costs required for a natural grass field.

Mr. Baldwin opened the topic up to the public for discussion.

Denise Catalano, 11 Alpine Trail – Ms. Catalano questioned the value of installing an artificial turf baseball field for young players when she recently watched the Little League World Series games and noticed all the fields were grass and not artificial turf. Ms. Catalano also questioned the cost benefit analysis of installation and annual maintenance of the field over a ten year period versus DPW staff maintaining a grass field. She commented that the proposed new park at the southern end of town would be a project for which funds would be better spent then a single artificial turf baseball field. She also commented to keep in mind funding parity among all the sports organizations in the Borough.

Mr. Baldwin stated all costs for the project will be reviewed. Also, the timeline to develop another park at the southern end of town is not imminent but possible two to four years away.

Mayor Turning commented the Borough's involvement in maintaining the baseball fields is minimal such as DPW staff cutting the grass. The Little League Association manages the fields with their volunteers. The Borough is aware of drainage issues with the fields and have been discussing these issues with the League to provide solutions which they have offered to help fund.

Mr. Baldwin thanked Ms. Catalano for her comments and stated Council has not made a final decision on this project.

Ms. Fama had a few questions such as: if the Open Space Grant application is submitted for the turf baseball field for \$250,000 and the grant funds are approved, are the funds solely dedicated to that project? And, does the matching funds come from the Open Space Tax Fund for approximately \$350,000 or another revenue source? Ms. Fama also asked if approving the Open Space Grant application for the artificial turf at Hochhockson Park is the Council consenting to the project and can the grant application request be bifurcated and represent a natural grass option and/or turf field.

Mr. Neff replied the grant application funds need to be applied to the open space park project submitted and the matching grant fund amount will come from the Open Space Tax Fund. The grant application would need to specify either grass or turf field. Mr. Baldwin stated the Borough can accept or reject project funding.

Mr. Manginelli commented on the issue of Astroturf being a safe surface for young children to play on and suggested waiting for more information on the subject.

Mr. Neff stated there are many types of Astroturf and the products have greatly improved over the years.

Mr. Pak stated having been involved in Little League over the years; he is well versed in the safety issues concerning Astroturf versus grass fields. His concerns were more financial and do the benefits to a group of our taxpayers outweigh the cost of this project. He stated for every good reason to move forward with the turf field there is an opposing reason not to, so for now he is reserving his opinion on the matter.

Mr. Neff added that part of the grant approval process is to demonstrate the designated land can pass environmental concerns and this particular piece of land in Hockhockson Park would meet that approval.

Mr. Baldwin stated the ability to regain DPW resources and assign those resources elsewhere in the Borough is valuable. He understands a group of taxpayers have requested this for the park in order to increase the usability of the field but thinks the price is high and Council should discuss this further.

Mr. Neff stated the deadline date for application submission is September  $20^{th}$  and the application would include an approved resolution. Council's next meeting is September  $19^{th}$ .

Council agreed to pull the resolution from the consent agenda tonight.

There were no other questions or comments from the public.

### REPORT OF MAYOR/COUNCIL/ADMINISTRATION

#### Mayor's Report - Gerald M. Turning, Sr.

Mayor Turning expressed his appreciation for the DPW staff who has been working very hard at the Jumping Brook Pumping Sewage station for the past three weeks.

#### **Engineer's Report - Thomas Neff**

Mr. Neff stated the next grant application is the NJDOT Municipal Aid Grant for road paving. He suggested Water Street for this grant which is due October 6<sup>th</sup>. He has a meeting tomorrow with the County regarding the Hance Avenue and Sycamore traffic signal study. The Water Street sewage project will be starting on Monday and the road will be closed for approximately one week from Tinton Avenue to Rutgers Drive. Also, on tonight's agenda is a resolution to upgrade the Tinton Avenue pump station.

#### **Finance Director – Thomas Fallon**

Mr. Fallon stated the Borough has been awarded an additional \$550,000 in Green Acres Acquisition Grant Funds. The Borough will be able to draw \$400,000 of the funds towards the Traditions acquisition for a total funding of \$1.1 million of the Traditions acquisition. The funds will be received this year and be placed in the Borough's Open Space Trust Fund and an enabling resolution will be placed on the next meeting's agenda.

Mayor Turning commented on the history of the Traditions acquisition and complimented Mr. Fallon and everyone involved in reaching a positive outcome.

#### Interim Borough Administrator – Elizabeth Perez

Ms. Perez stated the Tinton Falls Library has been closed for several weeks due to mold issues in two areas. She has been working with the Borough's Joint Insurance Fund "JIF" and remediation companies who are providing quotes to fix the mold issue. During the month of September the Municipal Court is participating in an "Access & Fairness Survey" which will be available to all visitors to the municipal court to participate. On September 12, 2017 the Municipal Division Manager and his staff will be available to encourage visitors to complete the survey. Also, Monmouth Regional High School for the first time will have varsity soccer night games at the Sycamore Turf Field. She announced new Recreation programs such as painting classes for kids and adults and *StoryWalk* a joint project with the Library which displays large laminated pages from a children's book along an outdoor path located at Sycamore Park. The soccer program starts this Saturday for Kindergarten through Second Grade.

#### PUBLIC DISCUSSION OPEN

Joyce Gray, 119 Apple Orchard Drive – Ms. Gray expressed her concerns about the mold in the Library and she is also upset that the staff is on furlough while the building is being fixed. These are very loyal employees and she is ashamed that the employees are not being paid and wants to know why. These loyal employees will have to look for other jobs as they have bills to pay.

Ms. Perez commented the employees referenced are not employed by the Borough but the Tinton Falls Library Association. Mr. Fallon commented the Borough budget appropriates an approximate amount of \$340,000 annually to the Library and recommended her concerns be brought to the attention of the Library Board.

Susan Leanza – Wellington Drive – Library Employee for 25 Years – Ms. Leanza wants to know what happened to the money budgeted for salaries through the end of the year and why can't the employees continue to be paid until then. Ms. Leanza commented that employees can't make it on unemployment and will have to look for other jobs – this means possibly losing very loyal employees.

Betty Gass – On the Library Board – Treasurer – Ms. Gass reported the employees have been getting paid since August 16<sup>th</sup> and will be paid through September 9<sup>th</sup>. After that, the employees will be eligible to apply for unemployment. Ms. Gass also commented that last year during renovations, the employees were paid for several months without having to work. She also commented that once the library is fixed, everything in the basement will have to be thrown out and the library will need the money to replace those items.

Council President Baldwin commented that the Council has no control over how the money is spent by the Library Board. Mr. Baldwin asked Gary Gebele, Director of DPW, to give an update on the status of mold testing.

Mr. Gebele reported that a full evaluation is being conducted. He further explains the process takes time especially waiting for laboratory results. He reported that current testing shows that this is more of an allergen mold and not toxic mold. Right now, everything is in the hands of the adjuster who will have a recommendation on how to proceed.

Bruce Gray - 119 Apple Orchard Drive – Mr. Gray commented to Ms. Gass that he doesn't understand the logic of the decision to furlough the employees of the library when you will need those employees once the repairs are done to reorganize the library.

Council President Baldwin commented that this is not an issue that concerns this council and administration. He respectfully ask Mr. Gray to please take this issue up with the Library Board in a separate environment.

Ruth Santulli, 9 St. John Court – Thank the members of the council and administration for the way they are handling the Library's mold situation and for the code red messages. She asked that the website continue to be updated as well. She asked if the rest of the Library will be tested.

Mr. Gebele commented that the entire building will be tested.

Brock Siebert, 24 Leland Terrace – Mr. Siebert asked the Clerk if petitions were filed. Ms. Muttie replied that two candidates are running for Mayor (Gerald Turning and Vito Perillo) and two candidates are running for Councilmember-at-Large (John Manginelli and Brock Siebert).

There being no other comments from the public, Mr. Manginelli offered a motion to close the Public Discussion, seconded by Mr. Pak.
