**A. Aging and Disability Resource - Wendy Hutterer**

**C. Recreation Department Programs - Mike Mathis**

Mike reported that the extension trail is finished at Neshotah Beach and will be looking at redoing the signage at the beach. Planning to redo the restrooms by the horseshoe pits and remove the tennis courts. Fishing has been good this season because of the filling up bins at the fish station. Concession sales are at a all-time high and show the high level of traffic on the beach. With the increased traffic, the trash collection has increased. Parks and Rec staff are doing a wonderful job keeping up with trash as much as they can. The senior center will be releasing a survey to gage interest about senior focused outdoor equipment in the patio area where the pergola is currently.

Jerry made positive comments about the busyness of the beach and concerns about the removal of the volleyball courts.

Jo had questions about trees in the terrace. She experienced sewer back up due to old root systems. Mike explained how trees are picked to plant for specific sized terraces to prevent those types of issues in the future. Mike also clarified that shrubs are not allowed in the terrace.

D. Senior Center - Heather Ihlenfeldt

Heather reported on monthly statistics for the senior center. There were 274 Trust Car Rides, 1,445 meals delivered, and the average daily attendance was 109.43. 387 participants in various fitness classes, 101 congregate meal attendants, and the total member check in for June was 2,444.

Significant events in June were the collection of items for the Bridges mathematics program at the elementary schools. Community members have been very generous. The senior center hosted the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter birthday party. Fatso's subs and Chicken noodle soup from Connies Diner was served, with Mystic Moods was the scheduled entertainment. The party had good reviews, with close to 50 members in attendance. Sullivan Family Farms continue to provide their farm stand every other Tuesday with high quality produce that is chemical free. The center hosted a rock painting class that was also well attended. Cathy, the center's yoga instructor arranged a class at the London Dairy Alpaca Ranch. All proceeds collected were donated back to the ranch.

Upcoming events for the center include a senior center/back to school carnival night July 14<sup>th</sup> with special senior seating, 50/50 raffles, and free TRUST car rides. Back to School Carnival will be held August 6<sup>th</sup> from 4-7pm. On August 21<sup>st</sup> there will be senior center night at concerts in the park at 6pm, entertainment by the Del-Rays. Raffles and Free TRUST car rides available.

She also noted that there will in Two Rivers Tips in upcoming electric bills including lawn ordinances, school safety, and other pertinent topics.
