Work Session

- 1. 5:30 p.m. (30 min) Current Regional Transportation Issues & Priorities for 2025. Staff will provide an update on current transportation topics of interest including ODOT funding and revenues, future TriMet transit planning, and the status of Washington County's 2023-2028 MSTIP (Major Streets & Transportation Improvement Program) funding cycle. In addition, as the 2025 legislative session approaches, transportation will be one of the critical issues for the state and the region; staff will facilitate a discussion about transportation priorities for the 2025 legislative session.
- 2. 6:00 p.m. (30 min) Neighborhood Transportation Safety Program Update. A key component of the Tualatin Moving Forward bond program was the Neighborhood Traffic Safety Program, which delivered over a dozen transportation safety-oriented projects suggested by the community with estimated costs in the range of \$100,000. Due to the success of that program, the City has budgeted \$150,000 of the Road Operating (Gas

Tax) fund for an annual Neighborhood Transportation Safety Program (NTSP) to similarly construct projects suggested by the community. Staff will provide an overview of the program, project suggestions received, the process used to determine which projects to advance, and an overview of the three projects recommended for detailed design towards construction through this program.
