ORDINANCE NO. 2023-28

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF WILLOWICK TO REAFFIRM THE CITY'S COMMITMENT WITH THE LAKE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS TO PARTICIPATE IN THE URBAN ENTITLEMENT COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) PROGRAM AND FOR UTILIZATION OF FUNDS MADE AVAILABLE BY THE HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT ACT OF 1974, AS AMENDED, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, provides an entitlement of funds for community development purposes for urban counties; and

WHEREAS, Lake County, Ohio will be designated as an "Urban County" provided that it secures the continued commitments with various political subdivisions in Lake County; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Willowick desire the use of "Urban County Entitlement Funds" for needed public improvements and public service programs in Lake County and its municipalities, including the City of Willowick; and

WHEREAS, the County shall prepare Applications for fiscal years 2024, 2025 and 2026 CDBG Urban County Entitlement Funds pursuant to the aforementioned Act;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILLOWICK, COUNTY OF LAKE, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Mayor be and is hereby authorized to reaffirm the commitment with the Lake County Board of Commissions from the first day of the 2024 program year through and including the last day of the 2026 program year, with said Agreement to authorize the County to undertake essential Community Development and Housing Assistance Plans and Projects eligible under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended.

Section 2. That the funds necessary for the purposes of this Ordinance and as authorized hereby shall be paid from "CDBG Urban County Entitlement Funds" under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended.

Section 3. All formal actions of this Council concerning the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting, and that all deliberations of this Council, or any of its Committees, which resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances and Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, welfare and dignity of the residents of the City of Willowick, and for the further reason to permit the County to submit the documents at the earliest date possible in order to meet federal deadlines for program eligibility to secure possible funding, wherefore this Ordinance shall be in full force and take effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.



MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT

THE BOARD OF LAKE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, OHIO ("Commissioners") and THE LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITIES OF ALL POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS WITHIN LAKE COUNTY, OHIO ("Political Subdivisions") hereby enter into this Agreement to continue the existence of a County-wide organization, known as the LAKE COUNTY NARCOTICS AGENCY ("Agency"), under a reformulated Board, said organization is created pursuant to Section 307.15, Ohio Revised Code, and according to the following terms and conditions:

- 1. The Agency is hereby authorized to render the services of coordinating the investigation of illegal drug sales and illegal drug use throughout Lake County and to exercise for and on behalf of each party hereto such power and authority incidental thereto as such party may lawfully do, consistent with State statutes and the provisions of this Agreement.
- 2. There is hereby created a "LAKE COUNTY NARCOTICS EXECUTIVE BOARD" ("Board") whose membership shall consist of an eight (8) member Board of Trustees including the following members for the following terms:
 - a. The Lake County Sheriff, or his designee, is to be a permanent member of the Board.
 - b. The Lake County Prosecutor, or his designee, is to be a permanent member of the Board.
 - c. The Commissioners are to designate their representative on the Board as a permanent member of the Board. The Commissioners shall have the authority to change its representative annually.
 - d. A City Manager and/or Mayor shall be chosen, by the Commissioners, to serve a three (3) year term commencing upon the execution of this Agreement and ending on December 31, 1993. On and after January 1, 1994, this term shall be for successive three (3) year terms.
 - e. Two (2) Police Chiefs from Lake County shall be chosen by the Commissioners to serve two (2) year terms commencing upon the execution of this Agreement and ending on December 31, 1992. On and after January 1, 1993, these appointments shall be for successive three (3) year terms. The Commissioners shall consider a recommendation made by the Lake County Association of Chiefs of Police ("Association"), but shall not be constrained to follow that recommendation.
 - f. Two (2) Police Chiefs from Lake County shall be chosen to serve one (1) year terms, commencing upon the execution of this Agreement and ending on December 31, 1991. On and after January 1, 1992, these appointments shall be for successive three

- (3) year periods. The Commissioners shall consider a recommendation made by the Association, but shall not be constrained to follow that recommendation. All appointments to the Board shall be made by the Commissioners, as set forth above.
- 3. The Board shall select its own chairperson. The Board shall meet upon the call of its chairperson or one-third (1/3) of its members may call for a meeting. Once appointed, the chairperson shall only vote in the event of a tie vote to break the tie.
- 4. The Board shall employ by contract or appoint an Agency Director whose duties shall be prescribed by the Board and as further prescribed herein. The Agency Director may appoint, with prior approval of the Board, such other assistants and staff to assist him in administering this program. The salary of the Agency Director and other personnel shall be paid from a Lake County fund known as the "Lake County Narcotics Agency Fund."
- The Board shall prepare for submission to the Commissioners a proposed budget each year. The funds to be provided for the Agency's budget shall be derived from the Narcotics Levy passed June 8, 1982, et seq. All other funds received by the Agency or to the Agency's credit from whatever source, or by whatever means shall be paid to the Auditor of Lake County to be placed in the "Lake County Narcotics Agency Fund."
- 6. Any appointed member of the Board who terminates before the expiration of his term will be replaced by a new appointee to fill the unexpired term pursuant to paragraph 2 above.
- 7. The Board shall be the policy making authority and shall be responsible for implementing the provisions of this Agreement through its Agency Director. In performing duties pursuant to this Agreement, the Board is authorized to cooperate with all other political subdivisions, with the State of Ohio, with other states, the Federal Government, and private agencies in all matters pertaining to narcotics investigations.
- 8. All employees of the Agency, who are certified by the State of Ohio as law enforcement officers, shall have full police powers to undertake actions authorized by this Agreement in any of the signatory political subdivisions to this Agreement, and shall have the authority to enforce drug related criminal statutes of the State of Ohio. The Agency shall be solely liable for any actions taken by employees of the Agency in the scope of their employment, and the Agency and the Commissioners agree to hold harmless other signatories to this Agreement for any and all claims which may arise therefrom.
- 9. On or about the 31st day of January, 1992, and every year thereafter on January 31st, the Board shall issue a written report to the Commissioners which shall include, but not be limited to, the number of investigations during the prior year, the number of arrests made, the number of convictions, the estimated value of drugs seized, and any other information the Board or the Commissioners may deem pertinent.

This Agreement shall be in full force and effect when the Commissioners have executed it. This Agreement shall be in full force and effect as to any political subdivision upon execution by it. There shall be no set term ending this contract. This Agreement may be terminated or amended by the Commissioners at any time, after a thirty (30) day written notice is given to the other signatories hereto. Any other party to this Agreement may terminate this Agreement, as to that party only, upon thirty (30) days written notice to all other parties hereto.

The parties agree that the terms of this Agreement shall be severable, in the event that any term is considered illegal, unenforceable, or against public policy. This Agreement shall be interpreted and construed under the laws of the State of Ohio, County of Lake, and shall be considered entered into at Painesville, Ohio.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto subscribe their signatures by their duly elected officers, in accordance with and pursuant to legislation duly and lawfully adopted by their legislative bodies as of the dates indicated. The political subdivision shall attach a copy of its legislation hereto.

Executive Summary:

Thank you for your interest in training and educational opportunities offered by Cleveland State University's Center for Emergency Preparedness. Since our 1984 inception, Cleveland State University's Center for Emergency Preparedness has continuously provided outstanding programming to our customers. Our mission is to provide the highest quality hazardous material, homeland security and business continuity training, taught by professionals utilizing industry standards and best practices.

Cleveland State University's Center for Emergency Preparedness has been instrumental in several emergency service consolidation and operational feasibility studies over the past decade, including the Lake County, Ohio "Consolidation of the Lake County Fire & EMS Department Feasibility Study," 2015.

Director for the Cleveland State University's Center for Emergency Preparedness is Dr. Bernard W. Becker III, and has earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Fire and Safety Engineering Technology from the University of Cincinnati, Ohio; a Master of Science degree in Executive Fire Service Leadership from Grand Canyon University, Arizona; and a Doctorate in Business Administration (DBA) degree from Columbia Southern University, Alabama.

Scope of Work:

Investigate and develop a Fire and EMS Department Feasibility Study for the City of Willowick, Ohio.

Factors to be investigated and presented are, but not limited to:

- a) assess the current part-time staffing model and evaluate against alternative staffing models to determine the most effective and sustainable structure for the City.
- b) Four (4) staffing alternatives shall be assessed as a part of the study.
 - 1) Existing (all part time),
 - 2) Hybrid (mix of full and part-time employees),
 - 3) All full time, and
 - 4) A consolidation into a fire district and/or shared resources between communities.

Each alternative will be assessed for the following:

- a) Fiscal Analysis review all revenue and expenditures
- b) Legal Analysis review legal basis for establishing any of the three (3) alternative structures the City does not currently have in place.

Fire and EMS Operational Analysis:

- a) Level of Service and Response Time
- b) Requirements to meet standards and operational needs for each staffing model

Future considerations and Overall Costs of Services per model.

The study shall also include identifying specific funding opportunities that may be available for hiring any new personnel.

Final deliverables shall include a report detailing each alternative staffing model, methodology and summary of each individual analysis, and recommendations based on assessment of each alternative. The report will also include a section detailing available funding opportunities for hiring new personnel.



Project Methodology:

The methodology used for this study will be grounded in the recommended best practices of the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), the NFPA Fire Department Profile for small sized emergency service operations, the NFPA Handbook, and the International City/County Management Association (Managing Fire and Emergency Services).

Study Cost:

The total cost for the described scope of work is: **\$8,250.00**; 50% due at first draft, 50% due upon completion of the study.

Receivables:

CSU will provide all relevant materials. All rights, title and interest to any copyrights, patents, trademarks, trade secrets or other intellectual property rights embodied in any Receivables will be the sole and exclusive property of CSU. This license does not include the right to copy the receivables to conduct its own services using the receivables. CSU reserves all rights not expressly granted herein. This paragraph shall survive the expiration or termination of this agreement.

Term & Termination:

This agreement will commence as of the effective date set forth on the signature page and will end until completion of the course and receipt of payment by CSU.

Miscellaneous:

- (a) The parties are independent contractors. Nothing in this agreement creates or implies any joint venture, employer/employee, principal/agent or partnership relationship.
- (b) Each party agrees to be responsible for any negligent acts or negligent omissions by or through itself or its employees and each party further agrees to defend itself and themselves and pay any judgments and costs arising out of such negligent acts or negligent omissions, and nothing in the Agreement shall impute or transfer any such responsibility from one to the other.



- (c) This agreement represents the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes any prior oral or written understandings with respect to the services. Only a written instrument that refers this agreement and that is signed by the authorized representatives of both parties may amend this agreement.
- (d) This agreement and the rights of the parties shall be governed, construed, and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Ohio, without regard for its choice of law principles, and only Ohio courts shall have jurisdiction over any action or proceeding concerning the agreement.
- (e) A waiver by a party of any breach or default by the other party under this agreement shall not constitute a continuing waiver by such party of any subsequent act in breach of or in default hereunder.
- (f) All notices and communications shall be given in writing and shall be deemed to have been properly given when: i) hand delivered with delivery acknowledged in writing; ii) sent by U.S. certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid; or iii) sent by overnight delivery service (Fed Ex, UPS, etc.) with receipt. Notices shall be deemed given upon receipt thereof, and shall be sent to the addresses first set forth below. Any party may change its address for receipt of notices upon notice to the other party. - (g) In the event of any conflict between the terms and provisions of the body of this agreement and any exhibit hereto, the terms and provisions of the body of this agreement shall control.
- (h) The headings in this agreement are for convenient reference only and shall not be considered in any questions of interpretation or construction of this agreement.
- (i) The provisions of this agreement are severable and independent, and if any such provision shall be determined to be unenforceable in whole or in part, the remaining provisions and any partially enforceable provision shall, to the extent enforceable in any jurisdiction, nevertheless be binding and enforceable.
- (j) Both parties will maintain applicable insurance policies with industry standard coverage.
- (j) This agreement is not binding upon Cleveland State University unless executed in full and is effective as of the last date of signature by Cleveland State University.

Study Period:

The period for this work will commence upon this signed agreement and this study will take approximately four (4) months to complete, (120 days) excluding holidays; excluding any unforeseen circumstances by either party involved.
