	Erica described an important distinction that she realized from these meetings. It has become clear through recent interaction that there are two groups in Kitakata that we are now working with. A City Hall/International Association group and a High School Group. The group coming in December is organized by the School District, not the sister city association which is why there's a big difference in ages of the students. Erica made the group aware that we need to be a bit more careful how we move forward with projects so that one group doesn't feel valued more than the other does. It was not originally made clear that the group coming in December was not part of the international/sister city association with City Hall.
