ORDINANCE NO. 2022-15

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF WESTLAKE, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES BY CREATING ARTICLE ______ ENTITLED "TEMPORARY STRUCTURES AND USES"; PROVIDING FOR THE REGULATION OF TEMPORARY STRUCTURES AND TEMPORARY USES; PROVIDING FOR THE REGULATION OF SALE MODELS; PROVIDING FOR THE REGULATION OF SALE MODELS; PROVIDING FOR THE REGULATION OF TEMPORARY CONSTRUCTION TRAILERS AND PORTABLE STORAGE UNITS; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR A CONFLICTS CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Mayor O'Connor introduced item and called for the City Attorney to read the Ordinance title into record, by title only.

Mr. Doody read Ordinance 2022-15, by title only, into the record.

Mayor O'Connor called for staff presentations. Mr. Leon with Planning & Zoning presented a PowerPoint presentation to introduce Ordinance 2022-15, Temporary Structure and Uses, into the zoning code.

Mr. Leon explained that all temporary uses and/or structures which are not otherwise treated by these LDRs as a permitted use or conditional use in a particular zoning district, which are not otherwise subject to a special event permit, and which are not otherwise prohibited under the terms of these LDRs may be conducted or erected after obtaining a temporary permit.

Mr. Leon continued, noting the City Manager is authorized to issue a permit for temporary structures and temporary uses. The City Manager may impose reasonable conditions upon the Temporary Permit.

In addition to the authorization process, Mr. Leon reviewed the Application Review and approval procedure, the duration of the temporary structures, construction site requirements, use compatibility, cessation, traffic circulation and nuisance and revocation process.

Mr. Leon further identified the section of the code that provides the permitted temporary uses and structures and any additional requirements.
