Any citizen shall have a reasonable opportunity to be heard at any and all meetings of the Platinum Roads Panel in regard to: (1) any and all matters to be considered at any such meeting, or (2) any matter a citizen may wish to bring to the Platinum Roads Panel's attention. No member of the Governing Body may discuss or comment on any citizen public comment, except to make: (1) a statement of specific factual information given in response to the inquiry, or (2) a recitation of existing policy in response to the inquiry. Any deliberation of or decision about the subject of the inquiry shall be limited to a proposal to place the subject on the agenda for a subsequent meeting per Texas Local Government code Sec. 551.042.

Citizen comments will be allowed at the beginning of every meeting, or alternatively, before an item on the agenda on which the citizen wishes to speak is to be considered. All citizens will be allowed to comment for three (3) minutes per person and shall be allowed more time at the Mayor's discretion. In addition, citizens may pool their allotted speaking time. To pool time, a speaker must present the names of three (3) individuals present in the audience who wish to yield their three minutes. Citizens may present materials regarding any agenda item to the City Secretary at or before a meeting, citizens attending any meeting are requested to complete a form providing their name, address, and agenda item/concern, but are not required to do so before speaking and presenting it to the City Secretary prior to the beginning of such meeting. Comments may only be disallowed and/or limited as per Government Code § 551.007(e).

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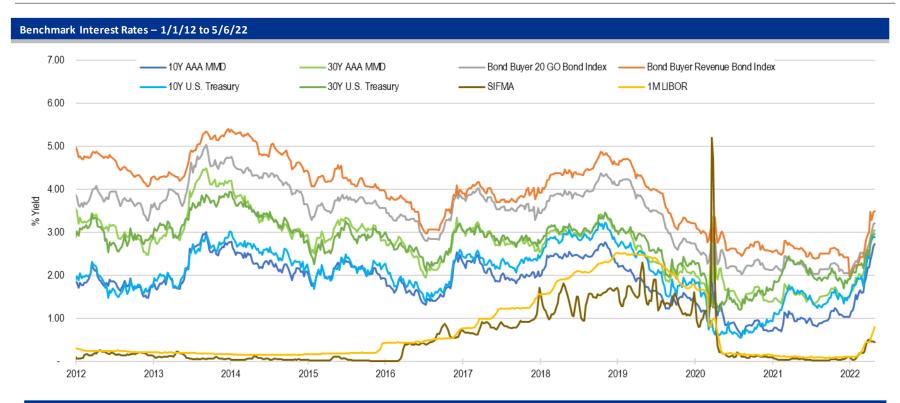

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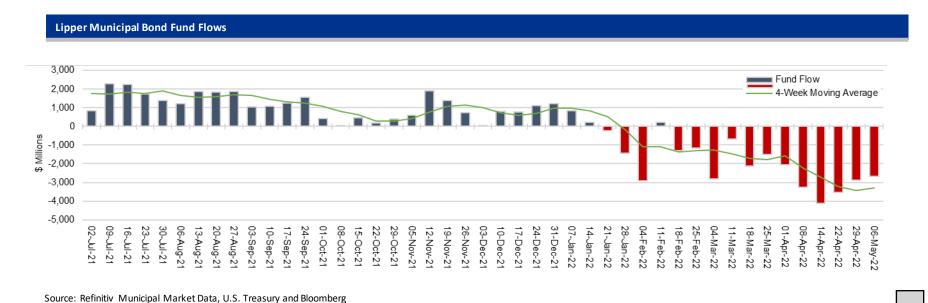

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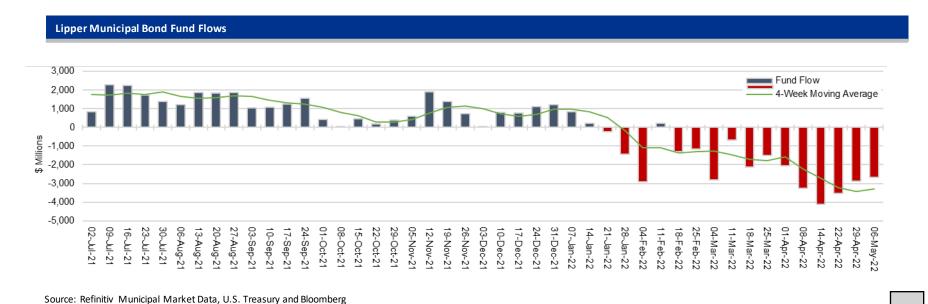

Potential Sources for Additional Revenues –

- Increased Sales Taxes
 - sales taxes may not be collected from businesses in the ETJ without an annexation of the property.
- Hotel Occupancy Taxes Short Term Rentals, small hotel in the City, restaurant within City limits
 - These must be weighed against citizens' response to the survey and past events. City of Woodcreek attempted to collect HOT in the ETJ in the past was not successful.
- Annexation would yield additional ad valorem taxes
 - Current law prohibiting annexation other than voluntary
- Grants
 - Match requirements most grants require a match of 20 to 25%

Revenue Issues to Consider :

- Ad Valorem Taxes Impact. As a residential community with little land left for development within city limits, any future activities that require funding would impact ad valorem taxes and could represent a financial burden on some of our citizens
 - ✓ Must look for options for additional revenue sources.
- Sales Tax Revenue. Considering the citizens' responses to CP Survey regarding development in the ETJ with "none" being the #2 answer, what are our options to introduce opportunities for additional sources of income, preferably from a source other than ad valorem taxes?
 - ✓ would the citizens reconsider their position if we were to propose lowimpact businesses that preserve the character of the City? If the business is in the ETJ, the revenue from sales taxes would be limited unless the business were to seek voluntary annexation of the property to the City. This option would require negotiations, including certain concessions from the City.
 - ✓ If yes, to above, should part of the fiscal/financial portion of the CP include or propose a plan to encourage small business development? This could include some small businesses within the City limits that do not affect the character of the community. We already have some small home-based businesses within City limits that are collecting sales taxes.
- Hotel occupancy taxes (HOT). Both in the Survey and during meetings and public hearings held in 2020, residents expressed opposition to short-term rentals within the City of Woodcreek.
 - ✓ Considering HOT as a potential source of additional revenues must take into consideration the citizens' expressed disapproval of short-term rentals.
- Other Funding Sources. What other funding sources may be available to the City?
 Annexation of areas in our ETJ where sales tax revenues are already available (lodge, swimming hole, others?). How would we go about it?
 - ✓ We are further limited in the area of annexation as a result of last session's legislation - in the past cities could approach areas in the ETJ to discuss annexation. Now, the communication must begin with those in the area approaching the city.

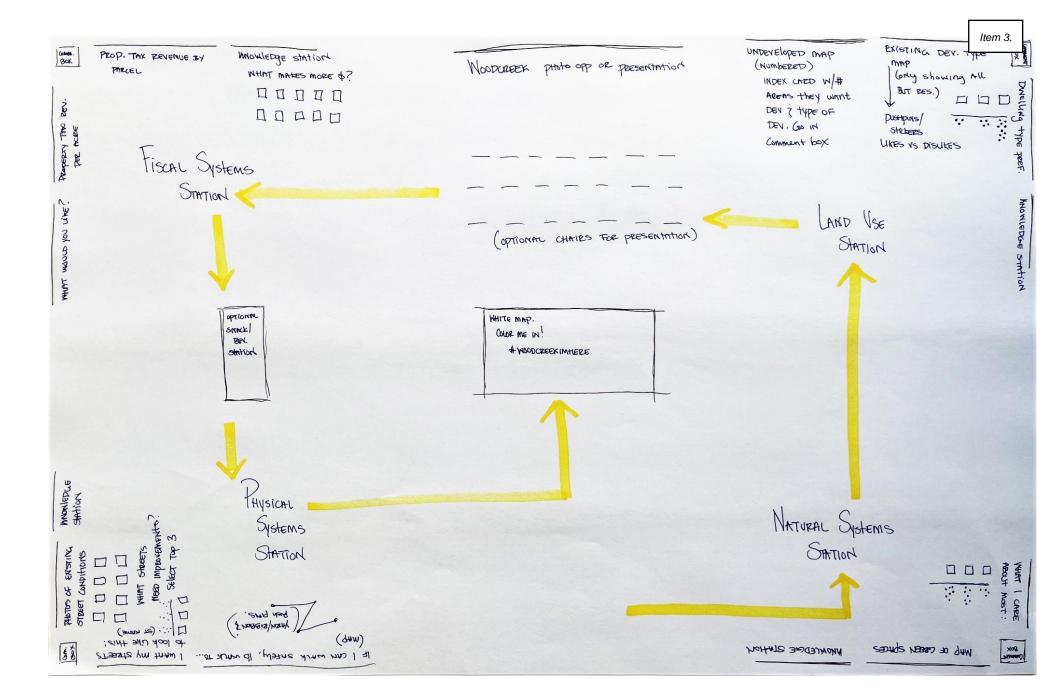
- <u>Desired Improvements Identified on Comprehensive Plan Survey:</u>
 - Physical Systems #1 concern is the City streets. This includes drainage, traffic calming, walking safety (sidewalks, trails)
 - Others?
 - Parks and Green Areas
 - More parks, including parks with amenities for children and adults
 - More green areas protect natural resources
 - Trails
 - Others?
 - Roads it is necessary to explore financing options as the current reserves and revenues are insufficient to fund the required repairs and improvements. In the earlier meetings of the Fiscal Systems Focus Workgroup, the group reviewed options available for financing and impact on citizens' ad valorem taxes.
 - Some of the financing options reviewed by the focus workgroup included tax notes and a bond issue. The workgroup considered that a bond may be the best alternative, if approved by the citizens, to repair (and in some cases replace) the roads.
 - Others?
 - <u>Parks and Green Spaces</u> the workgroup discussed options to finance, including grants that may be available and donations. Some of these include:
 - Texas Parks & Wildlife Opportunities
 - Lower Colorado River Authority community grants offered every six months with ceiling of \$50,000 per grant.
 - Donations consider the formation of a 501(c)(3) "Friends of the Parks" organization to raise funds and receive donations.
 - Others?

<u>Ultimate Goal for Focus Workgroup</u>: To meet future requirements and improvements Identified by citizens the Fiscal Systems Workgroup must develop a budget that includes an estimate of needed or desired improvements and features, potential sources of revenue or funding options. This budget is dependent on input from other focus groups.

Next Steps and Goals:

- 1. Set a plan for next steps of this focus group.
- 2. Continue participation in Comprehensive Plan workgroup obtain additional data from focus groups to begin financial analysis.

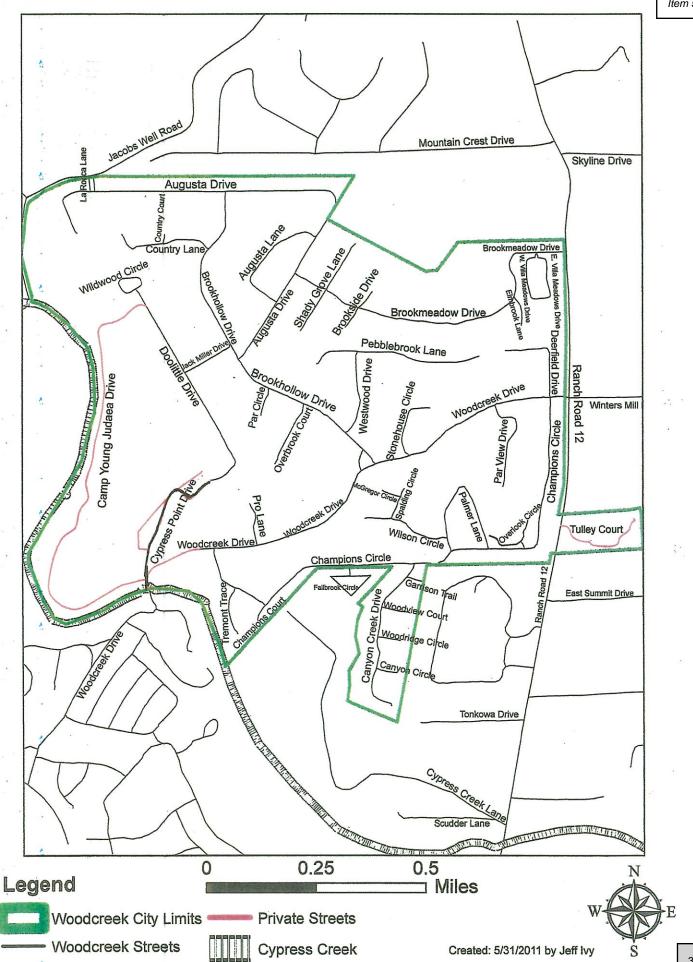

- The knowledge station will educate the viewer by giving them the purpose and importance of each system.
- The existing conditions section will most likely be the maps we created or photos showing the current conditions of Woodcreek.
- The feedback section is where we will collect data from each person with a series of interactive questions.

We also would like to have a comment box in each section just in case people would like to make remarks on other things related to the associated station.

There are three other stations that are optional.

- 5. Color Me In map. This blank white map would be placed in the center of the room. There would be colored markers on the table where people that participated can color in their lot/parcel. The purpose of this is to give the participant a sense of belonging and leaves their mark, like a signature, on this project. It makes them feel involved. It also gives the city staff knowledge of what areas of the city are actively involved and what areas of the city need more community outreach to grow public participation.
- 6. Snack and Beverage bar. We thought it would be nice to highlight a local business and have them serve light snacks and beverages. Just a suggestion! This not only promotes them but builds the relationship between the city, the local business, and the community members.
- 7. Woodcreek Photo Opportunity. Because people love to take photos, we thought it would be a fun way to promote what's going on in the community with a photo opportunity station. The hashtag used can be #WoodcreekImHere or something else to make people feel involved. Another option for this station can be where Brandon and I can give a presentation, if need be. We thought the stations would do a good job educating the community, therefore the presentation was not needed.

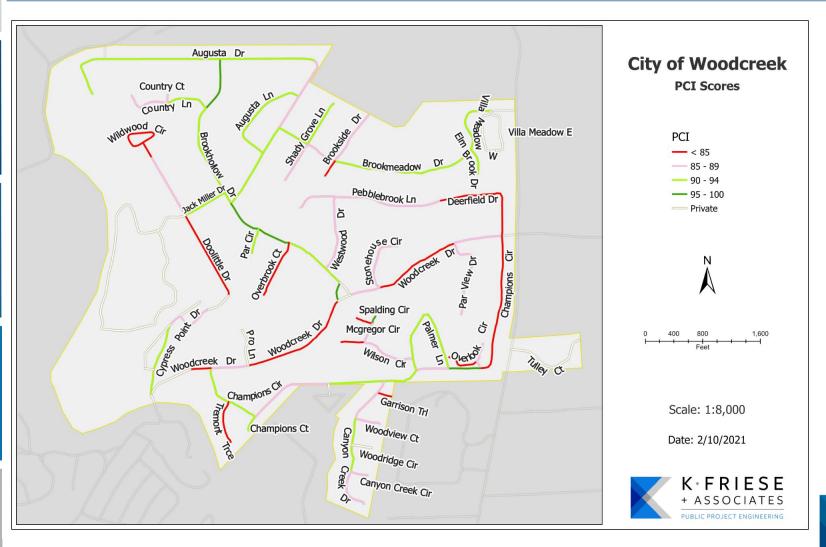


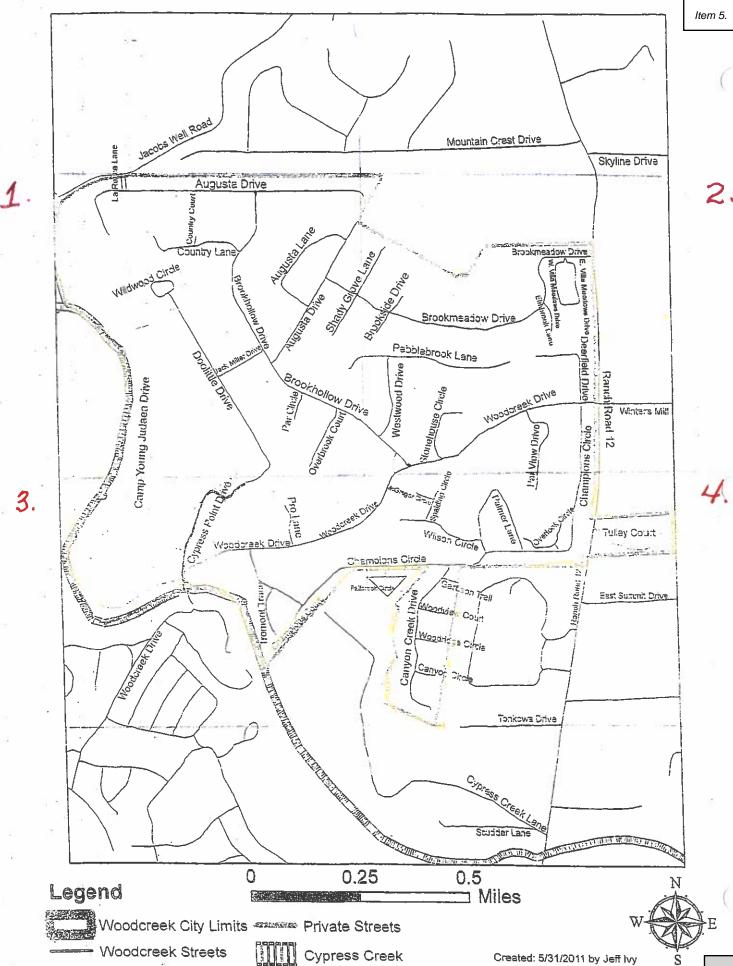
