#### 5. Heart of the City Storefront (Sandi Williams)

## **Explained Services provided**

- Metrics of services and giving.
- Reasons for requested change for storefront.
- Discussed concerns about volunteers.
- Questions regarding CEP request for \$20,000.
- Understanding that the contractor will donate time, but concerned about not having plans.

Timing may not be quite right. Would be helpful to have a more firm project. There is not a layout for building. It was suggested that they look into Clackamas County recovery funds, supportive services, and metro money.

## 6. Library Book Bike (Katie Howe)

- Reach new users.
- Attract broader community.
- Friends of the Wilsonville Library would obtain insurance for the bike.
- Staff to determine books. Hold up to 200 books.
- Staff would be assigned to outreach with the bike.
- Why this over other programs? Eco friendly related to patrons, visibility and branding of the library.
- Range is farther with electric assist.
- What is the success of the project? Other programs did not like trailer. Specialized bike would be customized.

#### 7. Memorial Park Skate Park Mural (Erika Valentine)

- Overview of public art.
- ACHS Strategy overview and overview of recommendation and findings.
- Working on City art policy.
- Why skate park? Availability to all community members.
- Mural affordable.
- City has more stand-alone art.
- Design, time, as well as fee for materials are included in project cost.
- Overview of timeline was presented.
- Mural lifespan is 10 years. Part of the contract would make the mural City property.

# 8. Watching Wilsonville's Wildlife (Kerry Rappold)

- Overview of project on city/school district property.
- On-line platform development to share with community members.
- Student place, nature-based learning.
- Educate community about wildlife in the community.
- Shared location:
  - 2 school district properties (not accessible to students)
  - 2 along Willamette (Boones Ferry/Memorial Park)
  - o 2 Boechman Creek corridor
- Engage with students field guide will describe the habitat.
- Cost of working with consultant, Samara Group, for greater coverage.
- Cameras/accessories will be city-owned.

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- Info on how to use the project long term.
- Cameras at school on the edge of the property and Grahams Oaks areas/animal/wildlife corridor.
- Open to sharing at the Library. Could work with the Library on a display for a presentation.
- Cost per camera was outlined.
- Suitable in the future by SMART/WES Station and Charbonneau.
- More expensive camera needed to get online. Would need to find high use areas.
- Possible to put pictures online/City newsletter. Possibly create ways to make materials available on Natural Resources page.

#### 9. Murase Arboretum (Dustin Schull)

- Outline of parks projects completed.
- Update on trail project behind schedule due to engineering.
- Arboretum in the master plan (Boones Ferry Park).
  - o Presentation and protection of trees
  - o Community-based to bring in to select trees
- Outline of trees that exist in the area.
- Move Arboretum Project Master Plan from Boones Ferry Park to Murase. Better location.
- Information about the tree and unique facts about each tree.
- Learn about trees. Seek community member input for tree selection.
- Need funding for starting the project.
- QR code is possible on sign.
- Need for care and long term viability. City has an arborist on staff. Need to care for the land.

Metro Councilor Rosenthal made a motion made to defer discussion and decision to the Committee's May 30 meeting. Councilor Linville seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.
