### **Background of Issue:**

On June 3, 2025, the City of White Salmon Public Works Department contracted Hurley Engineering to perform routine maintenance on the two pumps at the Los Altos Reservoir. During this inspection, Hurley Engineering discovered a complete failure of one pump. Further assessment determined that both pumps are now in need of immediate replacement.

These pumps play a critical role in the City's water system, moving water from Buck Creek (via the Los Altos Reservoir) to the Strawberry Mountain Reservoirs, and from there into the full distribution network that serves all city water users. Without operational pumps, the City's entire water delivery system is at risk of disruption.

### **Council Options:**

City Council has the following options available at this time:

- 1. Accept the Staff Recommendation and approve the contract.
- 2. Revise the Staff Recommendation.
- 3. Other action as may be desired by the City Council.
- 4. Refer this issue back to staff for further work.
- 5. Take no action on this matter.



RE: Emergency Proclamation 2025-001

June 5, 2025

**On June 3, 2025**, the City of White Salmon Public Works Department contracted Hurley Engineering to perform routine maintenance on the two pumps at the Los Altos Reservoir. During this inspection, Hurley Engineering discovered a complete failure of one pump. Further assessment determined that both pumps are now in need of immediate replacement.

These pumps play a critical role in the City's water system, moving water from Buck Creek (via the Los Altos Reservoir) to the Strawberry Mountain Reservoirs, and from there into the full distribution network that serves all city water users. Without operational pumps, the City's entire water delivery system is at risk of disruption.

Due to the urgent nature of this failure, an emergency exists that requires the use of emergency powers. In order to secure the necessary equipment and services as quickly as possible, the City may need to waive standard competitive bidding requirements and award contracts directly, ensuring a timely and effective response to restore essential water service.

Therefore I, Marla Keethler, Mayor, declare an emergency as defined by RCW 39.04.280(3) due to the unforeseen nature of the situation described in the first paragraph, above, and the immediate public health risks.

Pursuant to the emergency declared, the City Public Works Department is authorized to enter into contract(s) and incur obligations to address such emergency with approval by the City Administrator. Emergency measures may include, but is not limited to, the purchase of supplies and the hiring contractors for replacement of the pumps.

The declaration of a local emergency shall terminate when in the Mayor's judgment, the emergency measures contained herein are no longer required to safeguard property and public health.

Declaration of Emergency per RCW 39.04.280(2)(b) (attach additional sheets and documentation as required):

Insurance and Indemnification: The Contractor shall defend, indemnify and hold the City and all of its employees harmless from any and all liabilities, claims, damages, costs or expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees) arising from or relating to the work performed under this Agreement to the extent of the Contractor's negligence. The Contractor waives, with respect to the City, its immunity under industrial insurance, Title 51 RCW. This waiver has been mutually negotiated by the parties. This indemnification shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement. Contractor shall secure and maintain, at its own cost and expense, Comprehensive General Liability and Property Damage insurance in the amount of not less than \$1,000,000 for death or injury in any one occurrence and \$1,000,000 for property damage in any one occurrence which provides, at a minimum, the following coverage:

Premises and Operation; Explosions, Collapse and Underground Hazards (Where Applicable); Products/Completed Operations; Contractual Liability; Broad Form Property Damage; Independent Contractors; and Personal Injury.

Contractor shall secure and maintain, at its own cost and expense, Comprehensive Auto Liability insurance in the amount of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence which provides, at a minimum the following coverages:

Owned Vehicles; Non-Owned Vehicles; Hired Vehicles; Property Damage.

This coverage shall be issued from an insurance company authorized to do business in the State of Washington. The City shall be named as additional insured on said insurance coverage at least as broad as ISO CG 20 10 10 01 in a form acceptable to the City Attorney. The Contractor agrees to repair and replace all property of the City and all property of others damaged by the Contractor, Contractor's employees, subcontractors and agents. It is understood that the whole of the work under this contract is to be done at the Contractor's risk and that the Contractor is familiar with the conditions of materials, climatic conditions, and other contingencies likely to affect the work and has made their bid accordingly and that the Contractor will assume the responsibility and risk of all loss or damage to materials or work which may arise from any cause whatsoever prior to completion.

<u>Warranties</u>: If within one year after the completion date of the Work, defective and unauthorized Work is discovered, the Contractor shall promptly, upon written order by the City, return and in accordance with the City's instructions, either correct such work, or if such Work has been rejected by the City, remove it from the site and replace it with non-defective and authorized Work, all without cost to the City.

<u>Nondiscrimination</u>: The Contractor shall comply with all applicable federal and state laws, and city ordinances, for equal employment opportunity and nondiscrimination laws.

Gifts: The City's Code of Ethics and Washington State law prohibit City employees from soliciting, accepting, or receiving any gift, gratuity or favor from any person, firm or corporation involved in a contract or transaction. To ensure compliance with the City's Code of Ethics and state law, the Consultant shall not give a gift of any kind to City employees or officials.

<u>Business License</u>: The Contractor is required to submit proof of a City business license (\$50) within ten (10) days of contract award. Failure to provide proof of a business license may delay payment of invoices.

<u>Payment Processing</u>: The City shall pay the Contractor after final acceptance of each work order within 30 days of submittal of the invoice provided the City has received approved L&I forms.

Prevailing Wages: This contract is subject to prevailing wages according to RCW 39.12.020. Contractor shall file an Intent to Pay Prevailing Wage form and Affidavit of Wages Paid form with L&I and pay for all fees associated with filing the forms. Contractor shall submit the Intent and Affidavit forms, approved by L&I, to the City with payment request. No payment will be issued to the Contractor until the City receives both approved forms. If any work is subcontracted on this project, an approved Intent and Affidavit form must be submitted for each sub-contractor. If progress payments are made on this project, an approved Intent form must be received prior to issuing the first payment. An approved Affidavit form must be received prior to issuing final payment.

<u>Bonds/Retainage</u>: No Bid Bond is required. Contract Bond is required. For projects with an estimated total cost of less than \$35,000, the contractor may elect to a 50% retainage in lieu of a Contract Bond. Retainage is required.

<u>Industrial Insurance Status</u>: Contractor is responsible for maintaining a current status of their industrial insurance premiums with the Department of Labor and Industries (L&I). Prior to issuing final payment, the City will verify with L&I the status of the contractor's premiums. Under RCW 60.28 the City can withhold and pay the contractor's delinquent premiums from the final payment.

Improvement Plan for the City of White Salmon for 2026-2031

### **Action Required:**

Review and approval of Resolution 2025-06-624 amending the White Salmon Six Year Transportation Improvement Plan (STIP) for the years 2026-2031.

### **Motion for Business Item / Proposed Motion for Consent Agenda:**

Motion to approve Resolution 2025-06-624 amending the White Salmon Six Year Transportation Improvement Plan (STIP) for the years 2026-2031.

### **Explanation of Issue:**

The City is required to update and adopt its Six-Year Transportation Improvement Program each year and submit it to the Department of Transportation by July 1st.

The attached program is an update to the previous Six-Year Transportation Improvement Program, it prioritizes 10 street/pedestrian projects with a goal set to be constructed from 2026-2031.

A public hearing is required and is scheduled for June 18th, 2025, to hear comments from the public regarding the program.

The City Operations Committee reviewed and recommended edits to the plan at their June 12th meeting. Staff reviewed the recommendations and have provided their version attached.

### **Council Options:**

City Council has the following options available at this time:

- 1. Accept the Staff Recommendation.
- 2. Revise the Staff Recommendation.
- 3. Other action as desired by council.

### **Fiscal Analysis:**

There are no Financial Implications to the 2025 Annual Budget – Approved Projects are not required to be completed but should be considered as future budgets are created.

### **DEI & Stakeholder Analysis:**

All transportation improvements made within White Salmon City Limits impact the City's DEI goals. Having them listed in this plan allows the city to look for grant funding and allowed the council to consider use of the Transportation Benefit District Funding to help complete the projects. Other Stakeholders that will need to be included if the projects are funded will include WSVSD and WSDOT.

Policy & Plan Implications: Projects listed in the STIP are represented in the TSP lite and CFIP.

### **Recommendation of Staff/Committee:**

The City Operations Committee reviewed the STIP at their June 12th meeting and have staff recommends approval.

### White Salmon Tree Board Minutes

June 9, 2025 – 4:00 pm

Attending: Patty Fink, Karen Jenkins, Rowan Fairfield, Davy Stevenson

**Guest:** Julie Burgmeier

### 1. Welcome and Introductions

The meeting started a bit late, and we went quickly through the introductions of the committee's new staff member (Planner, Rowan Fairfield) and new member Davy Stevenson.

### 2. Committee Overview

Patty provided a brief introduction to the committee's roles and responsibilities and Karen Jenkins, who is the longest standing member on the committee, gave a brief history of the committee's past initiatives and accomplishments.

### 3. Wildflower Fest and Tree Walk

The committee had invited Julie Burgmeier from Discover White Salmon to talk about the Wildflower Fest and the potential to include a Tree Walk with a map as part of the festival next year. Julie was excited by the idea and indicated that if the Tree Board will provide the information, they can work to create the map and offer us a spot on the "events" page. It was noted that a database of existing heritage trees on city property is on the City's Tree Board website, but the committee may wish to see if private property owners with heritage trees might also want to be included. It was noted that several other communities have put together tree walks and we might us this as a template for the White Salmon walk (Beaufort, NC: http://ladysislandgardenclub.com/beaufort-tree-walk/ and Seattle, WA (https://www.seattle.gov/trees/get-involved/tree-walks).

Davy suggested engaging the school district or having a scavenger hunt (e.g. identifying the trees along the route and getting a prize) to educate/(interest kids.

### Action Items - Related to Tree Walk

**Action** – The committee will work over the summer to organize the route(s) and provide an overview of how they would like to work together with the Wildflower fest and then get back together with Julie in the fall to finalize the financial and marketing pieces. (Schedule for September Meeting)

**Action** – For next meeting all members (and potentially past members) will bring a list of their 3 (or more) favorite heritage trees within the area south of Rheingarten Park SORPA Oak/Tohomish street areas to Dock Grade and in the area north of Rheingarten Park NORPA in the Green/Fields street area to Gaddis Park for committee review (scheduled for review at July meeting).

**Action** – Patty will investigate otocast software as a possible narrative option for the tree walk.

### 4. Roundtable Discussion

There were several topics discussed related to trees on public property. Rowan noted that new sidewalks are required to have a green strip which might include adding trees. Patty noted that there had been a discussion of including swales and bike lanes on Main Street – which would also offer opportunities to include trees. There was a suggestion that we look at what roadways are next on the list to upgrade and talk with public works about whether there might be an opportunity to include a tree element.

This led to a tangent discussion about the WSDOT project along SR14 (Jewett) and a question as to how the city was working with WSDOT on this project. There was a discussion about whether the city would be working together with WSDOT to move specific elements (including traffic calming elements) forward. Rowan noted that tree locations would need to include sightline issues/concerns particularly at bump out locations near intersections.

There was also discussion about tree replacement requirements for the two subdivision projects (Four Oaks and Cherry Hill). Karen said she could follow up on what was required of each property.

Finally, it was again noted that having Ethan from Public Works attend the tree board meetings on a quarterly basis would be helpful and informative for the committee.

### Action Items related to Roundtable

**Action** – Patty will reach out to Andrew Dirks to see if we can schedule Ethan to come quarterly (with next meeting September) to the Tree Board meetings.

**Action** – Rowan will work internally to see if there are any upcoming street projects that could include a tree element.

Action - Patty will ask at Council for an update on the WSDOT SR 14 Project.
