Work Session

- 1. 5:00 p.m. (20 min) Update on the Neighborhood Transportation Safety Program. The City has budgeted \$150,000 of the Road Operating (Gas Tax) fund for an annual Neighborhood Transportation Safety Program (NTSP) to construct projects suggested by the community. This presentation provides an update on this year's completed projects, projects currently underway, and a look at the 2025-2026 cycle.
- 2. 5:20 p.m. (45 min) Legislative Agenda Preparation. Thorn Run provided the City Council with a recap of the 2025 State Legislative Session and an update on federal advocacy on August 25, 2025. Unfortunately, there was not time for the City Council to brainstorm potential priority items for the 2026 legislative agendas during that meeting. Tonight, the City Council will consider priorities for the next calendar year.
- 3. 6:05 p.m. (25 min) Allocation of Funds to Outside Agencies. The grant process was opened in July and a letter of invitation was emailed to all organizations that received funding in

FY24/25 or that expressed an interest in participating this year; in addition, information on submitting applications was available on the City's website and social media platforms. The FY 25/26 budget set aside \$50,000 for outside agency grants. Staff will return with a formal resolution at a future Council meeting implementing the Council's direction on the allocation of funds.

- **4. 6:30 p.m. (10 min) Request for Review of Tow Ordinance Rates.** The City received a letter from Beaverton Towing requesting a review and adjustment of the current towing rate structure that is set by ordinance. Staff is seeking direction from the City Council regarding this request.
- 5. 6:40 p.m. (20 min) Council Meeting Agenda Review, Communications & Roundtable. Council will review the agenda for the September 8 City Council meeting, hear a report from the Assistant City Manager, and brief the Council on issues of mutual interest.
