**SUBJECT: February Financial Report** 

Please find attached the February 2023 financial report. During your review, please keep in mind that the goal is for revenue to meet or exceed the year-to-date budget and for expenditures to be at or below the year-to-date budget. An overview of the City's funds is provided below. Should you have any questions or require additional information, please contact me at Steven.Fowler@inframark.com.

#### **General Fund**

- Total Revenues through February were approximately 75% of the annual budget. Collections of the FY2023 Ad Valorem Tax and Special Assessments were approximately 97% and 97%, repectively. The annual budget includes revenue from a funding agreement with the Developer. The Developer is invoiced quarterly for any year-to-date excess of actual expenditures over actual revenue.
- Total Expenditures through February were approximately 28% of the annual budget.

# **Special Revenue Fund – Housing Assistance Program**

Total Revenues through February were approximately 130% of the annual budget, which was a
result of a higher than anticipated rate of construction. A donation of \$1,500 per Single Family
Residence building permit is paid into the Housing Assistance Program.

#### Special Revenue Fund – Comprehensive Planning Services

- Total Revenues through February were approximately 31% of the annual budget.
- Total Expenditures through February were approximately 45% of the annual budget.

Mr. Leon, senior planner, presented request for approval for a public art sculpture installation for the James Business Park development located at Pod G SW.

Mr. Leon referenced Ordinance 2021-12 and discussed what was not eligible to be considered as artwork. Mr. Leon discussed the applicant's proposal and cost of the art sculpture. Mr. Leon displayed the location and a picture of the proposed artwork. Mr. Leon discussed the colors of the artwork, the different parts of the artwork and discussed the landscaping surrounding the artwork that will compliment the sculpture. Mr. Leon also stated the sculpture complies with applicable zoning and fire codes. Mr. Leon stated the art was approved by the Arts in Public Places Board and staff recommends approval of application.

Councilman Martinez asked if the sculpture was built in the United States.

Mr. Hearing stated it was built in the United States.

Mr. Doody asked for Mr. Hearing to hold any comments, and clarified the question was directed to staff.

Mr. Leon stated the sculpture was built in the United States.

Mayor O'Connor stated there is another presentation, from applicant, Mr. Donaldson Hearing, on behalf of Jamlyn Supply, Inc.

Mr. Hearing discussed the founding partners of Jamlyn Supply, Inc., and the concept and significance behind the idea of the art sculpture. Mr. Hearing discussed the location of the sculpture and its location in the heart of the City of Westlake. Mr. Hearing also stated the City attorney worked with the artist in obtaining a copyright waiver so the city is able to utilize the art as part of any celebrations in the city of Westlake, whether its through publication or on the city website. Mr. Hearing went over the landscaping surrounding the sculpture that will compliment the sculpture and not compete with the sculpture. Mr. Hearing discussed the materials the art is made of and the minimal maintenance the sculpture needs. Mr. Hearing clarified any questions on the manufacturing of the art, noting the fabricator is located in the south area of Florida and will meet hurricane standards. Mr. Hearing also stated the Arts in Public Places board did agree to have security cameras installed in the corner of the building to have additional security at this location.

Mayor O'Connor stated he was at the Arts in Public Places meeting and explained how the art is so intentional, the artist incorporated the city's history into this sculpture. Mayor O'Connor stated this is the first installation under the Arts in Public Places Ordinance and they have set the bar high for future art. Mayor O'Connor asked when will the sculpture be completed.

Mr. Hearing stated the sculpture must be in place prior to the issuance of the certificate of occupancy of the building. Mr. Hearing stated they are in for permits or very close to being submitted for permits.

Mayor O'Connor asked if council had any questions or comments.

Council stated their excitement for the incoming art sculpture.

Mayor O'Connor called for public comments.

Ms. Burgess stated no comment cards were received prior to the meeting and gave the virtual audience a moment to raise their virtual hand.

Mr. Cassel stated the proposed school is outside the boundaries that have been set by the ordinance.

#### **Amended Agenda**

Mayor O'Connor reminded council they had previously agreed they would have quarterly events. Mayor O'Connor stated the last event was the Christmas pop up market. The Spring Festival event would be held on April 8th, the day before easter. Mayor O'Connor stated this event will include a helicopter dropping 10,000 eggs, easter bunnies, face painters, balloon twisters, candy, golden tickets and entertainment. Mayor O'Connor stated as the city event would be for everyone not just the hammocks it shouldn't be a problem.

Councilwoman Leonard mentioned the Hammocks event is open to all city residents.

#### Final Recommendation

The Office of the City Engineer has reviewed the documents associated with the application referenced above and recommends approval by the Council. The Seminole Improvement District's Engineering Department approved the subject referenced plat on April 3, 2023 and approval by the board of Supervisors is scheduled for April 26, 2023.

#### Discussion

Pod I (Terraces of Westlake) will be reviewed and approved in multiple phases. This submittal is for Phase I, which will contain 23.159 acres and 109 single-family lots. Pod I is located in the southern portion of Westlake, south of Waters Edge Drive, south of Green Lane and east of Ilex Way, as shown in the graphics below. The primary access point to the Terraces of Westlake – Phase I community will be on Ilex Way from the west.

#### THE TERRACES AT POD I



There will be 109 single family attached homes located on minimum 20-foot-wide lots in configurations of 4 and 5 units in the north side of the Terraces of Westlake – Phase I. End units will have substantially wider lots. The proposed lot area exceeds the minimum area required by the City LDRs for the Mixed-Use zoning district.

The entirety of the Terraces of Westlake will contain 250 single family attached homes. The Westlake Comprehensive Plan requires a minimum of 5% of the Downtown Mixed Use DTMU land use be allocated to residential uses. This project satisfies a portion of this requirement. The Comprehensive Plan allows for a minimum of 4 dwellings units per acre and a maximum of 16 dwelling units per acre. The Terraces will be developed at a density of 10.79 dwelling units per acre.

The architecture within the Terraces is designed to inspire a Coastal Contemporary atmosphere mixed in with an Urban Transitional feeling, drawing inspiration from historic coast vernaculars and reinterpreting them with a cleaner more contemporary execution. The massing of the homes is ordered and appropriately proportioned. Rooflines, eaves, windows, garage doors, and entry doors work together to form a unified theme. The colors of the homes are pastels and tones with neutral colors on elements such as front doors or shutters. Trim and body colors should work together by complementing and contrasting each other. Overall schemes should have either a well-saturated trim or body color.

The south side of the Terraces of Westlake – Phase I – is designated in the plat as Tract "I" (reserved for future development). The applicant will be required to apply for a re-plat of the Tract "I" area when they wish to subdivide those lots. However, the current plat reserves Tract "I" to Minto PBLH, LLC and dedicates Tract "I" to the Seminole Improvement District for lake maintenance, drainage, and utilities.

The Legal Description of the Plat can be found in Exhibit A, and replications of the plat and plat topographical survey can be found in Exhibits B and C.

#### Review Criteria

Plats shall be prepared in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 177 F.S., as amended, and the City of Westlake Land Development Regulations. The plat was reviewed for clarity, legibility, and conformance with this statute and City requirements. The plat provides a graphic depiction of the legal description through geometric data. The data includes but is not limited to parcel, block, tract, right-of-way, street and associated names, easement, permanent reference monuments and permanent control points, and interior excepted parcels. Other requirements such as paper size, line work, layout of sheet and required content including the subdivision name, title, legal description, key map, vicinity map, north arrow, scale, and legend are verified in the Engineering Department review.

#### Conclusion

Three (3) reviews of the plat occurred, which resulted in an acceptable plat. The review was done for compliance with Chapters 177, 5J-17, Florida Statutes, and the City of Westlake's codes and ordinances. All comments have been adequately addressed and the plat is in compliance. We therefore recommend that the plat be approved for recording.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY FOR THE CITY OF WESTLAKE, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

**SECTION 1**. Recitals. The foregoing recitals are confirmed, adopted and incorporated herein and made a part hereof by this reference.

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**SECTION 2.** The City Council hereby amends Ordinance No. 2019-9 by amending Article \_\_\_\_\_ by specifically creating Section 3 entitled "Essential Facilities and Services" as follows:

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**Section 3: Essential Facilities and Services.** All buildings or structures defined as essential facilities and services in Chapter 1, Article 1.2 of this code (the "Essential Service Facilities"), are permitted by right in all zoning districts as shown in Table 3-20, when necessary for the day-to-day operation of the applicable governmental entity, subject to the requirements set forth in Chapter 3 Article 3.3 Section 3.

#### A) Height of structures.

No portion of any Essential Service Facility regulated by this section shall exceed 50 feet in height in any residential zoning districts or exceed 150 feet in nonresidential zoning districts.

#### B) Screening and appearance.

Essential Service Facilities (excluding transmission poles) exceeding three (3) feet in height, shall be of a neutral, non-glare color or finish so as to make them visually unobtrusive. In the event the Essential Service Facilities are adjacent to property within a R-1 or R-2 zoning district, the Essential Service Facility shall provide shrubs or plant material acceptable to the City at least three (3) feet high at time of planting to shield the Essential Service Facility from adjacent residential properties..

#### C) Exemptions from property development regulations.

- (a) Essential Service Facilities shall be exempt from the property development regulations which set forth minimum dimensions and setbacks, except as provided below.
- (b) Parcels containing Essential Service Facilities shall not be required to meet the minimum required lot area and lot dimensions for the zoning district wherein located, provided that access, buffering, drainage, retention, parking and other applicable provisions of this section and the Land Development Regulations are satisfied. Essential Service Facilities shall not have a maximum lot coverage exceeding 75%, and shall provide for a minimum pervious percentage of lot coverage of 25%.

#### D) Setbacks.

- 2 (a) Essential Service Facilities regulated by this section that are three (3) feet or less in height are exempt from all setback requirements.

  (b) Essential Service Facilities that are over three (3) feet but less than six (6) feet in height shall be set back a
  - (b) Essential Service Facilities that are over three (3) feet but less than six (6) feet in height shall be set back a minimum of five (5) feet from any road right-of-way or public easement and shall comply with the visibility triangles (corner clips).
  - (c) Essential Service Facilities that exceed six (6) feet in height shall provide for a minimum front setback of thirty (30) feet, and side and rear setback of a minimum of ten (10) feet. Essential Service Facilities shall not be located closer than twenty-five (25) feet to any body of water, measured from top of bank.

**SECTION 3.** <u>Codification</u>. It is the intention of the City Council of the City of Westlake that the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Westlake, Florida, and that the Sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered, re-lettered and the word "Ordinance" may be changed to "Section," "Article" or such other word or phrase in order to accomplish such intention.

**SECTION 4.** <u>Conflicts</u>. All ordinances or parts of ordinances, resolutions or parts of resolutions which are in conflict herewith, are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

**SECTION 5.** Severability. Should the provisions of this ordinance be declared to be severable and if any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance shall for any reason be held to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections, sentences, clauses, and phrases of this ordinance but they shall remain in effect, it being the legislative intent that this ordinance shall remain notwithstanding the invalidity of any part.

**SECTION 6**. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be effective upon adoption on second reading.
