# State of the Agreement

# Agreement Authority

This agreement applies to all Department of Homeland Security Federal Emergency Management Agency (DHS/FEMA) awards or other awarding agency financial assistance awards administered by the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM). The federal government, the State of Texas, and TDEM have the right to seek judicial enforcement of these actions.

Subrecipients are required to follow applicable provisions of the Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards located at <u>Title 2, Code of Federal Regulations (C.F.R.) Part 200</u>, and adopted by DHS at <u>2 C.F.R. Part 3002</u>, as well as all other applicable federal, state, and local laws, regulations, policies, procedures, and executive orders.

By accepting this agreement, Subrecipient and its executives, as defined in <u>2 C.F. R.</u> §170.315, certify that the subrecipient's policies are in accordance with guidance applicable to federal, state and local laws, and relevant executive guidance. This agreement, consisting of these terms and conditions and all exhibits, is between the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM), an agency of the State of Texas, hereinafter referred to as TDEM, and Subrecipient.

TDEM and Subrecipient are collectively hereinafter referred to as the parties. All awards made under this agreement are subject to the same terms and conditions except where additional provisions may be added by TDEM to assure compliance with the aforementioned authority.

Subrecipient may not assign or transfer any interest in this award without prior written consent of TDEM and, if required, DHS/FEMA or other awarding agency.

# <u>Agreement</u>

#### I. General Terms

- 1. The terms recipient and pass-through entity have the same meaning as grantee, as used in governing statutes, regulations, and DHS/FEMA guidance.
- 2. Throughout this document the terms grant and award will be used interchangeably.
- 3. A recipient is a non-Federal entity for administration purposes.
- 4. A subrecipient is known as a subgrantee as used in governing statutes, regulations, and DHS/FEMA guidance.
- 5. The grant referred to in this agreement is an award to the subrecipient passed through from TDEM to Subrecipient.
- 6. The "certifying official" is the mayor, judge, or executive director authorized to execute these terms and conditions, and to submit changes of subrecipient agents. Contracted staff and/or vendors may assist the certifying official in completing related grant tasks but may not act in lieu of the certifying official.
- 7. Project and any subsequent versions for those projects accepted by Subrecipient and subsequently obligated or de-obligated by DHS/FEMA are considered subawards to this agreement.
- 8. TDEM uses contractors to assist in administering subawards, both in communication with Subrecipient and the awarding agency. A subrecipient's point of contact for all awards will be the assigned regional staff. TDEM may task various grant management tasks to contractors to work directly with subrecipients.
- 9. Within 10 calendar days of any change, Subrecipient must notify TDEM of any change in Designated Subrecipient Agents as submitted during the execution of this agreement, and any subsequent changes submitted by Subrecipient in TDEM's Grants Management System (GMS).
- 10. In the event Subrecipient hires a consultant to assist them with managing its Public Assistance and Hazard Mitigation grants (or other), they must be listed on the Designated Subrecipient Agent Form (DSA) and may not act in lieu of the designated agent. TDEM will direct all correspondence to the Subrecipient. The Subrecipient is solely responsible for sharing written communications with the consultant. The Subrecipient is the primary point of contact and must be included in all decision-making activities.

#### II. Standard of Performance

#### III. Failure to Perform

In the event Subrecipient fails to implement and complete the project(s) approved and awarded, or comply with any provision of this grant, Subrecipient is liable to TDEM for an amount not to exceed the amount of this award and may be barred from receiving additional DHS/FEMA grant program funds or any other grant program funds administered by the State of Texas until repayment is made and any other compliance or audit finding is satisfactorily resolved, in addition to any other remedy specified in this grant. Failure to timely implement and complete projects may reduce future funding in additional DHS/FEMA and/or other grant programs administered by TDEM.

# IV. Funding Obligations

TDEM is not liable to Subrecipient for any costs incurred by Subrecipient that are not allowable costs authorized under the applicable award.

- Notwithstanding any other provision of this grant, the total of all payments and other obligations incurred by TDEM under this award must not exceed the total cumulative award amounts listed on the subawards (projects and subsequent versions).

- 4. In the event that TDEM is required to continue to manage the subrecipients award after the Recipients (TDEM) allocated state management funds have been exhausted, subrecipient agrees to reimburse TDEM for such costs necessary to close FEMA awards including the final recoupment of any funds due to FEMA and/or TDEM and the State of Texas.

#### VII. State Requirements for Grants

Subrecipient must comply with all other federal, state, and local laws and regulations applicable to this award including but not limited to the laws and the regulations promulgated in Texas Government Code, Chapter 783, Uniform Grant and Contract Management (UGMS) at:

Subrecipient must, in addition to the assurances and certifications, comply and require each of its subcontractors employed in the completion of the project to comply with all applicable statutes, regulations, executive orders, Office of Management and Budget (OMB) circulars,

terms and conditions of this award and the approved application.

Grant funds must not be awarded to or expended by any entity which performs political polling. This prohibition does not apply to a poll conducted by an academic institution as part of the institution's academic mission that is not conducted for the benefit of a particular candidate or party.

Award funds may not be expended by a unit of local government unless the following limitations and reporting requirements are satisfied:

- 1. Texas General Appropriations Act, Art. IX, Parts 2 and 3, except there is no requirement for increased salaries for local government employees;
- 2. - 6. Subrecipient agrees that it shall not make any subaward agreement or contract without first obtaining the subawardee's mandatory UEI.
- 7. Subrecipient must comply with Federal Executive Orders <u>12549</u> and <u>12689</u>, which provide protection against waste, fraud, and abuse by debarring or suspending those persons deemed irresponsible in their dealings with the Federal government

- 9. Subrecipient shall maintain property/inventory records which, at minimum, shall include a description of the property, a serial number or other identification number, the source of property, who holds title, the acquisition date, the cost of the property, the percentage of federal participation in the cost of the property, the location, use and condition of the property, and any ultimate disposition data including the date of disposal and sale price of the property. Subrecipient shall develop and implement a control system to prevent loss, damage, or theft of property and Subrecipient shall investigate and document any loss, damage or theft of property funded under this grant.
- 10. DHS/FEMA and/or TDEM, through its authorized representatives, have the right at all reasonable times to make site visits to review project accomplishments and management control systems and to provide such technical assistance as may be required. If any site visit is made by DHS/FEMA or TDEM on the premises of Subrecipient or a contractor under this grant, Subrecipient must provide and must require its contractors to provide all reasonable facilities and assistance for the safety and convenience of the government representatives in the performance of their duties. All site visits and evaluations shall be performed in such a manner that will not unduly delay the work. A final physical site inspection for eligible scope of work and program compliance may be conducted after the subrecipient's Project Completion and Certification Report has been submitted.

## IX. Procurement Contracting

Subrecipient shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws and requirements, including but not limited to proper competitive solicitation processes where required, for any procurement which utilizes federal funds awarded under this

award in accordance with 2 C.F.R. 200. 317-327 and Appendix II to Part 200 (A-C) and (E-J).

- All contracts executed using funds awarded under this award shall contain the contract provisions listed under <u>2 C.F.R. 200.327</u> and Appendix II (A), Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grants and Cooperative Agreements to State and Local Governments.
- 2. For each of the following types of procurement, activities must follow the most restrictive of federal, state, or local procurement regulations:
  - a. Micro purchase
  - b. Small purchase
  - c. Sealed bid
  - d. Competitive proposal
  - e. Non-Competitive proposal (solely when the award of a contract is unfeasible under the other methods)
- 3. The State must approve the use of a noncompetitive procurement method. Federal regulations allow for noncompetitive procurements under certain circumstances, including when a non-state entity determines that immediate actions required to address the public exigency or emergency cannot be delayed by a competitive solicitation. Failure to follow eligible procurement methods will result in ineligible costs. Other types of agreements for services must have State approval prior to use or execution. A copy of the local procurement policy must be provided to the State before initial payment.
- 4. Contracts attributed as "cost-plus-percentage-of-cost" or "percentage-of-construction-cost" are explicitly prohibited by Federal procurement standards and are ineligible for DHS/FEMA grant.

#### X. Monitoring

Subrecipient will be monitored periodically by federal, state, or local entities, both programmatically and financially, to ensure that project goals, objectives, performance requirements, timelines, milestone completion, budget, and other program-related criteria are met.

- a. TDEM, or its authorized representative, reserves the right to perform periodic desk/office-based and/or on-site monitoring of subrecipient's compliance with this award and of the adequacy and timeliness of subrecipient's performance pursuant to this award.
- b. After each monitoring visit, if the monitoring visit reveals deficiencies in subrecipient's performance under this grant, a monitoring report will be provided to the subrecipient that includes requirements for the timely correction of such deficiencies by subrecipient. Failure by subrecipient to take action(s) specified in the monitoring report may be cause for suspension or termination of this award pursuant to the Changes, Amendments, Suspensions or Termination Section (XIII) herein.

#### XI. Audit

Subrecipients expending \$750,000 or more in total federal financial assistance in a fiscal year will be required to provide an audit made in accordance with OMB Uniform Guidance; Cost Principles, Audit, and Administrative Requirements for Federal Awards, Subpart F.

1. A copy of the Single Audit must be submitted to TDEM or your cognizant state agency within nine months of the end of the subrecipient's fiscal year. If not required to submit a single audit, a response to the request will suffice. Failing to follow the regulation can result in significant adverse consequences including any action listing in the Enforcement Section (XIV) of this agreement Subrecipient must give DHS/FEMA, the Comptroller General of the United States, the Texas State Auditor, TDEM, or any of their duly authorized representatives access to and the right to conduct a financial or compliance audit of funds received, and performances rendered under this award. Subrecipient must permit TDEM or its authorized representative to audit subrecipient's records. Subrecipient must provide any documents, materials, or information necessary to facilitate such audit.

- Subrecipient understands and agrees that it is liable to TDEM for any costs
  disallowed pursuant to any financial or compliance audit(s) of these funds.
  Subrecipient further understands and agrees that reimbursement to TDEM of
  such disallowed costs shall be paid by Subrecipient from funds that were not
  provided or otherwise made available to the subrecipient pursuant to this award
  or any other federal contract.
- 2. Subrecipient must take such action to facilitate the performance of such audit(s) conducted pursuant to this section as TDEM may require of Subrecipient. Subrecipient must ensure that this clause concerning the authority to audit funds received indirectly by subcontractors through Subrecipient and the requirement to cooperate is included in any subcontract it awards.
- 3. Subrecipient understands that acceptance of funds under this award acts as acceptance of the authority of the State Auditor's Office to conduct an audit or investigation in connection with those funds. Subrecipient further agrees to cooperate fully with the State Auditor's Office's audit or investigation, including providing all records requested. Subrecipient must ensure that this clause concerning the State Auditor's Office's authority to audit funds and the requirement to cooperate fully with the State Auditor's Office is included in any subgrants or subcontracts it awards. Additionally, the State Auditor's Office shall at any time have access to and the rights to examine, audit, excerpt, and transcribe any pertinent books, documents, working papers, and records of Subrecipient relating to this award.

## XII. Retention and Accessibility of Records

Subrecipient shall follow its own internal retention policy, or the State's retention policy, whichever is more restrictive. At a minimum, the subrecipient must maintain fiscal records and supporting documentation for all expenditures of this award's funds pursuant to the applicable <a href="OMB 2 C.F.R. Subpart D - Post Federal Award Requirements">OMB 2 C.F.R. Subpart D - Post Federal Award Requirements</a>, §200.334-338, and this agreement.

1. Subrecipient shall retain these records and any supporting documentation for a minimum of three (3) years from the later of the completion of this project's public objective, submission of the final expenditure report, or any litigation, dispute, or audit.

- 2. Records shall be retained for three (3) years after any real estate or equipment final disposition.
- 3. DHS/FEMA or TDEM may direct subrecipient to retain documents or to transfer certain records to DHS/FEMA custody when DHS/FEMA determines that the records possess long term retention value.

Subrecipient must give DHS/FEMA, the Comptroller General of the United States, the Texas State Auditor, TDEM, or any of its duly authorized representatives, access to and the right to examine all books, accounts, records, reports, files, other papers, things, or property belonging to or in use by subrecipient pertaining to this award including records concerning the past use of DHS/FEMA funds. Such rights to access shall continue as long as the records are retained by Subrecipient.

XIII. Changes, Amendments, Suspensions or Termination

TDEM may modify this agreement after an award has been made. Once notification has been made in writing, any subsequent request for funds indicates Subrecipient's acceptance of the changes to this subrecipient award. Any alteration, addition, or deletion to this agreement by subrecipient is not valid.

Any alterations, additions, or deletions to this agreement that are required by changes in federal and state laws, regulations, or policy are automatically incorporated into this agreement without written amendment to this award and shall become effective upon the date designated by such law or regulation. In the event DHS/FEMA or TDEM determines that changes are necessary to this agreement after an award has been made, including changes to the period of performance of the award, or terms and conditions, the certifying official shall be notified electronically of the changes in writing. Once notification has been made, any subsequent request for refunds will indicate subrecipients acceptance of the changes to this award.

- In the event subrecipient fails to comply with any term of this grant or agreement, TDEM may, upon written notification to subrecipient, suspend this award, in whole or in part, withhold payments to Subrecipient, and prohibit Subrecipient from incurring additional obligations of this grant's funds.
- 2. TDEM has the right to terminate this award, in whole or in part, at any time before the end of the Performance Period, if TDEM determines that subrecipient has failed to comply with any terms of this grant. TDEM shall provide written notice of the termination that includes:
  - a. The reason(s) for such determination;
  - b. The effective date of such termination; and

- c. The scope of the termination of the award.
- d. Termination of an award is final.

#### XIV. Enforcement

If subrecipient materially fails to comply with any term of this award or agreement, whether stated in a federal or state statute or regulation, an assurance, in a state plan or application, a notice of award, or elsewhere, TDEM or DHS/FEMA may take one or more of the following actions, as appropriate in the circumstances:

- Increased monitoring of projects and require additional financial and performance reports;
- 2. Require all payments as reimbursements rather than advance payments;
- 3. Temporarily withhold payments pending correction of the deficiency;
- 4. Disallow or deny use of funds and matching credit for all or part of the cost of the activity or action not in compliance;
- 5. Request DHS/FEMA to wholly or partially de-obligate funding for a project;
- 6. Withhold cash payments pending correction of the deficiency bysubrecipient or more severe enforcement action by TDEM or DHS/FEMA;
- 7. Withhold future awards for the grant program; and
- 8. Take other remedies that may be legally available

In taking an enforcement action, TDEM will adhere to any administrative proceeding to which Subrecipient is entitled under any statute or regulation applicable to the action involved, and where TDEM, as the recipient, is obligated to follow.

The costs to a subrecipient resulting from expenses incurred by the subrecipient during a suspension or after termination of this award are not allowable.

The enforcement remedies identified in this section, including suspension and termination, do not preclude subrecipient from being subject to "Debarment and Suspension" under Executive Order 12549. 2 C.F.R., Appendix II Part 200, (1).

#### XV. Conflicts of Interest

The subrecipient must maintain and provide upon request written standards of conduct covering conflicts of interest and governing the actions of its employees engaged in the selection, award and administration of contracts and must establish safeguards to prohibit employees from using their positions for a purpose that

constitutes or presents the appearance of personal or organizational conflict of interest or personal gain.

# XVI. Closing of this Award

TDEM will close each subaward after receiving all required final documentation from the subrecipient. If the close out review and reconciliation indicates that subrecipient is owed additional funds, TDEM will send the final payment automatically to subrecipient. If Subrecipient did not use all the funds received, TDEM will recover the unused funds. This does not affect:

- 1. DHS/FEMA or TDEM's right to disallow costs and recover funds on the basis of a later audit or other review;
- 2. Subrecipient's obligation to return any funds due as a result of later refunds, corrections, or other transactions;
- 3. Records retention requirements, property management requirements, and audit requirements, as set forth herein; and
- 4. Any other provisions of this award that impose continuing obligations on Subrecipient or that govern the rights and limitations of the parties to this award after the expiration or termination of this award.

#### XVII. Notices

All notices and other communications pertaining to this agreement shall be delivered in electronic format and shall be transmitted in TDEM's Grant Management System, hereinafter referred to as "GMS". TDEM reserves the right to use other delivery avenues as needed.

# XVIII. TDEM Grants Management System

TDEM requires the use of the TDEM's Grants Management System (GMS) for subrecipient grant management functions. Subrecipient is required to access GMS for all grant related functions as required by TDEM unless written authorization from TDEM is given. Requested forms and processes may be adjusted and changed to accommodate GMS processes and requirements.

Subrecipient agrees to monitor GMS as necessary to properly manage and complete awarded projects under this agreement. Paper forms and email requests to initiate grant management functions within GMS are not accepted.

#### XIX. Performance Period

The performance period for this award is listed on the subaward letter for each project. All projects must be completed within the performance period and within the approved budget. Subrecipient shall have expended all award funds and must submit final requests for reimbursements, invoices, and any supporting documentation to TDEM no later than 60 calendar days after the end of the performance period. TDEM is not obligated to reimburse expenses incurred after the performance period or submitted after the deadline.

From time to time, the performance period for grants may be extended by TDEM. These extensions do not change the established performance periods for subrecipients to submit final requests for reimbursements, invoices, and any supporting documentation.

- 1. All work must be done prior to the approved project completion deadline assigned to each project.
  - a. For Public Assistance projects written at 100% complete, documentation must be submitted within 60 days of the Recovery Scoping Meeting (or DHS/FEMA process equivalent).
  - b. For projects not written at 100% complete for both Hazard Mitigation and Public Assistance awards, documentation must be submitted within 60 days of the work completion date.
- 2. Should additional time be required, a time extension request must be submitted which:
  - a. Identifies the projects requiring an extension;
  - b. Explains the reason for an extension;
  - c. Indicates the percentage of work that has been completed;
  - d. Provides an anticipated completion date;
  - e. Provides detailed milestones documenting expected progress.

The reason for an extension must be based on extenuating circumstances, or unusual project requirements that are beyond the control of Subrecipient. Failure to submit a time extension request 90 days prior to the end of the period of performance may result in denial, or reduction or withdrawal of federal funds for approved work.

## XX. Cost/Scope Modification

Any change to a project's approved scope of work must be reported and approved through TDEM and DHS/FEMA before starting the project. Failure to do so will jeopardize award funding.

Subrecipient shall submit requests for cost overruns to TDEM for review. Any requests sent for a Public Assistance project will be submitted to DHS/FEMA for review and approval. Approval of these requests is not guaranteed and is subject to funding availability. Costs incurred prior to approval of any scope or budget/cost changes may be denied.

### XXI. Final Expenditures Report

The Project Completion and Certification Report (P4) must be submitted to TDEM within 90 days of all approved work being completed for each project. If any project requires the purchase of insurance as a condition of receiving federal funds, a copy of the current policy must be attached to this report and the Applicant's Attestation for Duplication of Benefits (DOB) form certifying other funds were received to complete the project.

## XXII. Net Small Project Overrun

If the total actual cost of all of a subrecipient's Public Assistance small projects combined exceeds the total obligated for all small projects, the subrecipient may request additional funding through the appeal process, within 60 days of the latest work completion date of all its Small Projects, as described in the <a href="Public Assistance">Public Assistance</a> <a href="Program and Policy Guide">Program and Policy Guide</a>. A net small project overrun appeal will require a review of all small projects and could result in a reduction of funding.

#### XXIII. Appeals

#### Public Assistance

In the event that a subrecipient does not agree with the determinations made by DHS/FEMA, the subrecipient has the right to file an appeal. This appeal must be submitted in GMS by initiating a New Project Appeal, attaching documented justification supporting the subrecipient's position, specifying the monetary figure in dispute and the provisions in federal law, regulation, or policy with which the subrecipient believes the initial action was inconsistent. Additionally, for disasters declared on or after January 1, 2022, subrecipients must submit appeals using DHS/FEMA's Grants Portal system, in addition to GMS. An appeal must be submitted by the subrecipient within the following time frames:

- a. Any DHS/FEMA determination 60 days from the written notice of the determination being made.
- b. Second Appeal 60 days from the written notice of the determination made on the previous appeal.

Appeals should be addressed to the TDEM's Deputy Chief of Recovery & Mitigation and should contain additional information that the subrecipient wants to have considered. Upon receipt of an appeal from Subrecipient, TDEM will review the material submitted, and forward the appeal with a written recommendation to DHS/FEMA within 60 days.

For presidentially declared disasters on or after October 30, 2012, a subrecipient may choose to arbitrate in lieu of submitting a second appeal. The arbitration program is designed to offer an alternate second appeal process by providing final adjudication through an independent, neutral panel of arbitrators for particular PA projects involving a dispute equal to or in excess of \$500,000 (or \$100,000 if the Applicant is in a "rural area", defined as having a population of less than 200,000 living outside an urbanized area) and must be filed within 60 days of receipt of the first appeal decision. For specific information, refer to 44 CFR § 206.206.

# 2. Hazard Mitigation

In the event that a subrecipient does not agree with the determinations made by DHS/FEMA, the subrecipient has the right to file an appeal. This appeal must be submitted in GMS by initiating a New Project Appeal, attaching documented justification supporting the subrecipient's position, specifying the monetary figure in dispute and the provisions in federal law, regulation, or policy with which the subrecipient believes the initial action was inconsistent. In accordance with 44 C.F.R §206.440, an appeal must be submitted by the subrecipient within the following time frames:

- a. Any DHS/FEMA or TDEM determination 60 days from the date of the determination of the appeal written on the DHS/FEMA letter;
- b. Second Appeal 60 days from the written notice of the determination made on the previous appeal. The decision of the Second Appeal is final and not subject to arbitration.

Appeals must be addressed to the State Hazard Mitigation Officer (SHMO) and should contain additional information, in accordance with Hazard Mitigation Assistance (HMA) guidance, that the subrecipient wants to have considered by DHS/FEMA. Upon receipt of an appeal from the subrecipient, TDEM will forward the appeal to DHS/FEMA within 60 days.

## XXIV. Requests for Reimbursement

Subrecipient will request payment of funds on projects by initiating a request for reimbursement (RFR) in GMS or an advance of funds request (AFR) through GMS. The request must include documentation supporting the request.

Payments for open projects must be requested at least quarterly if expenditures have been made in that quarter. If payment is not requested quarterly, Subrecipient is subject to enforcement mechanisms described in the Enforcement section (XIV). Additional monitoring may be required of subrecipients if funds are advanced.

Small projects will be paid upon completion of work and submission of all necessary closeout documentation to TDEM. Due to the increase of the small project maximum, subrecipients may require an Advance of Funds to pay eligible costs of approved project scopes of work.

## XXV. Quarterly Report Requirements

Subrecipients must submit quarterly progress reports (QPR) for open, large projects in Public Assistance, all Hazard Mitigation Grant Program, Building Resilient Infrastructure and Committees (BRIC), and Pre-Disaster Mitigation Grant projects using GMS. QPRs are due to TDEM the 15<sup>th</sup> of the month after the reporting period ends. The reporting period consists of 4 3-month periods:

- a. Quarter 1 (Q1): October December
- b. Quarter 2 (Q2): January March
- c. Quarter 3 (Q3): April June
- d. Quarter 4 (Q4): July September

Failure to submit required QPRs that demonstrate appropriate project progress for two or more quarters, or Requests for Reimbursement (RFR) not submitted quarterly, can result in the withholding or de-obligation of funding for subrecipients until all QPRs are submitted to TDEM.

TDEM may use the data provided in QPRs when considering requests for overruns, period of performance extensions, or any other award activity. If projects are not progressing, TDEM will require additional reporting or may take any other appropriate action to comply with required standards.

#### XXVI. Equipment Records

When an individual item of equipment is no longer required for federally-funded programs or projects, Subrecipient must calculate the current fair market value of the individual item. If items have a fair market value in excess of \$5,000.00, Subrecipient must make DHS/FEMA aware. For full rules and regulations regarding purchased

equipment, reference 2 C.F.R. 200.313.

#### XXVII. FEMA Public Assistance Portal and FEMA GO

In addition to TDEM's Grants Management System, must utilize the required DHS/FEMA grant management systems. The FEMA Public Assistance Delivery Model, or Simplified Application process, is used to facilitate the writing of project worksheets in FEMA's Grants Portal system (Portal). The subrecipient must establish and maintain an active account in the Portal. It is the subrecipient's responsibility to provide and upload timely, all information requested that is needed to write accurate project worksheets. The Portal provides the subrecipient visibility of the entire project writing process.

The FEMA Grant Outcomes (FEMA GO) platform is used to facilitate the application, tracking, and management of Hazard Mitigation Grant Programs (HMGP) including Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC), Flood Mitigation Assistance (FMA), and HMGP Post Fire Assistance. The subrecipient is responsible for requesting and maintaining an active account in FEMA GO and responding timely to any information requested in order to complete the award process.

The use of FEMA's Grants Portal and FEMA GO do not eliminate the requirement to use TDEM's Grants Management System.

#### XXVIII. Indirect Cost Rates

The subrecipient may use the negotiated Indirect Cost Rate approved by its cognizant agency, or may use the 10 percent de minimis rate of modified total direct costs (MTDC) (as per <u>2 C.F.R. § 200.414</u>) when receiving Management Costs.

## XXIX. Request for Information

TDEM and/or DHS/FEMA may request additional information from the subrecipient throughout the life cycle of this grant. This process, the Request for Information, herein referred to as RFI. DHS/FEMA RFIs may be received directly from TDEM's Grants Management System (GMS), FEMA systems (FEMA Grants Portal & FEMA GO), DHS/FEMA employees, or indirectly through TDEM representatives. DHS/FEMA RFI timeframes may vary, but due dates are always communicated upon transmission of the RFI. The TDEM RFI policies can be found in Exhibits G & H.

TDEM will work with Subrecipients throughout the RFI process as communication is the key to success.

This policy will be applied to Public Assistance and Hazard Mitigation projects for management and closeout activities after obligation. This policy will address non-responsive and inadequate responses to requests for information. Although the timeline outlines milestones to be completed, nothing limits the ability of TDEM from sending communications.

Day 1

TDEM regional coordinators or the Support Affiliate will reach out to Subrecipient's primary contact requesting the information needed. Communication will be documented in GMS.

Day 10

If adequate response is not received, TDEM Regional Unit Chief will reach out to Subrecipient primary contact. Communication will be documented in GMS.

Day 20

If adequate response is not received, TDEM Regional Section Chief will reach out to Subrecipient primary contact. Communication will be documented in GMS.

Day 30

If adequate response is not received, TDEM regional coordinator or Support Affiliate will send a letter, signed by the Regional Unit or Section Chief notifying the subrecipient of the missed deadline and any action that will be taken.

Extension Request

If Subrecipient requires additional time a written request must be submitted to the Regional Coordinator no later than Day 30. Extensions will be approved at TDEM's discretion and up to 30 days may be granted; in total an RFI will have a window of no more than 60 days.

End of Extension If adequate response is not received, TDEM regional coordinator will send a letter, signed by the Regional Unit or Section Chief notifying the subrecipient of the missed deadline and any action that will be taken.

# Exhibit H: Pre-Obligation Request for Information Policy

Timelines for providing complete and accurate information and documentation are crucial to the success of the overall Grant Program and to the timely obligation of projects. TDEM has developed a framework following a progressive series of communications for the subrecipient, referred to as Request for Information (RFI). TDEM will work with subrecipients throughout the RFI process as communication is the key to success.

This policy will be applied to Hazard Mitigation projects for management activities preobligation. This policy will address non-responsive and inadequate responses to requests for information. The timeline outlined below represents a single, 15-day period beginning from TDEM's first review of Subrecipient's application. Failure to supply timely responses could result in dismissal of application or award submission. Although the timeline outlines milestones to be completed, nothing limits the ability of TDEM from sending communications.

Day 1

Upon initial review of Subrecipient's HMGP application, TDEM staff will initiate contact with Subrecipient via email. This first communication begins the 15-day pre-obligation request for information policy timeline.

Day 6

5 days after the first communication, if adequate response is not received, the Regional Unit Chief will issue a read receipt, high importance email to the Subrecipient's primary contact highlighting previous requests and notifying Subrecipient of the 10 remaining days to provide the requested information.

Day 11

5 days after the second communication, if adequate response is not received, TDEM staff will issue a formal reminder through a letter signed by the Regional Unit Chief and emailed to the Subrecipient's primary contact and Certifying Official informing them of the final 5 days remaining to provide the requested information. The Assistant Chief is to be copied on the email for visibility.

Day 16

5 days after the third communication, if adequate response is not received, TDEM staff will send a letter, signed by the Regional Unit Chief, to Subrecipient's primary contact notifying Subrecipient of missed deadline.

#### Exhibit I: Recoupment of Funds

#### **Procedure Summary**

- This procedure is to ensure responsible spending of federal dollars, <u>2 CFR § 200.344</u> and <u>2 CFR § 200.345</u> require that the State of Texas and the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM) act to identify and recover any improper payments.
- 2. This procedure applies to all Division subrecipients that receive funds from or through TDEM and explains the process by which funding to subrecipients will be recovered in the event that such funding is determined to be an overpayment or is not expended appropriately under the terms and conditions between TDEM and the subrecipient and/or applicable FEMA program, statue, regulations, or guidance.
- 3. The federal dollars described in this policy are passed through the Division, which serves as the Governor's authorized representative for certain federal grants and awards. Any amount of debt owed to the federal government is ultimately the responsibility of the State of Texas, not specifically the responsibility of the Division.

#### **Procedure**

- 1. Applicability of Recoupment
  - 1.1. This procedure will be applied to subrecipients that have been determined by the Division to have received an overpayment or that the Division determines has not spent federal funds in accordance with their grant or financial award.
- 2. Recipient's Responsibilities
  - 2.1. subrecipients are required to sign Grant Terms and Conditions prior to receipt of funds that stipulate subrecipients shall refund to the Division any sum that has been determined by the Division to be an overpayment to Subrecipient or that the Division determines has not been spent by Subrecipient in accordance with their grant or financial award.
  - 2.2. No refund payment(s) shall be made from local, state or federal grant funds unless repayment with grant funds is specifically permitted under the applicable program.
  - 2.3. Subrecipients shall make such refund to the Division within thirty (30) calendar days after the Division requests such refund.
- 3. Division Collection Actions

- 3.1. Upon determination that a subrecipient has received an overpayment or has not expended funds in accordance with the grant or fiscal award, the following steps will be taken:
  - 3.1.1. First Formal Communication: A recoupment letter will be sent to the subrecipient's Authorized Agent(s) highlighting the amount of federal funds owed, electronic transfer information, and the requirement to repay the amount within thirty (30) calendar days.
    - 3.1.1.1. The communication will be sent using electronic mail to the designated agent identified in the grant/funding application, and;
    - 3.1.1.2. Posted in TDEM's Grants Management System (GMS), and;
  - 3.1.2. The Division will confirm receipt of the recoupment letter by either receiving a written confirmation from the subrecipient or making documented verbal contact with the subrecipients designated agent, mayor, or county judge as applicable.
  - 3.1.3. If the subrecipient fails to make repayment of the amount identified in the recoupment letter within thirty (30) business days of receipt of the letter, the Division may offset an applicant's owed funds against current available funding due to applicant unless an agreement to return funding is reached with the applicant as approved by TDEM
  - 3.1.4. If the repayment is not made, the Division shall send an additional notice to the subrecipient by electronic mail and posted to the TDEM Grants Management System (GMS) thirty (30) to forty-five (45) days after the first letter was sent and then confirm receipt of the recoupment letter by either receiving a written confirmation from the subrecipient or making documented verbal contact with the subrecipients designated agent, mayor, or county judge as applicable. This letter will indicate the amount of funds that have been transferred to offset the amount due and remaining balance or will confirm if offset will occur. In addition, the letter will contain information related to recoupment options that may be taken in accordance with section 3.2 Delinquent Accounts.

If the repayment is not made after the second letter, the Division shall send a third notice to the subrecipient by electronic mail and posted to the TDEM Grants Management System (GMS) thirty (30) to forty-five (45) days after the second letter was sent and then confirm receipt of the recoupment letter by either receiving a written confirmation from the subrecipient or making documented verbal contact with the subrecipients designated agent, mayor, or county judge as applicable. This letter will indicate the amount of funds that have been

transferred to offset the amount due and remaining balance or will confirm if offset will occur. In addition, the letter will contain information related to recoupment options that may be taken in accordance with section 3.2 Delinquent Accounts.

3.1.5. If the subrecipient fails to make repayment of the amount identified in the recoupment letter or enter an agreement to repay the funding with the Division approved by TDEM within one hundred twenty (120) days from the date that the original recoupment letter was sent, the Division will take any and all authorized actions to withhold funding for other grants, including issuing a State Comptroller Warrant Hold and/or referring the matter to the attorney general. The Division shall notify the subrecipient of any such decision.

#### 3.2. Delinquent Accounts

#### 3.2.1. Delinguency Determination

- 3.2.1.1. If a subrecipient fails to make repayment of the amount identified in the recoupment letter or enter an agreement approved by TDEM to repay the funding with the Division within 120 days from the date the original recoupment letter was sent, the Division may determine that the account is delinquent.
- 3.2.1.2. At TDEM's sole discretion, TDEM may authorize payment plans that fully reimburse the full amount owed over a 1–9-month period or prior to the end of the grant period. From time to time, variances in approved timelines may occur based on the phase of the grant process and other timelines determined by FEMA such as periods of performance and closeout liquidation periods.
- 3.2.1.3. Should a subrecipient enter into a payment plan and then fail to make more than one timely payment, the payment plan shall be considered invalid and the full balance shall be due within 30 calendar days. If payment is not made within 30 days, the actions contained within Section 3.1.7 and Section 3.2.

#### 3.2.2. Warrant Hold Process

- 3.2.2.1. Once the Division has determined that the debt is delinquent, the Division may utilize the state comptroller's warrant hold process to ensure payments are not issued to the individual or entity that is indebted to the state.
- 3.2.3. Referral to the Attorney General

- 3.2.3.1. Once the account is determined to be delinquent, the Division may determine whether to refer the account to the Attorney General through the System Office of the General Counsel.
- 3.2.3.2. The determination as to the manner in which to pursue the collection of the account must consider the following:
  - 3.2.3.2.1. The size of the debt:
  - 3.2.3.2.2. The existence of any security or collateral;
  - 3.2.3.2.3. The likelihood of collection through passive means;
  - 3.2.3.2.4. The cost to the Division or Attorney General in attempting to collect the obligation; and
  - 3.2.3.2.5. The availability of resources within the Division or Attorney General to devote to the collection of the obligation.
- 3.2.4. Referral to the Attorney General
  - 3.2.4.1. Upon a determination to refer to the Attorney General, the Division shall notify the subrecipient of the delinquency status of the account, including the amount in no more than two mailed letters.
    - 3.2.4.1.1. The first demand letter shall be mailed USPS First Class Mail within 30 days after the debt has been determined delinquent and an Attorney General referral is desired.
    - 3.2.4.1.2. The second demand letter shall be mailed USPS First Class Mail between 30-60 days after the first demand letter was mailed if repayment of the amount has not occurred.
  - 3.2.4.2. If the Division determines that it will refer the matter to the Attorney General, it shall, through the System Office of the General Counsel, notify the Attorney General around the 90<sup>th</sup> day after the first demand letter was sent.
- 3.3. The Division shall maintain copies of all communications with the subrecipients regarding the recoupment of the grant or financial award funding.
- 4. TDEM's Ability to Remedy

Nothing in this procedure shall limit TDEM's ability to implement alternative remedies for which it has authority to resolve outstanding recoupments.

Nothing in this policy shall prohibit TDEM from immediately taking any recoupment action after the first thirty (30) day notice has been issued requesting repayment.

COUNTY OF WALLER §

This Agreement is between Waller County, hereinafter called "County," and the City of Pattison, hereinafter called "City."

#### WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the legislative purpose and intent of the Interlocal Cooperation Act, Section 791.001, Texas Government Code, is to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of local government by authorizing the fullest possible range of inter-governmental contracting authority at the local level, including contracts between counties and other political subdivisions and agencies of the state;

WHEREAS, the County and City are authorized to enter into contracts and agreements for the performance of governmental functions, including for the performance of services in the general area of streets, roads and drainage; and

WHEREAS, the County recognizes the need to provide safe and well-maintained public roadways, including city streets, for the benefit its citizens; and

WHEREAS, the City recognizes the need to provide safe and well-maintained public roadways the City for the benefit of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, both the County and City recognize the need for repairs to the City's streets, for the public purpose of providing safe and well-maintained public roadways for its citizens; and

WHEREAS, the County has manpower, equipment, and other resources to facilitate repairs; and

WHEREAS, the City has manpower, equipment, and other resources to facilitate repairs; and

WHEREAS, the parties recognize that cooperation between the governmental agencies will provide better service to the public at reduced expense by avoiding costly duplication of manpower, equipment, and other resources; and

NOW, THEREFORE, both the County and City in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions contained herein and in recognition of the benefits to be gained by citizens of the County and City, promise and agree as follows:

1. The County and City agree that road work and repair shall be governed on the following roads as set forth herein:

Clapp Road: FM 359 to FM 362 – Shall be maintained by Waller County; All the sections in the City will be maintained by the County including roadside ditch drainage.

Durkin Road: FM 359 to Royal Road – Shall be maintained by City of Pattison; All the sections in the County will be maintained by the City.

Royal Road: Durkin Road to FM 362 – Shall be maintained by City of Pattison; All the sections in the County will be maintained by the City.

Sterling Road: City Limits to approximately 700 feet South; Shall be maintained by City of Pattison; however, County will rehabilitate this section of road later this year when County rehabilitates the County's section of Sterling Road. The City shall contribute \$10,000.00 for road base, prime coat, and surfacing materials.

- 2. Each party paying for the performance of governmental functions or services must make those payments from current revenues available to the paying party.
- 3. The Commissioner of Precinct 3 and 4 and the City Mayor shall coordinate reasonable requests for work done under this agreement.
- 4. The County and City understand that this agreement may be limited by budgetary restrictions, or the authority provided by the parties' respective governing bodies. Notwithstanding any provisions herein, this interlocal agreement is expressly contingent upon the availability of funding for each item and obligation contained herein for the term of the government and any extension thereto. If no funds or insufficient funds are appropriated for the payment due under this contract for the period covered by such budget or appropriation, the contract shall terminate without penalty to County or City.
- 5. Neither party shall be deemed an employee or agent of the other party. This Agreement does not constitute a joint venture, either expressed or implied. The City will maintain sole discretion and control over the operations for construction and maintenance of the City's streets, roads, ditches and recreational areas. The County will maintain sole discretion and control over the operations for construction and maintenance of the County's streets, roads, ditches and recreational areas.
- 6. The County agrees to exercise due diligence in the routine maintenance of County equipment.
- 7. The term of this Agreement is for a period beginning on the date the Agreement is executed

3. **Schedule:** The Riley Road bridge over Birch Creek Draw provides access to multiple subdivisions in northeast Waller County. In the Spring of 2024, one lane of the bridge was closed due to poor structural condition. As a result, truck traffic, buses and heavy vehicles were detoured to FM 1488. This route adds an additional 20 miles which severely impacts emergency response. An expedited delivery schedule is required for this project. Project letting should occur no later than October 2024.

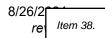

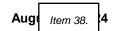

**B2Z Engineering** is pleased to submit this cost proposal to provide Geotechnical Engineering Services (GEO) for the above-referenced project. We are presenting this letter and cost estimate to confirm our understanding of this project and providing a description of the tasks to be performed. The broad objective of our study will be to determine subsurface conditions for use by others in completing the design of the above referenced project. Described in this proposal are:

- Our understanding of pertinent project characteristics
- Our proposed scope for field and laboratory study
- Our proposed scope for engineering evaluation and reporting
- Our tentative project schedule
- Our project lump sum fee

# I. Geotechnical Drilling and Miscellaneous Field Services (GEO - Drill)

Based on the location map (or general directive) provided to **B2Z**, we are proposing the drilling and sampling of subsurface materials within the project limits as follows:

- Geotechnical Borings (Bridge Location)
  - Two (2) Borings will be drilled at proposed location of Riley Rd. at Birch Creek Bridge (Borings will be advanced to a depth of approximately 70 feet below the existing top of natural ground per directive of Client) (Texas Cone Penetrometer TCP). (Borings will be drilled atop the existing pavement for definition of existing pavement thickness and for sampling of the subgrade soils for proposed pavement analysis).



The Client will be responsible for obtaining any necessary permits or authorization, including any needed clearing, to access areas (right of entry) where the borings are to be drilled. B2Z will stake the boring locations and provide utility clearances prior to performing the field exploration portion of the project.

The borings will be advanced to the specified depths and in-situ soil testing will be performed in general accordance with TxDOT Standard Test Procedures (<u>Tex-132-E - Texas Cone Penetration Testing</u>). The soil will be sampled as needed to verify subsurface materials and strata changes. Final drilling depths and elevations will be based on topographic conditions at the time of our drilling operations.

All samples will be removed from the sample apparatus during drilling operations. B2Z personnel will conduct various field tests on the recovered samples, visually classify the samples, and record the appropriate data on a field boring log. The samples will be appropriately packaged to minimize loss of their natural moisture content and to reduce the possibility of damage during transportation to our soils laboratory.

Following completion of drilling, sampling, and subsurface water monitoring operations, all boreholes will be backfilled with bentonite chips. Borings taken in existing roadway where ACP/HMAC is present, will be patched with cold-mix asphaltic paving material.

This proposal *does not* include activities and corresponding costs that may be associated with the following:

- Providing an ATV mounted drill rig, dozer or special equipment to clear areas of vegetation and debris or to regrade the site to gain access to the boring locations;
- Regrading the site or portions of the site after drilling activities are completed;
- Site safety meetings that may be required; or
- Encountering hazardous or contaminated soils or substances during our field activities.

We will notify you should these services become necessary for us to complete our field exploration activities. We can arrange to provide for these services as part of our project scope, should you authorize us to do so.

## II. Geotechnical Laboratory Testing Services (GEO - Test)

Geotechnical Laboratory Testing will be performed on the samples recovered during the field study to evaluate their physical and engineering properties. Testing shall include several of the following test procedures:

- (1) Lab. Determination of Moisture in Soils (ASTM D2216 / Tex-103-E)
- (2) Atterberg Limits (ASTM D4318 / Tex-104 thru 106-E)
- (3) Gradation (-200) (ASTM D1140 / Tex-111-E)
- (4) Particle Size (Sieve) Analysis with Hydrometer (ASTM D422 / Tex-110-E)
- (5) Sulfate Content of Soil (ASTM C1580 / Tex-145-E)
- (6) Lime-Series Testing (pH) (Part III) (Tex-121-E)



# III. Geotechnical Engineering Services (GEO – Eng)

Engineering analyses will be conducted after reviewing the results of both the field and laboratory phases of our study. The findings and conclusions derived from our analyses will be presented in an electronic engineering report / technical memo (.pdf), which will be prepared by one of our engineers. The report / memo will include a boring location plan, boring logs with laboratory classification of recovered soil samples. The scope of work for engineering shall include the following:

#### 1.0 PROJECT INFORMATION

The Riley Road / Birch Creek Draw bridge is located in the northeastern portion of Waller County, Texas, approximately 1.4 miles west of FM 1774 as measured along Riley Road. Terracon understands the Client is seeking a WOTUS delineation to support bridge replacement design and/or permitting. The survey area includes the project site (Birch Creek Draw Bridge) including Right-of-Way improvements within 200-feet and existing stream sections within 100-feet upstream and downstream of the proposed bridge. # 2.0 SCOPE OF SERVICES

# 2.1 Waters of the United States (WOTUS) Delineation

This scope item is presented to assist the client in remaining in compliance with Section 404 of the Clean Water Act and/or Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act. The results of this scope may dictate the appropriate level of United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) permitting and/or coordination, if any. Terracon will perform subtasks to accomplish this task, including a desktop review, a site visit, and report preparation as described below.

### 2.1.1 Desktop Review

Prior to visiting the site, background research will be conducted and will consist of locating and reviewing pertinent maps, aerial photographs, historical topographic maps, soil surveys, plant species data, United States Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) National Wetlands Inventory (NWI) maps, soil data from the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRM), and other related data necessary for a thorough desktop review of site conditions. This desktop review will assist Terracon in preliminarily identifying potential aquatic resources on the site. Terracon will use this information to plan the on-site investigation and to limit investigation activities and identify areas that may be excluded from development. Terracon will consult with Client to identify areas that may not be developed (i.e., floodplain areas) to exclude from additional studies. In addition to GIS sources, Terracon will investigate the presence and/or availability of prior investigations at the property such as USACE verifications, environmental checklists, Environmental Impact Statements, or geotechnical reports. The site visit will include completion of USACE wetland determination data forms with plant identification, notation of hydrologic indicators, and excavation of shallow soil profiles, as appropriate within each different vegetative community spread throughout the project



site. Potentially jurisdictional waterbodies (i.e., Birch Creek Draw) will be identified by delineating ordinary high-water marks and then mapped using a GPS receiver with appropriate accuracy, and the procedures required by the **USACE**. Following the site visit, exhibits showing the boundaries (polygons) and acreage and/or linear footage (if applicable) of all aquatic resources identified onsite during the site visit will be prepared. Client agrees that execution of this Agreement is a material element of the consideration Consultant requires to execute the Services, and if Services are initiated by Consultant prior to execution of this Agreement as an accommodation for Client at Client's request, both parties shall consider that commencement of Services constitutes formal acceptance of all terms and conditions of this Agreement. Additional terms and conditions may be added or changed only by written amendment to this Agreement signed by both parties. In the event Client uses a purchase order or other form to administer this Agreement, the use of such form shall be for convenience purposes only and any additional or conflicting terms it contains are stricken. This Agreement shall not be assigned by either party without prior written consent of the other party. Either party may terminate this Agreement or the Services upon written notice to the other. In such case, Consultant shall be paid costs incurred and fees earned to the date of termination plus reasonable costs of closing the Project.
- 3. Change Orders. Client may request changes to the scope of Services by altering or adding to the Services to be performed. If Client so requests, Consultant will return to Client a statement (or supplemental proposal) of the change setting forth an adjustment to the Services and fees for the requested changes. Following Client's review, Client shall provide written acceptance. If Client does not follow these procedures, but instead directs, authorizes, or permits Consultant to perform changed or additional work, the Services are changed accordingly and Consultant will be paid for this work according to the fees stated or its current fee schedule. If project conditions change materially from those observed at the site or described to Consultant at the time of proposal, Consultant is entitled to a change order equitably adjusting its Services and fee.
- 4. Compensation and Terms of Payment. Client shall pay compensation for the Services performed at the fees stated in the Proposal, including but not limited to the Compensation section, unless fees are otherwise stated in Exhibit C to this Agreement (which section or Exhibit is incorporated into this Agreement). If not stated in either, fees will be according to Consultant's current fee schedule. Fee schedules are valid for the calendar year in which they are issued. Fees do not include sales tax. Client will pay applicable sales tax as required by law. Consultant may invoice Client at least monthly and payment is due upon receipt of invoice. Client shall notify Consultant in writing, at the address below, within 15 days of the date of the invoice if Client objects to any portion of the charges on the invoice, and shall promptly pay the undisputed portion. Client shall pay a finance fee of 1.5% per month, but not exceeding the maximum rate allowed by law, for all unpaid amounts 30 days or older. Client agrees to pay all collection-related costs that Consultant incurs, including attorney fees. Consultant may suspend Services for lack of timely payment. It is the responsibility of Client to determine whether federal, state, or local prevailing wage requirements apply and to notify Consultant if prevailing wages apply. If it is later determined that prevailing wages apply, and Consultant was not previously notified by Client, Client agrees to pay the prevailing wage from that point forward, as well as a retroactive payment adjustment to bring previously paid amounts in line with prevailing wages. Client also agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless Consultant from any alleged violations made by any governmental agency regulating prevailing wage activity for failing to pay prevailing wages, including the payment of any fines or penalties.
- 5. Third Party Reliance. This Agreement and the Services provided are for Consultant and Client's sole benefit and exclusive use with no third party beneficiaries intended. Reliance upon the Services and any work product is limited to Client, and is not intended for third parties other than those who have executed Consultant's reliance agreement, subject to the prior approval of Consultant and Client.
- 6. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY. CLIENT AND CONSULTANT HAVE EVALUATED THE RISKS AND REWARDS ASSOCIATED WITH THIS PROJECT, INCLUDING CONSULTANT'S FEE RELATIVE TO THE RISKS ASSUMED, AND AGREE TO ALLOCATE CERTAIN OF THE ASSOCIATED RISKS. TO THE FULLEST EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW, THE TOTAL AGGREGATE LIABILITY OF CONSULTANT (AND ITS RELATED CORPORATIONS AND EMPLOYEES) TO CLIENT AND THIRD PARTIES GRANTED RELIANCE IS LIMITED TO THE GREATER OF \$50,000 OR CONSULTANT'S FEE, FOR ANY AND ALL INJURIES, DAMAGES, CLAIMS, LOSSES, OR EXPENSES (INCLUDING ATTORNEY AND EXPERT FEES) ARISING OUT OF CONSULTANT'S SERVICES OR THIS AGREEMENT. PRIOR TO ACCEPTANCE OF THIS AGREEMENT AND UPON WRITTEN REQUEST FROM CLIENT, CONSULTANT MAY NEGOTIATE A HIGHER LIMITATION FOR ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATION IN THE FORM OF A SURCHARGE TO BE ADDED TO THE AMOUNT STATED IN THE COMPENSATION SECTION OF THE PROPOSAL. THIS LIMITATION SHALL APPLY REGARDLESS OF AVAILABLE PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY INSURANCE COVERAGE, CAUSE(S), OR THE THEORY OF LIABILITY, INCLUDING NEGLIGENCE, INDEMNITY, OR OTHER RECOVERY. THIS LIMITATION SHALL NOT APPLY TO THE EXTENT THE DAMAGE IS PAID UNDER CONSULTANT'S COMMERCIAL GENERAL LIABILITY POLICY.
- 7. Indemnity/Statute of Limitations. Consultant and Client shall indemnify and hold harmless the other and their respective employees from and against legal liability for claims, losses, damages, and expenses to the extent such claims, losses, damages, or expenses are legally determined to be caused by their negligent acts, errors, or omissions. In the event such claims, losses, damages, or expenses are legally determined to be caused by the joint or concurrent negligence of Consultant and Client, they shall be borne by each party in proportion to its own negligence under comparative fault principles. Neither party shall have a duty to defend the other party, and no duty to defend is hereby created by this indemnity provision and such duty is explicitly waived under this Agreement. Causes of action arising out of Consultant's Services or this Agreement regardless of cause(s) or the theory of liability, including negligence, indemnity or other recovery shall be deemed to have accrued and the applicable statute of limitations shall commence to run not later than the date of Consultant's substantial completion of Services on the project.
- 8. Warranty. Consultant will perform the Services in a manner consistent with that level of care and skill ordinarily exercised by members of the profession currently practicing under similar conditions in the same locale. EXCEPT FOR THE STANDARD OF CARE PREVIOUSLY STATED, CONSULTANT MAKES NO WARRANTIES OR GUARANTEES, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, RELATING TO CONSULTANT'S SERVICES AND CONSULTANT DISCLAIMS ANY IMPLIED WARRANTIES OR WARRANTIES IMPOSED BY LAW, INCLUDING WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY AND FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE.
- 9. Insurance. Consultant represents that it now carries, and will continue to carry: (i) workers' compensation insurance in accordance with the laws of the states having jurisdiction over Consultant's employees who are engaged in the Services, and employer's liability insurance (\$1,000,000); (ii) commercial general liability insurance (\$2,000,000 occ / \$4,000,000 agg); (iii) automobile liability insurance (\$2,000,000 B.I. and P.D. combined single limit); (iv) umbrella liability (\$5,000,000 occ / agg); and (v) professional liability insurance (\$1,000,000 claim / agg). Certificates of insurance will be provided upon request. Client and Consultant shall waive subrogation against the other party on all general liability and property coverage.

- 10. CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES. NEITHER PARTY SHALL BE LIABLE TO THE OTHER FOR LOSS OF PROFITS OR REVENUE; LOSS OF USE OR OPPORTUNITY; LOSS OF GOOD WILL; COST OF SUBSTITUTE FACILITIES, GOODS, OR SERVICES; COST OF CAPITAL; OR FOR ANY SPECIAL, CONSEQUENTIAL, INDIRECT, PUNITIVE, OR EXEMPLARY DAMAGES.
- 11. Dispute Resolution. Client shall not be entitled to assert a Claim against Consultant based on any theory of professional negligence unless and until Client has obtained the written opinion from a registered, independent, and reputable engineer, architect, or geologist that Consultant has violated the standard of care applicable to Consultant's performance of the Services. - 14. Sample Disposition, Affected Materials, and Indemnity. Samples are consumed in testing or disposed of upon completion of the testing procedures (unless stated otherwise in the Services). Client shall furnish or cause to be furnished to Consultant all documents and information known or available to Client that relate to the identity, location, quantity, nature, or characteristic of any hazardous waste, toxic, radioactive, or contaminated materials ("Affected Materials") at or near the site, and shall immediately transmit new, updated, or revised information as it becomes available. Consultant will be responsible for supervision and site safety measures for its own employees, but shall not be responsible for the supervision or health and safety precautions for any third parties, including Client's contractors, subcontractors, or other parties present at the site. In addition, Consultant retains the right to stop work without penalty at any time Consultant believes it is in the best interests of Consultant's employees or subcontractors to do so in order to reduce the risk of exposure to unsafe site conditions. Client agrees it will respond quickly to all requests for information made by Consultant related to Consultant's pre-task planning and risk assessment processes.

### **DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT**

- A. Developer owns or plans to own approximately 318.1 acres of real property more particularly described by the metes and bounds attached to this Agreement as **Exhibit A**, of which all of the acreage is located in the County (the "Developer's Property").
- B. Developer desires to develop the Developer's Property in accordance with the plan of development ("Plan of Development") attached to this Agreement as **Exhibit B**, including the general uses, layout, configuration, lot sizes, lot widths, landscaping, and traffic circulation pattern shown on the General Plan ("General Plan") attached to this Agreement as **Exhibit C** (collectively, the "Project").
- C. The County desires that the Project be developed on the Property and expects to receive a benefit from the development of the Project.
- D. The County desires that, in exchange for the granting of the variances needed to facilitate the development of the Project, the Project be subject to certain construction and development standards.
- E. The Parties therefore desire to set out this Development Agreement between them to facilitate the development of the Project by Developer on the Property.

**IN CONSIDERATION** of the mutual covenants and promises set forth herein and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties, intending to be legally bound, hereby covenant and agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Integration of Recitals</u>. The foregoing recitals are accurate/ true and correct and constitute matters agreed to herein.
- 2. <u>Cohesive Development</u>. The Parties desire to coordinate development of certain aspects of the Property, including but not limited to, the square footage, exterior materials, elevations, and other aspects of the Project described in the Plan of Development attached to this Development Agreement as **Exhibit B**. Developer hereby agrees to develop the Project substantially in accordance with the Plan of Development. Furthermore, Developer hereby affirmatively agrees not to develop or permit the development of any multi-family residential projects upon the Developer's Property in connection with the Project.

- 3. <u>Variances</u>. The County has granted the variances attached as **Exhibit D** and included in the Plan of Development that include, but are not limited to requests to vary from the literal requirements of the subdivision regulations of the County. The County has the authority to enter into this Agreement and to contract for the granting of the variances attached to this Agreement.
- 4. <u>Annexation.</u> Developer and a municipal utility district may annex properties that would be included in this Agreement with Commissioners Court approval, which consent will not be unreasonably withheld. All provisions of this Agreement will apply to any future annexations by Developer.
- 5. <u>Applicable Law</u>. The Parties obligations as set forth herein are subject to compliance with applicable laws, codes, rules and regulations (collectively, "Applicable Laws"). In the event such Applicable Laws prevent performance of any obligations as set forth herein, the non-performing party shall not be in default of the terms of this Agreement.
- **Notices**. All such notices shall be either (a) sent by certified mail, return receipt requested, in which case notice shall be deemed delivered three (3) business days after deposit, postage prepaid in the U.S. Mail, (b) sent by overnight delivery using a nationally recognized overnight courier, in which case it shall be deemed delivered one (1) business day after deposit with such courier, if deposited prior to such carrier's deadline for overnight deliveries, otherwise two (2) business days after deposit with such courier, (c) sent by facsimile, in which case notice shall be deemed delivered upon electronic confirmation of receipt of such notice (or if such electronic confirmation of receipt occurs other than on a business day, or other than during normal business hours, then on the next business day after such electronic confirmation of receipt occurs), (d) sent by e-mail as a PDF, in which case notice shall be deemed delivered upon transmission (or if such transmission occurs other than on a business day, or other than during normal business hours, then on the next business day after such transmission occurs), or (e) sent by personal delivery, in which case notice shall be effective upon delivery or refusal to accept delivery. As used in this Agreement, "business day" refers to a day other than a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday in Waller County, Texas, and "normal business hours" refers to the hours between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Waller County, Texas time on a business day. The above addresses may be changed by notice to the other party; provided, however, that no notice of a change of address shall be effective until actual receipt of such notice. Notwithstanding the foregoing,

any notice of or relating to a default or claim of default by a party pursuant to this Agreement must be sent in accordance with the method provided in clause (a), (b), (c) or (e) in order to be effective. For purposes of notice, the addresses of the Parties shall be as follows:

7. Assignment. The County acknowledges that rights and obligations accrued under this Agreement are intended to facilitate the development of the Project by Developer or its Affiliate entities and that while Developer or its affiliate entities will be the primary actor in the grading and laying out of single-family lots and commercial parcels, the Parties acknowledge and agree that this Agreement is not intended to prevent the construction of single-family homes and commercial structures and their appurtenant infrastructure by a variety of builders who will purchase portions of the Project from Developer or its Affiliate entities from time to time, so long as that construction complies with the terms of this Agreement. Assignment of rights under this Agreement to a developer other than Developer or its Affiliate entities for the grading and laying out of lots and commercial parcels shall require the written approval by the County. Subject to the foregoing, this Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their approved successors and assigns. For the purposes of this Section, the term "Affiliate" means (a) an entity that directly or indirectly controls, is

controlled by or is under common control with Developer or (b) an entity at least five percent of whose economic interest is owned by Developer or an entity that directly or indirectly controls, is controlled by or is under common control with Developer; and the term "control" means the power to direct the management of such entity through voting rights, ownership or contractual obligations.

8. <u>Duration, Amendment and Termination</u>. This Agreement may be terminated by unanimous written consent of the Parties, or their approved successors or assigns. Upon the termination of this Agreement, all rights and privileges derived from and all duties and obligations created and imposed by the provisions of this Agreement shall terminate and have no further force or effect. To amend, supplement, or terminate this Agreement, the written consent of the Parties must first be obtained. This Agreement may not be amended, supplemented, or terminated except as provided herein.

## 9. <u>Invalidity and Enforcement</u>.

- a. If any portion of this Agreement is held invalid or inoperative under applicable law, then so far as is reasonable and possible the remainder of this Agreement shall be deemed valid and operative and severable therefrom, and effect shall be given to the intent manifested by the portion held invalid or inoperative and such portion shall be deemed reformed in accordance with such manifest intent so as to be enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by applicable law.
- b. The failure by either party to enforce against the other any term or provision of this Agreement shall be deemed not to be a waiver of such party's right to enforce against the other party the same or any other such term or provision.
- 10. <u>Binding Effect</u>. This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and shall be binding upon the Parties hereto and their respective approved successors and assigns.
- 11. <u>Governing Law</u>. This Agreement shall, in all respects, be governed, construed, applied, and enforced in accordance with the law of the State of Texas, excluding such state's conflict of laws principles.
- 12. <u>Venue</u>. Any legal proceedings undertaken with regard to this Agreement shall be prosecuted in the court of competent jurisdiction in Waller County, Texas.

- 13. <u>Development Rights</u>. Upon the mutual execution of this Agreement, the County and Developer agree that the development rights (as hereafter defined) of the County and the Developer as set forth in this Agreement shall be deemed to have vested, as provided by the Texas Local Government Code, Chapters 43 and 245 and Section 212.172(g), as amended or under any other existing or future common or statutory rights as of the Effective Date. "Development Rights" shall mean the covenants, agreements, and privileges regarding the development of the Developer's Property between the County and Developer set forth in this Agreement, but shall expressly exclude any right, title, interest, privilege, or claim in and to the Developer's Property.
- 14. <u>Uniform Treatment</u>. Notwithstanding any provision herein to the contrary, neither Developer nor a municipal utility district encompassing the Developer Property shall be required to design or construct public infrastructure to a standard higher than a standard made applicable hereafter to another conservation and reclamation district, municipal utility district or developer developing land within the County's unincorporated jurisdiction. It is the intention and desire of the County that development of the Property not be at a competitive disadvantage with other developments within the County.
- 15. <u>Governmental Affirmations</u>. Developer hereby verifies that it and its parent companies, wholly- or majority-owned subsidiaries, and other affiliates, if any, do not boycott Israel and will not boycott Israel during the term of this Agreement. The foregoing verification is made solely to comply with Section 2270.002, Texas Government Code,. As used in the foregoing verification, 'boycott Israel' means refusing to deal with, terminating business activities with, or otherwise taking any action that is intended to penalize, inflict economic harm on, or limit commercial relations specifically with Israel, or with a person or entity doing business in Israel or in an Israeli-controlled territory, but does not include an action made for ordinary business purposes. Developer understands 'affiliate' to mean an entity that controls, is controlled by, or is under common control with Developer and exists to make a profit.

Developer represents that neither it nor any of its parent companies, whollyor majority-owned subsidiaries, and other affiliates is a company identified on a list prepared and maintained by the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts under Section 2252.153 or Section 2270.0201, Texas Government Code, and posted on any of the following pages of such officer's internet website: https://comptroller.texas.gov/puchasing/docs/sudan-list.pdf; https://comptroller.texas.gov/purchasing/docs/iran-list.pdf; or https://comptroller.texas.gov/purchasing/docs/fto-list.pdf.

The foregoing representation is made solely to comply with Section 2252.152, Texas Government Code, and to the extent such Section does not contravene applicable Federal law and excludes Developer and each of its parent companies, wholly- or majority-owned subsidiaries, and other affiliates, if any, that the United States government has affirmatively declared to be excluded from its federal sanctions regime relating to Sudan or Iran or any federal sanctions regime relating to a foreign terrorist organization. Developer understands "affiliate" to mean any entity that controls, is controlled by, or is under common control with Developer and exists to make a profit.

- 16. <u>Texas 1295 Filing</u>. The Developer represents and the County agrees that a 1295 filing is not necessary in conjunction with the execution and approval of this Agreement, as the Developer is a publicly traded company.
- 17. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, and in separate counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original, and all of such counterparts shall constitute one Agreement.
- 18. <u>Law Enforcement</u>. Developer, the Homeowners' Association to be created by the Developer (the "HOA"), or the municipal utility district encompassing the Developer Property shall contract with the Waller County Sheriff's Office to provide supplemental police protection services to the Developer's Property by a deputy sheriff at 50% buildout.
- Morrison Road Contribution. In connection with the improvements to Morrison Road to be made by the County in connection with the Project (the "Morrison Road Improvements"), the Developer hereby agrees to fund an amount equal to \$322.50 per linear foot of Morrison Road Improvements to be constructed by the County, which shall be payable to the County on a pay estimate-by-pay estimate basis following the award of the applicable construction contract(s) by the County; provided, however, that Developer shall also have the option in its sole discretion to perform the Morrison Road Improvements following notice to the County prior to the award of a construction contract by the County.

# EXHIBIT B PLAN OF DEVELOPMENT MIRABELLA

#### A. Introduction

This proposed development is an important opportunity for Waller County (County) to participate in the strategic planning of a single-family community, further setting the tone for future development in the area. The proposed plan is intended to align elements of the County's requirements and goals with the goals and objectives of a contemporary master-planned development. The quality and cohesiveness of this development should continue to set the standard for the type of development the County desires to promote within its jurisdiction.

Mirabella (Project) is a single-family community consisting of approximately 318 acres, located north of F.M. 529, approximately 3,500' east of F.M. 362. The tract is located fully within Waller County, in Precinct 3.

The developer desires to construct a community consisting of recreational amenities and open space, with a range of housing types and prices.

This Plan of Development (PD), its description, rules, and regulations shall apply to the entirety of property as is depicted in Figure 2 - Conceptual Plan. The land plan depicted in Figure 2 is preliminary and subject to change.

- 1. This Plan of Development includes the following sections:
  - A. Introduction
  - B. General Provisions
  - C. Land Uses
  - D. Development Regulations
  - E. Parks, Recreation and Trails
  - F. Street Plan & Cross-Sections
  - G. Building Regulations

### B. General Provisions

- 1. The PD approved herein will be constructed, developed, and maintained in compliance with this Development Agreement and other applicable ordinances of the County. If any provision or regulation of any County ordinance applicable in the Mirabella Plan of Development is not contained in this PD, all the regulations contained in the County's ordinance applicable to the Mirabella PD in effect on the effective date of this ordinance will apply to this PD as though written herein, except to the extent the County regulation or provision conflicts with a provision of this Development Agreement.
- 2. If there are discrepancies between the text of this document and the figures attached, the text shall prevail.
- 3. The Project shall be developed in accordance with the following figures that are attached to and made part of this PD:
  - Figure 1 Boundary Exhibit
  - Figure 2 Conceptual Plan
  - Figure 3 Landscape and Open Space Plan
  - Figure 4 Street Type Designation Map
  - Figure 5 Street Cross-Section, Local Residential Street
  - Figure 6 Street Cross-Section, Collector Street
  - Figure 7 Fence Exhibit
- 4. A homeowners' association shall be established and made legally responsible to maintain all common areas, private streets, recreation reserves, and community amenities not otherwise dedicated to the public. All land and facilities dedicated to a municipal utility district shall be maintained by said District.
- 5. The homeowners' association shall enforce deed restrictions.



6. Developer agrees to provide "Increased Standard" street concrete thickness as provided in the table below, unless a geotechnical analysis demonstrates that improvements to subgrade will provide better long-term stability and reduced maintenance burden for the road, in which case the "Minimum Standard" below shall be provided with the recommended subgrade composition per the analysis.

Paving Standards	Local Streets	Collector Streets
Minimum Standard	6" thick concrete	7" thick concrete
Increased Standard	7" thick concrete	8" thick concrete

- 7. The developer or municipal utility district shall maintain a maintenance bond which shall commence on the effective date of the acceptance of the roads by the County and continue for a minimum one-year period but no longer than the earlier to occur of a two-year period or until 100% of the residences which are served by the accepted roads are substantially completed.
- 8. Waller County Municipal Utility District No. 46 is in the process of being created upon the property associated with the Project described in Exhibit 'A' to the Agreement. The target date for such a creation is the fourth quarter of 2024.
- 9. TxDOT has outlined plans for the expansion of FM 529 from SH 99 to FM 362, with an anticipated letting date in September 2027. As part of the preparatory measures, right-of-way acquisition is scheduled to occur on the south side of FM 529, adjacent to the project property. The current right-of-way width of FM 529, adjacent to the property, is 120 feet, which is the minimum right-of-way requirement for a major thoroughfare according to the Waller County Transportation Plan<sup>1</sup>.
- 10. Morrison Road runs along the project boundary to the north and is classified as a major collector according to the Waller County Transportation Plan<sup>2</sup>. A major collector requires an ultimate 80' right-of-way width. The developer shall dedicate up to 15' of right-of-way for Morrison Road. If the property owner to the north of Morrison Road decides to develop their property, they must also dedicate 15' of right-of-way so the ultimate width for the

- right-of-way can be 80 feet. The dedication shall occur in a piecemeal fashion along with each plat that abuts a portion of Morrison Road.
- 11. Morrison Road Contribution: In connection with the improvements to Morrison Road to be made by the County in connection with the Project, the Developer hereby agrees to fund an amount equal to \$322.50 per linear foot of Morrison Road Improvements to be constructed by the County, which shall be payable to the County on a pay estimate-by-pay estimate basis following the award of the applicable construction contract(s) by the County; provided, however, that Developer shall also have the option in its sole discretion to perform the Morrison Road Improvements following notice to the County prior the award of a construction contract by the County.
- 12. As a prerequisite for the development outlined in this agreement, the developer shall conduct a comprehensive Traffic Impact Analysis (TIA) in accordance with the standards and guidelines established by TxDOT. The TIA shall thoroughly assess the potential impact of the proposed development on the surrounding transportation infrastructure, including but not limited to roadways, intersections, and traffic flow. The analysis shall consider factors such as vehicular and pedestrian movements, peak traffic hours, and any other relevant parameters.
- 13. The developer acknowledges and agrees to be solely responsible for the installation of traffic control devices on all county roads affected by the development project described herein. The scope of responsibility includes, but is not limited to, the procurement, installation, and maintenance of all necessary traffic control devices in accordance with the TIA recommendations, county regulations and standards. All traffic control devices installed by the developer shall comply with the latest edition of the Texas Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices and any other relevant county ordinances, regulations, or standards in effect at the time of installation.
- 14. Law Enforcement: Developer, the Homeowners' Association to be created by the Developer (the "HOA"), or the Municipal Utility District shall contract with the Waller County Sheriff's Office to provide supplemental police protection services to the Developer's Property by a deputy sheriff at 50% buildout.



### C. Land Uses

- 1. The maximum number of single-family lots shall not exceed 1,250 lots (unless additional tracts of land are acquired and added to this PD). Currently, there is planned to be approximately 1,154 lots.
- 2. In accordance with the proposed PD, a portion of the land will be allocated for neighborhood park purposes, to equal one acre for each 54 proposed dwelling units. A minimum of 21.4 acres shall be dedicated for these purposes (1,154 lots/54 = 21.4 acres). If additional lots are platted, the commensurate amount of parkland shall be dedicated. A parkland dedication table shall be provided with each plat to ensure compliance with this requirement. The requirements for the parkland are described in Section E. Each plat does not need to stand on its own with regard to parkland dedication as parkland dedication shall be considered on a project total basis.
- 3. Multi-family development shall be prohibited within the Project.

### D. Development Regulations

Area within the PD shall be developed in accordance with the following regulations:

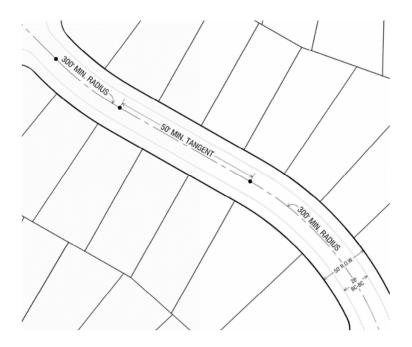
- 1. The maximum number of lots shall not exceed 1,250 lots (unless additional tracts of land are acquired and added to this PD).
- 2. At buildout, a minimum of 50% of the lots shall be at least 50 feet wide and a maximum of 30% of the lots shall be a minimum of 40 feet wide.
- 3. Maximum lot coverage: 65% calculated as the ground covered by building structures, principal, or accessory, of the gross lot surface area.
- 4. Minimum front yard building setback: 25 feet; measured from the front property/right-of-way line.
- 5. Minimum side yard building setbacks: five feet for interior, non-corner lots and the nonstreet side of corner lots; 15 feet exterior side yard for corner lots. Minimum 25 feet garage setback if the garage door faces the side street.



- 6. Minimum rear yard building setback: Ten feet, except when the rear utility easement width is greater than ten feet, the greater width is the minimum rear yard building setback. When a lot or a reserve is either directly adjacent to a major or minor arterial right-of-way or directly adjacent to a reserve less than 15 feet wide that is adjacent to a major thoroughfare, the minimum rear yard building setback is 25 feet measured from the street right-of-way line and a minimum of ten feet from the rear property line. When a residential lot backs to a designated major thoroughfare and a detached one-story garage is constructed on the residential lot, the rear yard between the detached one-story garage and the rear property line may be reduced to a minimum of three feet if a minimum of 25 feet is maintained between the rear of the one-story detached garage and the right-of-way line of the major thoroughfare.
- 7. The minimum right-of-way width for local streets within the PD shall be 50 feet as approved by variance by Commissioner's Court on March 20, 2024, and described in Exhibit C.
- 8. The minimum right-of-way width for major collector streets within the PD shall be 60 feet as approved by variance by Commissioner's Court on March 20, 2024, and described in Exhibit C.
- 9. The minimum lot width within the PD shall be 40 feet as approved by variance by Commissioner's Court on March 20, 2024, and described in Exhibit C.
- 10. For local streets, curves shall have a minimum centerline radius of 300 feet. Reverse curves shall be separated by a tangent distance of not less than 50 feet. This shall not apply to "L type" intersections. These types of intersections shall have a minimum centerline radius of 50 feet. The provisions of this standard were approved by variance by Commissioner's Court on March 20, 2024, and are described in Exhibit C.



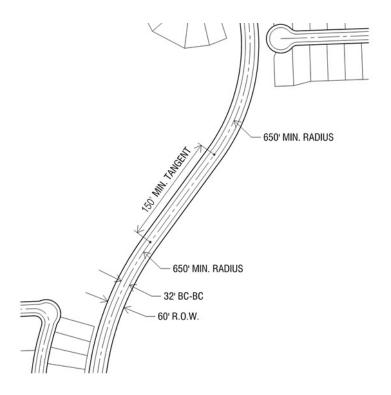

11. For major collector streets, curves shall have a minimum centerline radius of 650 feet. Reverse curves shall be separated by a tangent distance of not less than 150 feet. The provisions of this standard were approved by variance by Commissioner's Court on March 20, 2024, and are described in Exhibit C.

- 12. Cul-de-sac bulbs shall have a 60-foot right-of-way radius and a 50-foot paving radius as approved by variance by Commissioner's Court on March 20, 2024, and described in Exhibit C.
- 13. Compensating open space will be required for lots less than 5,000 square feet in area. Plats for lots below 5,000 square feet must include lot size tables to delineate this requirement. 200 square feet of compensating open space is required per lot.



Standards for Compensating Open Space:

- (a) Compensating open space may be used to reduce the minimum lot size requirement only to the extent that the area proposed to be dedicated to compensating open space meets the standards of this section.
- (b) The following areas shall not be used for or considered compensating open space:
  - 1) Areas designated or used as lots or building sites for dwelling units, utility or storage purposes, carports or garages;
  - 2) Driveways, private roadways, or streets;
  - 3) Private medians less than 12 feet wide; or
  - 4) Detention ponds, drainageways, water areas including floodplains and floodways, or ravines.
- (c) Compensating open space shall be reasonably dry and flat, unless the area is within an open space amenities plan approved separately by county staff. Landscape buffers are permitted to be considered as compensating open space provided that they meet the criteria listed in subsections (d) and (e).
- (d) The minimum size of any area used for compensating open space shall be 240 square feet, with dimensions of 20 feet by 12 feet.
- (e) Any area used for compensating open space:
  - 1) Shall be restricted for the use of owners of property in and residents of the subdivision;
  - 2) Shall be owned, managed and maintained under a binding agreement among the owners of property in the subdivision;
  - 3) Shall be accessible to all of the residents of the subdivision: and
  - 4) Shall be located within each respective subdivision where necessary. However, where excess compensating open space has been provided in a previously approved plat, the excess compensating open space may be allocated for the adjacent subdivision provided that the respective compensating open space reserve is within 500 feet of said plat boundary.



### 14. Shade Trees:

- (a) All lots shall have a minimum of one tree, planted in the front yard setback. The trees must be a minimum of 2.5 inches in caliper width and a minimum height of eight feet as measured at the tree trunk from the ground as planted.
- (b) In addition, on corner lots, one tree shall be provided within 15 feet of a street-side lot line per 50 feet of lot frontage on the side street, or portion thereof. Required trees shall be placed within the side yard setback.

### 15. Parking:

Each single-family home in the Project shall be subject to parking restrictions to be memorialized in separately filed covenants and restrictions as follows:

- (a) Resident Parking Vehicles of residents shall be parked in the resident's garage or driveway.
- (b) <u>Guest parking</u> Guests of residents must park in the driveway of the single-family residence they are visiting and may only park on the street if the driveway is not capable of parking another vehicle. This provision does not apply to law enforcement vehicles, emergency services vehicles, vehicles of service workers, such as landscapers, construction workers, or plumbers, but does apply to vehicles belonging to caregivers or domestic help that routinely provide services to the resident.
- (c) <u>Enforcement</u> The enforcement of these Parking Restrictions shall be done both in accordance with Chapter 684 of the Texas Transportation Code relating to the towing of vehicles, and in accordance with provisions relating to the issuance of fines and the granting of variances from the Parking Restrictions to be contained in separately filed covenants and restrictions.

#### 16. Screening:

- (a) Where residential lots are platted adjacent to major thoroughfares, a minimum 8-foot-tall masonry/pre-cast concrete fence shall be built along the back or side lot line adjacent to said major thoroughfares, as shown on Figure 7 Fence Exhibit.
- (b) Where residential lots are platted adjacent to major collectors, enhanced cedar fencing shall be built along the back or side lot line adjacent to said major collectors, as shown on Figure 7 Fence Exhibit.



### E. Parks, Recreation and Trails

As shown in Figure 3 - Landscape and Open Space Plan, an integrated network of open space and recreational amenities shall be provided in accordance with the following regulations:

- 1. At least 50% of the acreage required for neighborhood parkland shall be provided by the following:
  - (a) Pocket parks: recreation reserves of a minimum 1/4 acre.
  - (b) Community parks: recreation reserves of a minimum of 1/2 acre.
  - (c) Trails: incorporated into the design of maintenance berms surrounding wet detention ponds. The maintenance berm shall have an average width of at least 30 feet and a minimum width of 20 feet, with 100% of the maintenance berm acreage counted towards parkland. It's important to note that trails planned around dry detention ponds will not contribute to meeting the parkland dedication criteria.
- 2. Each home shall be located within 1/4 mile of a pocket park or 1/2 mile of a community park.
- 3. The remainder of the acreage required for neighborhood parkland may be provided by the following:
  - (a) Unencumbered landscape buffer and open space
  - (b) Land encumbered by detention areas, lake and drainage channel borders, or other similar characteristics, which shall serve as an alternative to parkland, if it complies with criteria listed below:
    - 1) Areas along lake and drainage channel borders have an average width of at least 30 feet and a minimum width of 20 feet; and
    - 2) Side slopes do not exceed a four to one (4:1) ratio; and
    - 3) If the maintenance berm is counted as parkland in the previous section, then it can not be double-counted into the calculation of remaining detention acreage that qualifies towards parkland dedication.



- 4. All pocket parks; community parks; unencumbered landscape buffer and open space; and land encumbered by detention areas, lake and drainage channel borders, or other similar characteristics shall comply with the criteria listed below:
  - (a) Front a minimum of 60 feet on a public street.
  - (b) Contain additional man-made improvements provided by the developer such as: concrete cart paths, sidewalks, benches, playgrounds, or shelters that facilitate an active/passive human recreational role.
- 5. Minimum four-foot-wide sidewalks shall be provided along both sides of local residential streets and along the maintenance berms of wet detention ponds. All sidewalks shall be constructed in accordance with the County details and shall meet the State of Texas ADA standards.
- 6. Minimum four-foot-wide sidewalks shall be provided along both sides of internal collectors within the property. At the discretion of the developer, an eight-foot-wide joint use trail may be constructed on only one side of the right-of-way in lieu of two separate five-foot-wide sidewalks on both sides of the right-of-way. In either case, the sidewalks or joint use trail may meander out of the right-of-way and into an adjacent landscape reserve if so provided. And if so provided, the HOA or District, (not Waller County) shall be responsible for the maintenance of the joint-use trail and its ancillary signage, and landscape.
- 7. Trails incorporated into the design of maintenance berms surrounding wet detention ponds are considered as parkland and shall be installed within one year after the completion of the respected detention pond, as shown in Figure 3. Trail configurations are subject to change, but the quantity of trails will remain substantially the same.

### F. Street Plan and Cross-Sections

- 1. All new construction will be concrete curb and gutter with ultimate storm sewer.
  - (a) Street cross sections listed below.

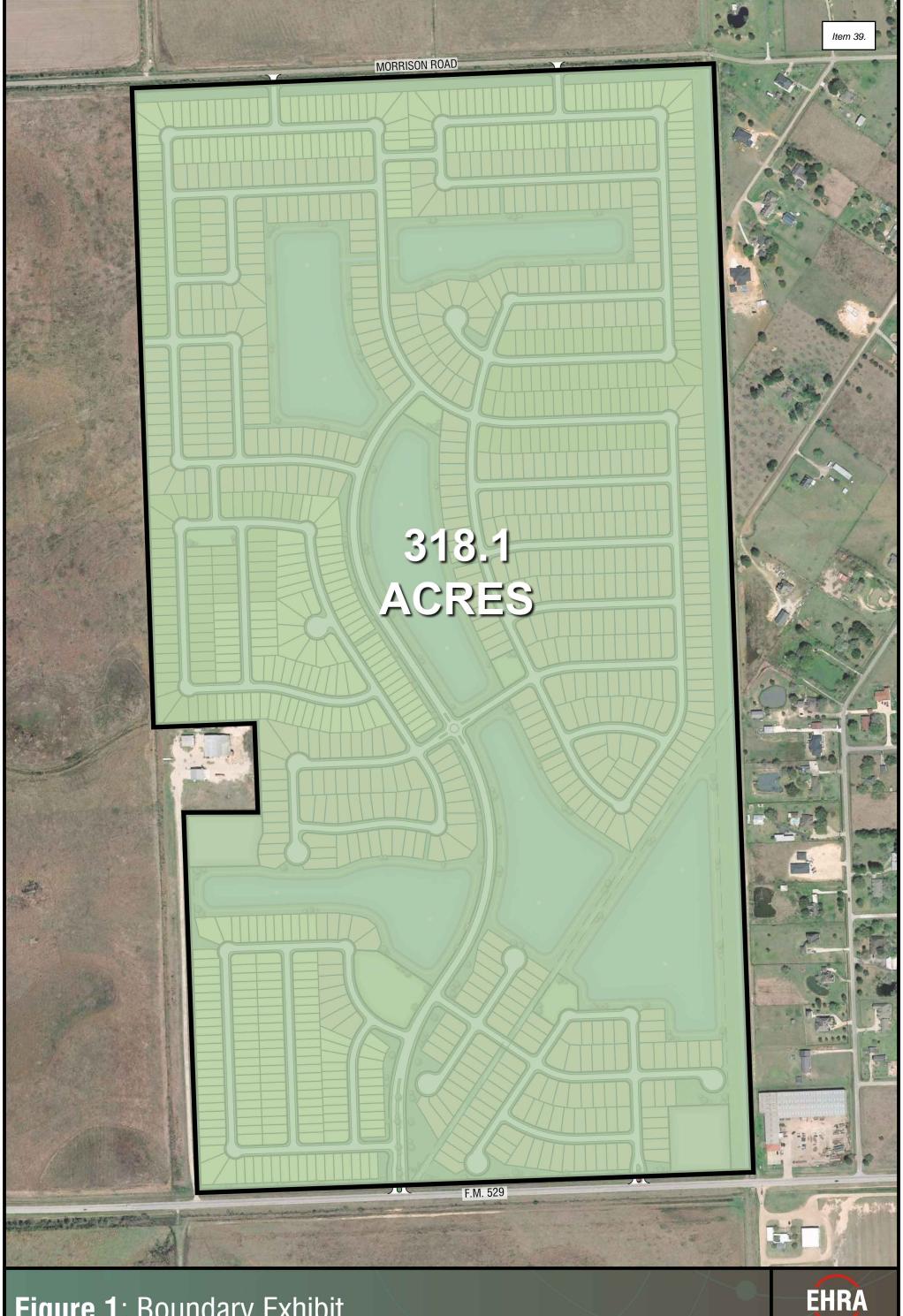
- (b) Street improvements: Streets shall be built in phases as the Project develops in accordance with the County's Engineering Design Criteria and Development Agreement.
- (c) A single-lane roundabout shall be permitted along Mirabella Drive, the 60' internal collector street shown in Figure 4, for the purpose of enhancing traffic safety, improving traffic flow, and ensuring efficient transportation within Mirabella.

### G. Building Regulations

Single-family homes within the PD shall be developed in accordance with the following building regulations:

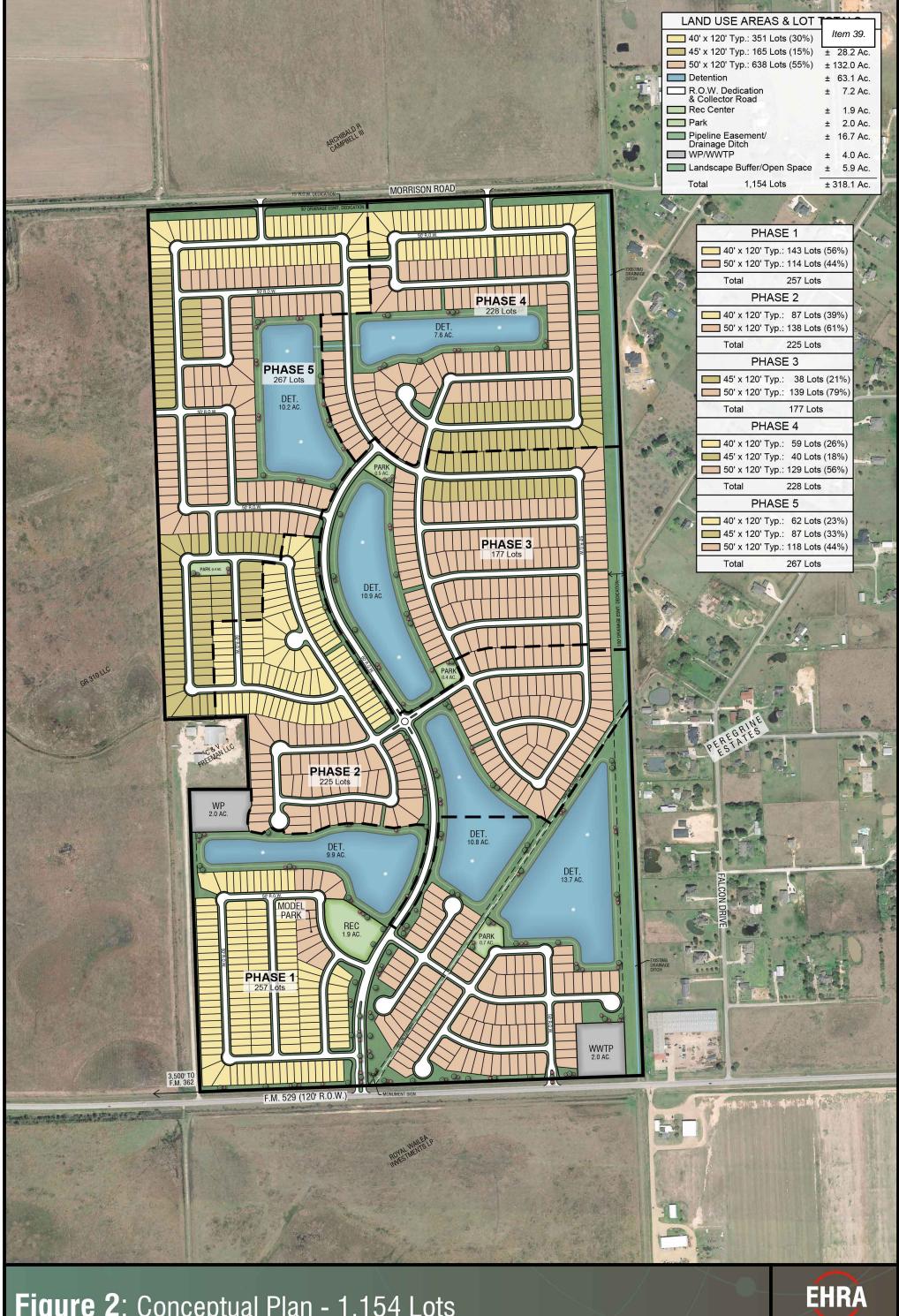
- Primary exterior finishes are limited to brick, stone (natural, cast, or cultured-textured), real stucco (wire mesh, cement lime based), fiber cement siding (i.e. Hardie Plank siding), and glass, and shall comprise at least 70% of the front façade (the area of the front façade shall exclude eaves, fascia, and door and window openings) and 50% of the remaining façades.
- 2. Secondary exterior finishes shall include wood and ceramic tiles.
- 3. Use of architectural metals may include canopies, roof systems, and miscellaneous trim work and such use shall meet the durability standards of the development code.
- 4. The following building materials shall not be used on the exterior finish:
  - (a) Vinyl siding, wood fiber hardboard siding, oriented strand board siding.
  - (b) plastic, or fiberglass panels.
  - (c) Smooth or untextured concrete surfaces.
  - (d) Exterior Insulated Finish Systems (E.I.F.S.).
  - (e) Unfired or underfired clay, sand, or shale brick.





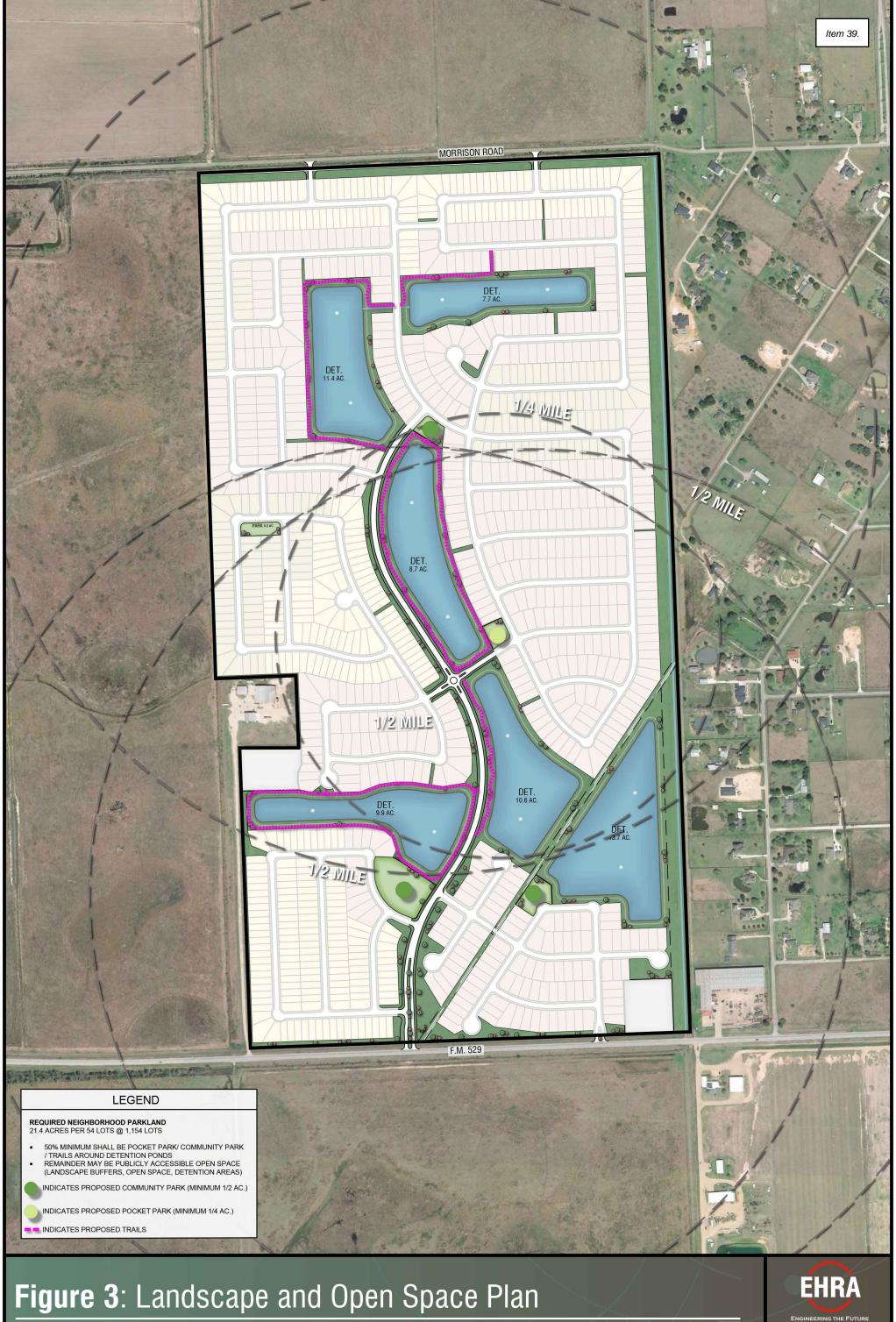
# Figure 1: Boundary Exhibit



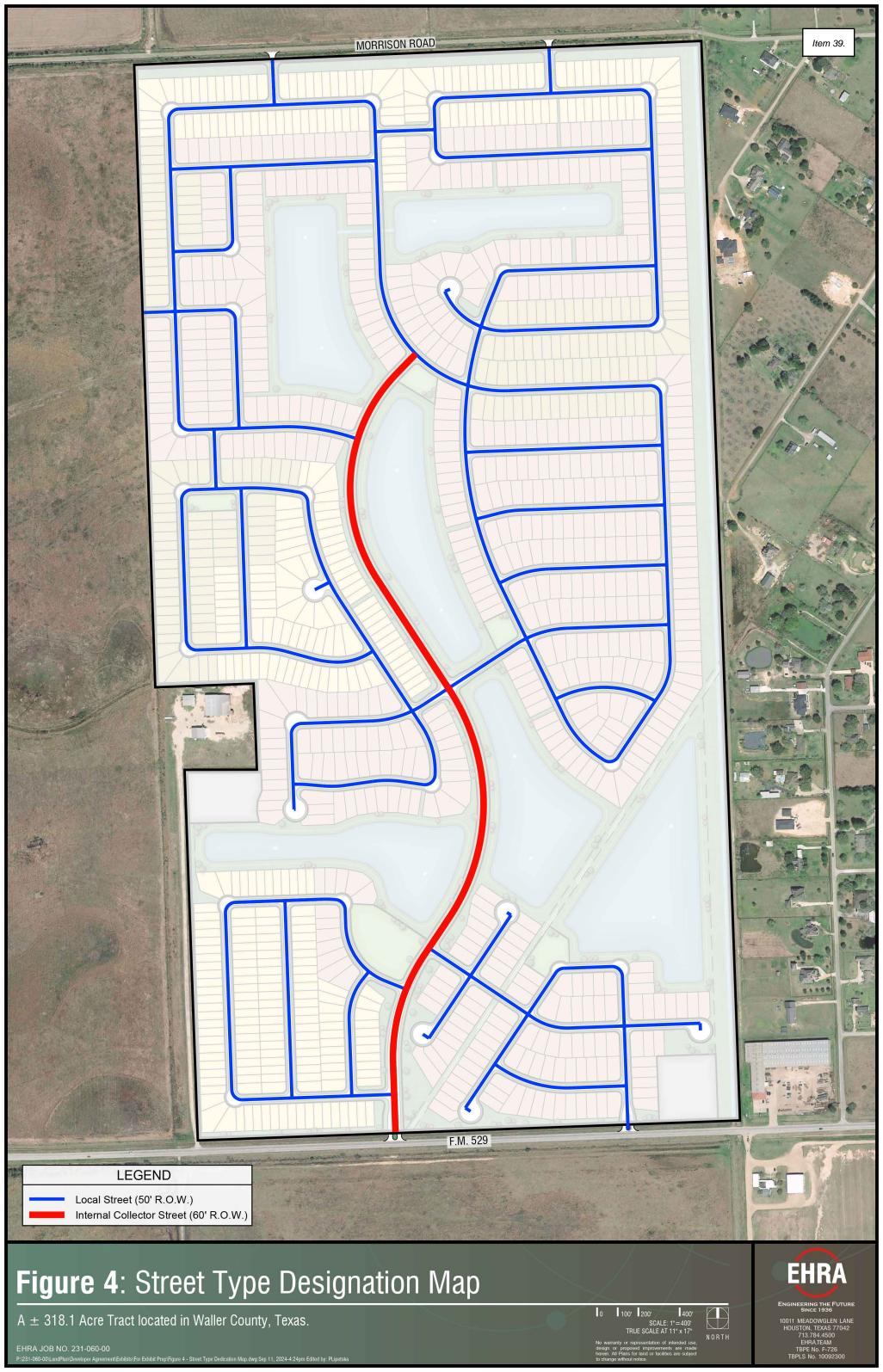


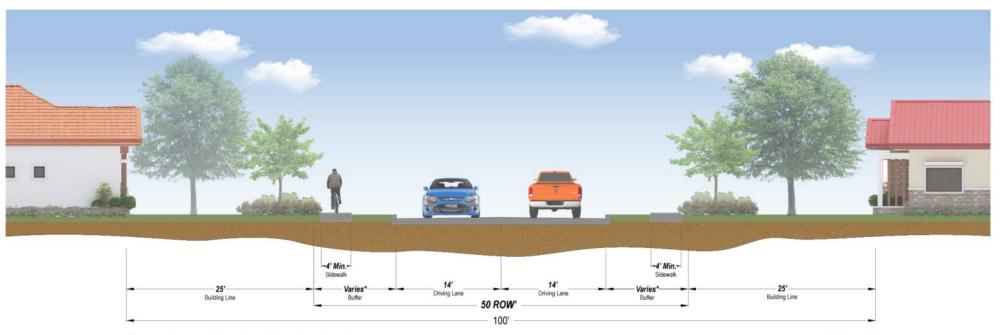
# Figure 2: Conceptual Plan - 1,154 Lots





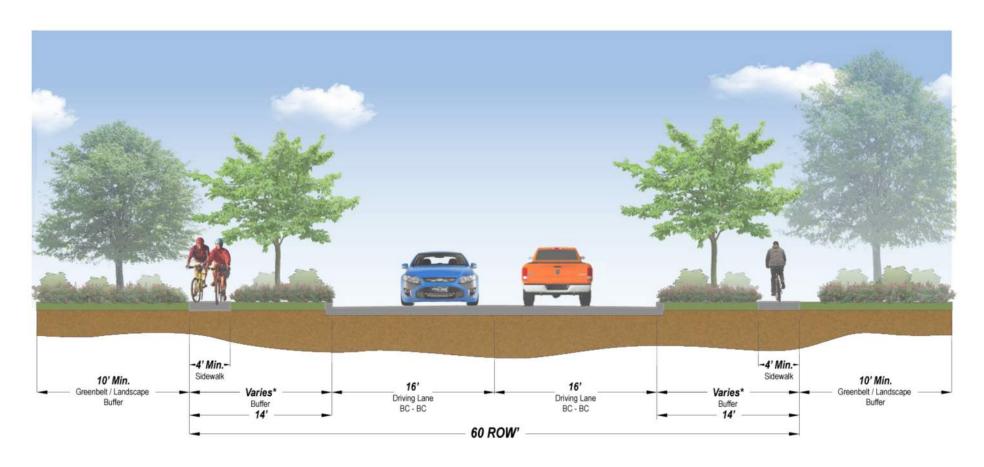






Street Cross Section | Residential Street \*Sidewalk can meander within the ROW

Street Cross Section | Collector Street \*Sidewalk can meander within the ROW

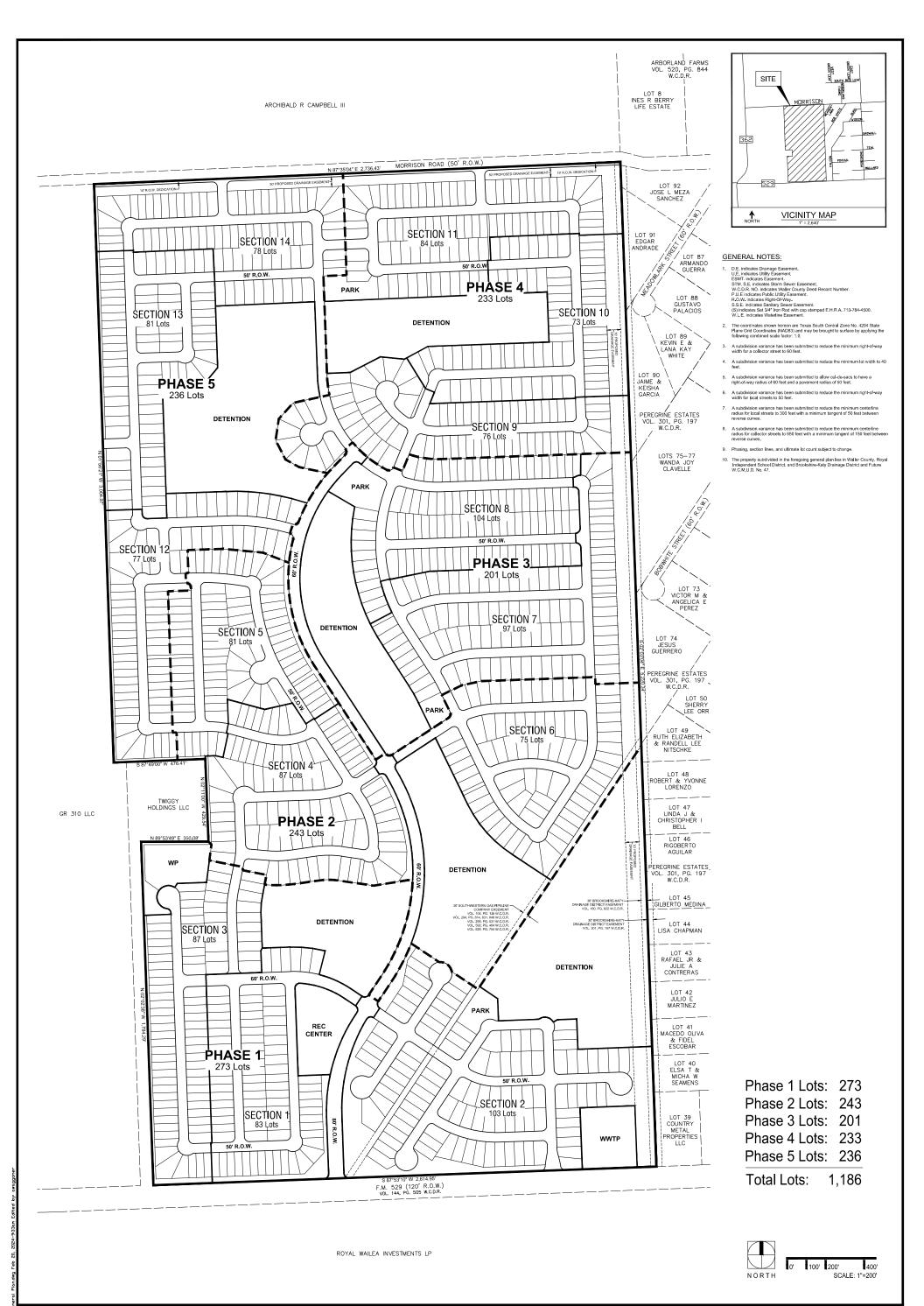

THIS TAX RATE WILL EFFECTIVELY BE RAISED BY .80 PERCENT AND WILL LOWER TAXES FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS ON A \$100,000 BY APPROXIMATELY \$-23.35.

This total tax rate shall be levied as follows:

There shall be levied and collected upon all taxable property in Waller County for the year 2024, for the use of the County, except the first Three Thousand (\$3,000.00) value of residential homestead, an ad valorem tax for maintenance and operations of \$.023043 on each \$100.00 worth of taxable property so assessed to be credited to the Farm-to-Market Roads of Waller County, Texas.

There shall be levied and collected upon all taxable property in Waller County for the year 2024, for the use of the County, an ad valorem tax for maintenance and operations of \$.413977 on each \$100.00 worth of taxable property so assessed to be credited to the General Fund of Waller County, Texas.

There shall be levied and collected upon all taxable property in Waller County for the year 2024, for the use of the County, an ad valorem tax for interest and sinking of \$.059001 on

each \$100.00 worth of taxable property so assessed to be credited to the Debt Fund of Waller County, Texas.

It shall be noted that Waller County grants a \$25,000.00 homestead exemption to persons who are sixty-five (65) year of age or older or who are disabled persons as has been previously allowed.

It shall be noted that Waller County grants an exemption of twenty percent (20%) of the appraised value of the residence homestead of Waller County residents in accordance with Tax Code Sec. 11.13(n), as amended. If this percentage produces an exemption of less than \$5,000.00 when applied to a particular residence homestead, the individual is entitled to an exemption of \$5,000.00 of the appraised value.

IN NO EVENT SHALL EITHER PARTY BE LIABLE FOR INCIDENTAL, CONSEQUENTIAL, OR SPECIAL DAMAGES OF ANY KIND, INCLUDING, WITHOUT LIMITATION, LOST REVENUES OR PROFITS, OR LOSS OF BUSINESS OR LOSS OF DATA ARISING OUT OF THIS AGREEMENT, IRRESPECTIVE OF WHETHER THE PARTIES HAVE ADVANCE NOTICE OF THE POSSIBILITY OF SUCH DAMAGE.

THE FOREGOING LIMITATIONS OF LIABILITY SET FORTH IN THIS SECTION 6 SHALL NOT APPLY WITH RESPECT TO: (A) DAMAGES OCCASIONED BY THE FRAUD, GROSS NEGLIGENCE, OR WILLFUL MISCONDUCTOF EITHER PARTY; (B) DAMAGES OCCASIONED BY VIOLATION OF LAW.

7. Force Majeure. Neither party shall be liable for delays in performing its obligations under this Agreement to the extent that the delay is caused by Force Majeure. "Force Majeure" is defined as an event beyond the reasonable control of a party, including governmental action, war, riot or civil commotion, fire, natural disaster, labor disputes, restraints affecting shipping or credit, delay of carriers, inadequate supply of suitable materials or any other cause which could not with reasonable diligence be foreseen, controlled or prevented by the party.

- 8. <u>Insurance</u>. Upon written request, Tyler shall provide Client with certificates of insurance evidencing the following insurance coverage:
  - a) Commercial general liability of at least \$1,000,000;
  - b) Automobile liability of at least \$1,000,000;
  - c) Professional liability of at least \$1,000,000; and
  - d) Workers compensation complying with statutory requirements.

#### 9. Miscellaneous.

- (a) <u>Tax Exempt Status</u>. Client is a governmental tax-exempt entity and shall not be responsible for any taxes for any services provided for herein, whether federal or state. The fees paid to Tyler pursuant to this Agreement are inclusive of any applicable sales, use, personal property, or other taxes attributable to periods on or after the Effective Date of this Agreement.
- (b) <u>Assignment</u>. Neither Tyler nor the Client shall, sell, transfer, assign, or otherwise dispose of any rights or obligations created by this Agreement without the written consent of the other party.
- (c) <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.
- (d) <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement and the Schedules hereto constitute the entire understanding and contract between the Parties and supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous oral or written representations or communications with respect to the subject matter hereof. The Exhibits to this Agreement are incorporated by reference herein.
- (e) Amendment. This Agreement shall not be modified, amended, or in any way altered except by an instrument in writing signed by the properly delegated authority of each party. All amendments or modifications of this Agreement shall be binding upon the parties despite any lack of consideration.
- (f) Relationship of Parties. The parties intend that the relationship between the parties created pursuant to or arising from this Agreement is that of an independent contractor only. Neither party shall be considered an agent, representative, or employee of the other party for any purpose.
- (g) <u>Governing Law.</u> Any dispute arising out of or relating to this Agreement or the breach thereof shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas, without regard to or application of choice of law rules or principles.
- (h) <u>No Third Party Beneficiaries</u>. Nothing in this Agreement is intended to benefit, create any rights in, or otherwise vest any rights upon any third party.
- (i) Equitable Relief. Each party covenants, represents, and warrants that any violation of this Agreement by such party with respect to its respective obligations set forth in Section 4 shall cause irreparable injury to the other party and shall entitle the other party to extraordinary and equitable relief by a Court of competent jurisdiction, including, without limitation, temporary restraining orders and preliminary and permanent injunctions, without the necessity of posting bond or security.
- (j) <u>Survival</u>. The provisions of Sections 4 through 9 shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

#### ESO SUBSCRIPTION AGREEMENT

This ESO Subscription Agreement (this "Agreement") is entered into as of the date of the signing ("Effective Date"), by and between ESO Solutions, Inc., a Texas corporation having its principal place of business at 11500 Alterra Parkway, Suite 100 Austin, TX 78758, including its controlled subsidiaries, (collectively, "ESO") and Waller County, Texas, having its principal place of business at 425 FM 1488, Suite 106, Hempstead, Texas 77445 ("Customer"). This Agreement consists of these terms and conditions (the "General Terms & Conditions") below, the Business Associate Agreement, and any Order (as defined below) executed by the parties, including any attachments to such Order.

The parties have agreed that ESO will provide Customer certain technology products and/or services and that Customer will pay ESO certain fees. Therefore, in consideration of the covenants, agreements and promises set forth below, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties, intending to be legally bound, hereby agree as follows.

#### **GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

- **DEFINITIONS.** Capitalized terms not otherwise defined in this Agreement have the meanings below:
- "Add-On Software" means any complementary software components or reporting service(s) that ESO makes available to customer through its Software.
- "Customer Data" means information, data and other content in electronic form that is submitted, posted, or otherwise transmitted by or on behalf of Customer through the Software.
- "De-identified Data" means Customer Data which (i) if PHI, has been deidentified in accordance with HIPAA, or (ii) if not PHI, which has had all personally identifiable information removed, as well as the names and addresses of Customer and any of its Users and/or Customer's clients, and in each case as a consequence is neither PHI nor identifiable to or by Customer.
- "Deliverable" means software, report, or other work product created pursuant to a Statement of Work.
- "Documentation" means the Software's user guides and operating manuals.
- "Feedback" refers to any suggestion or idea for improving or otherwise modifying ESO's products or services.
- "Integrated Service" means a third-party hardware, software, service, website, or data that is integrated with (or interoperates) with a Service. Nonexclusive examples of Integrated Services include computer-aided dispatch (CAD), cardiac monitors and billing software.
- "Intellectual Property" means trade secrets, copyrightable subject matter, patents and patent applications, and other proprietary information, activities, and any ideas, concepts, innovations, inventions and designs.
- "Licensed Software" means the executable, object code version of software that ESO provides to Customer for its use and installation on Customer's own equipment. For the avoidance of doubt, Licensed Software does not include Add-on Software or SaaS.
- "New Version" means any new version of Licensed Software (excluding SaaS Software) that ESO may from time to time introduce and market generally as a distinct licensed product, as may be indicated by ESO's designation of a new version number, brand or product.
- "Order" means a document addressing the order of a specific set of products or services which is executed by authorized representatives of each party. An Order may be (a) an ESO sales form or "Quote", (b) a Statement of Work, or (c) an addendum or other writing which is attached or which the parties intend to be incorporated by reference into this Agreement. For the avoidance of doubt, unilateral purchase orders and other similar documents do not constitute an Ordering Document.
- "Outage" means Customer is unable to access SaaS, or such access is materially delayed, impaired or disrupted, in each case as caused or controlled by ESO.
- "Professional Services" means professional services provided by ESO under a Statement of Work.
- "Protected Health Information" or "PHI" has the meaning set forth in HIPAA. All references herein to PHI shall be construed to include electronic PHI, or ePHI, as that term is defined by HIPAA.
- "Reporting Services" means, collectively, the different tools or features in the Software allowing Customer to generate compilations of data, including but not limited to ad-hoc reports, analytics, benchmarking or any other reporting tool provided through the Software.
- "SaaS" means software-as-a-service that ESO hosts (directly or indirectly) for Customer's use on a periodic subscription basis. For the avoidance of doubt, SaaS does not include Licensed Software.
- "Scheduled Downtime" means periods when ESO intentionally interrupts SaaS to perform system maintenance or otherwise correct service errors during non-peak hours (except for critical circumstances), typically between midnight and 6 a.m. Central Time on a fortnightly basis.

- "Software" means any ESO computer program, programming or modules specified in the Agreement or any Order. For the avof doubt, Add-on Software, SaaS, and Licensed Software are collectively referred to as Software.
- "Support Services" means those services described in Exhibit B.
- "Third-Party Data" means data not owned by ESO but which is (or access to which is) provided by ESO under an Order (such as fire codes or AAAM AIS codes).
- "Third-Party Service" means a service not provided by ESO but which is made available by ESO in connection with its Software under an Order.
- "Third-Party Software" means software not owned by ESO but which is (or access to which is) provided by ESO under an or Order.
- "Use Restrictions" means the restrictions imposed on Customer's use of Software as described in Section 3.3.
- "User" means any individual who uses the Software on Customer's behalf through Customer's account or passwords.
- 2. SOFTWARE ORDERS. During the Term, Customer may order Software from ESO by its governing body approving the Order, and an authorized representative signing an appropriate Order. Customer's license to Licensed Software and its subscription to SaaS are set forth below. Each such Order is incorporated herein by reference.

#### LICENSE/SUBSCRIPTION TO SOFTWARE

- 3.1. Grant of Subscription: SaaS. For SaaS, during the Term Customer may access and use the SaaS and Reporting Services, with the access and volume limitations set forth on the applicable Order, subject to Customer's compliance with the Use Restrictions and other limitations contained in this Agreement.
- 3.2. Grant of License: Licensed Software. For Licensed Software, during the Term ESO hereby grants Customer a limited, nonexclusive, non-transferable, non-assignable, non-sublicensable, revocable license to copy and use the Licensed Software, in such quantities as are set forth on the applicable Order and as necessary for Customer's internal business purposes, in each case subject to Customer's compliance with the Use Restrictions and other limitations and obligations contained in this Agreement.
- 3.3. Use Restrictions. Except as provided in this Agreement or as otherwise authorized by ESO, Customer has no right to, and shall not: (a) decompile, reverse engineer, disassemble, print, copy or display the Software or otherwise reduce the Software to a human-perceivable form in whole or in part; (b) publish, release, rent, lease, loan, sell, distribute or transfer the Software to another person or entity; (c) reproduce the Software for the use or benefit of anyone other than Customer; (d) alter, modify or create derivative works based upon the Software either in whole or in part; or (e) use or permit the use of the Software for commercial time-sharing arrangements or providing service bureau, data processing, rental, or other services to any third party (including any affiliate not specifically listed in the applicable Order).
- 3.4. Ownership. The rights granted under the provisions of this Agreement do not constitute a sale of the Software. ESO retains all right, title, and interest in and to the Software, including without limitation all software used to provide the Software and all graphics, user interfaces, logos and trademarks reproduced through the Software, and Feedback, except to the limited extent set forth in this Agreement. This Agreement does not grant Customer any intellectual property rights in the Software or any of its components, except to the limited extent that this Agreement specifically sets forth Customer's rights to access, use, or copy the Software during the Term. Customer acknowledges that the Software and its components are protected by copyright and other laws.
- 3.5. Third-Party Software and Services. This Section 3.5 applies to Third-Party Software and Services offered by ESO. Refer to the product table following the Agreement for applicability.
- 3.5.1. ESO neither accepts liability for, nor warrants the functionality, utility, availability, reliability or accuracy of, Third-Party Software or Third-Party Services.
- 3.5.2. Third-Party Data. If Customer (as indicated on an Order) elects to license Third-Party Data (e.g., fire codes), then subject to the terms hereof, ESO hereby grants Customer a non-exclusive, non-sublicensable, and non-transferable license during the Term to use such Third-Party Data via the Software solely for Customer's internal purposes. Customer will not (i) allow greater access than that set forth in the applicable Order, (ii) disclose, release, distribute, or deliver Third-Party Data, or any portion thereof, to any third party (iii) copy, modify, or create derivative works of Third-Party Data, (iv) rent, lease, lend, sell, sublicense, assign, distribute, publish, transfer, or otherwise make available Third-Party Data, (v) attempt to output in any form more than 10% of the Third-Party Data or otherwise circumvent the usage limitations included in the Software, (vi) remove any proprietary notices included within Third-Party Data or Software, or (vii) use Third-Party Data in any manner or for any purpose that infringes or otherwise violates any proprietary right of a person, or that violates applicable law. ESO does not warrant the functionality, reliability, accuracy, completeness or utility of, Third-Party Data, or accept any liability therefor. Additional terms and limitations applicable to Third-Party Data may be provided on the applicable Order.
- 3.6. Integrated Services. Customer is responsible for securing the right for ESO to receive, transmit, process, display, and store all data ("Integrated Data") from and to any Integrated Service to the extent required for ESO to perform its obligations and exercise its rights under this Agreement. ESO's obligation to support Integrated Services is contingent upon Customer securing such

rights. Customer's failure to secure such rights does not terminate or suspend Customer's obligation to pay Fees. Custor bears (and shall hold ESO harmless from) all risks associated with access to and use of Integrated Services and Integrated Data. Any Integrated Data made accessible by ESO in or through the Integrated Service is provided on an "as-is" and "as available" basis without any warranty of any kind. Customer acknowledges that ESO is not responsible for and under no obligation to control, monitor or correct Integrated Data; provided, however, ESO reserves the right to take remedial action if any such data violates applicable law or this Agreement, including without limitation, the removal of, or disablement of access to, such data and the Integrated Service. Customer acknowledges that ESO's ability to deliver each Service is contingent upon Customer or User's compliance with this Agreement and any applicable third party's terms of use. Accordingly, if ESO's performance under this Agreement is prevented or delayed by any act or omission of Customer or its agents, subcontractors, or third-party vendors (other than ESO) ("Customer Delay"), ESO shall not be deemed in breach of its obligations under this Agreement or otherwise be liable for any costs or losses of Customer (in each case, to the extent arising directly or indirectly from Customer Delay).

3.7. Third Party APIs. Customer acknowledges that: (i) the nature, type, quality and availability of Integrated Data and Integrated Services may change at any time during the Term, and (ii) features of the Integrated Service that integrate or interoperate with third parties and Integrated Data depend on the continuing availability of such third parties' respective application programming interfaces ("APIs") for use with the Integrated Service. ESO may update, change or modify the Integrated Services under this Agreement because of a change in, or unavailability of, such Integrated Data or APIs. If any third-party ceases to make its Integrated Data or APIs available on reasonable terms for the Integrated Services, as determined by ESO in its sole discretion, ESO may cease providing access to or support for the affected Integrated Data or Integrated Service without any liability to Customer. If any changes to Integrated Data or APIs occur with no fault of Customer, including their availability or unavailability, during the Term, Customer's obligations under this Agreement or the applicable Order will be prorated accordingly. Customer will not be responsible for fees related to a service or benefit under this Agreement that it does not receive.

#### 4. HOSTING, SLA & SUPPORT SERVICES

- 4.1. Hosting & Management. Customer shall be responsible for hosting and managing any Licensed Software on systems meeting the requirements specified by ESO. ESO shall be responsible for hosting and managing any SaaS.
- 4.2. Service Level Agreement. If an Outage, excluding Scheduled Downtime (as defined below), results in the service level uptime falling below 99% for any three-month period (the "Uptime Commitment"), then Customer may immediately terminate this Agreement, in which case ESO will refund any prepaid, unearned Fees to Customer. This is Customer's sole remedy for ESO's breach of the Uptime Commitment.
- 4.3. Scheduled Downtime. ESO will endeavor to provide reasonable (72 hour) notice of Scheduled Downtime to Customer's Users. Notice of Scheduled Downtime may be provided from within the Software or via email. Scheduled Downtime shall never constitute a failure of performance or Outage by ESO. Notification timelines and the frequency of Scheduled Downtime are subject to the emergence of security concerns outside of ESO's control.
- 4.4. Support and Updates. During the Term, ESO shall provide to Customer the Support Services, in accordance with Exhibit B, which is incorporated herein by reference. ESO may update and revise its Software, providing reasonable notice in the case of any material diminishment.

#### 5. **FEES**

- 5.1. Fees. In consideration of the rights granted hereunder, Customer agrees to pay ESO the fees for the Software and Professional Services as set forth in the Order(s) (collectively, "Fees"). The Fees are non-cancelable and non-refundable, except as expressly provided herein. Customer (or Third-Party Payer, if applicable) shall pay all invoices within 30 days of receipt.
- 5.2. Third-Party Payer. If Customer desires to use a third-party to pay some or all of the Fees on behalf of Customer (a "Third-Party Payer"), then (i) each applicable Order will identify such arrangement, (ii) the Third-Party Payer will enter into a written agreement with ESO regarding such arrangement, (iii) Customer may replace the Third-Party Payer by written notice to ESO (provided that no such change shall be made until the then-current Term's renewal), (iv) references within this Section 5 to Customer's responsibility for Fees shall be understood to refer to the Third-Party Payer when applicable, and (v) Customer shall remain responsible for payment if the Third-Party Payer does not pay the Fees.
- 5.3. <u>Uplift on Renewal</u>. Fees for Software, which recur annually, shall increase by 8.75% each year this Agreement is in effect.
- 5.4. Taxes and Fees. The Fees are exclusive of all taxes and credit card processing fees, if applicable. ESO understands that Customer is a governmental entity, and is exempt from paying taxes. Customer will provide tax-exempt documentation to ESO upon execution of this Agreement.
- 5.5. Appropriation of Funds. Customer may terminate the Agreement at the end of the Customer's fiscal term if its governing body did not appropriate sufficient funds for the next fiscal year. Notwithstanding the foregoing, this provision shall not excuse Customer from past payment obligations or other Fees earned and unpaid.
- 5.6. Usage Monitoring. Customer is solely responsible for its own adherence to volume and use limitations indicated on the applicable Order. ESO may monitor Customer's use of the Software, and if Customer's usage exceeds the level indicated in the

applicable Order (an "Overage"), Customer shall owe ESO the Fee corresponding to such usage level at a rate no high ESO's then-standard pricing for new customers at an equivalent usage level. ESO may invoice for Overages immediately.

#### 6. TERM AND TERMINATION

- 6.1. Term. The term of this Agreement (the "Term") commences on the Effective Date and continues for a period of one year (or any longer period provided in an Order). Thereafter, the Term will renew for successive one-year periods unless written notice is provided at least 60 days prior to the anniversary of the Effective Date.
- 6.2. Termination for Cause. Either party may terminate this Agreement or any individual Order for the other party's uncured material breach by providing written notice. The breaching party shall have 30 days from receipt to cure such breach to the reasonable satisfaction of the non-breaching party.
- 6.3. Termination for Convenience. Either party may terminate this Agreement without cause upon 30 days' written notice by the terminating party provided that in no event shall ESO provide Customer a refund for pre-paid Fees in the event of a Termination under this Section.
- 6.4. Effect of Termination. If Customer terminates this Agreement or any Order as a result of ESO's material breach, then to the extent Customer prepaid any Fees, ESO shall refund to Customer those prepaid Fees on a pro-rata basis from the date Customer actually ceases use of the Software. Upon termination of this Agreement or any Order, Customer shall cease all use of the Software and delete, destroy or return all copies of the Documentation and Licensed Software in its possession or control, except as required by law. Customer shall remain obligated to pay appropriate Fees at ESO's then-current rates if Customer continues to use or access Software after the termination or expiration of this Agreement. Termination of this Agreement is without prejudice to any other right or remedy and shall not release a party from any liability.
- 6.5. Delivery of Data. ESO will provide Customer its Customer Data in a searchable pdf format upon request made within 60 days of the expiration or termination of this Agreement. Customer acknowledges that ESO has no obligation to retain Customer Data more than 60 days after expiration or termination of this Agreement.

#### 7. REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES

- 7.1. Material Performance of Software. After it is fully implemented (and subject to Customer's adherence to Sections 3.3, 4.1 and 13.4), ESO warrants that the Software will reliably collect, transmit, store and/or permit access to data in compliance with applicable law and industry standards.
- 7.2. Due Authority. Each party's execution, delivery and performance of this Agreement and each agreement or instrument contemplated by this Agreement is duly authorized by all necessary corporate or government action.
- 7.3. Customer Cooperation. Customer agrees to use current operating systems and reasonably and timely cooperate with ESO, including providing ESO reasonable access to its equipment, software and data as necessary for the implementation and operation of the Software.
- DISCLAIMER OF WARRANTIES. EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN SECTION 7, ESO DISCLAIMS ALL WARRANTIES, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, INCLUDING ALL IMPLIED WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY, FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE, PERFORMANCE, SUITABILITY, TITLE, NON-INFRINGEMENT, OR ANY IMPLIED WARRANTY ARISING FROM STATUTE, COURSE OF DEALING, COURSE OF PERFORMANCE, OR USAGE OF TRADE. EXCEPT AS EXPRESSLY PROVIDED IN SECTION 7, CUSTOMER ACCEPTS THE SOFTWARE "AS-IS" AND "AS AVAILABLE."

#### CONFIDENTIALITY

9.1. "Confidential Information". ESO understands that Customer is a governmental entity subject to Texas Government Code Chapter 552 (the Texas Public Information Act), including Sections 552.371 and 552.372. ESO will limit or avoid, if possible. disclosing to Customer proprietary trade secret information. If ESO discloses to Customer any information that is confidential under the Texas Public Information Act, it shall clearly identify in writing that the information is proprietary or confidential. Customer will treat such information as confidential only to the extent allowable under the Texas Public Information Act or similar applicable disclosure law. Customer will, to the extent allowed by law, endeavor to protect from public disclosure the information that has been identified and marked as proprietary. In the event Customer seeks to withhold information under the Texas Public Information Act, ESO understands the confidential information will be sent to the Texas Attorney General, and ESO agrees to reasonably cooperate with Customer should the need arise. The final decision as to what information must be disclosed pursuant to the Texas Public Information Act, however, lies with the Texas Attorney General. It is understood that the Customer, its officers, and employees shall have the right to rely on the advice, decisions, and opinions of the Texas Attorney General, and that the Customer, its officers, and employees shall have no liability or obligation to any party hereto for the disclosure to the public, or to any person or persons, of any items or data furnished to the Customer by ESO, in reliance on any advice, decision, or opinion of the Texas Attorney General. If ESO fails to properly identify the information, Customer shall have no obligation to seek protection of such information from public disclosure. Customer and its representatives and/or employees will not be responsible for ESO's failure to clearly identify information ESO considers confidential or proprietary. ESO considers the following items to be Confidential Information: (a) any document marked "Confidential"; (b) any information designated in writing as "Confidential" at the time of disclosure; (c) the Software and Documentation; (d) ESO's security controls, policies, procedures,

audits, or other information concerning ESO's internal security posture; (e) any other nonpublic, sensitive information real treated as trade secret or otherwise confidential that is clearly identified in writing as such; and (f) Customer Data which does not comprise PHI. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Confidential Information does not include information that: (i) is in the other party's possession at the time of disclosure free of duty of non-disclosure; (ii) is independently developed without use of or reference to Confidential Information; (iii) becomes known publicly, before or after disclosure, other than as a result of the receiving party's improper action or inaction; (iv) is approved for release in writing by the disclosing party; (v) as to ESO, Customer's Feedback; or (vi) is PHI (which shall be governed by the Business Associate Agreement rather than this Section).

- 9.2. Nondisclosure. Each party shall use Confidential Information of the other party solely to fulfill the terms of this Agreement (the "Purpose"), and in accordance with applicable law, including but not limited to the Texas Public Information Act. Each party shall (a) ensure that its employees or contractors are bound by confidentiality obligations no less restrictive than those contained herein, and (b) not disclose Confidential Information to any other third party without prior written notice to the disclosing party. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the receiving party shall protect Confidential Information with the same degree of care it uses to protect its own confidential information of similar nature and importance, but with no less than reasonable care. A receiving party shall promptly notify the disclosing party of any misuse or misappropriation of Confidential Information of which it is aware.
- 9.3. Termination & Return. With respect to each item of Confidential Information, the obligations of nondisclosure will terminate upon the termination of this Agreement. ESO understands that Customer is a governmental body, and must comply with laws related to governmental records. To the extent possible and consistent with applicable law, upon termination of this Agreement, a party shall return all copies of Confidential Information to the other or certify the destruction thereof.
- 9.4. Retention of Rights. This Agreement does not transfer ownership of Confidential Information or grant a license thereto.
- 9.5. Open Records and Other Laws. Notwithstanding anything in this Section to the contrary, the parties expressly acknowledge that Confidential Information may be disclosed if such Confidential Information is required to be disclosed by law, a lawful public records request, or judicial order, provided that prior to such disclosure, written notice of such required disclosure shall be given promptly and without unreasonable delay by the receiving party in order to give the disclosing party the opportunity to object to the disclosure and/or to seek a protective order. The receiving party shall reasonably cooperate in this effort.
- 10. INSURANCE. Throughout the Term (and for a period of at least three years thereafter for any insurance written on a claims-made form) ESO shall maintain in effect the insurance coverage described below:
- 10.1. Commercial general liability insurance with a minimum of \$1 million per occurrence and \$1 million aggregate;
- 10.2. Commercial automobile liability insurance covering use of all non-owned and hired automobiles with a minimum limit of \$1 million for bodily injury and property damage liability;
- 10.3. Worker's compensation insurance and employer's liability insurance or any alternative plan or coverage as permitted or required by applicable law, with a minimum employer's liability limit of \$1 million each accident or disease; and
- 10.4. Computer processor/computer professional liability insurance (a/k/a technology errors and omissions) covering the liability for financial loss due to error, omission or negligence of ESO, and privacy and network security insurance ("cyber coverage") covering losses arising from a disclosure of confidential information (including PHI) with a combined aggregate amount of \$1 million.

#### 11. INDEMNIFICATION

11.1.IP Infringement. Subject to the limitations in Section 12, ESO shall hold harmless, defend and indemnify Customer AND/OR ITS EMPLOYEES, AGENTS, REPRESENTATIVES, CONTRACTORS, ASSIGNEES, AND/OR DESIGNEES from any and all thirdparty claims, including but not limited to damages, costs, liabilities, and expenses (including reasonable attorney's fees) ("Damages") as to any and all third-party claim or action alleging that the Software delivered pursuant to this Agreement infringe or misappropriate any third party's patent, copyright, trade secret, or other intellectual or intangible property rights in connection with the PERFORMANCE OR ACTIONS OF ESO PURSUANT TO THIS CONTRACT (each, an "Indemnified Claim"). ESO AND CUSTOMER AGREE TO FURNISH TIMELY WRITTEN NOTICE TO EACH OTHER OF ANY SUCH CLAIM. ESO SHALL BE LIABLE TO PAY ALL COSTS OF DEFENSE INCLUDING ATTORNEY'S FEES. THE DEFENSE SHALL BE COORDINATED BY CUSTOMER'S LEGAL COUNSEL. If Customer makes an Indemnified Claim under this Section or if ESO determines that an Indemnified Claim may occur, ESO may at its option: (a) obtain a right for Customer to continue using such Software; (b) modify such Software to make it a non-infringing equivalent or (c) replace such Software with a noninfringing equivalent. If (a), (b), or (c) above are not reasonably practicable, either party may, at its option, terminate the relevant Order, in which case ESO will refund any pre-paid Fees on a pro-rata basis for such Order. Notwithstanding the foregoing, ESO shall have no obligation hereunder for any claim resulting or arising from (x) Customer's breach of this Agreement; (y) modifications made to the Software not performed or provided by or on behalf of ESO or (z) the combination, operation or use by Customer (and/or anyone acting on Customer's behalf) of the Software in connection with any other product or service (the combination or joint use of which causes the alleged infringement). This Section 11 states ESO's sole obligation and liability, and Customer's sole remedy, for potential or actual intellectual property infringement by the Software.

- 11.2. Indemnification Procedures. Upon becoming aware of any matter which is subject to the provisions of Sections 11.1 (a Customer must give prompt written notice of such Claim to ESO, accompanied by copies of any written documentation regarding the Claim received by the Customer. ESO shall compromise or defend, at its own expense and with its own counsel, any such Claim. Customer will have the right, at its option, to participate in the settlement or defense of any such Claim, with its own counsel and at its own expense; provided, however, that ESO will have the right to control such settlement or defense. ESO will not enter into any settlement that imposes any liability or obligation on Customer without the Customer's prior written consent. The parties will cooperate in any such settlement or defense and give each other full access to all relevant information, at ESO's expense.
- 11.3. Acts or Omissions. . Subject to the limitations in Section 12, ESO shall indemnify and hold harmless Customer, AND/OR THEIR OFFICERS, AGENTS, EMPLOYEES, REPRESENTATIVES, CONTRACTORS, ASSIGNEES, AND/OR DESIGNEES FROM AN AGAINST ANY AND ALL LIABILITY, ACTIONS, CLAIMS, DEMANDS, OR SUITS, AND ALL RELATED COSTS, ATTORNEY FEES, AND EXPENSES arising out of, or resulting from any acts or omissions of ESO or its agents, employees, subcontractors, third-party providers, or suppliers in the execution or performance of this Agreement, and any Orders issued under this Agreement. ESO SHALL PAY ALL COSTS OF DEFENSE INCLUDING ATTORNEYS FEES. THE DEFENSE SHALL BE COORDINATED BY CUSTOMER'S LEGAL COUNSEL.

#### 12. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

- 12.1. LIMITATION OF DAMAGES. NEITHER ESO NOR CUSTOMER SHALL BE LIABLE TO THE OTHER FOR ANY CONSEQUENTIAL, INDIRECT, SPECIAL, PUNITIVE OR INCIDENTAL DAMAGES, INCLUDING CLAIMS FOR DAMAGES FOR LOST PROFITS, GOODWILL, USE OF MONEY, INTERRUPTED OR IMPAIRED USE OF THE SOFTWARE, AVAILABILITY OF DATA, STOPPAGE OF WORK OR IMPAIRMENT OF OTHER ASSETS RELATING TO THIS AGREEMENT.
- 12.2. SPECIFIC LIABILITY. LIABILITY SHALL BE LIMITED AS FOLLOWS:
  - (a) ESO'S OBLIGATIONS UNDER SECTION 11 SHALL BE LIMITED TO \$500,000.
  - (b) DAMAGES ARISING FROM A PARTY'S BREACH OF CONFIDENTIALITY OBLIGATIONS (INCLUDING A BREACH OF OBLIGATIONS REGARDING PROTECTED HEALTH INFORMATION), SHALL BE LIMITED TO \$1,000,000.
  - (c) DAMAGES ARISING FROM A PARTY'S WILLFUL MISCONDUCT OR CRIMINAL CONDUCT SHALL NOT BE LIMITED.
- 12.3. GENERAL LIABILITY. EXCEPT AS EXPRESSLY PROVIDED "SPECIFIC LIABILITY," ESO'S MAXIMUM AGGREGATE LIABILITY FOR ALL CLAIMS OF LIABILITY ARISING OUT OF OR IN CONNECTION WITH THIS AGREEMENT SHALL NOT EXCEED THE FEES PAID BY (OR ON BEHALF OF) CUSTOMER WITHIN THE PRECEDING 12-MONTH PERIOD UNDER THE APPLICABLE ORDER OR EXHIBIT GIVING RISE TO THE CLAIM.
- 12.4. THE FOREGOING LIMITATIONS, EXCLUSIONS, DISCLAIMERS SHALL APPLY REGARDLESS OF WHETHER THE CLAIM FOR SUCH DAMAGES IS BASED IN CONTRACT, WARRANTY, STRICT LIABILITY, NEGLIGENCE, TORT OR OTHERWISE. INSOFAR AS APPLICABLE LAW PROHIBITS ANY LIMITATION HEREIN, THE PARTIES AGREE THAT SUCH LIMITATION SHALL BE AUTOMATICALLY MODIFIED. BUT ONLY TO THE EXTENT SO AS TO MAKE THE LIMITATION PERMITTED TO THE FULLEST EXTENT POSSIBLE UNDER SUCH LAW. THE PARTIES AGREE THAT THE LIMITATIONS SET FORTH HEREIN ARE AGREED ALLOCATIONS OF RISK CONSTITUTING IN PART THE CONSIDERATION FOR ESO'S SOFTWARE AND SERVICES TO CUSTOMER, AND SUCH LIMITATIONS WILL APPLY NOTWITHSTANDING THE FAILURE OF THE ESSENTIAL PURPOSES OF ANY LIMITED REMEDY AND EVEN IF A PARTY HAS BEEN ADVISED OF THE POSSIBILITY OF SUCH LIABILITIES.
- 12.5. THIS SECTION 12 SHALL SURVIVE EXPIRATION OR TERMINATION OF THE AGREEMENT.

#### 13. CUSTOMER DATA & PRIVACY

- 13.1. Ownership of Data. As between ESO and Customer, all Customer Data shall be owned by Customer.
- 13.2. Use of Customer Data, Unless it receives Customer's prior written consent, ESO shall not grant any third-party access to Customer Data, except (a) subcontractors that are subject to a reasonable nondisclosure agreement or (b) authorized participants in the case of Software designed to permit Customer to transmit Customer Data. ESO may only use and disclose Customer Data to fulfill its obligations under this Agreement or as required by applicable law or legal or governmental authority. ESO shall give Customer prompt notice of any such legal or governmental demand and reasonably cooperate with Customer in any effort to seek a protective order or otherwise contest such required disclosure, at Customer's expense.
- 13.3. De-identified Data. CUSTOMER ACKNOWLEDGES AND AGREES THAT, NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION HEREIN, ESO MAY USE DE-IDENTIFIED DATA FOR INTERNAL AND EXTERNAL PURPOSES (INCLUDING BENCHMARKING AND RESEARCH), PROVIDED THAT ESO WILL NOT SELL DE-IDENTIFIED DATA TO THIRD PARTIES FOR COMMERCIAL USE. Without limiting the foregoing, ESO will own all right, title and interest in all Intellectual Property of any aggregated and de-identified reports, summaries, compilations, analysis, statistics or other information derived therefrom.

13.4. Internet Access. Customer is solely responsible for obtaining, maintaining, and securing its network connections, and acknowledges such connections are essential to the effective operation of the Software. ESO makes no representations to Customer regarding the reliability, performance or security of any network or service provider not provided or managed by ESO.

#### 14. WORK PRODUCT

14.1. Work Product Ownership. In the event Customer hires ESO to perform Professional Services, ESO alone shall hold all right, title, and interest to all proprietary and intellectual property rights of the Deliverables (including, without limitation, patents, trade secrets, copyrights, and trademarks), as well as title to any copy of software made by or for Customer (if applicable). Customer hereby explicitly acknowledges and agrees that nothing in this Agreement or a separate Order gives the Customer any right, title, or interest to the intellectual property or proprietary know-how of the Deliverables.

#### 15. GOVERNMENT PROVISIONS

- 15.1. Compliance with Laws. Both parties shall comply with and give all notices required by all applicable federal, state and local laws, ordinances, rules, regulations and lawful orders of any public authority bearing on use of the Software and the performance of this Agreement (provided that Customer shall be solely responsible for any such notice required to be given to its employees, agents or patients). Customer acknowledges and agrees that it must fully and accurately report discounts or other incentives under this Agreement on any cost reports or other applicable claims for payment submitted under any federal health care program, including but not limited to Medicare and Medicaid, as required by federal law.
- 15.2. Equal Opportunity. The parties shall abide by the requirements of 41 CFR 60-1.4(a), 60-300.5(a) and 60-741.5(a), and the posting requirements of 29 CFR Part 471, appendix A to subpart A, if applicable (prohibiting discrimination on the basis of protected veteran status, disability, race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or national origin).
- 15.3. Excluded Parties List. ESO agrees to report to Customer if an employee or contractor is listed by a federal agency as debarred, excluded or otherwise ineligible for participation in federally funded programs.

#### 16. ACCURACY & COMPLETENESS

16.1. Customer Responsibilities. The Software allows Customer and its Users to enter, document, and disclose Customer Data, and as such, ESO gives no representations or guarantees about the accuracy or completeness of Customer Data (including PHI) entered, uploaded or disclosed through the Software.

#### 17. MISCELLANEOUS

- 17.1. Independent Contractors. The parties are independent contractors. Neither party is the agent of the other, and neither may make commitments on the other's behalf. The parties agree that no ESO employee or contractor is or will be considered an employee of Customer.
- 17.2. Notices. Notices provided under this Agreement must be in writing and delivered by (a) certified mail, return receipt requested to a party's principal place of business as set forth in the recitals on page 1 of this Agreement, (b) hand delivered, (c) facsimile with receipt of a "Transmission Confirmed" acknowledgment, (d) e-mailed to a person designated in writing by the receiving party, or (e) delivered by a reputable overnight carrier service. In the case of delivery by facsimile or e-mail, the notice must be followed by a copy of the notice being delivered by a means provided in (a), (b) or (e). The notice will be deemed given on the day the notice is received.
- 17.3. Merger Clause. In entering into this Agreement, neither party is relying upon any representations or statements of the other that are not fully expressed in this Agreement; rather, each party is relying on its own judgment and due diligence and expressly disclaims reliance upon any representations or statement not expressly set forth in this Agreement. In the event the Customer issues a purchase order, letter or any other document addressing the Software or Services to be provided and performed pursuant to this Agreement, it is hereby specifically agreed and understood that any such writing is for the Customer's internal purposes only, and that any terms, provisions, and conditions contained therein shall in no way modify this Agreement.
- 17.4. Severability. To the extent permitted by applicable law, the parties hereby waive any provision of law that would render any clause of this Agreement invalid or otherwise unenforceable in any respect. If a provision of this Agreement is held to be invalid or otherwise unenforceable, such provision will be interpreted to fulfill its intended purpose to the maximum extent permitted by applicable law, and the remaining provisions of this Agreement will continue in full force and effect.
- 17.5. Subcontracting. Except for Support Services, and training and implementation services related to the Software, neither party may subcontract or delegate its obligations to each other hereunder, nor may it contract with third parties to perform any of its obligations hereunder except as contemplated in this Agreement, without the other party's prior written consent.
- 17.6. Modifications and Amendments. This Agreement may not be amended except through a written agreement signed by authorized representatives of each party, provided that the Customer agrees that ESO may rely on informal writings (including emails) of Customer's authorized representatives to terminate Software products and services. Any rate or tier increases for Software products and services in use by Customer must be approved by Customer's governing body.
- 17.7. Force Majeure. No delay, failure, or default will constitute a breach of this Agreement to the extent caused by acts of war. terrorism, hurricanes, earthquakes, other acts of God or of nature, strikes or other labor disputes, riots or other acts of civil

disorder, embargoes, or other causes beyond the performing party's reasonable control (collectively, "Force Majeure"). Ir event, however, the delayed party must promptly provide the other party notice of the Force Majeure. The delayed party stime for performance will be excused for the duration of the Force Majeure, but if the event lasts longer than 30 days, the other party may immediately terminate the applicable Order.

- 17.8. Marketing. If requested by ESO, Customer agrees to reasonably cooperate with ESO's preparation and issuance of a public announcement regarding the relationship of the parties.
- 17.9. Waiver & Breach. Neither party will be deemed to waive any rights under this Agreement except through an explicit written waiver made by an authorized representative of ESO, or the governing body of Customer. No waiver of a breach of this Agreement will constitute a waiver of any other breach hereof.
- 17.10. Survival of Terms. Unless otherwise stated, all of ESO's and Customer's respective obligations, representations and warranties under this Agreement which are not, by the expressed terms of this Agreement, fully to be performed while this Agreement is in effect shall survive the termination of this Agreement.
- 17.11. Ambiguous Terms. This Agreement will not be construed against any party by reason of its preparation.
- 17.12. Governing Law. This Agreement, any claim dispute or controversy hereunder (a "Dispute") will be governed by (i) the laws of the State of Texas. The UN Convention for the International Sale of Goods and the Uniform Computer Information Transactions Act will not apply. In any Dispute, each party will bear its own attorneys' fees and costs and expressly waives any statutory right to attorneys' fees. Venue for any dispute related to this Agreement shall be in Waller County, Texas.
- 17.13. New Versions & Sunset. If ESO releases a New Version of Licensed Software (i.e., not SaaS), Customer may elect to receive such New Version, subject to a relicense fee of 75% of the standard price for such new version. All New Versions provided under this Agreement will constitute Licensed Software and be subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement. ESO may discontinue Support Services for Licensed Software upon 12 months' notice to Customer.
- 17.14. No Class Actions. NEITHER PARTY SHALL BE ENTITLED TO JOIN OR CONSOLIDATE CLAIMS BY OR AGAINST OTHER ESO CUSTOMERS, OR PURSUE ANY CLAIM AS A REPRESENTATIVE OR CLASS ACTION OR IN A PRIVATE ATTORNEY GENERAL CAPACITY.
- 17.15. Dispute Resolution. Customer and ESO will attempt to resolve any Dispute through negotiation or by utilizing a mediator agreed to by the parties, rather than through litigation. ESO understands Customer is a governmental body, and that negotiations and mediations will be subject to applicable laws concerning confidentiality. If the parties are unable to reach a resolution within 30 days of notice of the Dispute to the other party, the parties may pursue all other courses of action available at law or in equity.
- 17.16. Technology Export. Customer shall not: (a) permit any third party to access or use the Software in violation of any U.S. law or regulation; or (b) export any software provided by ESO or otherwise remove it from the United States except in compliance with all applicable U.S. laws and regulations. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, Customer shall not permit any third party to access or use the Software in, or export such software to, a country subject to a United States embargo (as of the Effective Date - Cuba, Iran, North Korea, Sudan, and Syria).
- 17.17. Order of Precedence. In the event of any conflict between this Agreement, Addenda or other attachments incorporated herein, the following order of precedence will govern: (1) the General Terms and Conditions; (2) any Business Associate Agreement; (3) the applicable Order, with most recent Order taking precedence over earlier ones; and (4) any ESO policy posted online, including without limitation its privacy policy. No amendments incorporated into this Agreement after execution of the General Terms and Conditions will amend such General Terms and Conditions unless it specifically states its intent to do so and cites the section or sections amended.
- 17.18. Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts. Each counterpart will be an original, and all such counterparts will constitute a single instrument.
- 17.19. Signatures. Electronic signatures on this Agreement or on any Order (or copies of signatures sent via electronic means) are the equivalent of handwritten signatures.

  - 4.3. During the second year and any renewal years thereafter, 100% of the recurring Fees shall be due on the anniversary of the SaaS Subscription Start Date.

- 2.3 The Parties to this Agreement will adhere to all applicable laws concerning the procurement in its respective jurisdiction.
- 2.4 Access to the Cooperative Purchasing Program is effective upon the date of Participating Entity's completed registration. The Agreement will remain in effect until canceled by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party.
- 2.5 Each party agrees that it is responsible for its acts and the results thereof, to the extent authorized by law, and will not be responsible for the acts of the other Party.
- 2.6 There will be no financial remunerations by or obligations upon Participating Entity for participation in Sourcewell Cooperative Purchasing Program.
