PUBLIC HEARING

A. MPA-2023-04: The applicant is requesting an amendment to the Master Site Plan for Pod H. The request is limited to Parcel B, to modify the 2,572 square foot Bank with Drive through use to a Fast-Food Restaurant with Drive Through; Parcel C-3, to increase the allocation of Fast Food with Drive Through by 238 square feet to accommodate a minor increase in building area for Taco Bell; and Parcel F, to create three (3) sub-parcels identified on the master plan as Parcels F-1, F-2 and F-3. The subject Plaza is located west of Seminole Pratt Whitney Road on 50.826 acres.

Submitted By: Planning and Zoning

Mayor O'Connor introduced the item and asked for any staff presentations.

- Mr. Doody asked to first swear in any witnesses who were to testify.
- Mr. Leon, on behalf of the City gave a staff presentation.

Council discussed the item in further detail with the following applicants and staff; Osniel Leon, Kathryn Rossmell, Donaldson Hearing and John Carter. Mr. Carter gave a brief history of the City of Westlake to further educate council on the current matter.

Applicant presentation, presented by Kathryn Rossmell with Lewis, Longman and Wlaker, P.A., on behalf of Minto PBLH, LLC.

Council continued to discuss item.

Mr. Doody asked Mayor O'Connor to call for public comments.

<u>Public Comment - Alicia Torres - 5847 Whippoorwill Circle -</u> Ms. Torres asked what the name of the restaurant is that replaced the bank and she also asked for information on parcel F1.

<u>Public Comment - Mary Ellen Manning - 15780 Cresswind Place -</u> Ms. Manning advised Council to revisit the review of parcels and pods to limit drive-throughs to avoid issues in the long run.

<u>Public Comment – Ted Sarandis - 15780 Cresswind Place -</u> Mr. Sarandis asked Council to delay all amendments from the applicants and developers. Mr. Sarandis stated the City needs a sit-down restaurant and a bank, not more drive-throughs.

Council continued to discuss item and asked if it was possible to table the item.

Mr. Doody stated a motion to table the item does not entertain a discussion, if council wanted to continue to discuss the item, discussions must be made before the motion is made. Mr. Doody also stated if a motion to table the item is made, he asks the item to be tabled for a specific date, to not table indefinitely.

Council continued to discuss item.

Mr. Doody provided a procedural comment, noting that four council members are present, and a two-two vote would be a denial.

Council discussion continued addressing the inconsistencies in the application and possible remedies.

Mayor O'Connor called for a motion.

Motion by Vice Mayor Langowski to approve MPA-2023-04 as a fast casual with a drive-thru not as a bank and to clean up the application, Mayor O'Connor passed the gavel to Vice Mayor Langowski, and seconded the motion.

Councilman Werner called for a motion to table item for the next regular council meeting along with a special study session with the applicant and Minto present to discuss other development related issues that are in the background so everyone has better knowledge of what is possibly coming, the Mayor has his thumb on the pulse and he does not have that opportunity himself unless he learns it from the Mayor on how to do that, and he would like to hear from Minto and the developer prior to the first Tuesday in April.

Mr. Doody stated Councilman Werner must simplify the motion to table the item and if he wishes to call a workshop that would be a separate item.

Ms. Rossmell asked for clarification, noting procedurally the item was not approved and is now being moved to being tabled and asked to verify that the item is not denied, only tabled. Ms. Rossmell requested a three-minute recess.

Mayor O'Connor recessed the meeting at 7:37 PM.

Mayor O'Connor reconvened the meeting at 7:44 PM.

Ms. Rossmell requested reconsideration of the table and motion, noting for the record, that the application before Council is completely within the requirement of the Code and within staff approval and Council can waive the typo on the one page of the application. Ms. Rossmell further noted that a denial be preferred to allow an avenue forward for a lawsuit. Ms. Rossmell respectfully asked for the item to be removed from the table and reconsider the application.

Please find attached the March 2024 financial report. During your review, please keep in mind that the goal is for revenue to meet or exceed the year-to-date budget and for expenditures to be at or below the year-to-date budget. An overview of the City's funds is provided below. Should you have any questions or require additional information, please contact me at Steven.Fowler@inframark.com.

General Fund

- Total Revenues through March were approximately 86% of the annual budget. Collections of the FY2024 Ad Valorem Tax and Special Assessments were approximately 96% and 98%, repectively.
- Total Expenditures and Contingency through March were approximately 44% of the annual budget.

Special Revenue Fund – Housing Assistance Program

Total Revenues through March were approximately 165% of the annual budget, which was a
result of a higher than anticipated rate of construction and donations on commercial permits. A
donation of \$1,500 per Single Family Residence building permit is paid into the Housing
Assistance Program.

Special Revenue Fund – Comprehensive Planning Services

- Total Revenues through March were approximately 22% of the annual budget.
- Total Expenditures through March were approximately 39% of the annual budget.

DECLARING MAY 14-20, 2024 AS FLORIDA WATER REUSE WEEK

WHEREAS, safe, clean and sustainable water resources are essential to Florida's environment, economy, citizens, and visitors and

WHEREAS, although Florida's water supplies are finite, the state's population and need for water resources continues to increase; and

WHEREAS, water reuse provides a means for conserving and augmenting Florida's precious water resources and is key to the state's sustainable water future; and

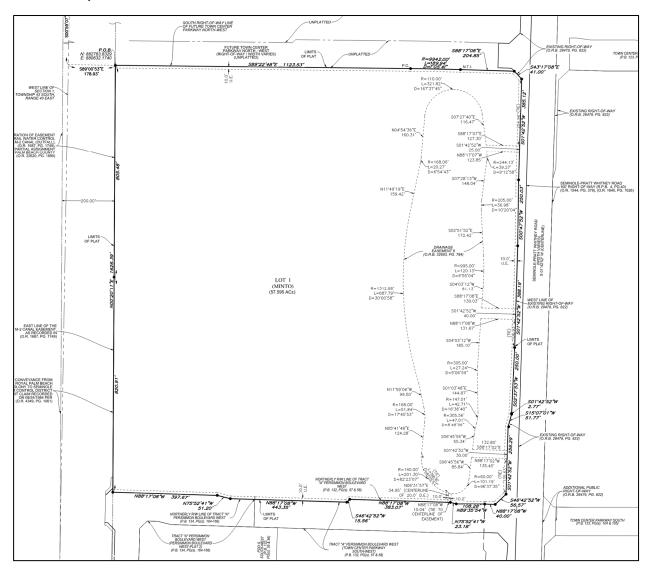
Discussion

Westlake Pod G – North will contain 57.595 acres of land. Westlake Pod G – North is located in the northern portion of Westlake, south of Pod E, southwest of Pod F, west of Pod L, and bounded by Town Center Parkway N and Town Center Parkway South, as shown in the graphics below. The primary access points to Westlake Pod G – North have yet to be determined and will be specified later with a site plan submittal. However, access is available through Town Center Parkway South and Town Center Parkway North.

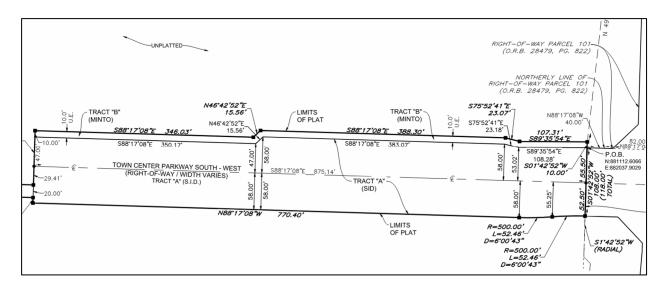


Figure 1. Image from Town Center Parkway South – West (P.B. 132, P.G. 57 – 58) showing the location of Tract "B" (MINTO).

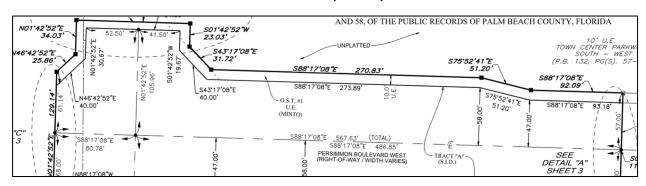


Figure 2. Image from Persimmon Boulevard West – Plat 2 (P.B. 134, P.G. 164 – 166) showing the location of O.S.T. #1 U.E. (MINTO).

Westlake Pod G – North is comprised of a portion of Section 1, Township 43 South, Range 40 East, City of Westlake, Palm Beach County, Florida, and being, in part, a replat of all of Tract "B", Town Center Parkway South – West, Plat Book 132, pages 57 and 58, and a portion of Open Space Tract #1, Persimmon Boulevard West – Plat 2, Plat Book 134, pages 164 through 166, inclusive, both of the Public Records of Palm Beach County, Florida. Images from the plats of Town Center Parkway South – West showing the location of Tract "B" and Persimmon Boulevard West – Plat 2 showing the location of O.S.T. #1 U.E. are shown in Figure 1 and Figure 2, respectively.

The Legal Description of the Plat can be found in Exhibit A, and replications of the plat and plat topographical survey can be found in Exhibits B and C.

Review Criteria

Plats shall be prepared in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 177 F.S., as amended, and the City of Westlake Land Development Regulations. The plat was reviewed for clarity, legibility, and conformance with this statute and City requirements. The plat provides a graphic depiction of the legal description through geometric data. The data includes but is not limited to parcel, block, tract, right-of-way, street and associated names, easement, permanent reference monuments and permanent control points, and interior excepted parcels. Other requirements such as paper size, line work, layout of sheet and required content including the subdivision name, title, legal description, key map, vicinity map, north arrow, scale, and legend are verified in the Engineering Department review.

Conclusion

Two (2) reviews of the plat occurred, which resulted in an acceptable plat. The review was done for compliance with Chapters 177, 5J-17, Florida Statutes, and the City of Westlake's codes and ordinances. All comments have been adequately addressed and the plat is in compliance. We therefore recommend that the plat be approved for recording.

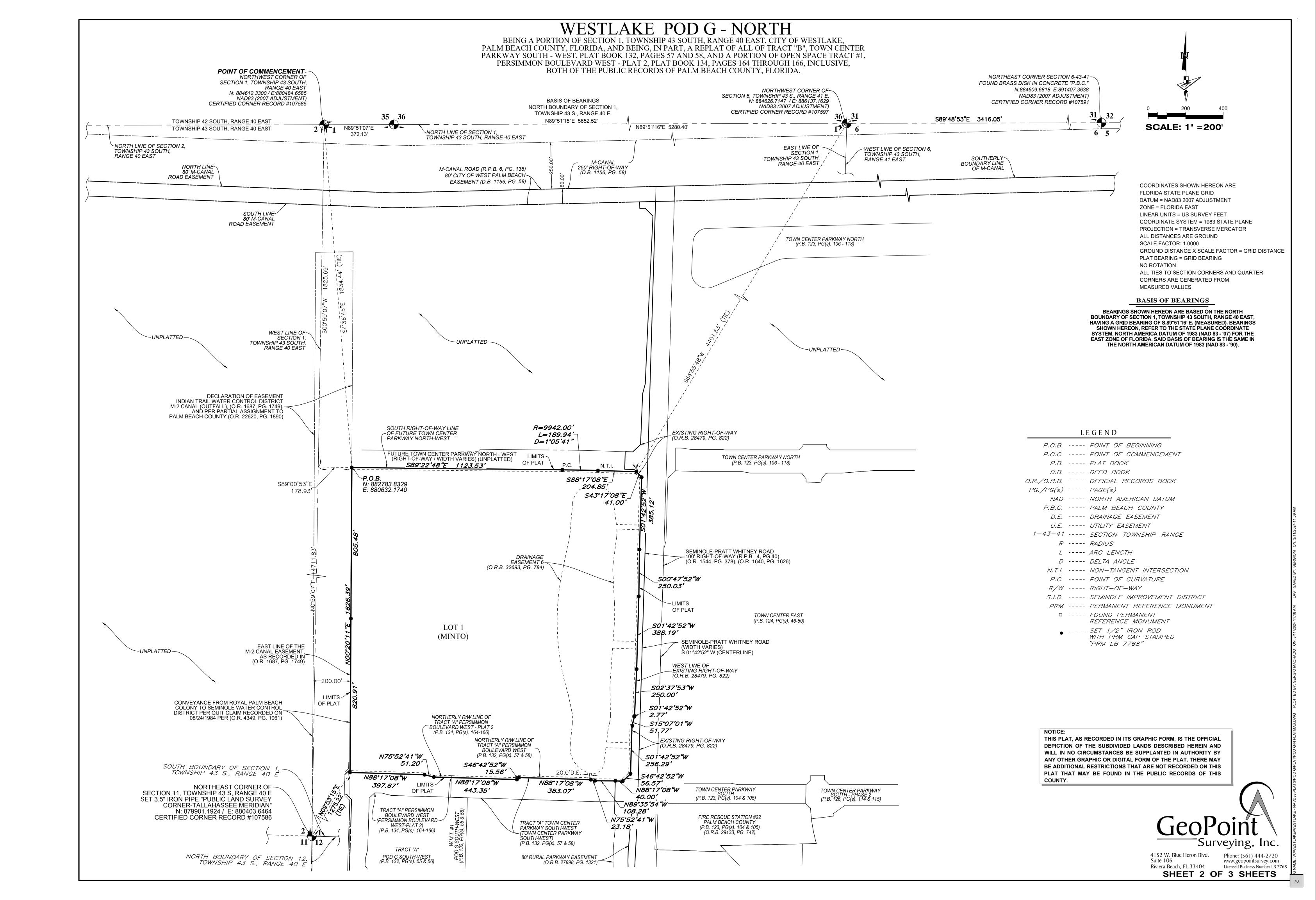

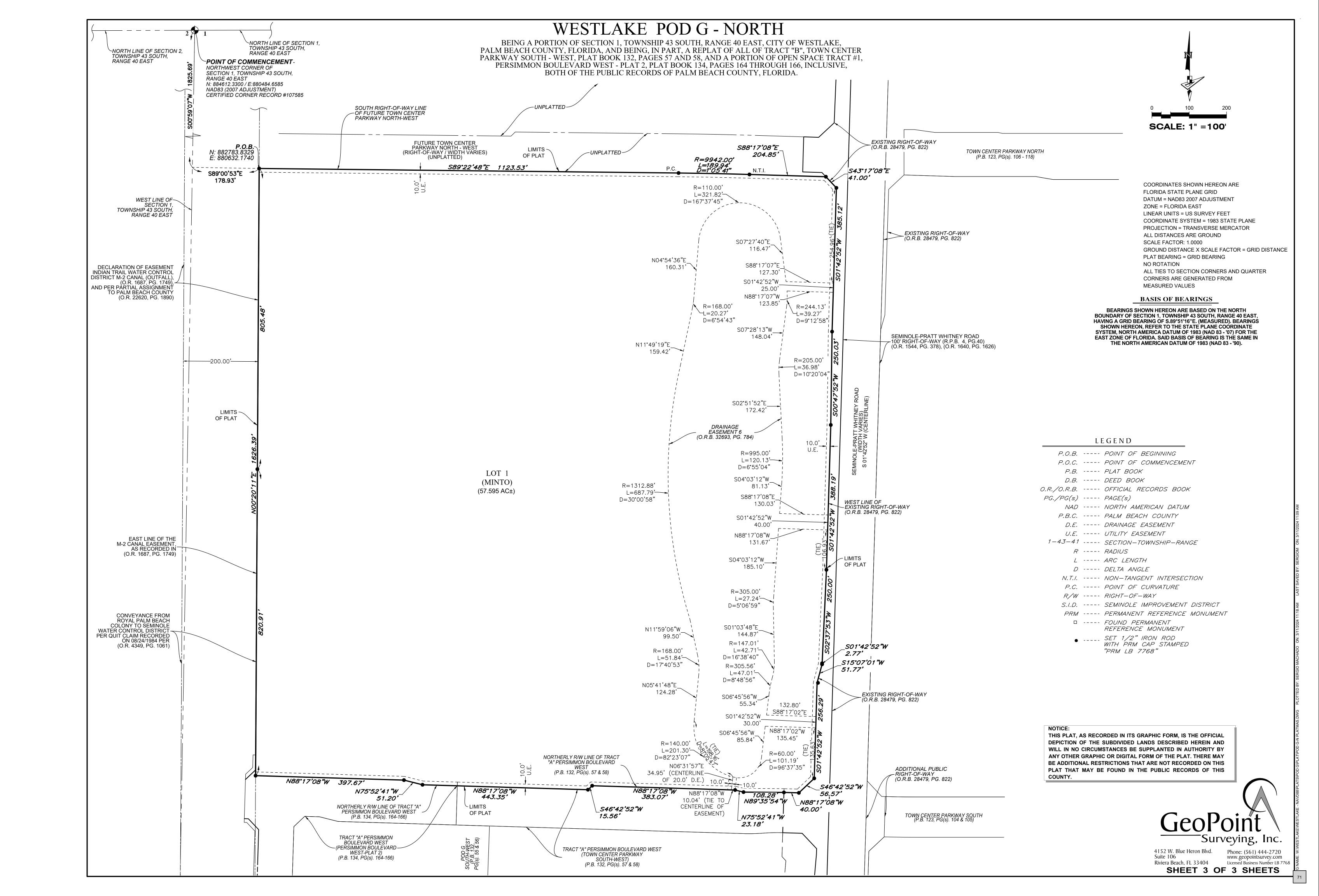

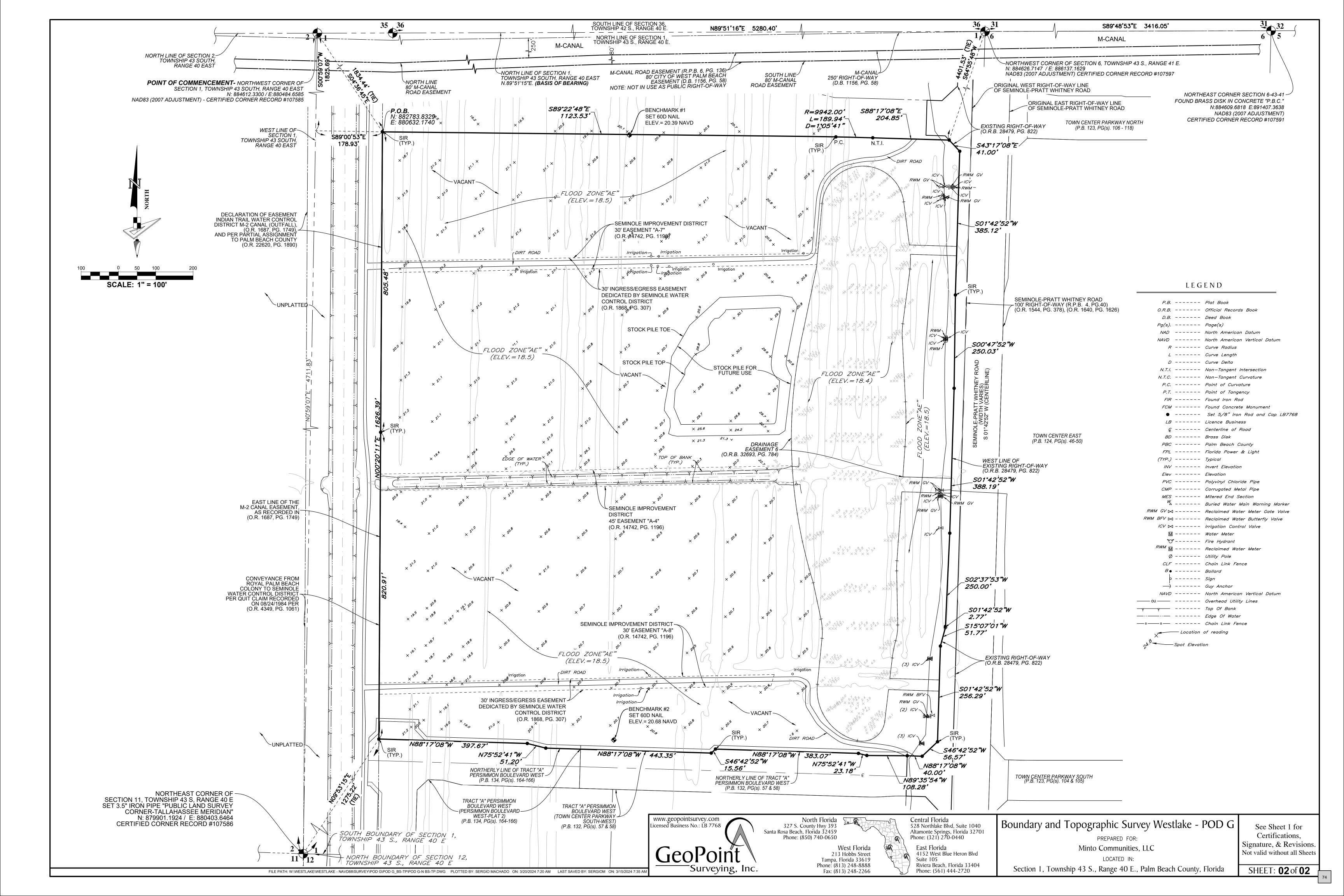

INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT

This Interlocal Agreement ("Agreement") is made on _______, 2024, between the City of Westlake, a municipality located in Palm Beach County, Florida ("Public Entity"), and Palm Beach County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida ("County"), each one constituting a public agency as defined in Part I of Chapter 163, Florida Statutes.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, Part I of Section 163.01, Florida Statutes, known as the "Florida Interlocal Cooperation Act of 1969" authorizes local governments to make the most efficient use of their powers by enabling them to cooperate with other localities on a basis of mutual advantage and thereby to provide services and facilities that will harmonize geographic, economic, population and other factors influencing the needs and development of local communities; and

WHEREAS, Part I of Chapter 163, Florida Statutes, permits public agencies as defined therein to enter into interlocal agreements with each other to jointly exercise any power, privilege, or authority which such agencies share in common and which each might exercise separately; and

WHEREAS, the Palm Beach County Commission on Ethics Ordinance (the Commission on Ethics Ordinance) permits the Commission on Ethics of Palm Beach County ("the Commission on Ethics"), subject to approval by the Board of County Commissioners, to negotiate agreements or memoranda of understanding with municipalities, special districts, and other public offices and entities, authorizing the Commission on Ethics to exercise any and all authority, functions and powers set forth in the Commission on Ethics Ordinance and the Lobbyist Registration Ordinance for the benefit of such Public Entity.

WHEREAS, Public Entity wishes to have the Commission on Ethics exercise such authority, functions, and powers for Public Entity's benefit.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual representations, terms, and covenants hereinafter set forth, the parties hereby agree as follows:

Section 1. Purpose

The purpose of this Agreement is to have the Commission on Ethics exercise the authority, functions and powers granted by the Commission on Ethics Ordinance as to Public Entity's operations.

Section 2. Representative/Monitoring Position

The County's representative/contract monitor during the term of this Agreement shall be Rhonda Giger, General Counsel, Palm Beach County Commission on Ethics, whose telephone number is (561) 355-1915.

The Public Entity's representative/contract monitor during the term of this Agreement shall be Public Entity's City Manager, Kenneth Cassel, whose telephone number is (954) 826-0056.

Section 3. Effective Date and Term

This Agreement shall be first executed by Public Entity and shall be retroactive and in effect as of February 2, 2024 and will remain in effect through February 2, 2027, subject to and upon approval and execution of this Agreement by the BCC. This Agreement will then be in effect for three (3) years. This Agreement may be terminated by either party, with or without cause, upon ninety (90) days written notice to the other party. Upon notice of termination by Public Entity, any ongoing Public Entity investigations being conducted by the Commission on Ethics pursuant to this Agreement shall continue until completed.

Section 4. Responsibilities and Duties

The Commission on Ethics shall exercise any and all authority, functions and powers provided for in the Commission on Ethics Ordinance, the Code of Ethics Ordinance, and the Lobbyist Registration Ordinance as set forth in the Palm Beach County Code of Ordinances as may be amended or revised, in regard to Public Entity's operations.

Those functions, authority and powers include, but are not limited to, the following:

- (A) The Commission on Ethics shall have the authority to: (1) review, interpret, render advisory opinions and enforce the Code of Ethics, (2) investigate legally sufficient complaints within the jurisdiction of the Commission on Ethics and conduct public hearings as provided by the Commission on Ethics ordinance; and (3) develop and deliver, training programs and ensure that effective and meaningful training experiences are delivered in a timely and efficient manner.
- (B) The Commission on Ethics shall have the power to conduct investigations, and receive full and unrestricted access to the records of the Public Entity, all elected and appointed Public Entity officials and employees, Public Entity departments, divisions, agencies and instrumentalities, contractors and other persons and entities doing business with the Public Entity and/or receiving Public Entity funds regarding any such contracts or transactions with the Public Entity.

- (C) In the case of a refusal to obey a request for documents or for an interview, the Commission on Ethics shall have the power to subpoena witnesses, administer oaths, and require the production of records in a manner consistent with §162.08 Florida Statutes. The Commission on Ethics shall not interfere with any ongoing criminal investigation or prosecution of the State Attorney or the U.S. Attorney for the Southern District of Florida.
- (D) Where the Commission on Ethics suspects a possible violation of any state, federal or local law, or rule, regulation or policy, the Executive Director or designee shall notify the appropriate civil, criminal or administrative agencies. In the case of a possible violation of a rule, regulation or policy governing a Public Entity employee, the Executive Director or designee shall also notify the city manager of the Public Entity.
- (E) The Commission on Ethics shall have the power to require officials and employees to participate in ethics training on a regular basis. The administrator of the public entity shall establish by policy a mandatory training schedule for all officials and employees, which shall include mandatory periodic follow-up sessions. The commission on ethics shall develop and deliver, or contract with other entities to develop and deliver, training programs. The commission on ethics shall coordinate and cooperate with the public entity to ensure that effective and meaningful training experiences are delivered in a timely and efficient manner.
- (F) The Commission on Ethics' "hotline" will receive complaints related to Public Entity operations. The Public Entity will support and assist the Commission on Ethics in publicizing the "hotline" and encouraging the reporting of ethics violations by local citizens, officials and employees.
- (G) The Commission on Ethics may exercise any of the powers contained in the Commission on Ethics Ordinance upon its own initiative.
- (H) All records held by the Commission on Ethics and its staff related to an active preliminary investigation are confidential and exempt from disclosure in a manner consistent with the provisions in §112.3188(2) and §112.324, Florida Statutes.
- (I) The Commission on Ethics and its staff shall be considered "an appropriate local official" of the Public Entity for purposes of whistleblower protection provided by §112.3188(1), Florida Statutes.

- (J) The Commission on Ethics may recommend remedial actions and may provide prevention and training services to Public Entity officials, employees, and any other persons covered by this Agreement. The Commission on Ethics may follow up to determine whether recommended remedial actions have been taken.
- (K) The Commission on Ethics shall monitor the costs of investigations undertaken. The Commission on Ethics shall cooperate with other governmental agencies to recover restitution from other entities involved in willful misconduct in regard to Public Entity funds.
- (M) As part of its obligation under this Agreement, Public Entity's staff will in all instances cooperate fully with Commission on Ethics staff regarding issues of staff and vendor training and in timely providing records requested by staff investigators.
- (N) In any case in which the Commission on Ethics determines that the complaining party filed a frivolous or groundless complaint as defined in §57.105 Florida Statutes, or a complaint with malicious intent and with the knowledge that the complaint contains material false allegations, the commission shall order the complaining party to pay any costs and attorney's fees incurred by the commission and/or the alleged violator.
- (O) The Commission on Ethics will maintain a website and all required databases including gift reports, voting conflict disclosures, outside employment waivers, complaints, letters of instruction/reprimand, final orders, and advisory opinions.

<u>Section 5</u>. Funding and Budgeting by Public Entity

Under this Agreement, all costs associated with the duties and responsibilities of the Commission on Ethics are funded by The Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners. County funding shall include all staff services and other resources to be provided in furtherance of this Agreement. However, the County's performance and obligation to pay under this Agreement for subsequent fiscal years is contingent upon annual appropriations for its purpose by the Board of County Commissioners.

<u>Section 6</u>. Delegation of Duty

Nothing contained herein shall be deemed to authorize the delegation of the constitutional or statutory duties of state, county, or municipal officers.

<u>Section 7</u>. Liability

The parties to this Agreement and their respective officers and employees shall not be deemed to assume any liability for the acts, omissions, and negligence of the other party. Further, nothing

herein shall be construed as a waiver of sovereign immunity by either party, pursuant to Section 768.28, Florida Statutes.

Section 8. Controlling Law

This Agreement shall be interpreted and construed according to, and governed by, the laws of the State of Florida. Any and all legal action necessary to enforce the Agreement will be held in Palm Beach County.

Section 9. Remedies

No remedy herein conferred upon any party is intended to be exclusive of any other remedy, and each and every such remedy shall be cumulative and shall be in addition to every other remedy given hereunder or now or hereafter existing at law or in equity or by statute or otherwise. No single or partial exercise by any party of any right, power, or remedy hereunder shall preclude any other or further exercise thereof.

<u>Section 10</u>. Severability

In the event any term or provision of this Agreement is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be illegal or otherwise invalid, such provision shall be construed or deleted and shall not affect the remaining portions of this Agreement and the remainder shall be construed to be in full force and effect.

Section 11. Notice and Point of Contact

All notices required to be given under this Agreement shall be deemed sufficient to each party when delivered by United States Mail, by hand delivery, or by overnight delivery service to the point of contact. For purposes of fulfilling the duties and responsibilities of this Agreement, the points of contact will be as follows:

Section 12. Filing

A copy of this Agreement shall be filed with the Clerk of the Circuit Court in and for Palm Beach County.

Section 13. Time of the Essence

The parties expressly agree that time is of the essence in this Agreement and the failure by a party to complete performance within the time specified, or within a reasonable time if no time is specified herein, shall, at the option of the other party without liability, in addition to any other rights or remedies, relieve the other party of any obligation to accept such performance.

Section 14. Equal Opportunity Provision

Commission on Ethics and Public Entity agree that no person shall, on the grounds of race, color, religion, sex, age, national origin, ancestry, marital status, sexual orientation, gender identity and expression, or disability be excluded from the benefits of, or be subjected to any form of discrimination under any activity carried out by the performance of this Agreement.

Section 15. Captions

The captions and section designations herein set forth are for convenience only and shall have no substantive meaning.

Section 16. Entirety of Agreement

This Agreement represents the entire understanding between the parties, and supersedes all other negotiations, representations, or agreements, written or oral, relating to this Agreement.

Code of Ethics

(Effective Date July 1, 2021)

Sec. 2-441. Title; statement of purpose.

This article shall be known as the Palm Beach County Code of Ethics. This code of ethics is enacted pursuant to Florida Constitution, Article VIII, section 1(g), Florida Statutes, Ch. 125, and the Charter of Palm Beach County. The Municipalities located within Palm Beach County are subject to the provisions of this code of ethics pursuant to referendum. The purpose of this code is to provide additional and more stringent ethics standards as authorized by Florida Statutes, §112.326. This code shall not be construed to authorize or permit any conduct or activity that is in violation of Florida Statutes, Ch. 112, pt. III. This code of ethics shall be deemed additional and supplemental to any and all state and federal laws governing ethical conduct of officials and employees, as well as all local laws, rules, regulations and policies.

Officials and employees in the public service shall be conscious that public service is a public trust, shall be impartial and devoted to the best interests of the people of Palm Beach County, and shall act and conduct themselves so as not to give occasion for distrust of their impartiality.

Nothing herein shall abridge employees' constitutional right to collective bargaining.

(Ord. No. 2011-011, §1(Exh. 1), 5-17-11)

Sec. 2-442. Definitions.

The following words, terms, and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning, or where expressly provided herein to the contrary:

Advisory board shall mean any advisory or quasi-judicial board created by the board of county commissioners, by the local municipal governing bodies, or by the mayors who serve as chief executive officers or by mayors who are not members of local municipal governing bodies.

Customer or **client** means any person or entity to which an official or employee's outside employer or business has supplied goods or services during the previous twenty-four (24) months, having, in the aggregate, a value greater than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000).

Domestic partner is an adult, unrelated by blood, with whom an unmarried or separated official or employee has an exclusive committed relationship and maintains a mutual residence.

Financial benefit includes any money, service, license, permit, contract, authorization, loan, travel, entertainment, hospitality, gratuity, or any promise of any of these, or anything else of value. This term does not include campaign contributions authorized by law.

Gift shall refer to the transfer of anything of economic value, whether in the form of money, service, loan, travel, entertainment, hospitality, item or promise of these, or in any other form, without adequate and lawful consideration. Food and beverages consumed at a single setting or a meal shall be considered a single gift, and the value of the food and beverage provided at that sitting or meal shall be considered the value of the gift. In determining the value of the gift, the recipient of the gift may consult, among other sources, Florida Statutes, §112.3148, and the Florida Administrative Code as may be amended.

Household member includes anyone whose primary residence is in the official or employee's home, including non-relatives who are not renters or employees of the head of the household.

Inspector general shall mean the office established in article XII of this chapter.

Lobbying shall mean seeking to influence a decision through oral or written communication or an attempt to obtain the goodwill of any county commissioner, any member of a local municipal governing body, any mayor or chief executive officer that is not a member of a local municipal governing body, any advisory board member, or any employee with respect to the passage, defeat or modification of any item which may foreseeably be presented for consideration to the advisory board, the board of county commissioners, or the local municipal governing body lobbied as applicable.

Lobbyist shall mean any person who is employed and receives payment, or who contracts for economic consideration, or who registers in the county's central lobbyist registration database or with any municipality, for the purpose of lobbying on behalf of a principal, and shall include an employee whose principal responsibility to the employer is overseeing the employer's various relationships with government or representing the employer in its contacts with government.

"Lobbyist" shall not include:

- (1) Any employee, contract employee, or independent contractor of a governmental agency or entity lobbying on behalf of that agency or entity, any elected local official when the official is lobbying on behalf of the governmental agency or entity which the official serves, or any member of the official's staff when such staff member is lobbying on an occasional basis on behalf of the governmental agency or entity by which the staff member is employed.
- (2) Any person who is retained or employed for the purpose of representing an employer, principal or client only during a publicly noticed quasi-judicial hearing or comprehensive plan hearing, provided the person identifies the employer, principal or client at the hearing, and providing that the person is not otherwise registered as a lobbyist in the county's central lobbyist registration database, or with any municipal lobbyist registration system when that municipality has its own lobbyist registration process.
- (3) Any expert witness who is retained or employed by an employer, principal or client to provide only scientific, technical or other specialized information provided in agenda materials or testimony only in public hearings, so long as the expert identifies the employer, principal or client at the hearing.
- (4) Any person who lobbies only in his or her individual capacity for the purpose of self-representation and without compensation.
- (5) Any employee, contract employee, or independent contractor of the Palm Beach County League of Cities, Inc., lobbying on behalf of that entity.

Official or employee means any official or employee of the county or the municipalities located within the county, whether paid or unpaid. The term "employee" includes but is not limited to all managers, department heads, and personnel of the county or the municipalities located within the county. The term also includes volunteers of the county or the municipalities located within the county when such volunteers exercise discretionary police, fire, or parking enforcement department authority. The term "employee" also includes the chief executive officer of the county or any municipality, who is not part of the local governing body. If the county or municipality utilizes and contracts for "privatized" chief administrative officers or chief executive officers, then the person providing such

services, or the officers, directors, and employees of any entity providing such services, shall be considered the employees of the county or municipality that he or she serves. However, it shall not include local government attorneys as defined in Florida Statutes § 112.313, or attorneys who render contracted services to the county or municipality that are limited in scope to a specific issue or subject, to specific litigation, or to a specific administrative proceeding. The term "official" shall mean members of the board of county commissioners, a mayor, members of local municipal governing bodies, and members appointed by the board of county commissioners, members of local municipal governing bodies or mayors or chief executive officers that are not members of local municipal governing body, as applicable, to serve on any advisory, quasi-judicial, or any other board of the county, state, or any other regional, local, municipal, or corporate entity.

Outside employer or business includes:

- (1) Any entity, other than the county, the state, or any other federal, regional, local, or municipal government entity, of which the official or employee is a member, official, director, proprietor, partner, or employee, and from which he or she receives compensation for services rendered or goods sold or produced. For purposes of this definition, "compensation" does not include reimbursement for necessary expenses, including travel expenses; or
- (2) Any entity located in the county or which does business with or is regulated by the county or municipality as applicable, in which the official or employee has an ownership interest. For purposes of this definition, an "ownership interest" shall mean at least five (5) percent of the total assets or common stock owned by the official or employee or any combination of the official or employee's household members, spouse, child, step-child, brother, sister, parent or step-parent, or a person claimed as a dependent on the official or employee's latest individual federal tax return.
- (3) The term outside employer or business shall not apply to an employee who is employed by a certified bargaining agent solely to represent employees.

Palm Beach County Commission on Ethics means the commission established in section 2-254 et seq. to administer and enforce the ethics regulations set forth herein, and may also be referred to as the "commission on ethics" in this article.

Persons and entities shall be defined to include all natural persons, firms, associations, joint ventures, partnerships, estates, trusts, business entities, syndicates, fiduciaries, corporations, and all other organizations.

Principal shall mean the person or entity a lobbyist represents, including a lobbyist's employer, for the purpose of lobbying.

Relative unless otherwise specified in this article, means an individual who is related to an official or employee as father, mother, son, daughter, brother, sister, uncle, aunt, first cousin, nephew, niece, husband, wife, father-in-law, mother-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, stepfather, stepmother, stepson, stepdaughter, stepbrother, stepsister, half-brother, half-sister, grandparent, great grandparent, grandchild, great grandchild, step grandparent, step great grandparent, step grandchild, step great grandchild, person who is engaged to be married to the official or employee or who otherwise holds himself or herself out as or is generally known as the person whom the official or employee intends to marry or with whom the official or employee intends to form a household, or any other natural person having the same legal residence as the official or employee.

Transaction shall refer to the purchase or sale by the county or municipality of goods or services for a consideration.

Vendor means any person or entity who has a pending bid proposal, an offer or request to sell goods or services or to sell or lease real or personal property, or who currently sells goods or services, or sells or leases real or personal property to the county or municipality involved in the subject contract or transaction as applicable. For the purposes of this definition, a vendor entity includes an owner, director, manager or employee. Currently sells goods or services shall mean the period of time of an actual transaction or contract between a vendor and the government entity if such transaction or contract exceeds \$500. Where no formal contract exists for the sale or lease of goods and services, it shall include the period of time from the point the government entity orders or otherwise agrees to purchase goods and services from a vendor, to the point that all obligations on the part of both the vendor and the government entity have been satisfied by delivery of the goods and/or services by the vendor, and payment has been received for those goods and services by the vendor, and where no other obligations by either party concerning the purchase of the goods and/or services remain unsatisfied. However, it shall not include any warranty period provided by the vendor once payment for the goods and services has been received and the goods and services have been delivered, even where an obligation to provide warranty service on the part of the vendor shall exist.

Sec. 2-443. Prohibited conduct.

- (a) Misuse of public office or employment. An official or employee shall not use his or her official position or office, or take or fail to take any action, or influence others to take or fail to take any action, or attempt to do any of these things, in a manner which he or she knows or should know with the exercise of reasonable care will result in a special financial benefit, not shared with similarly situated members of the general public, for any of the following persons or entities:
 - (1) Himself or herself;
 - (2) His or her spouse or domestic partner, household member or persons claimed as dependents on the official or employee's latest individual federal income tax return, or the employer or business of any of these people;
 - (3) A sibling or step-sibling, child or step-child, parent or step-parent, niece or nephew, uncle or aunt, or grandparent or grandchild of either himself or herself, or of his or her spouse or domestic partner, or the employer or business of any of these people;
 - (4) An outside employer or business of his or hers, or of his or her spouse or domestic partner, or someone who is known to such official or employee to work for such outside employer or business;
 - (5) A customer or client of the official or employee's outside employer or business;
 - (6) A substantial debtor or creditor of his or hers, or of his or her spouse or domestic partner— "substantial" for these purposes shall mean at least ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) and shall not include forms of indebtedness, such as a mortgage and note, or a loan between the official or employee and a financial institution;
 - (7) A civic group, union, social, charitable, or religious organization, or other organization of which he or she (or his or her spouse or domestic partner) is an officer or director. However, this sub-section shall not apply to any official or employee who is required to serve on the board of directors of any organization solely based on his or her official position (ex-officio), regardless of whether he or she has

- voting rights on the board, and who receives no financial compensation for such service on the board of directors, and otherwise has no personal ownership interest in the organization.
- (b) *Corrupt misuse of official position.* An official or employee shall not use or attempt to use his or her official position or office, or any property or resource which may be within his or her trust, to corruptly secure or attempt to secure a special privilege, benefit, or exemption for himself, herself, or others. For the purposes of this subsection, "corruptly" means done with a wrongful intent and for the purpose of obtaining, or compensating or receiving compensation for, any benefit resulting from some act or omission of an official or employee which is inconsistent with the proper performance of his or her public duties.
- (c) *Disclosure of voting conflicts.* County and municipal officials as applicable shall abstain from voting and not participate in any matter that will result in a special financial benefit as set forth in subsections (a)(1) through (7) above. The term "participate" as used in this section shall be defined as: "To take any action, or to influence others to take any action, or to attempt to do any of these things, in order to affect the passage or defeat of the specific matter before the voting body in which the official is required to abstain from voting." The official shall publicly disclose the nature of the conflict and when abstaining from the vote, shall complete and file a State of Florida Commission on Ethics Conflict Form 8B pursuant to the requirements of Florida Statutes, §112.3143. Simultaneously with filing Form 8B, the official shall submit a copy of the completed form to the county commission on ethics. Officials who abstain and disclose a voting conflict as set forth herein, shall not be in violation of subsection (a), provided the official does not otherwise use his or her office to take or fail to take any action, or influence others to take or fail to take any action, in any other manner which he or she knows or should know with the exercise of reasonable care will result in a special financial benefit, not shared with similarly situated members of the general public, as set forth in subsections (a)(1) through (7).
- (d) Contractual relationships. No official or employee shall enter into any contract or other transaction for goods or services with his or her respective county or municipality. This prohibition extends to all contracts or transactions between the county or municipality as applicable or any person, agency or entity acting for the county or municipality as applicable, and the official or employee, directly or indirectly, or the official or employee's outside employer or business. Any such contract, agreement, or business arrangement entered into in violation of this subsection may be rescinded or declared void by the board of county commissioners pursuant to section 2-448(c) or by the local municipal governing body pursuant to local ordinance as applicable. This prohibition shall not apply to employees who enter into contracts with Palm Beach County or a municipality as part of their official duties with the county or that municipality. This prohibition also shall not apply to officials or employees who purchase goods from the county or municipality on the same terms available to all members of the public. This prohibition shall also not apply to advisory board members provided the subject contract or transaction is disclosed at a duly noticed public meeting of the governing body and the advisory board member's board provides no regulation, oversight, management, or policy-setting recommendations regarding the subject contract or transaction.
- (e) Exceptions and waiver. The requirements of subsection (d) above may be waived as it pertains to advisory board members where the advisory board member's board is purely advisory and provides regulation, oversight, management, or policy-setting recommendations regarding the subject contract or transaction. No waiver shall be allowed where the advisory board member's board is not purely advisory and provides regulation, oversight, management, or policy-setting recommendations regarding the subject contract or

transaction. Waiver may be effected by the board of county commissioners or by the local municipal governing body as applicable upon full disclosure of the contract or transaction prior to the waiver and an affirmative vote of a majority plus one (1) of the total membership of the board of county commissioners or the local municipal governing body as applicable. In instances in which appointment to the advisory board is made by an individual, waiver may be effected, after full disclosure of the contract or transaction at a public hearing, by the appointing person. In addition, no official or employee shall be held in violation of subsection (d) if:

- (1) The business is awarded under a system of sealed, competitive bidding to the lowest bidder and:
 - a. The official or employee, or his or her relative or household member, has in no way participated in the determination of the bid specifications or the determination of the lowest bidder;
 - b. The official or employee, or his or her relative or household member, has in no way used or attempted to use the official or employee's influence to persuade the agency, governmental entity or any personnel thereof to enter such a contract other than by the mere submission of the bid; and
 - c. The official or employee, prior to or at the time of the submission of the bid, has filed a statement with the supervisor of elections and the commission on ethics, disclosing the nature of the interest in the outside employer or business submitting the bid.
- (2) An emergency purchase or contract, which would otherwise violate a provision of subsection (d), must be made in order to protect the health, safety, or welfare of the citizens of the county or municipality as applicable.
- (3) The outside employer or business involved is the only source of supply within the county or municipality under applicable law or county or municipal policy, and there is full disclosure by the official or employee of his or her interest in the outside employer or business to the county or municipality as applicable and the ethics commission prior to the purchase, rental, sale, leasing, or other business being transacted.
- (4) The total amount of the contracts or transactions in the aggregate between the outside employer or business and the county or municipality as applicable does not exceed five hundred dollars (\$500) per calendar year.
- (5) Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, subsection (d) shall not be construed to prevent an employee from seeking part-time employment with an outside employer who has entered into a contract for goods or services with the county or municipality as applicable provided that:
 - a. The employee or his or her spouse, domestic partner, household member, or relative does not
 work in the county or municipal department as applicable which will enforce, oversee or
 administer the subject contract; and
 - The outside employment would not interfere with or otherwise impair his or her independence of judgment or otherwise interfere with the full and faithful performance of his or her public duties to the county or municipality as applicable; and
 - c. The employee or his or her spouse, domestic partner, household member, or relative has not participated in determining the subject contract requirements or awarding the contract; and

- d. The employee's job responsibilities and job description will not require him or her to be involved in the outside employer's contract in any way including, but not limited to, its enforcement, oversight, administration, amendment, extension, termination or forbearance; and
- e. The employee demonstrates compliance with applicable county or municipal policy regarding outside employment and obtains written permission from his or her supervisor; and
- f. The employee has obtained a conflict of interest waiver signed by the chief administrative officer, or his or her designee, and the employee's direct supervisor, or his or her designee, based on a finding that no conflict exists. The employee shall submit the request for waiver in writing and under oath or affirmation on an approved form provided by the commission on ethics. The document shall contain written acknowledgment of compliance with the provisions of subsection (5)a. through (5)e. of this subsection, together with such pertinent facts and relevant documents that support such waiver. A waiver under this subsection must be approved by both the employee's direct supervisor and the chief administrative officer of the county or municipality or their designees. The county or municipality shall record such waiver in the employee's personnel file and shall submit a copy of the waiver and all related documents to the commission on ethics. The commission on ethics in its discretion may elect to review, comment on, or investigate any waiver. The commission on ethics review or investigation shall not delay an employee's ability to take the part-time employment.
- g. Official law enforcement or fire rescue overtime or extra duty details approved by the county or municipality of the employee. The provisions of subsection (d) shall be waived for outside employment when that employment consists of a certified police agency extra duty detail or a certified firefighter or paramedic extra duty detail when contracted or administered by the police or fire rescue agency as applicable. For the purpose of this subsection, all records of external, extra duty or overtime security details, including supervisor approval, identity of contracting parties, and including time, date and manner of detail shall be maintained by the individual contracting or administrating police or fire rescue agency, records of which shall be accessible to the public subject to state public records disclosure exemptions.
- (f) Accepting travel expenses. No official or employee shall accept, directly or indirectly, any travel expenses including, but not limited to, transportation, lodging, meals, registration fees and incidentals from any county or municipal contractor, vendor, service provider, bidder or proposer as applicable. The board of county commissioners or local municipal governing body as applicable may waive the requirements of this subsection by a majority vote of the board or local municipal governing body. The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to travel expenses paid by other governmental entities or by organizations of which the county or municipality as applicable is a member if the travel is related to that membership.
- (g) **Contingent fee prohibition.** No person shall, in whole or in part, pay, give or agree to pay or give a contingency fee to another person. No person shall, in whole or in part, receive or agree to receive a contingency fee. As used herein, "contingency fee" means a fee, bonus, commission, or nonmonetary benefit as compensation, which is dependent on or in any way contingent on the passage, defeat, or modification of: an ordinance, resolution, action or decision of the board of county commissioners or local municipal governing body as applicable, any employee authorized to act on behalf of the board of county commissioners or local municipal governing body as applicable, the county administrator or municipal

administrator as applicable, or any action or decision of an advisory board or committee. This prohibition does not apply to real estate brokers when acting in the course of their profession as regulated by Florida Statutes, §§475.001—475.5018, as may be amended. Nothing in this section may be construed to prohibit any salesperson from engaging in legitimate government business on behalf of a company from receiving compensation or commission as part of a bona fide contractual arrangement with that company provided such compensation or commission is ordinary and customary in the industry. Nothing in this section may be construed to prohibit an attorney from representing a client in a judicial proceeding or formal administrative hearing pursuant to a contingent fee arrangement if allowed by the rules of the Florida Bar.

- (h) Honesty in applications for positions. No person seeking to become an official or employee, or seeking any promotion or job reassignment within the public entity that currently employs them, or seeking to enter into a contract or otherwise seeking to provide goods or services to the county or municipality as applicable, may make any false statement, submit any false document, or knowingly withhold information about wrongdoing in connection with employment by or services to the county or municipality as applicable.
- (i) **Disclosure or use of certain information.** A current or former official or employee shall not disclose or use information not available to members of the general public and gained by reason of his or her official position, except for information relating exclusively to governmental practices, for his or her personal gain or benefit or for the personal gain or benefit of any other person.

Sec. 2-444. Gift law.

- (a) (1) No county commissioner, member of a local governing body, mayor or chief executive when not a member of the governing body, or employee, or any other person or business entity on his or her behalf, shall knowingly solicit or accept directly or indirectly, any gift with a value of greater than one hundred dollars (\$100) in the aggregate for the calendar year from any person or business entity that the recipient knows, or should know with the exercise of reasonable care, is a vendor, lobbyist, or any principal or employer of a lobbyist who lobbies, sells, or leases to the county or municipality as applicable.
 - (2) No vendor, lobbyist, or principal or employer of a lobbyist that lobbies, sells, or leases to the county or a municipality as applicable, shall knowingly give, directly or indirectly, any gift with a value greater than one hundred dollars (\$100) in the aggregate for the calendar year to a person who the vendor, lobbyist, or principal knows, or should know with the exercise of reasonable care, is an official or employee of that county or municipality. For the purposes of this subsection (a)(2), the term vendor also includes any person or entity that, because of the nature of their business, may respond to an invitation to bid, request for proposal or other procurement opportunity that has been published by the county or a municipality.
- (b) (1) No advisory board member, or any other person on his or her behalf, shall knowingly solicit or accept directly or indirectly, any gift with a value of greater than one hundred dollars (\$100) in the aggregate for the calendar year from any person or business entity that the recipient knows, or should know with the exercise of reasonable care, is a vendor, lobbyist, or any principal or employer of a lobbyist, who lobbies, sells, or leases to the recipient's advisory board or any county or municipal department as applicable that is subject in any way to the advisory board's authority, influence or advice.

- (2) No vendor, lobbyist, or principal or employer of a lobbyist who lobbies, sells, or leases to an advisory board or any county or municipal department as applicable that is subject in any way to the advisory board's authority, influence or advice, shall knowingly give, directly or indirectly, any gift with a value greater than one hundred dollars (\$100) in the aggregate for the calendar year to a person who the vendor, lobbyist, or principal knows, or should know through the exercise of reasonable care, is a member of that advisory board. For the purposes of this subsection (b)(2), the term vendor also includes any person or entity that, because of the nature of their business, may respond to an invitation to bid, request for proposal or other procurement opportunity that has been published by the county or a municipality.
- (c) No county commissioner, member of a local governing body, mayor or chief executive officer when not a member of the governing body, or employee, or any other person or business entity on his or her behalf, shall knowingly solicit a gift of any value from any person or business entity that the recipient knows, or should know with the exercise of reasonable care, is a vendor, lobbyist, or any principal or employer of a lobbyist who lobbies, sells, or leases to the county or municipality as applicable, where the gift is for the personal benefit of the official or employee, another official or employee, or any relative or household member of the official or employee. No advisory board member or any other person or business entity on his or her behalf, shall knowingly solicit a gift of any value from any person or business entity that the recipient knows, or should know with the exercise of reasonable care, is a vendor, lobbyist, or any principal or employer of a lobbyist who lobbies, sells, or leases to the recipient's advisory board or any county or municipal department as applicable that is subject in any way to the advisory board's authority, influence or advice, where the gift is for the personal benefit of the advisory board member, another advisory board member, another official or employee.
- (d) For purposes of this section, a principal or employer of a lobbyist shall include any officer, partner or director of the principal or employer entity, or any employee of a principal or employer who is not an officer, partner or director, provided that the employee knows or should know with the exercise of reasonable care that the principal or employer employs a lobbyist.
- (e) No person or entity shall offer, give, or agree to give an official or employee a gift, and no official or employee shall accept or agree to accept a gift from a person or entity, because of:
 - (1) An official public action taken or to be taken, or which could be taken;
 - (2) A legal duty performed or to be performed or which could be performed; or
 - (3) A legal duty violated or to be violated, or which could be violated by any official or employee.
- (f) **Gift reports.** Any official or employee who receives a gift in excess of one hundred dollars (\$100) shall report that gift in accordance with this section.
 - (1) Gift reports for officials and employees identified by state law as reporting individuals. Those persons required to report gifts pursuant to state law shall report those gifts in the manner provided by Florida Statutes, §112.3148, as may be amended, including, but not limited to, the state's definition of gift, exceptions thereto, and gift valuations. The county code of ethics' definition of gift and exceptions thereto shall not be used by reporting individuals to complete and file state gift reporting disclosures. When a state reporting individual files or is required to file a gift report with the state, a copy of each report shall also be filed with the county commission on ethics no later than ten (10) days after the

report is filed with the state. Failure to file a State of Florida Quarterly Gift Disclosure Form with the county commission on ethics within the required timeframe shall be a violation of this section.

- (2) All other officials and employees who are not reporting individuals under state law.
 - a. *Personal gifts*. All officials and employees who are not reporting individuals under state law are not required to report gifts in excess of one hundred dollars (\$100) so long as those gifts are given to the official or employee by a personal friend or co-worker and the circumstances demonstrate that the motivation for the gift was the personal or social relationship rather than an attempt to obtain the goodwill or otherwise influence the official or employee in the performance of his or her official duties. Factors to be considered in determining whether a gift was motivated by a personal or social relationship may include but shall not be limited to: whether the relationship began before or after the official or employee obtained his or her office or position; the prior history of gift giving between the individuals; whether the gift was given in connection with a holiday or other special occasion; whether the donor personally paid for the gift or sought a tax deduction or business reimbursement; and whether the donor gave similar gifts to other officials or employees at or near the same time. If the personal friend or co-worker is a vendor, lobbyist or principal or employer of a lobbyist that lobbies the county or municipality as applicable, then the official or employee shall not accept a gift in excess of one hundred dollars (\$100) in accordance with subsections (a)(1) and (b)(1).
 - b. All other gifts. All officials or employees who are not reporting individuals under state law and who receive any gift in excess of one hundred dollars (\$100), which is not otherwise excluded or prohibited pursuant to this subsection, shall complete and submit an annual gift disclosure report with the county commission on ethics no later than January 31 of each year for the previous calendar year (January 1 through December 31). All officials or employees, who are not reporting individuals under state law and who do not receive a gift in excess of one hundred dollars (\$100) during a given reporting period shall not file an annual gift disclosure report. The annual gift disclosure report shall be created by the county commission on ethics and shall be in a form substantially similar in content as that required by state law. The county code of ethics' definition of gift and exceptions thereto shall be used by non-state-reporting individuals in completing and filing annual gift disclosure reports required by this section.
- (g) Exceptions. For the purposes of this section, the following shall not be considered a gift:
 - (1) Political contributions specifically authorized by state or federal law;
 - (2) Gifts from any relatives, domestic partners, and dependents named on the official's or employee's latest federal income tax return, or one's household member;
 - (3) Awards for professional or civic achievement;
 - (4) Materials such as books, reports, periodicals or pamphlets that are solely informational or of an advertising nature;
 - (5) Gifts solicited or accepted by county or municipal officials or employees as applicable on behalf of the county or municipality in performance of their official duties for use solely by the county or municipality for a public purpose;
 - (6) Publicly advertised offers for goods or services from a vendor under the same terms and conditions as are offered or made available to the general public;

- (7) Inheritance or other devise;
- (8) Registration fees and other related costs associated with educational or governmental conferences, meetings or seminars and travel expenses either properly waived or inapplicable pursuant to section 2-443(f), provided that attendance is for governmental purposes, and attendance is related to his or her duties and responsibilities as an official or employee of the county or municipality;
- (9) A ticket, pass or admission in connection with public events, appearances or ceremonies related to official county or municipal business, if furnished by a nonprofit sponsor organization of such public event, or if furnished pursuant to a contract between the event's non-profit sponsor and the county or municipality as applicable, provided the sponsor organization does not employ a lobbyist, and further provided the ticket, pass or admission is given by a representative of the sponsor organization who is not otherwise a lobbyist or a principal or employer of a lobbyist. Notwithstanding the exception as provided in this subsection, the ticket, pass, or admission must be disclosed in accordance with the gift law reporting requirements of subsections (f)(1) and (f)(2);
- (10) Expenditures made in connection with an event sponsored by a nonprofit organization funded in whole or in part with public funds whose primary function is to encourage and attract tourism or other business opportunities for the benefit of Palm Beach County or the municipalities as applicable, provided the sponsor organization does not employ a lobbyist, and further provided that the invitation to the event is made by a representative of the sponsor organization and the representative is not otherwise a lobbyist or a principal or employer of a lobbyist. Notwithstanding the exception as provided in this subsection, the expenditure must be disclosed in accordance with the gift law reporting requirements of subsections (f)(1) and (f)(2).
- (h) Solicitation of contributions on behalf of a non-profit charitable organization.
 - (1) Notwithstanding the prohibition on gifts as outlined in subsections (a) and (b), the solicitation of funds by a county or municipal official or employee for a non-profit charitable organization, as defined under the Internal Revenue Code, is permissible so long as there is no quid pro quo or other special consideration, including any direct or indirect special financial benefit to the official or employee or to the person or entity being solicited. The solicitation by an official or employee as contemplated herein, is expressly prohibited if made to any person or entity with a pending application for approval or award of any nature before the county or municipality as applicable.
 - (2) To promote the full and complete transparency of any such solicitation, officials and employees shall disclose, on a form provided by the commission on ethics, the name of the charitable organization, the event for which the funds were solicited, the name of any person or entity that was contacted regarding a solicitation or pledge by the official or employee, and the amount of the funds solicited or pledged if known. The form shall be completed legibly and shall be filed with the commission on ethics. The form shall be filed within thirty (30) days from the occurrence of the event for which the solicitation was made, or if no event, within thirty (30) days from the occurrence of the solicitation.

Sec. 2-445. Anti-nepotism law.

An official may not appoint, employ, promote, advance, or advocate for appointment, employment, promotion, or advancement in or to a position in the county or municipality as applicable in which the official is

serving or over which the official exercises jurisdiction or control, any individual who is a relative or domestic partner of the official. An individual may not be appointed, employed, promoted, or advanced in or to a position in the county or a municipality if such appointment, employment, promotion, or advancement has been advocated by an official, serving in or exercising jurisdiction or control over the county or municipality as appropriate, who is a relative or domestic partner of the individual or if such appointment, employment, promotion, or advancement is made by a collegial body of which a relative or domestic partner of the individual is a member. However, this section shall not apply to appointments to boards other than those with land-planning or zoning responsibilities in those municipalities with less than thirty-five thousand (35,000) population. This section does not apply to persons serving in a volunteer capacity who provide emergency medical, firefighting, or police services. Such persons may receive, without losing their volunteer status, reimbursements for the costs of any training they get relating to the provision of volunteer emergency medical, firefighting, or police services and payment for any incidental expenses relating to those services that they provide. Mere approval of budgets shall not be sufficient to constitute "jurisdiction or control" for the purposes of this section.

- (1) For the purposes of this section, "official" means any official or employee in whom is vested the authority by law, rule, or regulation, or to whom the authority has been delegated to appoint, employ, promote, or advance individuals or to recommend individuals for appointment, employment, promotion, or advancement in connection with employment in the county or municipality as applicable.
- (2) For the purposes of this section, "relative" means spouse, parent, child, sibling, uncle, aunt, first cousin, nephew, niece, father-in-law, mother-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, stepfather, stepmother, stepson, stepdaughter, stepbrother, stepsister, half-brother, or half-sister.

Sec. 2-446. Ethics training.

- (a) Officials and employees, as public servants, are considered stewards of the public trust and should aspire to the highest level of integrity and character. Officials and employees shall be informed of their ethical responsibilities at the start of their public service, and shall receive updates and training materials on ethics issues throughout the span of their public service. The county administrator or municipal administrator, as applicable, shall establish, by policy, a mandatory training schedule for all officials, employees, and local government attorneys as defined in Florida Statutes §112.313, which shall include mandatory periodic follow-up sessions. This policy may also address ethics training for entities that receive county or municipal funds as applicable.
- (b) The commission on ethics shall develop and deliver, or contract with other entities to develop and deliver, training programs. The commission on ethics shall coordinate and cooperate with all affected county or municipal entities, departments, agencies, boards, councils and commissions to ensure that effective and meaningful training experiences are delivered in a timely and efficient manner.

Sec. 2-447. Noninterference.

It shall be a violation of this article for any person: (a) to retaliate against, punish, threaten, harass, or penalize any person for communicating, cooperating with, or assisting the commission on ethics or the inspector

general; or (b) to interfere, obstruct or attempt to interfere or obstruct without valid legal basis any investigation conducted by the commission on ethics or the inspector general.

Sec. 2-448. Administration, enforcement and penalties.

- (a) The commission on ethics shall be empowered to review, interpret, render advisory opinions, and enforce this code of ethics pursuant to the procedures established in the county commission on ethics ordinance. Jurisdiction of the commission on ethics with respect to advisory opinions rendered shall extend to all county and municipal officials and employees, and all other persons and entities required to comply with the provisions of this code and the county lobbyist registration ordinance, including but not limited to lobbyists, their employers and principals, and contractors and vendors and their employees.
- (b) A finding by the commission on ethics of a violation of any part of this article shall subject the person or entity to public reprimand, a fine of up to five hundred dollars (\$500), or both. The commission on ethics may also order the person or entity to pay restitution when the person or entity or a third party has received a pecuniary benefit as a result of the person's violation.
- (c) Upon a finding of the commission on ethics or hearing officer that a violation of this article or the lobbyist registration ordinance resulted in a contract, grant, subsidy, license, permit, franchise, use, certificate, development order or other benefit conferred by the county or municipality as applicable, then such contract, grant, subsidy, license, permit, franchise, use, certificate, development order or other benefit may be rescinded or declared void by the board of county commissioners or the local municipal governing body as applicable.
- (d) The commission on ethics may refer willful violations of sections 2-443, 2-444(a), 2-444(b), 2-444(c), 2-444(e), or 2-447 to the state attorney when deemed appropriate. Pursuant to Florida Statutes, §125.69, a person who violates the sections of the article set forth in this section 2-448(d) shall be subject to prosecution in the name of the state in the same manner as first degree misdemeanors are prosecuted, and upon conviction, such person may be punished by a fine not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000), imprisonment not to exceed one (1) year, or both.
