ISSUE SUMMARY

The Board of Park & Recreation Commission will be meeting on Monday, March 23, 2026, and will review 2026 Waupun Family Aquatic Center operating days. In regard to increasing pool staff wages to be competitive with neighboring pools, the attached plan reflects a shorter pool season, open for 72 days instead of 79 days. This plan would cost approximately the same as the original proposed budget of ~\$109,000. Horicon, Fox Lake, and Lomira pools are currently planning to close on August 16, 2026, as well, as they have seen a significant drop in patron attendance during that last week in August. Also, Waupun schools start school the week of August 24, 2026.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Accept the plan to stay within proposed budget and prevent staffing challenges due to the school year starting.

ATTACHMENTS: Operating plan from June 6- August 16 with staff wage increase.

RECOMMENDED MOTION:

Motion to set 2026 Waupun Family Aquatic Center operating days to open on June 6 and close on August 16 for the 2026 season with staff wage increases.

Electronic Message Center (EMC) Sign Policy

Purpose

The purpose of EMC signage is to provide timely and relevant information to residents, promote community engagement, and share announcements that serve the public interest. EMC signs are intended for community-related messages only and are not to be used for personal, political, or commercial promotion. This policy applies to the design, approval and content management of municipally owned EMC signage.

1. Eligible Messages

The sign may display messages related to:

- Community events, meetings, or programs open to the public
- Announcements from local government or recognized civic organizations
- Public safety or emergency notifications
- Community service opportunities
- Nonprofit or charitable events benefiting the community
- Seasonal greetings or community spirit messages approved by the governing body

The City reserves the right to suspend all messages and use EMC signage for emergency purposes when and if needed as determined by the Emergency Management Director.

2. Ineligible Messages

The following types of content will not be accepted:

- Commercial advertising or business promotions
- Political messages, campaign materials, or endorsements
- Personal messages (e.g., birthdays, anniversaries, memorials, etc.)
- Religious event promotions or doctrinal messages
- Content that is offensive, discriminatory, or violates local, state, or federal law
- Events and/or functions open only to members of an organization
- Any message not directly related to the community or approved organizations

3. Submission and Approval

- All message requests must be submitted through the Recreation Department
- Submissions must be received at least 15 days prior to the desired posting date.
- Messages will be reviewed for compliance with this policy.
- The City Administrator reserves the right to edit or decline any request.

4. Display Guidelines

- Messages will be displayed for a maximum of 10 days.
- Content may be shortened or reformatted to fit display requirements.
- Emergency or time-sensitive public safety messages will take priority.

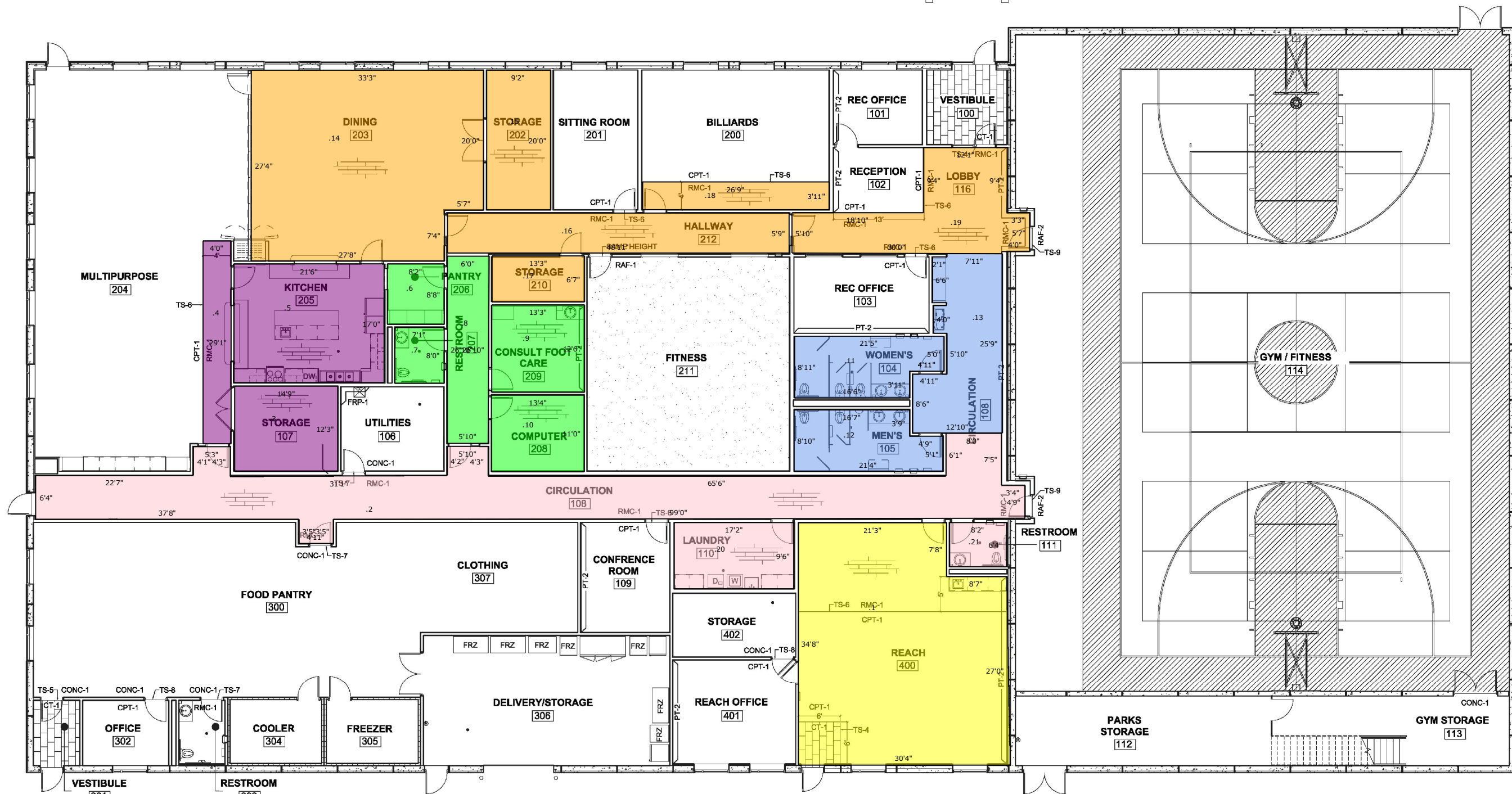

Ages: 7+ (Under 6 years old with a caregiver)

Dates: June 8 – August 14, 2026 (May cancel due to bad weather or staff availability.) **CLOSED Friday, July 3.**

What to Expect:

A City of Waupun Park Leader will be on-site to supervise and facilitate kids activities listed on calendar.

Fieldtrip: The fieldtrip is on Friday, June 26, 2026 to Waterworks Park & Beaver Dam Lake in Beaver Dam. We will rent canoes, kayaks and paddleboards, personal floatation devices to enjoy time on the water. There will also be time to play on the park playground. Permission slip and \$10 fieldtrip registration fee are needed to go on the fieldtrip.

Proper Playground Attire & Necessities:

- **Please dress your children comfortably.** Shorts and t-shirt are fine please dress to get messy! Your child will be active outdoors as well as participating in arts and crafts. We recommend shoes and socks.
- **Personal Items.** Please label everything with your child's name. Do not send valuables to Park Program activities. Send a backpack or other tote bag for their belongings.
- **Sunscreen.** Children will be outdoors and exposed to sun. Please apply sunscreen and send sunscreen to be reapplied during the day. Park leaders are not allowed to apply sunscreen for participants, but will remind children to reapply throughout the day.
- **Stay Hydrated.** Please encourage your child to bring a water bottle and drink plenty of fluids throughout the day.
- **Health.** Please keep your children home if they are sick. We realize that some children might have medication needs. Please know that staff cannot administer or hold any medications. Park leaders are CPR trained.

Playground Code of Conduct:

To ensure the enjoyment and a positive experience for everyone, the City of Waupun Recreation Department has established a "Code of Conduct" for the Park Program. Everyone is expected to be Safe, Responsible and Respectful by practicing the following:

- Be quiet and attentive when the Park Leader is providing instruction.
- Be responsible with equipment, including using the equipment for its intended purpose and putting the equipment away when finished.
- Be respectful by avoiding hitting, kicking, pushing and like behavior.
- Be courteous and use appropriate language.
- Be safe when playing and crossing the street.

Please take time to review the code of conduct with your child so everyone can have a safe and enjoyable summer! Note that the Summer Park Program is not a substitute for daycare. If a child has a behavior problem during the day, a program supervisor will be reaching out to talk with you about ways to resolve concerns. This may be necessary before your child is permitted back into the Park Program.

Weather:

In the case of bad weather, the Park Program will close. Rain, cold, severe weather warnings and watches will determine closure. Registered participants will be sent home and parents will be contacted. Weather related closures will be posted on Facebook (**Waupun Recreation Department**) and at www.cityofwaupun.org.

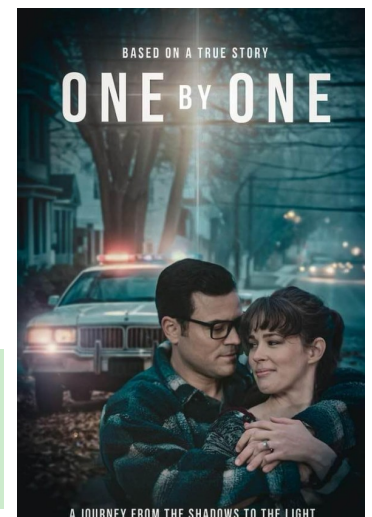
