

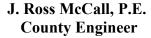



FURTHER, Owners have dedicated and by these presents do dedicate to the use of the public for public utility purpose forever unobstructed aerial easements. The aerial easements shall extend horizontally an additional ten feet (10' 0") for ten feet (10' 0") back—to—back ground easements, or eight feet (8' 0") for fourteen feet (14' 0") back—to—back ground easements or seven feet (7' 0") for sixteen feet (16' 0") back—to—back ground easements, from a plane sixteen feet (16' 0") above ground level upward, located adjacent to both sides and adjoining said public utility easements that are designated with aerial easements (U.E. and A.E.) as indicated and depicted hereon, whereby the aerial easement totals thirty feet (30' 0") in width.

OWNER'S RESPONSIBILITIES:

- (1) No structure in this subdivision shall be occupied until connected to a public sewer system which has been approved and permitted by Waller County Environmental Department.
- (2) No structure in this subdivision shall be occupied until connected to an individual water supply or a state—approved community water system.

# AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE WALLER COUNTY SHERIFF AND SUSTAINABLE SECURITY SOLUTIONS FOR ANNUAL PREVENTATIVE MAINTENANCE SERVICES

This Agreement for annual preventative maintenance services ("Agreement") is entered into on the date of the last signature affixed hereto ("Effective Date") by and between the Waller County Sheriff ("Sheriff"), and Sustainable Security Solutions, Inc. ("Contractor"), a Texas corporation, with its principal place of business at 1107 Basse Road, San Antonio, Texas 78212 (each referred to individually as "Party" and collectively as "Parties").

WHEREAS, the Sheriff desires to contract with Contractor to provide certain annual maintenance services for detention door hardware, sliding detention doors, and detention electronic devices and equipment to be performed at the Waller County Jail, and Contractor desires to provide such services to the Sheriff under the terms and conditions hereof;

WHEREAS, the Sheriff shall use commissary funds to pay for such services;

WHEREAS, the Sheriff and Contractor have the intent to comply with all applicable laws relative to performance of the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Sheriff and Contractor desire to enter into this Agreement to clarify and make explicit the rights, duties, and responsibilities between the Parties;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties agree that the foregoing is true and correct, and further agree as follows:

#### **SECTION 1. AGREEMENT**

- 1.1 <u>Services to be Performed</u>: Contractor shall perform the services as set forth herein, and the County agrees to pay the fees as set forth herein as full and final compensation for all services performed under this Agreement. Contractor shall perform the services as further described in Exhibit A.
- Character and Extent of Services: Contractor agrees to perform the services as specified by Contractor in Exhibit A, Contractor's Proposal. The services shall be performed at the Waller County Jail, located at 300 Sheriff R. Glenn Smith Dr., Hempstead, Texas 77445. Contractor shall perform the services, which include inspecting, cleaning, adjusting, lubricating, and repairing for detention door hardware and sliding detention doors; and inspecting, cleaning, updating software and firmware, and repairing detention security electronic devices and equipment as specified in Exhibit A. Specifically excluded from the services to be performed are: access control system equipment and devices, replacement hardware and hardware components, and replacement electronic devices, CPUs, monitors, control equipment, and security electronics components. Contractor shall perform the services upon the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement and its exhibits.

- Contactor shall furnish all personnel, labor, equipment, supplies, deliverables, and all other items necessary to provide all of the work as specified by the terms and conditions of the Agreement.
- 1.3 <u>Exhibits</u>: Exhibit A, Contractor's Proposal is attached hereto, and incorporated by reference as if it were fully set forth herein for all purposes.

#### **SECTION 2. DESIGNATED REPRESENTATIVES**

- 2.1 <u>Sheriff's Designated Representatives</u>: The Sheriff designates the Chief Deputy of the Justice Command and the Jail Administrator as his Designated Representatives with regard to the services performed under this Agreement.
- 2.2 <u>Contractor's Designated Representatives</u>: Contractor designates [NAME] as its Designated Representative with regard to the services performed under this Agreement.
- 2.3 <u>Changes to Designated Representatives</u>: Either Party may change its Designated Representative(s) by providing written notice to the other Party.

#### **SECTION 3. CONTRACTOR'S OBLIGATIONS**

- 3.1 <u>Time for Performance</u>: Contractor shall provide the services as provided herein immediately upon execution of the Agreement, and throughout the term specified in Section 5.
- 3.2 <u>Contractor's Performance</u>: Contractor shall provide the services identified in Exhibit A, on an annual or semi-annual basis, in accordance with Exhibit A. Contractor shall be responsible for conducting its activities in order to achieve the performance of the Agreement. Contractor shall furnish all labor, equipment, fuel, supervision, and any other item or service necessary to perform the services in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement.
- 3.3 <u>Standard of Performance</u>: The services performed shall be to the satisfaction of the Sheriff. In the event the Sheriff determines, in his sole discretion, that the services are not performed satisfactorily, the Contractor shall promptly remedy the work to the satisfaction of the Sheriff.
- 3.4 <u>Texas Commission on Jail Standards</u>: Contractor shall perform the services in accordance with any applicable rules adopted by the Texas Commission on Jail Standards.
- 3.5 <u>Meetings and Cooperation</u>: Contractor shall meet with the Sheriff or his Designated Representative(s) on an as needed basis to ensure the services are performed satisfactorily, and to make any necessary or requested adjustments. Contractor shall cooperate at all times with the Sheriff, and other contractors providing services to the Sheriff to maintain maximum security and efficiency.
- 3.6 Necessary and Qualified Staff: Contractor shall provide necessary staff and equipment to perform the services, and shall be responsible for any cost associated with implementing this Agreement. Contractor agrees to employ, maintain, and assign a sufficient number of competent and qualified personnel to provide the services required by this Agreement.
- 3.7 <u>Criminal History Background Investigation</u>: Contractor agrees that the personnel that will perform work under this Agreement shall be subject to a criminal history background investigation by the Sheriff's Office. Contractor will provide any information requested by

- the Sheriff to perform the investigation. Contractor further agrees that its personnel will comply with any and all security measures and identification required by the Sheriff.
- 3.8 Personnel Clearance: Contractor's personnel shall not access Sheriff secure areas or information without first obtaining clearance for those personnel from the Sheriff or his Designated Representative(s). Contractor agrees that it will replace any personnel that the Sheriff or his Designated Representative(s) determine in good-faith is incompetent, careless, unsuitable, or otherwise objectionable in performing any work under this Agreement.
- 3.9 <u>Compliance with Security Measures</u>: Contractor agrees that its employees and personnel will comply with security measures put in place by the Sheriff or his Designated Representative(s) prior to performing any services under this Agreement, and shall not access any secure area or information prior to receiving approval from the Sheriff or his Designated Representative(s).

#### SECTION 4. CONTRACT PRICE

- 4.1 Total Fee: In consideration of the services to be performed by the Contractor under the terms of this Agreement, the Sheriff shall pay to Contractor the amount of twenty-nine thousand nine hundred and seventy-nine dollars (\$29,979.00), which shall be paid from the Sheriff's commissary funds.
- 4.2 <u>Invoices</u>: Contractor shall provide to the Sheriff an invoice each month in which services are performed indicating the services actually performed.

#### **SECTION 5. TERM AND TERMINATION**

- Agreement Term: The term of this Agreement shall begin on the Effective Date and terminate on December 31, 2025 (the "Initial Term"), unless either Party terminates this Agreement in accordance with its terms. Upon expiration of the Initial Term, the Agreement may be extended for a one (1) year period at a seven percent (7%) increase to the Contract Price (the "Renewal Term").
- 5.2 <u>Automatic Termination</u>: This Agreement shall automatically terminate upon complete performance of the terms and conditions of the Agreement by each Party, or otherwise in accordance with its terms.
- 5.3 <u>Termination for Failure to Perform</u>: Either Party may terminate this Agreement if the other Party fails to perform in accordance with the terms of this Agreement, provided that the failure to perform is at no fault of the terminating Party. Contractor shall be responsible for any expenses it incurs after the date of termination.
- 5.4 <u>Termination for Insolvency and Bankruptcy</u>: The Sheriff, in his sole discretion, may immediately terminate this Agreement without notice or the opportunity to cure if Contractor becomes insolvent or files any petition for bankruptcy.
- 5.5 <u>Termination for Cause or Convenience</u>: The Sheriff may terminate this Agreement for cause or convenience by providing written notice to the Contractor in accordance with Section 5.6. The notice must state the reasons for such termination. The Agreement will continue in force during the 30 day notice period.
- 5.6 Notice of Termination: The terminating Party shall provide 30 days written notice of

- termination to the other Party as provided in Section 16.16.
- 5.7 Opportunity to Cure: A Party receiving notice of termination for failure to perform in accordance with the terms of this Agreement shall have the opportunity to cure its failure to perform beginning on the day of its receipt of the written notice, and continuing for thirty (30) calendar days thereafter. The cure, if made, shall be to the terminating Party's satisfaction. If no cure is made, the Agreement will terminate on the date specified in the written termination notice, or if no date is specified, on the thirtieth (30th) calendar day after the date of receipt of the notice, unless otherwise agreed by the Parties.
- 5.8 <u>Termination Without Penalty</u>: Contractor shall not be entitled to lost or anticipated profits, or any other damages, whether direct or indirect, should the Sheriff choose to exercise his option to terminate.
- 5.9 <u>Prorated Refund</u>: In the event that the Sheriff terminates the Contract prior to the termination date provided in Section 5.1, Contractor shall refund to the Sheriff a prorated portion of the Contract Price.

#### **SECTION 6. NO EXCLUSION OR PAYMENT**

6.1 No Exclusion or Payment: Contractor understands and agrees that this Agreement does not create an exclusive right for Contractor to provide the services contemplated by this Agreement.

#### **SECTION 7. RECORDS AND AUDITS**

7.1 Records and Audits: The Sheriff, and the Waller County Auditor shall have access to and the right to examine any directly pertinent books, documents, papers, and records of Contractor involving transactions relating to this Agreement. The Sheriff shall give Contractor reasonable advance notice of intended inspections or audits. Contractor shall maintain records necessary for the Sheriff or the County Auditor to complete an audit, and to comply in all respects with any request by the Sheriff or the County Auditor for records and documents for the purpose of performing an audit.

#### **SECTION 8. INTERPRETATION**

8.1 <u>Interpretation</u>: This Agreement controls over any other document, terms, or conditions in regard to the services to be performed hereunder. In the event of any discrepancy between the provisions of this Agreement and Exhibit A, the Agreement shall control.

### **SECTION 9. SITE INSPECTION AND COORDINATION**

9.1 <u>Site Inspection and Coordination</u>: Contractor represents that Contractor is thoroughly acquainted with all matters relating to the performance of this Agreement. Contractor understands that it will be performing the services in a correctional facility. All services under this Agreement shall be coordinated under, and performed to the satisfaction of the Sheriff or his Designated Representative(s).

#### SECTION 10. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

10.1 <u>Limitation of Liability</u>: Contractor understands that it will be performing the services in a correctional facility. Neither the Sheriff nor the County shall be liable for any damage to any property owned by Contractor that is caused by an inmate. Neither the Sheriff nor the County shall be liable under any theory of recovery, including negligence, for

any damages arising out of or pertaining to Contractor's performance of this Agreement, or the products or services provided by Contractor under this Agreement.

#### SECTION 11. PERMITS; COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS AND REGULATIONS.

11.1 Permits; Compliance with Laws and Regulations: Contractor shall possess or obtain any applicable permits required by municipal ordinance, county ordinance, or state or federal law for the performance of the services prior to executing this Agreement. Contractor shall perform its obligations pursuant to this Agreement in accordance with all federal, state, and local statutes, ordinances, laws, regulations, and executive, administrative, and judicial orders applicable to the services to be performed.

#### SECTION 12. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR.

12.1 Independent Contractor: In performing the services under this Agreement, Contractor and its employees are independent contractors. Contractor shall exercise independent judgment in performing its duties under this Agreement, in cooperation with the Sheriff, and is solely responsible for setting working hours, scheduling or prioritizing its work flow, and determining how the work is to be performed. No term or provision of this Agreement or act of the Contractor in the performance of this Agreement shall be construed as making Contractor or its employees an agent, servant, or employee of the Sheriff or County in any capacity or form.

#### SECTION 13. INDEMNITY.

INDEMNITY: CONTRACTOR, ITS OFFICERS, DIRECTORS, PARTNERS, 13.1 REPRESENTATIVES, AGENTS, CONTRACTORS, EMPLOYEES, SUCCESSORS, ASSIGNS, VENDORS, GRANTEES, AND/OR TRUSTEES (COLLECTIVELY REFERRED TO AS "CONTRACTOR" FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION), AGREE TO RELEASE, DEFEND, INDEMNIFY, AND HOLD HARMLESS THE COUNTY AND ITS OFFICERS, OFFICIALS, DEPARTMENT HEADS, REPRESENTATIVES, AGENTS, AND EMPLOYEES (COLLECTIVELY REFERRED TO AS "COUNTY" FOR PUPOSES OF THIS SECTION) FROM ANY AND ALL CLAIMS, DEMANDS, DAMAGES, INJURIES - INCLUDING DEATH - LIABILITIES, AND EXPENSES (INCLUDING ATTORNEY'S FEES AND COSTS OF DEFENSE) ARISING DIRECTLY OUT OF OR RESULTING FROM THE OPERATION OR PERFORMANCE OF CONTRACTOR UNDER THIS AGREEMENT. THE COUNTY WILL NOT ACCEPT LIABILITY FOR INJURIES THAT ARE THE RESULT OF THE NEGLIGENCE, MALFEASANCE, ACTION, OR OMMISION OF CONTRACTOR. CONTRACTOR AGREES TO ACCEPT LIABILITY FOR INJURIES TO ITSELF OR OTHERS CAUSED BY ITS OWN MALFEASANCE, ACTION, OR **OMMISSION.** NEGLIGENCE, INDEMNIFICATION PROVISION IS ALSO SPECIFICALLY INTENDED TO APPLY TO, BUT NOT BE LIMITED TO, ANY AND ALL CLAIMS, WHETHER BROUGHT AGAINST COUNTY CRIMINAL, GOVERNMENT AUTHORITY OR AGENCY RELATED TO ANY PERSON PROVIDING SERVICES UNDER THIS AGREEMENT THAT ARE BASED ON ANY FEDERAL IMMIGATION LAW AND ANY AND ALL CLAIMS, DEMANDS, DAMAGES, ACTIONS, AND CAUSES OF ACTION OF EVERY KIND AND NATURE, KNOWN AND UNKNOWN, EXISTING OR CLAIMED TO EXIST, RELATING TO OR ARISING OUT OF ANY EMPLOYMENT RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN CONTRACTOR AND ITS EMPLOYEES OR SUBCONTRACTORS A RESULT OF THAT SUBCONTRACTOR'S **EMPLOYEE'S** OR EMPLOYMENT AND/OR SEPARATION FROM EMPLOYMENT WITH THE CONTRACTOR, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO ANY DISCRIMINATION CLAIM BASED ON SEX, SEXUAL ORIENTATION OR PREFERENCE, RACE, RELIGION, COLOR, NATIONAL ORIGIN, AGE OR DISABILITY UNDER FEDERAL, STATE OR LOCAL LAW, RULE OR REGULATION, AND/OR ANY CLAIM FOR WRONGFUL TERMINATION, BACK PAY, FUTURE WAGE LOSS, OVERTIME PAY, EMPLOYEE BENEFITS, INJURY SUBJECT TO RELIEF UNDER THE WORKERS' COMPENSATION ACT OR WOULD BE SUBJECT TO POLICY FOR WORKERS COMPENSATION ANY UNDER INSURANCE, AND ANY OTHER CLAIM, WHETHER IN TORT, AGREEMENT, OR OTHERWISE.

COUNTY SHALL HAVE THE RIGHT TO APPROVE DEFENSE COUNSEL TO BE RETAINED BY CONTRACTOR IN FULFILLING ITS OBLIGATION TO DEFEND AND INDEMNIFY COUNTY HEREUNDER, UNLESS SUCH RIGHT IS EXPRESSLY WAIVED BY COUNTY IN WRITING. COUNTY RESERVES THE RIGHT TO PROVIDE A PORTION OR ALL OF ITS OWN DEFENSE; HOWEVER, COUNTY IS UNDER NO OBLIGATION TO DO SO. ANY SUCH ACTION BY COUNTY IS NOT TO BE CONSTRUED AS A WAIVER OF CONTRACTOR'S OBLIGATION TO DEFEND COUNTY OR AS A WAIVER OF CONTRACTOR'S OBLIGATION TO INDEMNIFY COUNTY PURSUANT TO THIS AGREEMENT. IF CONTRACTOR FAILS TO RETAIN COUNTY APPROVED DEFENSE COUNSEL WITHIN TEN (10) BUSINESS DAYS OF COUNTY'S WRITTEN NOTICE THAT COUNTY IS INVOKING ITS RIGHT TO INDEMNIFICATION UNDER THIS AGREEMENT, COUNTY SHALL HAVE THE RIGHT TO RETAIN DEFENSE COUNSEL ON ITS OWN BEHALF, AND CONTRACTOR SHALL BE LIABLE FOR ALL REASONABLE ATTORNEY FEES AND COSTS INCURRED BY COUNTY. CONTRACTOR AND COUNTY AGREE TO FURNISH TIMELY WRITTEN NOTICE TO EACH OTHER OF ANY SUCH CLAIM.

THIS SECTION SHALL SURVIVE THE TERMINATION OF THIS AGREEMENT.

#### SECTION 14. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

- 14.1 <u>Insurance Limits and Required Certificates</u>: Contractor shall provide the Sheriff with certificates of insurance evidencing compliance with the requirements of this Section. The certificates shall indicate the name of Sustainable Security Solutions, Inc., the name of the insurance company, the policy number, and the term and limits of coverage. The insurance coverage must be with a company authorized to do business in the State of Texas, and shall be of the following types and limits:
  - a. Workers Compensation in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas.
  - b. Employers' Liability insurance with limits of not less than \$1,000,000 per injury

- by accident, \$1,000,000 per injury by disease, and \$1,000,000 per bodily injury by disease.
- c. Comprehensive general liability insurance with a limit of not less than \$1,000,000 each occurrence and \$2,000,000 in the annual aggregate. Policy shall cover liability for bodily injury, personal injury, and property damage and products/completed operations arising out of the business operations of the policy holder.
- d. Business Automobile Liability coverage for owned, non-owned, and hired vehicles, with minimum limits of not less than \$1,000,000 each occurrence combined single limit for Bodily Injury and Property Damage combined.
- 14.2 <u>Additional Insured</u>: Contractor's insurance policies that cover performance under this Agreement shall name the Sheriff's Office and Waller County Jail as an additional insured.
- 14.3 <u>Certificates of Insurance</u>: Contractor shall provide the Sheriff with certificates of such insurance within thirty (30) days of the Effective Date, and the certificates shall indicate insurance coverage as of the Effective Date.
- 14.4 <u>No Decrease in Liability</u>: The Sheriff's acceptance of the certificates of insurance shall not relieve or decrease Contractor's liability.
- 14.5 No Cancellation or Modification: Contractor shall not cancel or modify the insurance coverages required by this Agreement without providing thirty (30) days written notice to the Sheriff. Contractor shall not allow a lapse in the insurance coverage specified in this Agreement during the Initial Term or any Renewal Term.

#### SECTION 15. ASSIGNMENT

Assignment: Contractor shall not sell, assign, transfer, or convey this Agreement, in whole or in part, without the prior written consent of the Sheriff. The following conditions must be met before any permitted assignment becomes effective: a) Contractor must give written notice of a proposed assignment to the Sheriff at least thirty (30) days prior to the effective date of the assignment; b) the assignee must explicitly accept all of Contractor's obligations under this Agreement; c) Contractor must retain its obligations to the County under this Agreement until the assignment is effective; d) the Assignment must be executed by both Contractor and the assignee; e) Contractor must provide the Sheriff a fully executed assignment agreement not later than five (5) business days after the assignment is signed, and f) the Sheriff provides a signed, written consent to the assignment.

#### SECTION 16. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

- 16.1 <u>Recitals</u>: The Recitals are incorporated into this Agreement.
- 16.2 <u>Jurisdiction and Venue</u>: This Agreement is made in and shall be construed according to the laws of the State of Texas, without regard to its conflict of laws provisions. Venue of any court action(s) brought directly or indirectly by reason of this Agreement shall be in a court of competent jurisdiction in Waller County, Texas. This Agreement is made and is to be performed in Waller County, Texas.
- 16.3 <u>Right of Review</u>: The Sheriff or his Designated Representative(s) may review and inspect any and all of the services performed by Contractor under this Agreement. Sheriff and his

Designated Representative(s) are granted the right to audit, at the Sheriff's election, all of Contractor's records and billings related to the performance of this Agreement as may be reasonably necessary. Contractor agrees to retain such records for a minimum of three (3) years following completion of this Agreement. Any payment, settlement, satisfaction, or release made or provided during the course of performance of this Agreement shall be subject to Sheriff's rights as may be disclosed by a review under this section.

- 16.4 <u>No Subcontractors</u>: Contractor shall not subcontract any portion of its duties under this Agreement, unless the Sheriff has provided prior written consent. In the event that the Sheriff provides written consent for a portion of the services to be performed by a subcontractor, the subcontractor must agree to be bound by the terms of this Agreement.
- 16.5 No Waiver: No claim or right arising out of a breach of this Agreement can be discharged in whole or in part by a waiver or renunciation of the claim or right unless the waiver or renunciation is supported by consideration and is in writing signed by the aggrieved party. The Sheriff's failure to require strict performance of any provision of this Agreement does not waive or diminish the Sheriff's right thereafter to demand strict compliance with that or any other provision. The Sheriff's waiver or failure to exercise in any respect any right provided for in this agreement shall not be deemed a waiver of any further right under this agreement. The Sheriff and his employees, officers, and officials do not waive, modify, or alter to any extent any of their defenses, immunities, or remedies.
- Force Majeure: Neither Party shall be deemed to have breached any provision of this 16.6 Agreement as a result of any delay, failure in performance, or interruption of services resulting directly or indirectly from acts of God, network failures, acts of civil or military authorities, civil disturbances, wars, energy crises, fires, transportation contingencies, interruptions in third-party telecommunications, or Internet equipment or service, or other catastrophes, or any other occurrences which are reasonably beyond a Party's control. The Parties are required to use due caution and preventive measures to protect against the effects of force majeure, and the burden of proving that a force majeure event has occurred shall rest on the Part seeking relief under this provision. The Party seeking relief due to force majeure is required to promptly notify the other Party in writing, citing the details of the force majeure event and the relief sought, and shall resume performance immediately after the obstacles to performance caused by a force majeure event have been removed, provided the Agreement has not been terminated. Delay or failure of performance, by either Party to this Agreement, causes solely by a force majeure event, shall be excused for the period of delay caused solely by the force majeure event.
- 16.7 <u>Severability</u>: If any provision of this agreement is invalid, illegal, or unenforceable under any applicable statute, court decision, or rule of law, it is to that extent to be deemed omitted. In such event, there shall be substituted for such deleted provisions a provision as similar as possible in terms and in effect to such deleted provision that is valid, legal, or enforceable. The remainder of the agreement shall be valid and enforceable to the maximum extent possible.
- 16.8 Entire Agreement: This Agreement, together with all of its exhibits, embodies the complete agreement of the Parties hereto, superseding all oral or written previous and contemporary agreements between the Parties and relating to matters in this Agreement. The Agreement may not be modified, altered, or amended except by written instrument duly executed by

both Parties.

- 16.9 <u>Titles Not Restrictive</u>: The titles assigned to the various sections and paragraphs of this Agreement are for convenience only. Titles shall not be considered restrictive of the subject matter of any part of this Agreement.
- 16.10 <u>Tax Exempt</u>: The Sheriff's Office and Waller County Jail are tax-exempt, and neither will pay a tax from which it is exempt. Tax exempt paperwork may be provided upon written request.
- 16.11 No Arbitration: A dispute arising under this Agreement shall not be subject to arbitration.
- 16.12 <u>Waiver of Subrogation</u>: Contractor and Contractor's insurance carrier waive any and all rights whatsoever with regard to subrogation against the Sheriff, Waller County Jail, and Waller County as indirect parties to any suit arising out of personal or property damages resulting from Contractor's, its employees', or permitted subcontractors' performance under this Agreement.
- 16.13 No Third-Party Beneficiaries: This Agreement does not inure to the benefit of any third party, except permitted successor or assigns.
- 16.14 <u>Authority to Sign</u>: Signatories to this Agreement represent and warrant that they have the authority to bind the respective parties.
- 16.15 Confidentiality: The Sheriff's Office and Waller County Jail are bound by Texas Government Code Chapter 552, the Public Information Act, and other laws concerning government records. Contractor shall clearly and noticeably mark all confidential information and documents it provides to the Sheriff pursuant to this Agreement. The Sheriff will make good faith efforts to promptly notify Contractor if any such information is requested in a public information request, subpoena, or other method so Contractor may argue against the release of such information. Contractor recognizes and understands that the final decision as to what information must be disclosed pursuant to the PIA lies with the Texas Attorney General. Contractor further agrees that the Sheriff or another Waller County employee may furnish information acquired through or pursuant to this Agreement and that is requested through the PIA to the Texas Attorney General for a determination of whether the information must be disclosed. Neither the Sheriff, nor the County, or any of either's officers, or employees shall have any liability or obligation to any party for the disclosure to the public, or to any person or persons, of any items or data furnished to the Sheriff by Contractor in reliance on any statute, court opinion, court order, or the advice, decision, or opinion of the Texas Attorney General.
- 16.16 Notices: Notices delivered hereunder shall be in writing and shall be delivered by personal delivery or certified mail, return receipt requested. Mailed notices shall be deemed received three (3) business days after the notice is placed in the mail with proper postage paid. Any notice or certification to be provided pursuant to this Agreement shall be delivered to the following persons, unless a substitute representative is designated in writing:

# RULES OF PROCEDURE, CONDUCT AND DECORUM AT MEETINGS OF THE

## WALLER COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT

- I. All Regular, Special, Emergency and Executive Session Meetings of the Waller County Commissioners Court will be called and conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Open Meetings Act, Chapter 551, Government Code.
- II. Regular, Special, and Emergency Meetings of the Waller County Commissioners Court are open to the public and to representatives of the press and media. Executive Sessions of the Commissioners Court are not open to the public, the press, or the media and only those individuals expressly requested or ordered to be present are allowed to attend Executive Session.
- III. The Waller County Commissioners Court meets in Regular Session every other Wednesday each month. For a matter or issue to appear as an agenda item on the Agenda of any Regular Meeting of the Commissioners Court, a request must be filed with, and approved by, at least one Commissioner or the County Judge by 12:00 p.m. (noon) on the Wednesday immediately preceding the next Regular Meeting of the Commissioners Court.
  - A. The County Judge may group routine items without controversy together on the Court's Voting Session Agenda as "Consent Items," which items may be approved by the Court on a single motion and vote.
    - Prior to consideration of the "Consent Items" the County Judge, or
      presiding member of the Court, will honor any request from any
      Court Member that an item be removed from the Consent Items and
      separately considered by the Court.
    - 2. Each Voting Session agenda item may, after discussion, be designated as "Consent", if appropriate, and included in the consent motion of the appropriate Voting Session. However, any single Court Member may prevent an item from being included in the Voting Session consent motion.

- B. The Court may act on multiple discussion items with one motion so long as items to be acted upon in this manner are under the same department (I.E. County Engineer, Sheriff's Office, etc.) However, any single Court Member may remove an item from the group action for separate discussion and action by the Court.
- C. Items that are likely to be discussed in Executive Session may be grouped on the agenda with an indication under which provisions of the Texas Open Meetings Act the Executive Session will be heard.
- IV. The business of Waller County is conducted by and between the members of the Waller County Commissioners Court and by those members of the County staff, elected officials, department heads, consultants, experts and/or members of the public requested to be present and participate. While the public is invited to attend all meetings of the Commissioners Court (except Executive Sessions) the public's participation therein is limited to that of observers unless a member of the public is invited to address the Commissioners Court on a particular issue or unless the member of the public completes a Public Participation Form and submits same to the County Clerk prior to the time the agenda item is addressed by the Court. The Court will make every reasonable effort to accommodate requests for interpreters but may need advanced notice to be able to accommodate such requests. A sample of the Waller County Commissioners Court Public Participation Form is attached hereto as Exhibit "A".
  - A. Each member of the public who appears before the Commissioners Court shall be limited to a maximum of three (3) minutes to make his/her remarks.

    Time for each speaker shall be maintained by the County Clerk or such other designated representative of the Commissioners Court. Members of the public who have properly completed a Public Participation Form and submitted same to the County Clerk must wait to be recognized before they will be allowed to address the Court.
  - B. Maximum discussion on any agenda item, regardless of the number of members of the public wishing to address the Commissioners Court on such

- agenda item shall be limited to thirty (30) minutes. If more than six (6) members of the public wish to address a particular agenda item, then time allocated to members of the public recognized to speak shall be divided equally between those members of the public wishing to speak for the agenda item and those members of the public wishing to speak against the agenda item.
- C. In matters of exceptional interest, the Court may, by the majority vote of the members of the Court in attendance at the meeting, either shorten or lengthen the time allocated for all members of the public and/or the amount of time allocated for all agenda items and/or a specific agenda item.
- D. It is the intention of the Court to provide an open access to the citizens of Waller County to address the Commissioners Court and express themselves on issues of County Government. Members of the public are reminded that the Waller County Commissioners Court is a Constitutional Court, with both judicial and legislative powers, created under Article V, Section 1 and Section 18 of the Texas Constitution. As a Constitutional Court, the Waller County Commissioners Court also possesses the power to issue a Contempt of Court Citation under §81.023 of the Texas Local Government Code. Accordingly, members of the public in attendance at any Regular, Special and/or Emergency Meeting of the Court shall conduct themselves with proper respect and decorum in speaking to, and/or addressing the Court; in participating in public discussions before the Court; and in all actions in the presence of the Court. Those members of the public who do not conduct themselves in an orderly and appropriate manner will be ordered to leave the meeting. Refusal to abide by the Court's Order and/or continued disruption of the meeting may result in a Contempt of Court citation.
- E. It is not the intention of the Waller County Commissioners Court to provide a public forum for the demeaning of any individual or group.Neither is it the intention of the Court to allow a member (or members) of the

public to insult the honesty and/or integrity of the Court, as a body, or any member or members of the Court, individually or collectively. Accordingly, profane, insulting, or threatening language directed toward the Court and/or any person in the Court's presence and/or racial, ethnic, or gender slurs or epithets will not be tolerated. These Rules do not prohibit public criticism of the Commissioners Court, including criticism of any act, omission, policy, procedure, program, or service. Violation of these rules may result in the following sanctions:

- 1. Cancellation of a speaker's remaining time;
- 2. Removal from the Commissioners Courtroom;
- 3. A Contempt Citation; and/or
- 4. Such other civil and/or criminal sanctions as may be authorized under the Constitution, Statutes and Codes of the State of Texas.
- V. All members of the Court and public are expected to conduct themselves in a manner that demonstrates respect towards others and the Court itself. Behavior that impedes or disrupts the business of the Commissioners Court while Court is in session is prohibited and unlawful pursuant to Texas Penal Code § 42.05. It is the intention of Waller County Commissioners Court to attend to County business effectively and efficiently, without undue interruption. Cell phone usage during Commissioners Court is strictly prohibited. All cell phones, pagers, and other mobile communication devices should be in "silent" mode at all times while Court is in session.
- VI. The County Judge is the presiding officer of the Waller County
  - Commissioners Court and is a fully participating member thereof. In the absence of the County Judge, the members present at the Regular, Special,
  - Emergency Meeting or Executive Session, shall select a Commissioner to preside over of the Court meeting.
- VII. The presiding officer of the Commissioners Court is responsible for conducting all meetings in accordance with these Rules of Decorum and Procedure. The presiding officer shall conduct the meeting in the following manner:

- A. When an individual member of the Commissioners Court wishes to make a motion, the presiding officer shall first recognize the individual's right to speak. The individual may then make the motion. A second is then required prior to any discussion or debate on the matter before the Court.

  B. Only after the motion and second, the presiding officer repeats the motion and opens the floor to discussion of the motion. The maker of the motion speaks first, and the presiding officer allows proponents and opponents to alternate speaking if possible. A member who has not yet spoken has precedence over those who have already voiced an opinion. The presiding officer has the authority to end discussion if it becomes too personal or too longwinded by calling for a vote.
- C. Motions are limited to those listed in Addendum A, "Motions at a Glance." A member may only make one motion at a time. The presiding officer may decline to allow more than three motions (one main, two secondary) on the floor at one time; for example, one substantive motion and two motions to amend. When multiple motions are on the floor, the last motion made should be the first voted on.
- D. The presiding officer at the officer's discretion but in keeping with these rules, makes procedural rulings. The body may overrule the presiding officer's procedural ruling with a motion, second, and majority vote to do so.
- E. Three members of the Court constitute a quorum unless the Court is levying taxes, in which case four members constitutes a quorum or unless the Court is canvassing an election, in which case only two members of the Court constitutes a quorum. If a quorum is present, the Judge shall take a vote by asking for the "ayes" and "nays". Silence shall indicate an "aye" vote.

  Abstentions should be stated on the record. Approval of a motion is attained by a majority vote of all the votes cast when a quorum is present.

  The presiding officer shall announce the result of the vote and each member's vote verbally to ensure a complete record.

#### VIII. Special Rules for the Press and Media:

- A. No media personnel or equipment, including lights, cameras or microphones will be located on the Commissioners Court bench nor closer than five feet (5') in front of the Commissioners Court bench.
- B. Reporters and media technicians are required to structure their movements, equipment set-up and take-down and adjustments, etc. in such a manner as to not disrupt the Commissioners Court deliberations or the ability of the public to see, hear, and participate in the proceedings.
- C. Interviews shall not be conducted inside the Commissioners Courtroom during the time the Court is in session.
- D. Media interviews which are conducted outside the Commissioners

  Courtroom should be conducted in such a manner that the interview does

  not disturb, impede, or disrupt the proceedings of any Regular, Special,

  Emergency and/or Executive Session Meeting of the Court.
- IX. The Sheriff of Waller County, Texas, or his designated deputy, shall serve as the Bailiff at all Regular, Special and Emergency Meetings of the Court. However, in the event of the absence of the Sheriff, or in the event that there exists a conflict of interest between the Sheriff, any member of the Sheriff's Department, and the Commissioners Court, or in the event of an Executive Session of the Court in which the Sheriff is not an authorized participant, then in such event, the Court shall appoint such other commissioned peace officers to serve as Bailiff as may be necessary.
- X. From time to time, the Commissioners Court shall conduct town meetings and public hearings. These rules of procedure, conduct and decorum shall also apply to such town meetings and public hearings, however, the Commissioners Court may adopt such additional and supplemental rules for such meetings as may be necessary and appropriate to conduct such meetings in an orderly, efficient, and proper manner.
- XI. These Rules of Procedure, Conduct and Decorum at Meetings of the Waller

  County Commissioners Court shall be effective immediately upon adoption by the

Item 36.

Court and shall remain in full force and effect until amended or repealed by a Majority vote of the Commissioners Court. These Rules may be temporarily suspended by majority vote of the Court in a manner that does not conflict with the Texas Open Meetings Act.

# Sunterra Lakes

#### A. Introduction

Sunterra Lakes (Project) is a master planned community consisting of approximately 1,464.79 acres located east of FM 362, south of FM 529, and north of Stockdick Road, as shown in Exhibit A, *Boundary Map*.

The developers, Astro Sunterra West, L.P. and Astro Sunterra Lakes North, L.P. (collectively referred to as the "Developer"), desires to construct a community surrounded by "resort style" amenities with numerous lakes, open space and recreation sites interconnected with on-street and off-street trails to allow easy access for residents. This development will boast a wide range of housing types and prices, a diverse selection of lots, including numerous lake-view lots, and an appropriate spectrum of non-residential land uses to support a quality residential development.

This Plan of Development (PD), its description, rules, and regulations shall apply to the property. The plan for the development and the projected lot count is shown in Exhibit C, *Conceptual Development Plan*.

This PD includes the following sections:

- A. Introduction
- B. General Provisions
- C. Land Uses
- D. Development Regulations
- E. Parks, Recreation and Trails
- F. Street Plan & Cross-Sections
- G. Building Regulations

#### **B.** General Provisions

- **B1.** The PD approved herein will be constructed, developed, and maintained in compliance with the Development Agreement to which this PD is attached (Development Agreement), and other applicable ordinances of Waller County (County). If any provision or regulation of any County ordinance applicable in the Sunterra Lakes PD is not contained in this PD, all the regulations contained in the County's ordinance applicable to the Sunterra Lakes PD, in effect on the effective date of this PD, will apply to this PD as though written herein, except to the extent the County regulation or provision conflicts with a provision of this PD.
- **B2.** If there are discrepancies between the text of this PD and the figures attached, the text shall prevail.

**B3.** The Project shall be developed in accordance with the following exhibits and figures that are attached to and made part of this PD:

Exhibit A: Boundary Map
Exhibit B: Vicinity Map

Exhibit C: General Development Plan

Exhibit D: Jurisdiction Exhibit

Exhibit E: Roadway Improvement Plan
Exhibit F: Major Thoroughfare Plan

Exhibit G: Fence Exhibit

Exhibit H: Trails, Landscape and Open Space Exhibit

- **B4.** A homeowners association (HOA) shall be established and made legally responsible to maintain all common areas, private streets, recreation reserves and community amenities not otherwise dedicated to the public. All land and facilities dedicated to a municipal utility district (MUD) shall be maintained by said MUD.
- **B5.** The HOA shall enforce restrictions regarding on-street parking on residential streets. Said restrictions regarding on-street parking cannot be omitted, amended, or changed without the review and favorable vote of the County Commissioner's Court.
- **B6.** The Developer may not add property to the Development Agreement and PD without additional County Commissioners Court approval. In the event of an annexation, all PD constraints on land uses, such as maximum lot or unit counts, will be increased proportionately to accommodate the additional annexation of property(s) into the Development Agreement and PD.
- **B7.** The Developer or MUD shall maintain a construction/maintenance bond for a minimum of one year. Developer or MUD can reduce the required maintenance bond by 50% when the roadway is substantially complete and formally accepted into the one-year maintenance period. After the County accepts the roadway, the bond can be reduced by 100% and released.
- **B8.** The Developer shall only fund or construct road improvements where the Developer constructs direct connections into existing County/TxDOT-maintained roads. Refer to Exhibit F.

- B9. The parties agree this PD was created by the Developer for generally illustrating the boundary, lot mix and simplified layout of the Project. Any amendment to the PD shall be considered an amendment to the Development Agreement and shall replace the PD and become a part of the Development Agreement. The Waller County Engineer (the "County Engineer") may administratively approve any amendments to the PD that the County Engineer deems in his/her reasonable discretion to be minor in nature. Any change in the PD that does not materially increase density of residences by more than 1.0 unit per gross acre shall be deemed minor in nature. Relocation of residential lots set forth in the PD shall be deemed minor in nature, so long as such relocation remains in the spirit of the PD. Upon approval by the County Engineer of a minor revised PD, or approval by the County Commissioner's Court or County official or Commissioner with delegated authority for approval of a revised PD containing more than minor revisions, the revised PD shall replace and supersede the then-current PD.
- **B10.** The following major modifications of the PD require approval by the County Commissioner's Court:
  - 1. Any increase in the maximum permitted single-family lots or multifamily units as outlined in **Section C Land Uses**.
  - 2. Deviations from the Development Regulations specified in **Section D** that are intended to achieve a different design character. However, this does not preclude any individual variances with a physical hardship that may be approved by the Commissioners Court on a case-by-case basis.
- **B11.** A phase update to the General Development Plan shall not be required unless there are substantial changes to collector road alignments or internal street patterns. The Developer shall submit such changes to the County Engineer and the County Engineer shall review and determine if the changes are substantial enough to warrant a new General Development Plan that requires approval by the County Commissioners Court. Changes in lot sizes shall not constitute a substantial change if the lot size split percentages are consistent with this PD.

#### C. Land Uses

- **C1.** The maximum number of single-family lots shall not exceed 4,500 lots, and a maximum of 400 multi-family for a total number of dwelling units not to exceed 4,900.
- **C2.** Within the proposed Project area, land shall be dedicated to the County, MUD(s), or HOA for parks and open spaces at a rate of one acre per 54 planned dwelling units. Public park areas must have at least 60 feet of frontage on a public street. Open spaces without developer-added improvements—such as trails, benches, or shelters that support active recreation—will not count toward the minimum public park requirement. Maintenance of all public parks and open spaces may be handled by the HOA or MUD(s).

- **C3.** Commercial and non-residential uses are regulated by applicable County ordinances and design guidelines imposed by the Developer. The Developer has limited the Development Plan to one potential multifamily development on one of the swing/flex tracts a shown on Exhibit C: *General Development Plan*.
- **C4.** For the purposes of this Agreement, "Build-to-Rent" shall mean any residential development in which multiple dwelling units—including, but not limited to, single-family homes, duplexes, or townhomes—are constructed on public or private streets, and held under common ownership for the primary purpose of leasing to individual tenants, rather than for sale to individual owner-occupants.

Build-to-Rent developments shall be permitted solely within those portions of the Sunterra Lakes Subdivision designated as Swing/Flex land use, as depicted in Exhibit C. Build-to-Rent developments are expressly prohibited in all other areas of the Sunterra Lakes Subdivision. Furthermore, apartment developments are strictly prohibited throughout the entirety of the Sunterra Lakes Subdivision.

#### D. Development Regulations

**D1. Roadway Design** – Roadways within this Project shall be developed in accordance with the following regulations:

#### a. Prairie Parkway (SH 36A)

- Developer shall plat 180' of right-of-way (ROW) with adjacent development as it progresses. An additional 270' of width on either side of the 180' will be dedicated to the MUD(s) and be available for an ultimate width of 450'. The MUD will be allowed to occupy this additional 270' with drainage, detention, landscape, walking paths, sidewalks and utilities. No homes or other vertical structures shall be constructed in this 450' width.
- 2. Developer shall not be required to construct any part of the Prairie Parkway (SH 36A) roadway except what is required to cross with the planned at-grade collector roadway.
- 3. Water, wastewater, storm sewer, drainage ditches, dry utilities (gas, telecom, power, etc) will be allowed to cross the platted 180' ROW where necessary to serve the development.
- 4. See Exhibit I Future 36A.

- **b.** Arterial Streets (Major Thoroughfares) roadway geometry for major thoroughfares shall comply with all County regulations and requirements in effect as of this date of this Agreement, as adopted by the County Commissioners Court and attached as Appendix A and *Exhibit F Major Thoroughfare Plan*.
  - 1. Stockdick Road
    - i. Developer shall dedicate 50' of ROW from the existing center line of Stockdick Road from FM 362 to the north-south collector.
    - ii. Developer shall be responsible to construct two (2) westbound lanes from FM 362 to the north-south collector.
    - iii. Developer shall dedicate 100' of ROW from the north-south collector east to the eastern property line.
    - iv. The Developer shall be responsible to construct the four (4) lane roadway from the north-south collector road to the eastern property line.

#### 2. Beckendorff Road

- i. Developer shall dedicate 100' of ROW.
- ii. Developer shall construct a four (4) lane boulevard from FM 362 to the eastern property line prior to 90% of the lots are platted.

#### c. Collector Streets

- 1. 80' minimum ROW width
- 2. 10' minimum landscape reserve adjacent to ROW
- 3. 500' minimum centerline radius
- 4. Paving width shall be 33' B-B minimum.
- 5. A divided collector shall be 21' B-B both ways with 20' wide median.
- All collector streets shall be considered self-imposed collector streets as the
  Project is not subject to any collector streets on the County's Major Thoroughfare
  Plan at the time of approval and execution of this PD.

#### d. Local Streets

- 1. 60' minimum ROW width
- 2. 28' paving width
- 3. 125' minimum centerline radius
- 4. 50' centerline radius on knuckles
- 5. 60' radius on knuckle bulbs
- 6. 60' radius on cul-de-sac bulbs
- 7. 50' radius on cul-de-sac and knuckle bulbs (back of curb)
- 8. Center point of bulb on cul-de-sac or knuckle may be offset from right of way centerline.
- e. Private Streets Shall be designed as a local street and adhere to Item d above.
- **f.** Except as specifically stated herein, roadway construction details for concrete thickness, reinforcement, and subgrade shall comply with County regulations and requirements, as adopted by the County Commissioners Court.

- g. The Developer is not responsible for any improvements to any exterior roadways except as determined by the *Royal Wailea Traffic Impact Analysis* dated February 26, 2024, submitted by Quiddity Engineering, LLC (Engineer) and reviewed by Waller County. The County has no objections to the mitigation measures as submitted. In the event any ROW or additional paving improvements are required outside the Project boundary per the TIA, County shall be responsible for obtaining such ROW at its cost and Developer shall commence construction after such ROW is obtained. The Developer is only responsible for making existing roadway improvements as identified by the TIA and shown on Exhibit E, *Roadway Improvement Plan*.
- h. If the Developer does not complete the full construction of any future County-maintained roadway within the tract boundary, the Developer shall contribute funds for the future construction of such roadways by the County. The County shall provide the cost per linear foot for the length of the roadway to be constructed within the development boundary.
- **D2. Points of Access -** Points of access within the Project shall be determined for all residential sections based on the following:
  - **a.** One (1) point of access is allowed for up to 150 lots.
  - **b.** The Developer will provide a second point of access for any phase of development or section greater than 150 lots.
    - 1. A boulevard paving section shall be considered two (2) points of access.
    - Construction of the various external connection and internal street patterns
      may be phased, except that the ultimate design shall not allow more than
      150 lots to be limited to a single point of ingress and egress to the larger
      interconnected street network.
- **D3. Block Length and Intersection Spacing** The proposed subdivision shall adhere to the block length and intersection spacing standards as outlined in Exhibit C General Development Plan. The design will ensure that block lengths are manageable to promote accessibility and connectivity within the development. Additionally, intersection spacing will be established to facilitate safe and efficient vehicular and pedestrian movement, thereby enhancing traffic flow throughout the subdivision.

#### D4. Roundabouts

- **a.** Roundabout design will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis depending on the roadway intersection type(s) and any relevant information as specified in the TIA.
- **b.** Roundabouts will be designed in accordance with any relevant regional or national design standards and are intended to be designed similarly to other roundabouts found within the region.

**D5. Development Regulations for Single-Family Lots** – Single-family home sites within the Project shall be developed in accordance with the following regulations:

#### a. Lots

- 1. The maximum number of lots shall not exceed 4,500 lots.
- 2. Minimum lot size, forty feet (40') wide.
- 3. Lots less than fifty feet (50') in width shall not exceed 34% of the total lot count.
- 4. Lot width measurement shall be taken at the building line. The measurement of the building line shall be based off a tangential width on radial shaped lots, not based on arc length.
- 5. The minimum lot width on a cul-de-sac or knuckle that is fronted entirely by lots (no landscape reserves or other reserves) shall be such that the projected width at the curb line allows for thirteen (13') feet plus the width of the driveway and radii (3 feet) on each side of the driveway.
- 6. Lots less than five thousand (5,000 s.f.) square feet shall be subject to a \$3.33 per square foot fee for any lots under 5,000 square feet. Fees shall be due to Waller County upon submission and approval of the final plat.
- 7. Maximum lot coverage: Sixty-five (65%) percent calculated as the ground covered by building structures, principal or accessory, of the gross lot surface area.
- 8. Minimum front yard building setback: 25 feet; 20 feet on cul-de-sac bulbs as measured from the front property / ROW.
- 9. Minimum side yard building setbacks: 5 feet for interior, non-corner lots and the non-street side of corner lots; 15 feet exterior side yard for corner lots. Minimum 25 feet garage setback if the garage door faces the side street.
- 10. Minimum rear yard building setback: 10 feet for lots backing local and collector streets, except when the rear utility easement width is greater than ten (10) feet, in which case the greater width is the minimum rear yard building setback. When a lot or a reserve is either directly adjacent to a major thoroughfare ROW or directly adjacent to a reserve less than fifteen (15) feet wide that is adjacent to a major thoroughfare, the minimum rear yard building setback is twenty—five (25) feet measured from the street ROW line and a minimum of ten (10) feet from the rear property line. When a residential lot backs to a designated major thoroughfare and a detached one-story garage is constructed on the residential lot, the rear yard building setback between the detached one-story garage and the rear property line may be reduced to a minimum of three (3) feet if a minimum of twenty—five (25) feet is maintained between the rear of the one-story detached garage and the ROW line of the major thoroughfare.

#### b. Shade Trees

- 1. All lots shall have a minimum of one (1) tree, planted in the ROW or front yard setback. The trees must be a minimum of two and one-half (2-1/2) inches in caliper width measured from the base of the trunk to 6" above soil level, and a minimum height of eight (8) feet as measured at the tree trunk from the ground as planted.
- 2. In addition, one tree shall be provided within 15 feet of a street-side lot line per 50 feet of lot frontage on the side street, or portion thereof. Required trees shall be placed within the side yard setback or the adjacent ROW.

#### c. Parking

Each single-family home in the Project shall be subject to parking restrictions to be memorialized in separately filed covenants and restrictions as follows:

- 1. <u>Resident Parking.</u> Vehicles of residents shall be parked in the resident's garage or driveway.
- 2. <u>Guest parking</u>. Guests of residents must park in the driveway of the single-family residence they are visiting and may only park on the street if the driveway is not capable of parking another vehicle. This provision does not apply to law enforcement vehicles, emergency services vehicles, vehicles of service workers such as landscapers, construction workers, or plumbers, but does apply to vehicles belonging to caregivers or domestic help that routinely provide services to the resident.
- 3. <u>Enforcement</u>. The enforcement of these parking restrictions shall be done both in accordance with Chapter 684 of the Texas Transportation Code relating to the towing of vehicles, and in accordance with provisions relating to the issuance of fines and the granting of variances from the parking restrictions to be contained in separately filed covenants and restrictions.

#### d. Screening Walls

Where residential lots are platted adjacent to major roadways a minimum six feet (6') tall masonry wall shall be built along the back or side lot line adjacent to major thoroughfares as shown on Exhibit G, Fence Exhibit. At the Developer's opinion six feet (6') tall masonry or enhanced cedar will be installed along the collector roads.

#### e. Specialty Products

- 1. 20% of total lot count (not to exceed).
- 2. Specialty Project shall include:
  - Townhome (attached or detached)
  - ii. Patio Home (not centered patio homes)
  - iii. Duplex
  - iv. Cluster
  - v. Quads
  - vi. Alley Loaded Product (with primary access from a road)
  - vii. New product dictated by market trends
- 3. Minimum lot sizes shall be 3,000 square feet.

#### E. Parks, Recreation and Trails

As shown on Exhibit H, *Trails, Trails, Landscape and Open Space Exhibit*, an integrated network of open space and recreational amenities shall be provided in accordance with the following regulations:

- a. A maximum of fifty percent (50%) of the required area for neighborhood park land may be provided by private neighborhood park land consisting of the following;
  - Small "pocket parks", recreation or open space reserves of a minimum one-tenth
    (1/10) acre, strategically located near the entries of various neighborhood pods,
    as shown on Exhibit H, Trails, Landscape and Open Space. The contributing park
    / recreation / open space areas will be dispersed throughout the community so
    that nearly every home is located within one-quarter (1/4) mile from the nearest
    neighborhood park.
  - 2. Two large, recreation reserves of a minimum area of five (5) acres each including water recreation, playground, picnic areas and/or other active recreational uses.
- b. A minimum of fifty percent (50%) of the required area for neighborhood park land shall be provided consisting of the following:
  - 1. Unencumbered landscape buffer, open space and trails.
  - 2. Land which is encumbered by detention areas, lake and drainage channel borders, or other similar characteristics shall qualify at a fifty percent (50%) credit for public park but only if it complies with criteria listed below.
    - i. Shall have a minimum frontage of 60 feet on a public street. Portions of open space that do not have any additional man-made improvements provided by the Developer, such as concrete cart path, hiking/running trail, benches or shelters that facilitate an active human recreational role will not be considered contributing to the minimum neighborhood park area requirement.
    - ii. Areas along lake and drainage channel borders shall have a minimum width of twenty feet (20'). Borders along lakes and drainage channels adjacent to roadways shall be measured from the back of curb to top of bank; and
    - iii. Side slopes for area used in credit not to exceed a four to one (4:1) ratio.

- iv. A minimum of two (2) view corridors per lake with an unobstructed view from the adjacent streets with a minimum combined width of 60 feet, per lake, shall be provided to each permanent lake. The minimum width of a single view corridor is 20 feet. Views to the permanent lakes from the view corridors shall not be obstructed by fences, structures, screening or landscaping that would prevent seeing the lake area.
- v. View corridors shall be separated by a minimum of one thousand (1,000) feet as measured along the lake water edge. Unless the lake is less than one thousand (1,000) feet in length in which case the view corridors shall be separated by at least 4/5 the total length of the lake.
- c. Minimum 5-foot-wide sidewalks shall be provided along both sides of local residential streets. All sidewalks shall be constructed in accordance with the County details and shall meet the State of Texas American with Disabilities Act accessibility guidelines.
- d. Minimum 5-foot-wide sidewalks shall be provided along both sides of major thoroughfares and internal collectors within and adjacent to the property. The sidewalks may meander out of the ROW and into an adjacent landscape reserve if so provided. The HOA or MUD, and not the County, shall be responsible for the maintenance of ancillary signage and landscape features. Where a walking trail is provided along a major thoroughfare or internal collector and adjacent to a pipeline or detention/amenity pond, a sidewalk in the ROW shall not be required. However, the walking trail and sidewalk should be connected to provide a continuous connection.
- e. The Developer, HOA, or MUD shall be eligible to install landscaping features within the ROW. All such features must adhere to applicable County design and safety standards. Landscaping features may include, but are not limited to, softscape elements (e.g., trees, shrubs, and ground cover), hardscape elements (e.g., decorative pavers and retaining walls), irrigation systems, and entry monumentation. The HOA or MUD, and not the County, shall bear full responsibility for the maintenance, repair, and replacement of these landscaping features to ensure their continued functionality and aesthetic appeal.

#### F. Street Plan and Cross Sections

All new construction will be concrete curb and gutter with the ultimate storm sewer. Dead-end streets that terminate at properties with potential for future development may remain as dead-end streets, with extensions required up to the property line. Dead-end streets that will remain as dead-ends shall end in a temporary cul-de-sac with a minimum ROW radius of 60 feet (minimum base 50-foot radius) with dead-end street signs clearly posted. All other County requirements for dead-end street design shall remain applicable.

- 1. Street cross sections listed below.
  - Figure 1: Street cross section, Local Street 60-foot Right-of-Way
  - Figure 2: Street cross section, Collector Street Four Lanes
  - Figure 3: Street cross section, Collector Street Two Lanes
- 2. Street improvements: Streets shall be built in phases as the Project develops in accordance with the County's Engineering Design Criteria, Development Agreement, and as shown on Exhibit E, Roadway Improvement Plan.
- 3. Upon approval of this PD, the County will amend its major thoroughfare plan to reflect the revised alignments of Prairie Parkway (SH 36A) in accordance with Exhibit F, *Major Thoroughfare Plan* of this PD.

#### G. Building Regulations

Single-family homes within the Project shall be developed in accordance with the following building regulations:

The Developer and/or the HOA will establish an Architectural Review Committee to create, review and enforce architectural and design standards for the single-family homes within the Project. There may be additional sub-homeowner associations and Property Owner's Associations (POA) may be established for non-residential property owners for the same purpose. These construction guidelines will be developed prior to any single-family home construction and will be filed in the property records separately from this PD.

#### H. Other Provisions

After 25% of planned residential units are occupied (not platted lots) within the Development, it is understood and agreed that the Developer and/or HOA shall contract with the Waller County Sheriff's Department to provide supplemental police protection services to Developer's Property. The interlocal agreement for such services shall be identical to the form of agreement entered into with other municipal utility districts in Waller County, Texas.

### I. Applicability

This PD shall apply to any development within this Project and has no expiration. It shall be upheld for any and all existing and future developers or builders, except and unless a new amended agreement is written and approved by all owners and applicable agencies.

# EXHIBIT B PLAN of DEVELOPMENT

# Sunterra Lakes

#### A. Introduction

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- **B8.** The Developer shall only fund or construct road improvements where the Developer constructs direct connections into existing County/TxDOT-maintained roads. Refer to Exhibit E.

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**C3.** Commercial and non-residential uses are regulated by applicable County ordinances and design guidelines imposed by the Developer. The Developer has limited the Development Plan to one potential multifamily development on one of the swing/flex tracts a shown on Exhibit C: *General Development Plan*.

#### **C4.** Build to rent shall be prohibited in the Sunterra Lakes Subdivision.

**C4.** For the purposes of this Agreement, "Build-to-Rent" shall mean any residential development in which multiple dwelling units—including, but not limited to, single-family homes, duplexes, or townhomes—are constructed on public or private streets, and held under common ownership for the primary purpose of leasing to individual tenants, rather than for sale to individual owner-occupants.

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**D1. Roadway Design** – Roadways within this Project shall be developed in accordance with the following regulations:

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- 2. Developer shall not be required to construct any part of the Prairie Parkway (SH 36A) roadway except what is required to cross with the planned at-grade collector roadway.
- 3. Water, wastewater, storm sewer, drainage ditches, dry utilities (gas, telecom, power, etc) will be allowed to cross the platted 180' ROW where necessary to serve the development.
- 4. See Exhibit I Future 36A.
- **b.** Arterial Streets (Major Thoroughfares) roadway geometry for major thoroughfares shall comply with all County regulations and requirements in effect as of this date of this Agreement, as adopted by the County Commissioners Court and attached as Appendix A and *Exhibit F Major Thoroughfare Plan*.
  - 1. Stockdick Road
    - i. Developer shall dedicate 50' of ROW from the existing center line of Stockdick Road from FM 362 to the north-south collector.

- ii. Developer shall be responsible to construct two (2) westbound lanes from FM 362 to the north-south collector.
- iii. Developer shall dedicate 100' of ROW from the north-south collector east to the eastern property line.
- iv. The Developer shall be responsible to construct the four (4) lane roadway from the north-south collector road to the eastern property line.

#### 2. Beckendorff Road

- i. Developer shall dedicate 100' of ROW.
- ii. Developer shall construct a four (4) lane boulevard from FM 362 to the eastern property line prior to 90% of the lots are platted.

#### c. Collector Streets

- 1. 80' minimum ROW width
- 2. 10' minimum landscape reserve adjacent to ROW
- 3. 500' minimum centerline radius
- 4. Paving width shall be 33' B-B minimum.
- 5. A divided collector shall be 21' B-B both ways with 20' wide median.
- 6. All collector streets shall be considered self-imposed collector streets as the Project is not subject to any collector streets on the County's Major Thoroughfare Plan at the time of approval and execution of this PD.

#### d. Local Streets

- 1. 60' minimum ROW width
- 2. 28' paving width
- 3. 125' minimum centerline radius
- 4. 50' centerline radius on knuckles
- 5. 60' radius on knuckle bulbs
- 6. 60' radius on cul-de-sac bulbs
- 7. 50' radius on cul-de-sac and knuckle bulbs (back of curb)
- 8. Center point of bulb on cul-de-sac or knuckle may be offset from right of way centerline.
- e. Private Streets Shall be designed as a local street and adhere to Item d above.
- **f.** Except as specifically stated herein, roadway construction details for concrete thickness, reinforcement, and subgrade shall comply with County regulations and requirements, as adopted by the County Commissioners Court.
- g. The Developer is not responsible for any improvements to any exterior roadways except as determined by the *Royal Wailea Traffic Impact Analysis* dated February 26, 2024, submitted by Quiddity Engineering, LLC (Engineer) and reviewed by Waller County. The County has no objections to the mitigation measures as submitted. In the event any ROW or additional paving improvements are required outside the Project boundary per the TIA, County shall be responsible for obtaining such ROW at its cost and Developer shall commence construction after such ROW is obtained. The Developer is only responsible for making existing roadway improvements as identified by the TIA and shown on Exhibit E, *Roadway Improvement Plan*.
- h. If the Developer does not complete the full construction of any future County-maintained roadway within the tract boundary, the Developer shall contribute funds for the future construction of such roadways by the County. The County shall provide the cost per linear foot for the length of the roadway to be constructed within the development boundary.

- **D2. Points of Access -** Points of access within the Project shall be determined for all residential sections based on the following:
  - **a.** One (1) point of access is allowed for up to 150 lots.
  - **b.** The Developer will provide a second point of access for any phase of development or section greater than 150 lots.
    - 1. A boulevard paving section shall be considered two (2) points of access.
    - Construction of the various external connection and internal street patterns
      may be phased, except that the ultimate design shall not allow more than
      150 lots to be limited to a single point of ingress and egress to the larger
      interconnected street network.
- **D3. Block Length and Intersection Spacing -** The proposed subdivision shall adhere to the block length and intersection spacing standards as outlined in Exhibit C General Development Plan. The design will ensure that block lengths are manageable to promote accessibility and connectivity within the development. Additionally, intersection spacing will be established to facilitate safe and efficient vehicular and pedestrian movement, thereby enhancing traffic flow throughout the subdivision.

#### D4. Roundabouts

- **a.** Roundabout design will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis depending on the roadway intersection type(s) and any relevant information as specified in the TIA.
- **b.** Roundabouts will be designed in accordance with any relevant regional or national design standards and are intended to be designed similarly to other roundabouts found within the region.
- **D5. Development Regulations for Single-Family Lots** Single-family home sites within the Project shall be developed in accordance with the following regulations:

#### a. Lots

- 1. The maximum number of lots shall not exceed 4,500 lots.
- 2. Minimum lot size, forty feet (40') wide.
- 3. Lots less than fifty feet (50') in width shall not exceed 34% of the total lot count.
- 4. Lot width measurement shall be taken at the building line. The measurement of the building line shall be based off a tangential width on radial shaped lots, not based on arc length.
- 5. The minimum lot width on a cul-de-sac or knuckle that is fronted entirely by lots (no landscape reserves or other reserves) shall be such that the projected width at the curb line allows for thirteen (13') feet plus the width of the driveway and radii (3 feet) on each side of the driveway.
- 6. Lots less than five thousand (5,000 s.f.) square feet shall be subject to a \$3.33 per square foot fee for any lots under 5,000 square feet. Fees shall be due to Waller County upon submission and approval of the final plat.
- 7. Maximum lot coverage: Sixty-five (65%) percent calculated as the ground covered by building structures, principal or accessory, of the gross lot surface area.

- 8. Minimum front yard building setback: 25 feet; 20 feet on cul-de-sac bulbs as measured from the front property / ROW.
- 9. Minimum side yard building setbacks: 5 feet for interior, non-corner lots and the non-street side of corner lots; 15 feet exterior side yard for corner lots. Minimum 25 feet garage setback if the garage door faces the side street.
- 10. Minimum rear yard building setback: 10 feet for lots backing local and collector streets, except when the rear utility easement width is greater than ten (10) feet, in which case the greater width is the minimum rear yard building setback. When a lot or a reserve is either directly adjacent to a major thoroughfare ROW or directly adjacent to a reserve less than fifteen (15) feet wide that is adjacent to a major thoroughfare, the minimum rear yard building setback is twenty—five (25) feet measured from the street ROW line and a minimum of ten (10) feet from the rear property line. When a residential lot backs to a designated major thoroughfare and a detached one-story garage is constructed on the residential lot, the rear yard building setback between the detached one-story garage and the rear property line may be reduced to a minimum of three (3) feet if a minimum of twenty—five (25) feet is maintained between the rear of the one-story detached garage and the ROW line of the major thoroughfare.

#### b. Shade Trees

- 1. All lots shall have a minimum of one (1) tree, planted in the ROW or front yard setback. The trees must be a minimum of two and one-half (2-1/2) inches in caliper width measured from the base of the trunk to 6" above soil level, and a minimum height of eight (8) feet as measured at the tree trunk from the ground as planted.
- 2. In addition, one tree shall be provided within 15 feet of a street-side lot line per 50 feet of lot frontage on the side street, or portion thereof. Required trees shall be placed within the side yard setback or the adjacent ROW.

#### c. Parking

Each single-family home in the Project shall be subject to parking restrictions to be memorialized in separately filed covenants and restrictions as follows:

- 1. <u>Resident Parking.</u> Vehicles of residents shall be parked in the resident's garage or driveway.
- 2. <u>Guest parking</u>. Guests of residents must park in the driveway of the single-family residence they are visiting and may only park on the street if the driveway is not capable of parking another vehicle. This provision does not apply to law enforcement vehicles, emergency services vehicles, vehicles of service workers such as landscapers, construction workers, or plumbers, but does apply to vehicles belonging to caregivers or domestic help that routinely provide services to the resident.

3. <u>Enforcement</u>. The enforcement of these parking restrictions shall be done both in accordance with Chapter 684 of the Texas Transportation Code relating to the towing of vehicles, and in accordance with provisions relating to the issuance of fines and the granting of variances from the parking restrictions to be contained in separately filed covenants and restrictions.

#### d. Screening Walls

Where residential lots are platted adjacent to major roadways a minimum six feet (6') tall masonry wall shall be built along the back or side lot line adjacent to major thoroughfares as shown on Exhibit G, Fence Exhibit. At the Developer's opinion six feet (6') tall masonry or enhanced cedar will be installed along the collector roads.

#### e. Specialty Products

- 1. 20% of total lot count (not to exceed).
- 2. Specialty Project shall include:
  - i. Townhome (attached or detached)
  - ii. Patio Home (not centered patio homes)
  - iii. Duplex
  - iv. Cluster
  - v. Quads
  - vi. Alley Loaded Product (with primary access from a road)
  - vii. New product dictated by market trends
- 3. Minimum lot sizes shall be 3,000 square feet.

#### E. Parks, Recreation and Trails

As shown on Exhibit H, *Trails, Trails, Landscape and Open Space Exhibit*, an integrated network of open space and recreational amenities shall be provided in accordance with the following regulations:

- a. A maximum of fifty percent (50%) of the required area for neighborhood park land may be provided by private neighborhood park land consisting of the following;
  - Small "pocket parks", recreation or open space reserves of a minimum one-tenth
    (1/10) acre, strategically located near the entries of various neighborhood pods,
    as shown on Exhibit H, Trails, Landscape and Open Space. The contributing park
    / recreation / open space areas will be dispersed throughout the community so
    that nearly every home is located within one-quarter (1/4) mile from the nearest
    neighborhood park.
  - 2. Two large, recreation reserves of a minimum area of five (5) acres each including water recreation, playground, picnic areas and/or other active recreational uses.

- b. A minimum of fifty percent (50%) of the required area for neighborhood park land shall be provided consisting of the following:
  - 1. Unencumbered landscape buffer, open space and trails.
  - 2. Land which is encumbered by detention areas, lake and drainage channel borders, or other similar characteristics shall qualify at a fifty percent (50%) credit for public park but only if it complies with criteria listed below.
    - i. Shall have a minimum frontage of 60 feet on a public street. Portions of open space that do not have any additional man-made improvements provided by the Developer, such as concrete cart path, hiking/running trail, benches or shelters that facilitate an active human recreational role will not be considered contributing to the minimum neighborhood park area requirement.
    - ii. Areas along lake and drainage channel borders shall have a minimum width of twenty feet (20'). Borders along lakes and drainage channels adjacent to roadways shall be measured from the back of curb to top of bank; and
    - iii. Side slopes for area used in credit not to exceed a four to one (4:1) ratio.
    - iv. A minimum of two (2) view corridors per lake with an unobstructed view from the adjacent streets with a minimum combined width of 60 feet, per lake, shall be provided to each permanent lake. The minimum width of a single view corridor is 20 feet. Views to the permanent lakes from the view corridors shall not be obstructed by fences, structures, screening or landscaping that would prevent seeing the lake area.
    - v. View corridors shall be separated by a minimum of one thousand (1,000) feet as measured along the lake water edge. Unless the lake is less than one thousand (1,000) feet in length in which case the view corridors shall be separated by at least 4/5 the total length of the lake.
- c. Minimum 5-foot-wide sidewalks shall be provided along both sides of local residential streets. All sidewalks shall be constructed in accordance with the County details and shall meet the State of Texas American with Disabilities Act accessibility guidelines.
- d. Minimum 5-foot-wide sidewalks shall be provided along both sides of major thoroughfares and internal collectors within and adjacent to the property. The sidewalks may meander out of the ROW and into an adjacent landscape reserve if so provided. The HOA or MUD, and not the County, shall be responsible for the maintenance of ancillary signage and landscape features. Where a walking trail is provided along a major thoroughfare or internal collector and adjacent to a pipeline or detention/amenity pond, a sidewalk in the ROW shall not be required. However, the walking trail and sidewalk should be connected to provide a continuous connection.

e. The Developer, HOA, or MUD shall be eligible to install landscaping features within the ROW. All such features must adhere to applicable County design and safety standards. Landscaping features may include, but are not limited to, softscape elements (e.g., trees, shrubs, and ground cover), hardscape elements (e.g., decorative pavers and retaining walls), irrigation systems, and entry monumentation. The HOA or MUD, and not the County, shall bear full responsibility for the maintenance, repair, and replacement of these landscaping features to ensure their continued functionality and aesthetic appeal.

#### F. Street Plan and Cross Sections

All new construction will be concrete curb and gutter with the ultimate storm sewer. Dead-end streets that terminate at properties with potential for future development may remain as dead-end streets, with extensions required up to the property line. Dead-end streets that will remain as dead-ends shall end in a temporary cul-de-sac with a minimum ROW radius of 60 feet (minimum base 50-foot radius) with dead-end street signs clearly posted. All other County requirements for dead-end street design shall remain applicable.

# TAX ABATEMENT AGREEMENT BETWEEN WALLER COUNTY, TEXAS AND GRUNDFOS CBS, INC.

This Tax Abatement Agreement (this "Agreement") is entered into by and between the County of Waller, Texas ("County"), duly acting herein by and through the County Judge, and Grundfos CBS, Inc. ("Grundfos"), a Delaware corporation with its principal place of business at 902 Koomey Road, Brookshire, Texas 77423. Grundfos owns the property subject to this Agreement, and on which the Improvements (defined hereafter) will be made. The taxable real and personal property is located within Waller County, Texas, in the City of Brookshire, Texas, and is in the City of Brookshire Reinvestment Zone #3 ("Reinvestment Zone") designated by the City of Brookshire on June 5, 2025. This Agreement is entered as of the last day of signature affixed hereto (the "Effective Date").

#### **RECITALS:**

WHEREAS, on the 5th day of June, 2025 the City of Brookshire passed an Order establishing City of Brookshire Reinvestment Zone #3, a Reinvestment Zone for commercial/industrial tax abatement ("Order"), as authorized by Texas Tax Code Chapter 312, attached hereto as Exhibit C; and

WHEREAS, the City entered into a tax abatement agreement under Texas Tax Code § 312.204 with the property owner; and

WHEREAS, the County is a taxing unit under Texas Tax Code § 312.002, in which the property is located, and wishes to enter into a tax abatement agreement with the property owner; and

WHEREAS, the County has previously adopted the Waller County Tax Abatement Policy Guidelines & Criteria ("Policy") governing Tax Abatement Agreements and Reinvestment Zones; and

WHEREAS, the Policy constitutes appropriate guidelines and criteria governing Tax Abatement Agreements to be entered into by the County; and

WHEREAS, the County has adopted a resolution stating that it elects to participate in tax abatement; and

WHEREAS, in order to maintain and/or enhance the commercial/industrial economic and employment base of County, to otherwise further the goals of the Policy previously adopted by County, and for the long-term benefit of the County;

**NOW THEREFORE**, the parties hereto mutually agree as follows:

### **COVENANTS AND AGREEMENTS:**

- 1. This Agreement shall begin on the Effective Date, and continue until termination in accordance with its terms (the "Agreement Term").
- 2. The "Premises" is the parcel of land described in Exhibit A, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein.
- 3. Grundfos shall make or cause to be made real and personal property improvements (the "Improvements") on the Premises, and the Improvements shall be of the kind, number, and location specifically described in Exhibit B, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein. In addition, Grundfos shall install and maintain, or cause to be installed and maintained, at the Premises the Improvements described on Exhibit B, the taxable value of which shall be as identified on Exhibit B, and shall be for the purpose of allowing Grundfos to operate or cause the Premises to be operated as required in Section 3.

- a. Grundfos shall ensure the Improvements are diligently and faithfully undertaken and completed in a good and workmanlike manner, in compliance with all applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations.
- b. Grundfos shall have additional reasonable time to complete the Improvements in the event of "force majeure," if Grundfos is diligently and faithfully pursuing completion of the Improvements. "Force majeure" shall mean any contingency or cause beyond the reasonable control of Grundfos including, without limitation, an act of God, public enemy, war, riot, civil commotion, insurrection, or labor strikes.
- 4. Grundfos shall, by the end of YEAR 1 of the Abatement Period referenced in Section 9, and until the expiration of the Abatement Period, continuously operate and maintain, or cause to be continually operated and maintained, the Premises as a production facility for water pumps and related equipment. If Grundfos operations at the Premises are prevented due to force majeure, such interruption of operations shall not constitute a default hereunder.
- 5. Grundfos shall file or cause to be filed the Forms 50-116, 50-141, 50-142, and/or any other reasonably required documentation, to verify personal property values and continued compliance for the abatement granted, to the Waller County Appraisal District annually during the Abatement Period for so long as the law requires annual application. The forms shall be timely filed in accordance with applicable law, and in no event filed later than the final extension allowed by law. Failure to do so and cure such default within thirty (30) days after receipt of notice of the same may result in the termination of this Agreement. Further, Grundfos agrees to allow both the County and the Waller County Appraisal

- District access to the Improvements to confirm rendered inventory values as part of ensuring compliance with this Agreement.
- 6. Grundfos shall, in writing in a form reasonably acceptable to both Grundfos and the County and, until the expiration or termination of this Agreement, annually certify compliance with this Agreement, including the Employment requirements set forth in Section 7.
- 7. EMPLOYEES: For the duration of this Agreement, Grundfos shall employ an agreed number of persons as set forth below.
  - a. Grundfos must hire a minimum of ten (10) new Employees (defined hereafter) each Year of the Abatement Period. For example, this requires ten (10) new Employees by the end of Year 1 of the Abatement Period, and an additional ten (10) new Employees by the end of Year 2 of the Abatement Period, for a total of 20 Employees by the end of Year 2, and continuing for each subsequent Year of the Abatement Period. In the event that Grundfos employs more than ten (10) new Employees during any year of the Abatement Period, then the year immediately following the year in which Grundfos exceeds ten (10) new Employees will be credited with the excess number of new Employees. The new Employees must be employed at or based from the Premises. New Employees may include persons transferred from an existing facility in another Texas county. The parties agree and understand that the number of Employees within a certain class may increase or decrease and that Grundfos will be in compliance with the Employee requirements as long as ten (10) new Employees are employed each Year during the Abatement Period, as described herein, regardless of the number of new Employees in each position.

- b. An Employee is a person who (i) is paid directly by Grundfos or in the case of a contract employee paid directly or indirectly by Grundfos, and (ii) regularly works at least 35 hours a week at or based from the Premises, excluding time taken for holidays, vacations, sick leave, or other regular leave.
- c. Where there are qualified applicants living in Waller County, Grundfos shall make a good faith effort to employ such persons living in Waller County, Texas for its new Employees. Grundfos may contact the County to assist in obtaining applicable training grants, if available, to ensure that citizens of Waller County are given every opportunity for employment.
- d. Grundfos, upon a five (5) business day prior request by the County, shall validate compliance with the terms of this Section 6 by allowing the County to review Grundfos' records and documents on location at the Premises, or such other reasonable location agreed to by the Parties, that are directly related to Grundfos obligations with regards to the Employees for the sole purpose of verification of the information contained in the compliance certifications due pursuant to Section 5; provided, however, such review must be done during normal business hours no more than once per calendar year, and the County shall not be permitted to photocopy any documentation. Grundfos may withhold any information it reasonably deems to be sensitive (subject to the requirements of any applicable statute). In the event that the County is unable to determine compliance because access to information is denied, or information is withheld hereunder, then the County may terminate this Agreement upon written notice to Grundfos. The County agrees it will make best efforts not to interrupt the Grundfos business with such

reviews, and Grundfos shall not be required to disclose the names or other sensitive personally identifiable information (such as social security numbers, home addresses or telephone numbers) of specific Employees.

- 8. It is understood, and agreed among the parties, that beginning Year 1 of the Abatement Period, as defined herein, and continuing each year thereafter, as provided in law, the Premises and any and all Improvements shall be appraised at market value effective January 1 of each tax year, including the value of any partially completed Improvements.
- 9. INVENTORY: By the beginning of Year 2 of the Abatement Period, and continuing during the Abatement Period, Grundfos shall maintain a minimum \$2,186,176.00 rendered taxable inventory value at the Premises. Grundfos agrees to render all Personal Property for tax valuation purposes with the Chief Appraiser for the Waller County Appraisal District annually and within the deadline for filing renditions. Grundfos shall give the Waller County Appraisal District any necessary permission required for the Waller County Appraisal District to provide copies of Grundfos tax documents with inventory values to the County for the purpose of verifying rendered inventory values.
- 10. Subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, and subject to the rights of the holders of any outstanding bonds of the County, a portion of the ad valorem property taxes only for real and personal property Improvements for the Premises, which would otherwise be owed to the County, shall be abated for a period of years, commencing January 1, 2028 and terminating December 31, 2033("Abatement Period").
  - a. Said Abatement Period shall be only for qualifying real and personal property Improvements, referenced in Exhibit B, in an amount equal to the percentages listed below:

YEAR 1 (2028) 100% YEAR 2 (2029) 100% YEAR 3 (2030) 75% YEAR 4 (2031) 75%

YEAR 5 (2032) 75%

YEAR 6 (2033) 50%

- b. The abatement percentages in Section 9(a) shall be applied only to the taxes assessed for each year during the Abatement Period on the value of the real and personal property Improvements identified on Exhibit B.
- c. Grundfos shall have the right to protest any appraisals of the Premises,
  Improvements, or any portion thereof, during the term of this Agreement. Nothing
  in this Agreement shall affect the right to protest and/or contest any taxes assessed
  on the Premises and any and all Improvements, and the abatement percentages shall
  be applied to the amount of taxes finally determined to be due as a result of any
  such protest and/or contest.
- d. If the certified appraised value of the real property Improvements is reduced, regardless of the initial appraised value, as the result of Grundfos' protest, the percentage of abatement granted herein will be adjusted downward by the same percentage, then rounded to the nearest whole number. For example, if the protest of the certified appraised value is reduced by 6.6% then the percentage of the tax abatement granted in any given year under this Agreement on the Improvements would be decreased by the same percentage, rounded upward to the nearest whole number, thereby reducing the abatement by 7%.

### **DEFAULT:**

11. Grundfos shall be in default if it fails to perform its obligations in accordance with this Agreement. Default includes, but is not limited to:

- a. Improvements not installed or maintained in accordance with this Agreement as described in Exhibit B, except where force majeure is the cause, as provided under Section 2(b);
- b. Grundfos fails to employ the number of persons in accordance with (and during the period set forth in) Section 7 of this Agreement for any consecutive 90-day period, which would reduce the abatement by the same percentage as noted in Section 13;
- c. With respect to the Abatement Period, Grundfos fails to timely file, or cause to be filed, annual renditions for the Premises and any and all Improvements or Grundfos fails to file, or cause to be filed, an annual application with the Waller County Appraisal District for so long as the law requires such an application;
- d. During the Agreement Term, Grundfos allows their ad valorem taxes owed to the County, or any other taxes owed to any other taxing entity located in whole or in part in the County, to become delinquent without timely and properly following the legal procedures for protest and/or contest of any such taxes;
- e. During the Agreement Term, Grundfos operates, allows the Premises to be operated in violation of public health and safety laws; or causes or allows the Premises or any part thereof to become a public nuisance, as provided under the appropriate ordinances of Waller County, or the State of Texas;
- f. For duration of the Abatement Period beginning with Year 2, if Grundfos fails to maintain a minimum of \$2,186,176.00 rendered taxable value of inventory at the Premises, then Grundfos shall not be entitled to the abatement of property taxes for the year in which the default occurs.

- 12. In the event Grundfos defaults as described in Section 10, the County, or the Waller County Appraisal District shall give Grundfos written notice of such default. If Grundfos has not cured such default under Section 10 within sixty (60) days of said written notice or, if the nature of such default is such that sixty (60) days is not sufficient to affect such cure, does not commence such cure within such sixty (60) days and diligently pursue it to completion, the County may take the actions permitted in Section 12 or Section 13, as applicable.
- 13. In the event that Grundfos fails to maintain the required minimum number of Employees at the Premises in accordance with (and during the period set forth in) Section 6 for any consecutive 90-day period, the tax abatement granted by this Agreement will be reduced as a percentage based on the difference. The amount of the tax abatement granted by this Agreement for the tax year following the year in which the requirement was not met is reduced by the same percentage, rounded to the nearest whole number, as the percentage decrease in the actual number of Employees that is maintained in the 90-day period. For example, if the actual average number of Employees is reduced by 6.6% during a given year, then the percentage of the tax abatement granted for that year under this Agreement on the Improvements would be decreased by the same percentage, rounded upward to the nearest whole number reducing the abatement by 7%. Should Grundfos not maintain the required number of employees, and reduce the taxable value of real property as a result of tax protest, then the greater of the two shall be applied to the reduction.
- 14. This Agreement may be terminated as follows:
  - a. This Agreement shall automatically terminate upon complete performance of the terms and conditions of the Agreement.

- b. Either party may terminate this Agreement if Grundfos elects not to proceed with the project before the Abatement Period commences.
- c. If Grundfos, or any permitted successor or assign filed any petition for bankruptcy, then this Agreement shall be deemed to have automatically terminated one (1) day prior to the filing of the petition for bankruptcy, and upon such termination, all taxes previously abated under this Agreement shall be recaptured by the County.
- d. The County may terminate this Agreement in the event of default in the manner described below.
- 15. In the event of default under Section 10(a) and Section 10(c)-(e), the County may (after notice and opportunity to cure as provided for herein) terminate this Agreement upon written notice of termination to Grundfos, and the County, in such event, shall be entitled to recapture any and all property taxes which have been abated as a result of this Agreement for those years in which Grundfos was in default under Section 10(a) and Section 10 (c)-(e), and all such taxes shall be paid to the County within sixty (60) days of Grundfos' receipt of written demand from the County following the expiration of the cure period described in Section 11 (provided no cure is made).
  - a. In addition to any taxes due as a result of default hereunder, interest on any amounts subject to recapture or not current as of the time of default may be charged at the statutory rate of delinquent taxes, as determined by Chapter 33 of the Texas Tax Code.
  - b. Notwithstanding subsection (a) above, in the event of default or termination, no penalty shall be charged under Chapter 33 of the Texas Tax Code.

### **MISCELLANEOUS:**

- 16. The County represents and warrants that the Premises do not include any property that is owned by a member of the Waller County Commissioners Court, or owned by any party responsible for the approval of this Agreement.
- 17. The terms and conditions of this Agreement are binding upon the permitted successors and assigns of all parties.
  - a. This Agreement cannot be assigned by Grundfos without the County's written consent, which shall not be unreasonably withheld. In order for an Assignment to be effective, the following conditions must be met:
    - An Assignment must be publicly posted by the County for 30 days prior to the regularly scheduled Commissioners Court meeting where consent to the Assignment will be considered;
    - The assignee must explicitly accept all or assignor's obligations under this Agreement,
    - iii. The assignor retains all of its obligations under this Agreement until the Assignment becomes effective;
    - iv. The Assignment is executed by both the assignor and the assignee.
    - v. The assignor provides the County a fully executed Assignment agreement not later than ten (10) business days prior to the date the Commissioners Court will consider consenting to the Assignment.
  - b. Grundfos may assign this Agreement without written consent from the County if such assignment is to any entity that, directly or indirectly, is controlled by, or is in common control with Grundfos, provided that:

- i. The assignor gives written notice of any such assignment to the County at least thirty (30) days prior to the effective date of the assignment;
- ii. The Assignment is made a part of the official minutes of a regularly scheduled Commissioners Court meeting, and notice of the Assignment is publicly posted for 30 days prior to the regularly scheduled Commissioners Court meeting;
- iii. The assignee explicitly accepts all of assignor's obligations under this Agreement;
- iv. The assignor retains its obligations to the County under this Agreement until the Assignment is effective;
- v. The Assignment is executed by both the assignor and the assignee; and
- vi. The assignor provides the County a fully executed Assignment agreement not later than five (5) business days prior to the date the Assignment is included in the official minutes of the Commissioners Court meeting.
- 18. This Agreement does not inure to the benefit of any third-party, except permitted successors or assigns
- 19. Grundfos recognizes and understands that Waller County will not provide public support for companies or companies with a partial ownership from or investors from communist countries or those companies coming from countries with poor human rights records. Grundfos agrees that in the event Grundfos allows such a company to occupy or possess any portion of the Premises, this Agreement will be immediately terminated. In such event, the County shall be entitled to recapture any and all property taxes which have been abated

- as a result of this Agreement for those years in which Grundfos violated this Section of the Agreement.
- 20. It is understood and agreed between the parties that Grundfos is acting independently in the performance of its obligations hereunder, and the County assumes no responsibilities or liabilities for Grundfos' performance of this Agreement. Grundfos agrees to Defend, Indemnify, and hold Harmless the County, including but not limited to the County's officials, officers, employees, agents, and affiliates, and the Waller County appraisal district, from any and all third party claims, losses, damages, Injuries, suits, judgments, and reasonable attorney's fees relating to Grundfos' breach of performance of its obligations under this Agreement. In no event shall Grundfos indemnify County for acts, omissions or defaults of County, including, without limitation, the negligence or willful misconduct of County or any agents, consultants, or employees thereof.
- 21. Grundfos agrees that both the Waller County Appraisal District and the County, and their agents or employees shall, during the Agreement Term, have the reasonable right of access to the Premises after five (5) business days' prior written notice to inspect the Improvements to ensure that the Improvements have been made and are being made in accordance with this Agreement. After completion of the Improvements, both the Waller County Appraisal District and the County, and their agents and employees shall have the continuing right of reasonable access to ensure that the Premises are thereafter maintained and operated in accordance with this Agreement, during the Abatement Period. The County agrees (i) to give Grundfos notice of its intent to inspect the Premises at least two (2) business days prior to such inspections, (ii) that such inspections shall be during normal

business hours, and (iii) Grundfos shall be permitted to have a representative accompany the County's representative(s) at all times during such inspections. The County's inspections, if any, shall not constitute an acknowledgment or certification to Grundfos, or any third party, that Grundfos followed federal, state, or local laws or regulations.

- 22. This Agreement shall be construed and interpreted in accordance with Texas law, and it is performable in Waller County, Texas. Any disputes regarding this agreement shall be litigated or mediated in Waller County, Texas.
- 23. This Agreement was authorized by the Commissioners Court of Waller County, Texas at this meeting on June 25, 2025, whereupon it was duly determined that the County Judge would execute the Agreement on behalf of Waller County, Texas.
- 24. All amendments and additions to this Agreement and its Exhibits must be approved in writing by Grundfos and the Waller County Commissioners Court, and be done in accordance with Texas Tax Code Chapter 312.
- 25. Signatories to this Agreement represent and warrant that they have the authority to bind the respective parties.
- 26. Except as otherwise expressly set forth in this Agreement, each of the parties will bear its own expenses in connection with the transactions contemplated by this Agreement.
- 27. In the event any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, or sentence herein is held invalid, illegal or unenforceable, the balance of this Agreement shall stand, shall be enforceable and shall be read as if the parties intended at all times to delete said invalid section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, or sentence. In such event there shall be substituted for such deleted provisions a provision as similar as possible in terms and in effect to such deleted provision that is valid, legal and enforceable.

- 28. The County shall have the right to seek any remedy available at law to which it may be entitled, in addition to the remedies provided herein.
- 29. Except as may otherwise be provided herein, this Agreement constitutes the entire understanding between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and none of the parties hereto has relied upon any fact or representation not expressly set forth herein. No obligations, agreements, representations, warranties, or certifications, expressed or implied, shall exist among the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof except as expressly stated herein.
- 30. All headings and captions used herein are for the convenience of the parties only and are of no meaning in the interpretation or effect of this Agreement.
- 31. Grundfos recognizes and understands that the County is a governmental entity subject to Texas Government Code Chapter 552, the Texas Public Information Act ("PIA"). Grundfos shall mark any confidential documents or other information provided to the County as such. In the event that the County receives any open records requests regarding any such confidential document or information or directly regarding this Agreement or any documents or information related to or prepared in connection therewith, the County will make good faith efforts to promptly notify Grundfos of the request. Grundfos recognizes and understands that the final decision as to what information must be disclosed pursuant to the PIA lies with the Texas Attorney General. Grundfos further agrees that the County may furnish information acquired through or pursuant to this Agreement and that is requested through the PIA to the Texas Attorney General for a determination of whether the information must be disclosed. The County, its officers, and employees shall have no liability or obligation to any party for the disclosure to the public, or to any person or

persons, of any items or data furnished to the County by Grundfos in reliance on any statute, court opinion, court order, or the advice, decision, or opinion of the Texas Attorney General.

- 32. Any party hereto may request an estoppel certificate related to this Agreement (each, a "Certificate") from another party hereto so long as the Certificate is requested in connection with a bona fide business purpose. The Certificate, which if requested, will be addressed to a subsequent purchaser or assignee of Grundfos or other party designated by Grundfos which shall include, but not necessarily be limited to, statements that this Agreement is in full force and effect without default, if such is the case, the remaining term of this Agreement, the levels of tax abatement in effect, and such other matters reasonably requested by the party(ies) to receive the Certificate.
- 33. Grundfos, as a party to this Agreement, shall be deemed a proper and necessary party in any litigation questioning or challenging the validity of this Agreement or any of the underlying ordinances, resolutions, or County actions authorizing same, and Grundfos shall be entitled to intervene in said litigation.
- 34. Pursuant to Texas Tax Code § 312.206, this Agreement is conditioned on Grundfos entering into a tax abatement agreement with the City of Brookshire, Texas in accordance with Texas Tax Code § 312.204. If Grundfos fails to enter into such agreement with the City of Brookshire, this Agreement will be deemed null and void.
- 35. Notices delivered hereunder shall be in writing and shall be delivered by personal delivery or certified mail, return receipt requested. Any notice or certification to be provided pursuant to this Agreement shall be delivered to the following persons, unless a substitute representative is designated in writing:

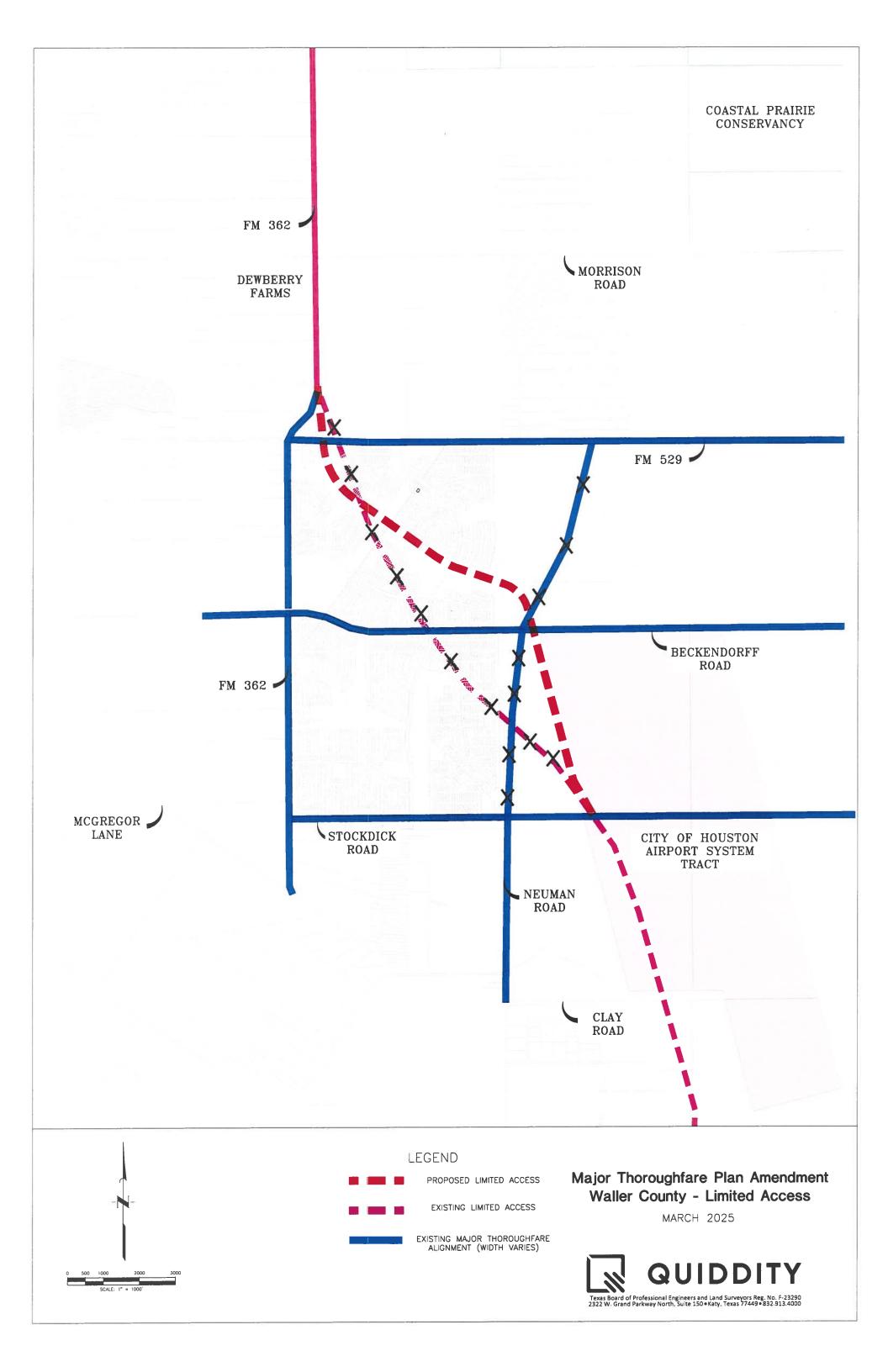

### MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

### Between

### DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY OF THE STATE OF TEXAS (DPS)

and

### Waller County Sheriff's Office (Allied Agency)

### GENERAL AGREEMENT

### A. Introduction and Statutory Authority

DPS and Allied Agency enter into this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) in order to maximize the effective utilization of commercial motor vehicle, driver, and cargo inspection resources; to avoid duplication of effort, to expand the number of inspections performed; to advance uniformity of inspections; and to minimize delays in schedules incurred by the industry inherent to this type of enforcement activity.

- 1. Due to the need for a basic delineation of routine responsibilities for the federal, state, county, and municipal agencies, it is agreed:
  - DPS will inspect vehicles operating over public highways and at carrier terminal facilities.
  - Allied Agencies must, as a routine practice, confine inspection activities to vehicles operating over public highways and city streets in their jurisdictions with the exception of municipal police officers certified under Tex. Transp. Code § 644.101. These certified municipal police officers may conduct vehicle inspections at carrier terminal facilities.
- The Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) has imposed timeliness and accuracy standards on DPS regarding interstate and intrastate motor carrier information. DPS, in turn, has established timeliness and accuracy standards for Allied Agencies engaged in the inspection of commercial motor vehicles (CMV).
- 3. Allied Agencies and their authorized inspection representatives (Program Coordinators) must implement procedures in accordance with the minimum standards in this MOU.
- 4. In order to advance uniformity in the inspection of CMV and their operators, Allied Agencies must adopt the Commercial Vehicle Safety Alliance's (CVSA) North American Standard Roadside Inspection Procedures and the North American Standard Out-of-Service Criteria as adopted by DPS under the following:
  - Tex. Transp. Code Ch. 644, located at <a href="http://www.statutes.legis.state.tx.us/">http://www.statutes.legis.state.tx.us/</a>;
  - 37 Tex. Admin. Code Chapter 4, Subchapter B; 37 Tex. Admin. Code Chapter 16, Subchapter A; and 37 Tex. Admin. Code Chapter 21 located at <a href="http://www.sos.texas.gov/tac/index.shtml">http://www.sos.texas.gov/tac/index.shtml</a>; and
  - The most current version of the CMV Enforcement Guidance Documents provided by DPS to the Allied Agencies:

### CVSA Levels of Inspection

- Level I North American Standard
- Level II Walk-a-round Inspection
- Level III Driver-Only Inspection
- Level IV Special Inspection
- Level V Vehicle-Only Inspection (Terminal)

The State of Texas has an inspection quality agreement with the FMCSA in its Commercial Vehicle Safety Plan. Inspections found to be non-compliant with this policy may be nullified by the DPS Motor Carrier Bureau (MCB) from the carrier's safety profile and from the inspector's certification record by the authority of the Assistant Division Director of the DPS Texas Highway Patrol (THP) or that person's designee.

If amendments to 37 Tex. Admin. Code Chapter 4, Subchapter B require amending this MOU, DPS will do so within a reasonable period of time. The date of any amendment under this paragraph will not affect the renewal date described in Section IV, unless otherwise indicated by DPS.

### II. DPS RESPONSIBILITIES

DPS will:

- A. Train, retrain (as necessary or desirable), test, and certify Allied Agency inspectors as per the agreement between DPS and the CVSA.
- B. Approve inspection forms for all inspections conducted in conformance with this MOU.
- C. Approve vehicle and driver out-of-service stickers.
- D. Supply CVSA decals on a cost-recovery basis to Allied Agencies.
- **E.** Supply software necessary for the data entry of all inspection information, on a cost recovery basis to Allied Agencies.
- F. Supply Allied Agencies with inspection data, upon request.
- **G.** Forward challenges of data in inspections or crash reports to Allied Agencies for their inspections.
- **H.** Conduct random in-person observation of inspections conducted by Allied Agency in order to ensure Allied Agency's inspectors maintain practical proficiency in the program.

### III. ALLIED AGENCY RESPONSIBILITIES

### A. Certification Testing

Allied Agency must:

 Enroll its commissioned, full-time officers who have not met the minimum certification requirements for enforcement of Tex. Transp. Code Ch. 644 in training programs required by 37 Tex. Admin. Code § 4.13(b) prior to using these officers as inspectors for commercial vehicle enforcement. Allied Agency must reimburse DPS for costs associated with any training provided by DPS under 37 Tex. Admin. Code § 4.13(b)(5).

- 2. Implement a program to ensure its officers perform the required number of inspection annually, as specified in 37 Tex. Admin. Code § 4.13(c), and successfully complete the required annual certification training to maintain certification. To further program goals and achieve the highest quality in inspections, Allied Agency must ensure its officers conduct more than the minimum number of inspections required annually to maintain certification and that inspections are evenly distributed throughout the year to maintain enforcement continuity.
- Immediately suspend from performing CVSA enforcement and inspections, any officer who
  fails to maintain certification or who fails to perform the required number of inspections
  following CVSA's North American Standard Uniform Inspection Procedures and the North
  American Standard Out-of-Service Criteria guidelines.
- 4. Send a representative to the annual MCSAP meeting held by DPS to ensure familiarity with all updated policies and procedures.

### B. Policies and Guidelines

Allied Agency must:

- 1. Conduct inspections only by using CVSA-certified officers.
- Only conduct inspections on-duty. No inspections may be performed at any time for the specific purpose of benefitting a carrier's safety profile whether on-site or off-site (such as a roadside or at an inspection facility). Compensation for inspections of any kind by other entities (including carriers and carrier employees) is prohibited.
- 3. Not use inspection as a pretext to search commercial vehicles.
- 4. Ensure traffic stops performed on a commercial vehicle are made by either a CVSA certified inspector or by a peace officer using probable cause or reasonable suspicion guidelines. An absence of these requisites will be cause for inspection report invalidation and a program participation review.
- 5. Use the most current forms approved by DPS during the inspection process. Forms and software may not be altered without the prior, written approval of DPS.
- Ensure that CVSA-certified inspectors have adequate tools and resources to conduct queries into motor carrier registration and operating authority while conducting roadside inspections.
- 7. Perform Level I, IV, and V inspections requiring undercarriage inspection and brake measurements utilizing an inspection pit or with a referring officer for safety.
- 8. Perform only Level V terminal inspections on motor coaches for certification purposes except for unusual circumstances (such as post-crash investigations). All other inspections must be conducted roadside. Level I, II, IV and V motor coach inspections must only be performed by Passenger Vehicle Inspection certified inspectors.
- Forward inspection data electronically to DPS within seven calendar days following the date of inspection for processing and final compliance using the most recent version of reporting software.

- 10. Forward crash reports involving commercial motor vehicles to Texas Department Transportation (TxDOT) no later than ten calendar days after the date of the crash investigation.
- 11. Allow DPS to conduct random in-person observation of inspections conducted by Allied Agency in order to ensure that Allied Agency's inspectors maintain practical proficiency in the program.
- 12. Not use its certification to enforce federal safety regulations as a primary method to generate program revenue through enforcement penalties, or to enhance criminal interdiction activities.
- 13. Not allow officers certified to enforce federal safety regulations to participate in secondary employment activities that present a conflict of interest related to their commercial vehicle enforcement duties. This prohibition includes Allied Agency officers trained by DPS that are no longer assigned to commercial vehicle enforcement units but remain employed by the Allied Agency.
- 14. Require all defects disclosed during the inspection process to be corrected.
- 15. Adopt the Recommended Out-of-Service Criteria and other defect repair verification procedures as developed by CVSA.
- 16. Honor CVSA inspection decals affixed to those vehicles by all authorized agencies. CVSA decals will be affixed to vehicles which pass the Level I or V CVSA inspection with no disqualifying violations under the North American Standard Roadside Inspection Procedures and the North American Standard Out-of-Service Criteria.
- 17. Maintain the official copy of all reports of inspections conducted by its CVSA certified inspectors for the current calendar year, plus two additional years. The official copy may be in paper or retrievable electronic form, and it must bear the signature of the commercial motor vehicles driver involved in the inspection. A copy must be provided to DPS upon DPS's request.
- 18. Conduct mock inspections and safety presentations as requested by the carrier and as approved by supervisors. Allied Agency may conduct safety presentations that include a mock (walk-around) inspection, but no documented inspection may be performed as part of a walk-around or safety presentation.
- 19. Note circumstances in the inspection report when more than two citations are issued during an inspection. An important aspect of the MCSAP is consistency in the inspection process and uniform enforcement. While it is recognized that uniform enforcement may include the issuance of a citation by the inspecting officer, it is also recognized that there may be exceptional occasions when the issuance of multiple citations may be warranted.
- 20. Document all violations (citations and warnings) discovered on the inspection report as violations, including violations of local ordinances. All CMV contacts must be recorded on the inspection report.

- 21. Investigate and determine whether a correction to data needs to be made when data in inspection or crash report is challenged. Allied Agency must notify the motor carrier and DPS in writing of the results of the investigation within ten calendar days. If a correction is necessary, the Allied Agency must make the correction and forward the corrected reports to DPS immediately. Retaliatory actions against motor carriers who file data challenges are strictly prohibited
- 22. Must notify DPS in writing ten calendar days any time an officer's certification status changes (is certified, suspended, or decertified for different types of inspections, or transfers out of the CVSA inspection program). A cumulative list of officers whose status has changed must be sent to DPS by January 31 of each year.
- 23. Must comply with the annual fiscal requirements mandated by TRC 644.102 in reporting the total amount of fines collected, actual enforcement program expenses and the remittance of mandated funds to the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts.

### IV. TERMINATION OF CERTIFICATION

### *** UNLESS RENEWED, THIS MOU WILL EXPIRE ON AUGUST 1, 2027.***

### A. Renewal of this MOU

To prevent a loss of authority to conduct CVSA inspections, please mail or FAX your renewal request to the Department no more than 60 nor less than 30 days prior to the expiration of this MOU. If the renewal has not been executed by the Allied Agency before the MOU expiration date, certified officers must cease performing all CVSA inspections, until the renewal has been fully executed.

### B. Decertification

- 1. DPS may decertify Allied Agency, or individual officers conducting inspections for Allied Agency, for failure to demonstrate practical proficiency in the program during random inperson observations by DPS, or by audits of inspections submitted.
- DPS may decertify Allied Agency, or individual officers conducting inspections for Allied Agency, for using the certification as a primary method of generating program revenue or enhancing criminal interdiction activities.
- 3. DPS may decertify Allied Agency, or individual officers conducting inspections for Allied Agency, if officers to engage in secondary employment activities that present a conflict of interest with their commercial vehicle enforcement duties.
- 4. DPS may decertify Allied Agency, or individual officers conducting inspections for Allied Agency, for failure to comply with the provisions of the MOU, training, officer certification, or data-sharing requirements, including the requirement that Allied Agency reimburse DPS for training expenses and the requirement that Allied Agency forward information and respond to requests in a timely manner, or any other provisions of 37 Tex. Admin. Code §§ 4.13 and 4.14. Reimbursement can be made by check or money order, payable to the Department of Public Safety of the State of Texas.

5. DPS may decertify Allied Agency for failure to comply with the annual fiscal requirements mandal by Tex. Transp. Code § 644.102. Allied Agency must properly report fines collected, actual expenses, and the amount of remittance sent to the State of Texas's Comptroller of Public Accounts.

### C. Termination of Certification

- Termination of certification, whether by decertification, request of Allied Agency, or by failure
  to renew, will result in the inability of Allied Agency, to retain expenses for any enforcement
  actions taken after the effective date of the termination of certification. All reporting
  requirements, including the list of officers suspended and no longer certified which is
  normally due by January 31 of each year, inspection data reports, and crash reports must be
  provided to DPS immediately upon discontinuation in the certification program.
- 2. Allied Agency may discontinue certification at any time by notifying DPS Program Coordinator in writing.
- 3. The CVSA and Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration require officers to complete a minimum number of inspections annually in order for officers to renew their certifications. The purpose of this requirement is to ensure officers achieve and maintain practical proficiency in inspecting commercial motor vehicles. Therefore, DPS will decertify Allied Agency, or individual officers conducting inspections for Allied Agency, for failure to report any inspections to DPS within a six-month period or for failure to evenly space the required number of inspections throughout the year.
- 4. Any Termination of Certification terminates Allied Agency's authority to enforce federal safety regulations under Texas Transp. Code Ch. 644, and Allied Agency's eligibility for reimbursement of expenses from penalties assessed. DPS will notify the program coordinator for Allied Agency and the Comptroller of Public Accounts in writing of any Termination of Certification.
- 5. DPS may issue a warning to Allied Agency if Allied Agency fails to conduct any inspections within a three-month period. DPS may also issue a warning if Allied Agency fails to comply with MOU requirements in such a way that DPS deems the quality or timeliness of inspection data could be compromised, or certified officers would fail to maintain practical proficiency in the program. Failure to correct the compliance issues within three months, or such other period as DPS may specify, can result in termination of the MOU and decertification of Allied Agency.
- 6. DPS may decertify the Allied Agency if the agency does not have a certified officer within one year of joining the MCSAP program and if an agency no longer has certified officers due to promotion, retirement, resignation or transfer they must certify an officer within one year of last officer's removal date.

### V. PROGRAM COORDINATORS

The parties' program coordinators are responsible for all communications and contacts required to manage this MOU. The parties must provide any updates regarding contact information within 30 calendar days. The current program coordinators for this MOU are:

### MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Between

### DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY OF THE STATE OF TEXAS (DPS)

and

### Waller County Sheriff's Office (Allied Agency)

### I. General Agreement

In accordance with Texas Transportation Code § 621.402, DPS has established parameters for approved Allied Agencies seeking to enforce Texas Transportation Code Chapter 621, Subchapter F. In order to maximize the uniform enforcement of statute, the parties enter into this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) regarding training, approved scale use, annual scale re-calibration standards, violation report requirements, and mandated annual reporting.

### II. DPS Responsibilities

In order to better implement and maintain the standards in this MOU, DPS will:

- 1. Train, retrain (as necessary or desirable), test, and certify the officers of any qualified Allied Agency.
- 2. Forward any weight enforcement complaints or challenges to the issuing Allied Agency.
- 3. Supply software necessary for the data entry of all inspection information on a cost recovery basis to Allied Agencies.

DPS may conduct random, in-person observation of weight enforcement inspections conducted by an Allied Agency in order to ensure that Allied Agency's officers are adhering to DPS certification standards.

### III. Allied Agency Responsibilities

### A. Certification Training

Allied Agency must enroll their commissioned, full-time officers in the 40 hour, Basic CVE course conducted at the direction of the DPS Motor Carrier Bureau. A commissioned officer must obtain 80% or better to become certified as a "weight enforcement officer." After initial certification, mandated re-certification training will take place following each legislative session. Weight enforcement officers must obtain 80% or better to maintain certification. DPS will immediately suspend any officer who fails to re-certify and Allied Agency must prohibit that officer from conducting or assisting with any weight enforcement activities.

Allied Agency may discontinue agency certification at any time by notifying DPS in writing. If a certified officer separates from an Allied Agency, Allied Agency must notify DPS within ten days.

### B. Application of Statute and Allied Agency Requirements

During the course of duty, an Allied Agency weight enforcement officer must adhere
to the "reasonable suspicion" requirements in weighing a commercial motor vehicle
as inferred by Transportation Code § 621.402. There must be an articulable reason
to detain a vehicle prior to utilizing any type of approved scale to determine actual
weight. A fixed location signaling all commercial traffic to enter a weight

- enforcement site is in direct conflict with this mandate.
- Allied Agency will only conduct weight inspections while an officer is on-duty. Allied
  Agency may not perform inspections at any time for the specific purpose of
  benefitting a carrier, whether onsite or offsite (such as a roadside or at a principal
  place of business). Compensation for weight inspections of any kind is prohibited.
- 3. Officers sent for training by the Allied Agency must be full-time employees of the Allied Agency carrying their TCOLE commission. Officers will not serve as weight enforcement officers or carry out weight enforcement duties for any other agency or elected county official (other than the Sheriff of the Allied Agency, where applicable) during the time they are employed and commissioned by Allied Agency.

### C. Approved Scales

Allied Agency must purchase and use scales from the approved Scale List found at the following URL: <a href="http://www.dps.texas.gov/cve/Publications/approvedScaleList.pdf">http://www.dps.texas.gov/cve/Publications/approvedScaleList.pdf</a>. Allied Agency must re-calibrate the approved scales during each calendar year by a certified scale technician or vendor. Allied Agency must retain all individual scale calibration records for the current year plus the two previous years. These records are subject to review during contested judicial proceedings or any DPS audit.

### D. Weight Inspection Reports & Upload

Allied Agency must purchase hardware and software to conduct weight inspections in order to upload the reports to DPS. Allied Agency may only issue DPS authorized weight inspection reports.

### E. Annual Reporting Requirements

Allied Agency must submit an annual report of its weight enforcement activities for each calendar year to DPS. Allied Agency must send the report to the Motor Carrier Bureau in Austin, Texas by January 31 of each year for the prior year's enforcement activities. The annual reporting requirements under this Section will survive the termination date of this MOU.

### F. Statutory Financial Reporting and Remittance Requirements

Allied Agency must comply with Transportation Code § 621.506(g) and report that data to DPS.

This includes: (1) sending the required 50 percent share to the State of Texas's Comptroller of

Public Accounts (CPA) if the fine meets the statutory criteria; and (2) only imposing the minimum

dollar fine unless the vehicle's weight was determined by a scale given or approved by DPS. DPS will confirm fiscal standing with CPA before renewing an MOU with Allied Agency.

### IV. Termination of Certification

### * * * UNLESS RENEWED, THIS MOU WILL EXPIRE ON AUGUST 1, 2027 * * *

To prevent a loss of authority to conduct weight enforcement inspections, please email DPS with your renewal request between the 60th and 30th day prior to the expiration of your current MOU. If the Allied Agency does not sign the renewal and mail it in to DPS before its current MOU expiration date, certified officers must cease performing all weight enforcement activities, until DPS receives the new fully executed MOU.

DPS may issue a warning to Allied Agency if Allied Agency fails to comply with MOU
requirements in such a way that DPS deems that the weight enforcement action being
taken is contrary to established training and statute. Failure to immediately correct any
compliance issue or comply with the required remittance of assessed fines to the
Comptroller of Public Accounts may result in the termination of the established MOU and
the decertification of Allied Agency.

2. DPS may decertify the Allied Agency if the agency does not have a certified officer within one year of joining the MCSAP program and if an agency no longer has certified officers due to promotion, retirement, resignation or transfer they must certify an officer within one year of last officer's removal date.

### V. Program Coordinators and Signatory Acceptance

Allied Agency's weight enforcement coordinators are responsible for all communications and contacts required to manage this MOU. The coordinators must provide any updates regarding contact information within 30 calendar days.

# INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICES BETWEEN WALLER COUNTY, TEXAS AND WALLER INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between WALLER COUNTY, TEXAS acting by and through its governing body, the Waller County Commissioners Court, and the WALLER INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT acting by and through its governing body, the Waller Independent School District Board of Trustees.

### RECITALS:

This Agreement is made pursuant to chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code, which authorizes contracts between counties and school districts for the performance of governmental functions and services, including police protection services;

The Waller Independent School District Board of Trustees is authorized by section 37.081 of the Texas Education Code to enter into a memorandum of understanding with a local law enforcement agency to provide school resource officers; and

The District desires to obtain the services of the Waller County Sheriff to provide law enforcement services at Fields Store Elementary School, Evelyn Turlington Elementary School, Jones Elementary School, and/or Waller High School in compliance with and furtherance of House Bill 3 of the 88th Texas Legislative Session.

**NOW THEREFORE,** the County and the District, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, do mutually agree as follows:

### **DEFINITIONS:**

Area: Collectively Fields Store Elementary School, Evelyn Turlington

Elementary School, Jones Elementary School, and/or Waller High School, the real property on which each school sits, and any property that is owned, leased, rented, or otherwise under control of the District, and

that is adjacent to said real properties.

**Board:** The Waller Independent School District Board of Trustees, the governing

body of the Waller Independent School District

Commissioners' Court: The governing body of Waller County, Texas

County: Waller County, Texas

District: Waller Independent School District

School Resource Officer: Has the meaning assigned by Occupations Code § 1701.601

Services: The law enforcement services provided by the Waller County Sheriff to

the Waller Independent School District under this Agreement.

**Sheriff:** The Sheriff of Waller County, Texas

### TERMS:

### I. TERM

1.1 The Services to be performed under this Agreement shall begin on August 1, 2025, and end on August 31, 2026. This Agreement may be terminated sooner in accordance with the provisions of Section IV.

### II. SERVICES

- 2.1 The County agrees to authorize the Sheriff to provide six (6) commissioned peace officers to devote seventy percent (70%) of their working time (defined below) to provide law enforcement services to the District as School Resource Officers. Each School Resource Officer shall be assigned to a school within the Area and shall remain at the assigned school daily during regular school hours, or in a location required by the performance of the Services. The Services include, but are not limited to: patrolling, preparing reports, appearing in court, investigating crimes, arresting persons, transporting suspects, protecting District property, protecting the safety and welfare of any person within the Area, and other duties detailed in Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated by reference. The School Resource Officers shall perform the Services during regular school hours. The Services do not include work performed during extracurricular events, or school functions that take place outside of regular school hours.
- 2.2 As used herein, the phrase "working time" is defined as the usual or normal hours that the Sheriff's officers are required to work in any calendar month, and does not include any extra or overtime work. The consideration for the law enforcement services provided herein includes a share of the costs to the County for such times when officers are not available to the District. Vacation and sick leave are earned through County service, and funeral leave is a benefit available to County employees. Therefore, "working time" shall not include vacation, sick leave, funeral leave or other county benefit leave. It is not anticipated that the Sheriff will authorize substitute officers to work within the Area when the regularly assigned officers are not available. The Sheriff will give notice or cause notice to be given each time an officer assigned to perform Services under this Agreement is anticipated to be absent or is absent for any reason to allow the District to respond appropriately. Such notice may be given to the affected school according to Exhibit C to this Agreement instead of as outlined in Section 5.1.
- 2.3 The Sheriff shall retain absolute control and supervision of the officers performing Services under this Agreement to the same extent that he does other officers. The District understands and agrees that this Agreement is not intended, nor shall it be construed, to obligate the Sheriff to assign officers to devote any portion of their working time to the District when, in the Sheriff's sole discretion, circumstances necessitate their assignment elsewhere. This includes but is not limited to circumstances related to officer funerals and natural disasters.
- 2.4 The District shall provide to the officers performing Services under this Agreement copies of the District's guidelines and policies relating to student absenteeism and implement any necessary related training.

The District shall neither request nor require the officers to take actions with respect to absent students that are not authorized by law. An officer who has probable cause to believe that a child is in violation of the compulsory school attendance law may take the child into custody for the purpose of returning the child to the child's school campus to ensure the child's compliance with compulsory school attendance requirements.

- 2.5 Law enforcement officers shall only be responsible for law enforcement duties that are identified in campus and district documents as required by Texas Education Code § 37.081(d). The District shall not assign or require law enforcement officers to perform routine student discipline, school administrative tasks, or to have contact with students unrelated to their law enforcement duties. The law enforcement officers' duties shall only relate to law enforcement intervention. The law enforcement officers shall not be tasked with behavioral or administrative duties better addressed by other District employees.
- 2.6 Law enforcement officers performing Services under this Agreement shall possess a school- based law enforcement proficiency certificate or obtain one within sixty (60) days of the officers' placement in the District, or on a campus of the District.
- 2.7 Law enforcement officers performing Services under this Agreement shall complete an active shooter response training program approved by the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement and as set forth in Texas Education Code Section 37.0812(a) which requires such training at least once every four (4) years.
- 2.8 The Board explicitly authorizes law enforcement officers performing Services to carry a weapon in the Area while performing Services under this Agreement.
- 2.9 Pursuant to Education Code§ 37.081 (a-1), the jurisdiction of the School Resource Officers performing the Services under this Agreement is determined by the Board, as shown by Exhibit B that is attached hereto and incorporated by reference.
  - 2.10 The Services shall be limited to those contained in this Agreement.

# III. CONSIDERATION FOR SERVICES

3.1 The District agrees to pay the County monthly installments of sixty-one thousand five hundred fifty-seven dollars and fifty cents (\$61,557.50) for the purposes of paying seventy percent (70%) of the full-time salary cost for six (6) law enforcement officers (including one (1) supervisor), equipping six (6) law enforcement officers, utilizing six (6) equipped law enforcement vehicles, and utilizing one (1) law enforcement K-9 for the duration of the contract of thirteen (13) months. This payment is in exchange for the Services provided by the Sheriff, and includes compensation for equipment, salaries, benefits, vacation, sick leave, and any additional expenses the County may incur in providing the Services under this Agreement. The District agrees to make payments on the total sum in installments, which are due and payable, without demand, on the following dates in the amounts set forth next to the dates:

The monthly installments are due and payable before 5:00 p.m. to the office of the County Treasurer. Payment may be made by electronic transfer to an account designated by the County. If the County or District is closed on any of the dates identified, payment must be made on the business day.

The first payment is due on August 20, 2025, or five (5) days after the District receives a fully executed copy of this Agreement from the County, whichever is later.

- 3.2 In addition to the monthly payments in Section 3.1 above, the District shall reimburse the County for:
  - a) any costs the County incurs related to training required by law or regulation for law enforcement officers who provide law enforcement at a school district, including but not limited to the required training under Texas Occupations Code 1701.263;
  - b) any costs the County incurs related to training that the District requests for law enforcement officers who provide Services under this Agreement; and
  - c) any overtime rate of the Officer if District requests that the Officer work overtime for reimbursement, pending both District and County approval of such work.
- 3.3 The payment for the Services is intended to compensate the County for the costs incurred as a result of the Agreement. The payment for the Services does not result in, and will not be construed as a profit to the County.
- 3.4 The District will notify the Sheriff and County in writing if it intends to make, or makes any payment or portion of a payment pursuant to this Agreement with any amount of grant funding, whether federal, state, or otherwise.

# IV. DEFAULT AND TERMINATION

- 4.1 Payment for Services is due on or before the date identified in Section 3.1. Failure to pay the full amount due on or before the specified date is a default.
  - 4.2 The District understands and agrees that if the County does not receive the monthly

payments within thirty (30) days of the date due, the County is authorized to terminate this Agreement without prior notice to the District. The County's failure to make demand for payments due is not a waiver of the District's obligation to make timely payment.

- 4.3 If the District defaults in the payment of any obligation hereunder, the District is liable to the County for an interest assessment of one percent (1%) on the unpaid amount. Interest shall thereafter compound monthly at one percent (1%) on unpaid amounts and interest assessments from the date of default until paid. This interest is in addition to any monies due for Services rendered hereunder. Interest on all past due amounts shall not exceed the maximum amount of nonusurious interest that may be contracted for, taken, charged, or received under law. Any interest in excess of that maximum amount shall be refunded. The District is also liable for attorney's fees and costs should the matter have to go to litigation for collection.
- 4.4 If the District is dissatisfied in any way with the performance of the County, the Sheriff or the officers under this Agreement, the District's sole remedy is termination under Paragraph 4.4, except that if at any time the District provides notice of documented concerns with an assigned officer, the Sheriff will, to the extent available, first work with the District to assign a different officer.
- 4.5 Either party may terminate this Agreement prior to the expiration of the term set forth in this Agreement, with or without cause, upon thirty (30) days prior written notice to the other party in conformity with Paragraph 5.1. The County will submit an invoice to the District showing the prorated amount due for the month in which termination occurs. The District agrees to pay the final invoice within ten (10) days of receipt. This Paragraph does not limit the County's right to terminate the Agreement under Paragraph 4.1.
- 4.6 If this Agreement is terminated at any time other than at the end of a contract month, the monthly installment or payment for such contract month will be prorated. The District will still be responsible for paying any other amount due under the contract, including interest under Paragraph 4.2.
- 4.7 In the event the Sheriff cannot or will not provide six (6) officers to devote seventy percent (70%) of their working time to performing Services for the District, the Sheriff must inform both the Commissioners' Court and the District. The notice to the District must be in writing and in conformity with Paragraph 5.1. If the Sheriff does not provide Services to the District at any time after giving said notice to the District, the County shall refund any amount prepaid by the District for Services that were not provided to the District.

#### V. NOTICE

5.1 Any written notice required to be given under the provisions of this Agreement shall be deemed served when the notice is deposited in the mail, enclosed in a wrapper with the proper postage prepaid thereon. The written notice must be sent by certified mail, return receipt requested. Written notice must be given to the following parties at the following addresses:

# VI. MERGER

6.1 The parties agree that this Agreement contains all of the terms and conditions of the understanding of the parties relating to the subject matter hereof. All prior negotiations, discussions, correspondence, and preliminary understandings between the parties, whether oral or in writing, are superseded by this Agreement.

#### VII. MISCELLANEOUS

- 7.1 This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas, without regard to its conflicts of laws provisions, and any dispute arising hereunder shall be heard by a court of competent jurisdiction in Waller County, Texas.
- 7.2 This Agreement may only be modified in a writing duly authorized the governing bodies of the County and the District, and signed by all parties.
- 7.3 Unless otherwise consented to and approved by Commissioners' Court, modifications to the Agreement that increase funding, personnel positions, or geographical area can only be approved on a quarterly basis, and the effective date must coincide with the beginning of a pay period. Agreement modifications that decrease funding, personnel positions or geographical area may be approved at a regularly scheduled meeting of Commissioners' Court, and the effective date must coincide with the end of a pay period, unless otherwise agreed to in writing by the parties.
  - 7.4 This Agreement shall commence on the last date of signature affixed hereto, after receiving

approval from the Waller County Commissioners' Court, the Waller Independent School District Board of Trustees, and the Sheriff.

- 7.5 To the extent any term or condition in the Agreement conflicts with applicable Texas law, such Agreement term or condition is void and unenforceable. If one (1) or more term or condition in the Agreement, or the application of any term or condition to any party or circumstance is held invalid, unenforceable, or illegal in any respect by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of the Agreement shall remain valid and in full force and effect.
- 7.6 Neither party may assign, transfer, sub-contract or delegate its rights and responsibilities under this Agreement to any other party, are not assignable and may not be delegated by any party.
- 7.7 TO THE EXTENT PERMITTED BY APPLICABLE TEXAS LAW, EACH PARTY SHALL SAVE AND HOLD HARMLESS THE OTHER PARTY, AND/OR THEIR OFFICIALS, OFFICERS, AGENTS, EMPLOYEES, REPRESENTATIVES, AND/OR DESGINEES FROM ANY AND ALL LIABILITY, ACTIONS, CLAIMS, DEMANDS, OR SUITS, INCLUDING ANY RELATED TO NEGLIGENCE, MISCONDUCT, WRONGFUL ACT(S), OR OMISSION(S), AND ALL RELATED COSTS, ATTORNEY FEES, AND EXPENSES ARISING OUT OF, RESULTING FROM, OR RELATED TO THE PERFORMANCE OF THE SERVICES.
- 7.8 Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to alter any reporting requirements required by law or regulation of school personnel and administrators, including those specified in Texas Education Code Chapter 37. Reports must be made as required by applicable law or regulation.
  - 7.9 Neither the County, the District, nor the Sheriff waives any immunity granted to it by law.
  - 7.10 This Agreement is not intended to inure to the benefit of third parties.
- 7.11 County, Sheriff, and their agents and employees are and at all times shall be deemed to be independent contractors of District. The Sheriff is wholly responsible for the manner in which he determines which Officer is assigned to the District. Nothing herein shall be construed as creating the relationship of employer and employee, or principal and agent, between District and County, District and Sheriff, or District and School Resource Officer, or any of County's or Sheriff's agents or employees. Neither County nor the Sheriff, or either of their agents and employees, shall be entitled to any rights or privileges of District employees and shall not be considered in any manner to be District employees. No term or provision of this Agreement or act of County, District, or Sheriff, or any of their agents or employees in the performance of this Agreement shall be construed as making any of County or Sheriff's agents or employees an employee of the District.
- 7.12 This Agreement may be executed in multiple counterparts, each having equal force and effect of an original.
