

<u>Minutes</u>	A. 1/12/22 minutes approved (all in favor)
Public Comment	A. N/A
Welcome & Presentation- Graham JASO	A. Graham Morris of JASO (The Japan-America Society of Oregon) gave a presentation on the organization and how the board can get involved in the future.
	JASO is a 501c3 organization whose mission is "to support business and develop community by strengthening the US-Japan relationship" – established in 1907, JASO is the third oldest JAS in the United States. JASO is a membership organization and is volunteer driven, with 2 full-time and 1 part-time staff.
	Graham mentioned several workshops and events that JASO is putting on in the near future and encouraged the board to consider attending.
	Opportunities to Explore:  Education Committee: Elementary Classroom Visits "Japan on the Road"-education committee (2-hour curriculum) grant funded (WLWV not enrolled) High School "Pacific Northwest Japan Bowl" – WLWV High School not enrolled Culture Committee- Sammy is a member! Shinnenkai, Beer Garden, Movie Nights Membership Committee- 150 Japanese companies in Oregon that have some sort of bricks and mortar (soy sauce factory in Salem) Workplace Language and Culture: presentations on workplace culture in japan (*could be a good fit for us to take this presentation)
	JASO Memberships available for groups/boards/organizations JASO is not currently working/collaborating with any other Sister City Boards or Orgs. Graham showed the JASO website which features a sister city map component.
	Dave expressed the need for the board to be more connected with the business community, and asked Graham if JASO had experience with importing Japanese products and introducing them to the greater Portland/Oregon community. Graham said that while JASO is not an economic development center or a chamber of commerce, they do work with many people in the business community. Graham

	explained that JASO helps make connections with the Japan/American community and local Japanese businesses such as a Japanese dentist, a Japanese hair dresser, where do the Japanese kids go to school, etc helps families settle in.
	This is a cool company Sammy mentioned that has sponsored JASO events in the past- could be a cool connection for us to make - <a href="https://kirikomade.com/">https://kirikomade.com/</a> (I need to go here ASAP)
	Adrienne requested more information on how the programs like 'japan on the road' and 'japan bowl' etc are getting into the schools. Graham explained that it's usually the school that makes the request. The request form is online. This could be something that we approach the schools about after we learn a little bit more about the program.
	FYI- we are now bronze members of JASO listed under Wilsonville-Kitakata Sister City Advisory Board
Budget Review	A. Seiji - \$1743 had been spent at the time of this meeting. (total budget is \$20,000)
	Ashleigh mentioned the 35 <sup>th</sup> anniversary of the sister city relationship will be coming up in October 2022, and is something to think about purchasing for during this fiscal year (fiscal year runs July 1 – June 30)
	Other notes: funds do not accrue. If we do not use the full amount in our budget, the money will go back into the general fund. Erica has requested the full \$20,000 for the 22/23 budget year.
Survey Review	<ul> <li>A. Adrienne shared a draft survey she created in google forms. She created one for Wilsonville residents and one for Kitakata residents.</li> </ul>
	Comments: Erica mentioned Let's Talk Wilsonville! As an opportunity to post surveys for the Wilsonville community. You can find that community interface here: <a href="https://www.letstalkwilsonville.com/">https://www.letstalkwilsonville.com/</a>
	Dave requested that some terminology be added to the survey that says 'short term host' – this will help clarify that we are looking for host families to welcome a student for about 10 days to two weeks. (a lot of folks seem to think this is a much longer commitment)
	We will likely use Hanae to help translate the survey into kanji.
	Follow-up: Adrienne will continue to tweak the survey and then will send to Erica. Erica will then review and send the survey out to all board members for further comment.
Review of School Meetings	A. All board members expressed a lot of positive feedback about the school meetings.     Erica has a follow up meeting with Tomita san and Hanae to review the meetings and talk next steps.


