Mayor Vanni reports that their second K9 officer passed away on June 26. The new K9 officer reached out to Molly because we have the memorial in the back and they have not put up a K9 since 2016 or so. They will get it back together and likely have a ceremony in the fall. Every City in the County can participate and he believes it is about \$125 each. More to come on that.

He swore in the newest part time Lt. for Fire Department last week. He also swore in a part time captain a couple months ago. There was a test for the full time captains and they had two accept. August 11 they will likely swear them in and then do a formal swearing in with families at the September 2nd Council Meeting. Kyle Baker will join next week for Police. Everyone is excited about him coming back. An additional officer in continued commitment for making our safety forces the best in the County.

It looked like an isolated incident, but there was a phishing email that went to businesses last Thursday asking for \$4800. It was a pretty decent fake but they did not pay. IT thinks it was isolated and we were not hacked. We did post a warning on a few Facebook pages though. The good news is we were not hacked.

You might have seen that work started at the median at Shoregate. Maybe Monday? The bad news is it is on hold for a potential sewer issue. Might delay a bit. Will be right turn only there.

Vision 2050 continues to meet to discuss the County's comprehensive plan. There is a survey, Mayor posted it on the website also. He encourages every resident to participate.

Last, Gold Star is having their 5k race July 27 at 9 am. \$35 to register.

Joanne Schilner, 29700 Silven Dr., says she has lived here since 2009. Willowick is a wonderful place to live. It is quiet and peaceful with friendly neighbors. It is very different from many places around. She appreciates living here. Their homes are tightly packed together, barely room for a driveway between,

yet they are able to live harmoniously. Fireworks are illegal in Willowick, but it seems to make no difference to the home owner on Cresthaven who has set off professional grade fireworks for the second year in a row now. What can she, and other neighbors, do to be sure it does not happen again?

Nicolas Koudela, 29529 Cresthaven Dr, says he has lived there on and off for the past 36 years. Claims the other resident has been illegally trespassing and has made accusations she cannot back up.

Ms. Koudela thanks Ms. Schilner for her comments. If you witness fireworks you can call the non-emergency police line. If they witness anything, they can issue a citation for that.

Chief Daubenmire says that particular night, they responded to 27 fireworks complaints. They issued 8 warnings and the rest were unfounded. They were not going off at the time they were there. They did not have to go to a repeated address.

Ms. Koudela says she agrees Willowick is a great place to live. If you have an issue with one of your neighbors, you should reach out individually rather than a public meeting or email.

Ms. Shilner says she attempted to go and speak to the homeowner. She walked to the back of the property where the party was going on and asked to find the homeowner. No one could point her in the correct direction. She lives a block away from her and the amount of noise and disruption was unbelievable. There were fireworks for cities that could have been attended instead. As a council member and council president, you should have more consideration for your neighbors. She states she has videos and other proof.

Ms. Koudela says the other person mentioned he was the sole owner.

WHEREAS, the City of Willowick adopted Res. No. 2025-28 authorizing the temporary advance of \$3,473.56 from the General Fund (101) to the NOPEC Grant Fund (227); and declaring an emergency; and

SECTION 1. The Council hereby authorizes and approves the return of the advanced funds from NOPEC Grant Fund (227) to the General Fund (101) in the amount of \$3,473.56.

SECTION 2. The Finance Director is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to take all actions necessary to effectuate such transfer and evidence the same on the books and financial records of the City.

SECTION 3. All formal actions of this Council concerning the passage of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting, and that all deliberations of this Council, or any of its Committees, which resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 3.12 of the Charter of the City of Willowick, and Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 4. This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, welfare and dignity of the residents of the City of Willowick in that it provides for a return of funds for the daily operations of the municipality.

WHEREFORE, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by Council and approval by the Mayor.

- 3. Transfer of \$8,311.68 from the Emergency Management Agency Fund (221) to the State Highway Fund (203)
- 4. Transfer of \$9,402.87 from the Emergency Management Agency Fund (221) to the Sewer Revenue Fund (205)

SECTION 2. AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 141 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF WILLOWICK, OHIO, TITLED "DIVISION OF FIRE;" SPECIFICALLY, AMENDING SECTION 141.01, TITLED "COMPENSATION; AGE; RANK" AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILLOWICK, COUNTY OF LAKE, STATE OF OHIO:

- <u>Section 1.</u> Chapter 141 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Willowick, Ohio titled "DIVISION OF FIRE;" specifically, Section 141.01 "COMPENSATION; AGE; RANK" is hereby amended to read and provide as follows:
- a) The Division of Fire shall consist of the following officers, in order of rank: Chief, three full-time Captains, four five-part-time Captains, six part-time Lieutenants and a maximum number of fifty-eight, who shall be designated as First Class or Probationary part-time firefighters.
- (b) Upon recommendation of the Chief of Fire and with the approval of the Safety Director, any member of the Fire Division who has up to eighteen months of service as a Probationary firefighter shall advance to First Class firefighter provided he or she has satisfactorily completed all requirements as prescribed by the Training Officer and the Chief of the Division of Fire (c) There shall be no maximum age limitation for an original appointment to the Willowick Fire Department.
- <u>Section 2.</u> The existing Section 141.01 of the City's Codified Ordinances are hereby repealed in that said Section and is suspended by this legislation.
- <u>Section 3.</u> All formal actions of this Council concerning the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting, and that all deliberations of this Council, or any of its Committees, which resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances and Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 2025-11 PROVIDING FOR THE COMPENSATION OF APPOINTED OFFICIALS AND CERTAIN OTHER EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY, AND REPEALING CERTAIN ORDINANCES; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Willowick previously passed Ordinance No. 2025-11, providing for the compensation of appointed officials and certain other employees of the City commencing the first full pay period of 2025; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Willowick, Ohio deems it to be in the best interest of the City and to the orderly operation of all departments of the City to adjust the compensation of certain other employees as set forth in Ordinance No. 2025-11.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Willowick, County of Lake, State of Ohio:

<u>Section 1.</u> That the certain employees listed below shall be paid bi-weekly compensation, effective June 30, 2025 and all following pay periods in accordance with the following rates of pay:

Payroll/Finance Officer...... in the range of One Thousand Eight Hundred Sixty One And Nine Cents (\$1,861.09) to Two Thousand Six Hundred Twenty Three And Ninety Six Cents (\$2,623.96)

<u>Section 2.</u> That all Ordinances or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed, with the specific exception that all other established rates of compensation for the appointed officials and certain other employees set forth in Ordinance No. 2025-11, not modified herein, shall remain in full force and effect.

<u>Section 3.</u> All formal actions of this Council concerning the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting, and that all deliberations of this Council, or any of its Committees, which resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances and Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

<u>Section 4</u>. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, welfare and dignity of the residents of the City of Willowick, insofar as it provides for the usual daily operation of the City and its Fire Department and that it will ensure the orderly and uninterrupted efficient operation of the City.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2005-93 TO IDENTIFY ADDITIONAL PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, on December 28, 2005, this Council approved Ordinance No. 2005-93 (the "Original Ordinance") thereby declaring improvements to parcels of certain real property located in the City (as described and depicted in the Original Ordinance and referred to therein as the "Property") to be a public purpose, exempting those improvements from real property taxation for a period of time, specifying public infrastructure improvements to be made to benefit those parcels, providing for the making of service payments in lieu of taxes by the owner(s) thereof, and establishing a municipal public improvement tax increment equivalent fund into which those service payments were to be deposited; and

WHEREAS, this Council now desires to specify additional public infrastructure improvements that directly benefit or once made will directly benefit the Property; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Willowick, County of Lake, Ohio, that:

- Section 1. The Public Improvements set forth in Exhibit A of the Original Ordinance are hereby supplemented to include the additional Public Improvements identified in Exhibit A attached hereto, which this Council hereby determines directly benefit, or once made will directly benefit, the Property.
- Section 2. Except as provided herein, all other provisions of the Original Ordinance remain in full force and effect.
- Section 3. Pursuant to Section 5709.40 of the Ohio Revised Code, the Clerk of Council is hereby directed to deliver a copy of this Ordinance to the Director of the Ohio Department of Development within fifteen days after its passage.
- Section 4. This Council hereby authorizes and directs the Mayor, the Director of Law, the Director of Finance, or other appropriate officers of the City to prepare and sign all documents and instruments and to take any other actions as may be appropriate to implement this Ordinance.
- Section 5. This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council and of any of its committees concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council or committees, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

Section 6. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, welfare and dignity of the residents of the City of Willowick and therefore shall be in full force and take effect immediately upon its passage by Council and its approval by the Mayor, or at the earliest period allowed by law.

EXHIBIT A

Public Improvements

The Public Improvements consist of any "public infrastructure improvement" defined under ORC 5709.40(A)(8) and that directly benefits the Parcels (as more fully described in Ordinance No. 2005-93) and specifically include, but are not limited to, the following improvements that will directly benefit the Parcels and all related costs of those permanent improvements (including, but not limited to, those costs listed in ORC 133.15(B)):

- **Roadways**. Construction, reconstruction, extension, opening, improving, maintaining, widening, grading, draining, curbing or changing of the lines and traffic patterns of roads, highways, streets, intersections, bridges (both roadway and pedestrian), sidewalks, bikeways, medians and viaducts accessible to and serving the public, and providing signage (including traffic signage and informational/promotional signage), lighting systems, signalization, and traffic controls, and all other appurtenances thereto, including but not limited to a roadways known as E. 293rd Street, Lakeshore Boulevard (OH-293) bounded between E. 293rd Street and Vine Street, and all streets that of which that the noted Parcels front or connect to.
- Water/Sewer. Construction, reconstruction or installation of public utility improvements (including any underground municipally owned utilities), storm and sanitary sewers (including necessary site grading therefore), water and fire protection systems, and all appurtenances thereto.
- **Utilities**. Construction, reconstruction, burial or installation of gas, electric and communication service facilities and all appurtenances thereto, including, but not limited to those associated with improvements described in "Roadways" above.
- **Stormwater**. Construction, reconstruction, relocation, modification and installation of stormwater and flood remediation projects and facilities, both for storm water quantity and quality, including the payment and reimbursement for such projects and facilities on private property when determined to be necessary for public health, safety and welfare, including, but not limited to stormwater improvements in conjunction with and along the roadway improvements described in "Roadways" above.
- Streetscape/Landscape. Construction or installation of streetscape and landscape improvements including trees, tree grates, signage, curbs, sidewalks, scenic fencing, street and sidewalk lighting, trash receptacles, benches, newspaper racks, burial of overhead utility lines and related improvements, together with all appurtenances thereto, including, but not limited to streetscape improvements in conjunction with and along the roadway improvements described in "Roadways" above.

- **Real Estate**. Acquisition of real estate or interests in real estate (including easements) (a) necessary to accomplish any of the foregoing improvements or (b) in aid of industry, commerce, distribution or research, including acquisition of interests in the Parcels.
- **Professional Services**. Engineering, consulting, legal, administrative, and other professional services associated with the planning, design, acquisition, construction and installation of the foregoing improvements and real estate.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 155 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF WILLOWICK, OHIO, TITLED "EMPLOYEES GENERALLY;" SPECIFICALLY, AMENDING SECTION 155.07, TITLED "SICK LEAVE; FUNERAL LEAVE" AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILLOWICK, COUNTY OF LAKE, STATE OF OHIO:

<u>Section 1.</u> Chapter 155 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Willowick, Ohio titled "EMPLOYEES GENERALLY;" specifically, Section 155.07 "SICK LEAVE; FUNERAL LEAVE" is hereby amended to read and provide as follows:

- (a) Each full-time employee of the City or any department thereof, whether paid on a salary or on an hourly rate basis, shall be entitled, for each completed month of service to the City, to be absent for one and one-fourth work days with pay for the reasons specified in subsection (d) hereof. For the purposes of this section, a total of 170 160 hours of work within any one calendar month shall be considered as one month of full-time employment. However, in computing such total of 170 160 hours in any calendar month, no deduction shall be made for the absence of an employee due to illness of or injury to the employee, which illness or injury shall be established by the evidence required by subsection (d) hereof, or due to paid vacations or legal holidays.
- (b) Compensation to be allowed for such days of sick leave actually taken by an employee of the City paid at an hourly rate shall be on the same basis to which the employee would have been entitled as compensation for his usual service if it had been performed on such days. The daily sick leave pay of a salaried employee shall be computed by dividing the annual salary of such employee by the number of work days in a calendar year.
- (c) Unused sick leave may be accumulated for a total of 210 work days. Unused sick leave may be accumulated without limit. However, as provided in 155.07(f), after 10 years of full time employment, death or injury resulting in total and permanent disability, no employee shall be paid for more than 120 accumulated unused sick days.
- (d) When approved by the Mayor, an employee of the City may use sick leave as provided for in subsection (a) hereof for absence due to illness, injury, exposure to contagious disease which could be communicated to other employees and to illness or death in the employee's immediate family. In addition to the foregoing, an employee shall be allowed, without deduction from accumulated sick leave, three days in the event of the death of any of the following relatives of such employee or his or her spouse: spouse, child, parent, brother or sister. However, no employee shall be entitled to sick leave or compensation therefor unless he or she first furnishes an affidavit satisfactory to the Mayor showing the duration of his or her absence and that such absence was the result of one of such causes and, in addition, if the Mayor so requires, a certificate of the attending physician, likewise satisfactory to the

Mayor, confirming the facts recited in such affidavit. If such absence extends for more than seven consecutive days, such an affidavit and such a certificate, if the Mayor requires the latter, shall be furnished on the seventh day of such absence and once each seven days thereafter. Nothing contained in this section shall be construed to authorize sick leave with pay for any sickness or accident resulting from moral turpitude, intoxication or use of narcotics.

- (e) Except as provided in subsection (f) hereof, sick leave credit shall be effective only during such time as an employee remains in the employ of the City and no employee shall be entitled to compensation in any form for any unused sick leave credit remaining upon the termination of his employment with the City. However, the previously accumulated sick leave of an employee whose employment with the City has been terminated may, with the approval of the Mayor, be placed to his credit in the event of his re-employment by the City within a period of three years from the date of his last employment by the City.
- (f) After ten years of full-time employment with the City, and upon the retirement, death or injury resulting in total and permanent disability to perform the work for the City for which such employee was employed, of any employee of the City, there shall be paid an amount representing any previously accumulated sick leave at such employee's then current rate of compensation, up to a total of 120 work days, as follows:
 - (1) In case of retirement, with the exception of an employee who is a re- employed retirant as defined in Ohio R.C. 145.381, to the employee. A re- employed retirant shall not be entitled to be paid the amount representing any previously accumulated sick leave at such employee's then current rate of compensation until such time as the employee is no longer a re-employed retirant.
 - (2) In case of death, to the employee's surviving spouse, if any, who was living with such employee or dependent upon him for support at the time of his death, or, if there is no surviving spouse, to the dependent children, including adopted children, of such employee or for their use to their legal guardian or guardians or to the person or persons who, as determined by the Mayor, were dependent upon such employee for support or for their use to their legal guardian or guardians or to the person or persons with whom they are living. The determination of the Mayor as to the person or persons entitled to receive any payment in accordance with this subsection shall be final and neither the Mayor nor the City nor any other officer or employee thereof shall be required to see to the proper expenditure of any such payments.
 - (3) In case of injury resulting in total and permanent disability to perform the work for the City for which such employee was employed, to the employee or for his use to the guardian or conservator of his estate, if any, or to the person or persons having custody and care of such employee, if any, provided that the determination of the Mayor as to the person or persons entitled to receive any payment in accordance with this subsection shall be final and neither the Mayor nor the City nor any other officer or

employee thereof shall be required to see to the proper expenditure of any such payment.

- (g) An employee of any public agency who transfers his employment from such public agency to the City shall be credited with the unused balance of his accumulated sick leave with such public agency, provided that such balance is evidenced to the satisfaction of the Mayor by an appropriate certificate or letter from an appropriate official of such public agency. Transferred leave may only be used as sick leave, after the employee has exhausted sick leave accrued with the City. No employee shall be compensated for any sick leave transferred from another public agency upon the conclusion of his employment from the City for any reason.
- (h) An employee of this City whose compensation has been funded by any State or Federal funded program who transfers his employment to the City shall be credited with the unused balance of his accumulated sick leave with such State or Federal agency, provided that such balance .is evidenced by an appropriate certificate or letter from an appropriate official of such agency. Transferred leave may only be used as sick leave, after the employee has exhausted sick leave accrued with the City. No employee shall be compensated for any sick leave transferred from another public agency upon the conclusion of his employment from the City for any reason.
- (i) Except as provided in subsection (c) hereof, the City shall grant an eligible employee up to twelve weeks leave during a twelve-month period in accordance with the provisions of the Family and Medical Leave Act. Accrued paid vacation, compensatory time off, holiday leave or sick leave time (if medically required) shall be utilized first and shall count towards the twelve-week period.
- <u>Section 2.</u> The existing Section 155.07 of the City's Codified Ordinances are hereby repealed in that said Section and is suspended by this legislation.

<u>Section 3.</u> All formal actions of this Council concerning the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting, and that all deliberations of this Council, or any of its Committees, which resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Chapter 107 of the Codified Ordinances and Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, welfare and dignity of the residents of the City of Willowick and therefore shall be in full force and take effect immediately upon its passage by Council and its approval by the Mayor, or at the earliest period allowed by law.

A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE AUTHORIZATIONS (THEN AND NOW CERTIFICATE) TO LAKE COUNTY TELECOMMUNICATIONS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$4,525.45 FOR THE CITY OF WILLOWICK, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code 5705.41(D)(1) provides that if prior certification of funds by the Fiscal Officer was not obtained before the contract or order involving the expenditure of money was made, then the Fiscal Officer may instead certify; and

WHEREAS, that there was at the time of the making of such contract or order and at the time of the execution of such certificate, a sufficient sum appropriated for the purpose of such contract and in the treasury or in process of collection to the credit of an appropriate fund, free from any previous encumbrances; and

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Officer is accordingly certifying that there were appropriations available and funds in the treasury or in the process of collection at the time the contract or order was made (then), and there are still sufficient appropriations and funds in the treasury or in the process of collection at the time the certificate is being issued (now); and

WHEREAS, the amount of the certificate exceeds \$3,000.00.

Section 1.
