- b. Water-Pumping under 1 million a day. SCADA project should be done early October. Transmitter boxes are about 16 months out from order date. Doing large meter testing. Will be putting in new valves in the Jefferson St area.
- c. Street-W Benton & W Jackson will be paved in about a week. Farnhan has done the chip sealing in the Lemonweir area and in mid September they will fog seal. Stu Westphal is retiring after 40 years on September 2. Paul Steele moved positions to Parks and Rec department.

a. On September 30-31 there will be a large tank going through town. Looking into alternate material, other than ductile, for water and sewer pipes, due to supply issues. Keeping up on the PFAS regulations.
