1. The City of Woodcreek has received an application from Mr. Todd A. Mackenzie of 24 Canyon Creek Drive, Woodcreek, Texas 78676 requesting a variance to City of Woodcreek, Ordinance §156.057 that states: "(A) No wall, fence, planter or hedge in excess of two feet high shall be erected or maintained nearer to the front lot line than the front building setback line, nor on corner lots nearer to the street side lot line than the building setback line parallel to the side street. No rear fence, wall or hedge and no side fence, wall or hedge located between the side building line and the interior lot line (or located on the interior lot line) shall be more than six feet high. For multifamily districts (MF-1 and MF-2) adjacent and contiguous to single-family districts (SF-1 through SF-6), perimeter fences along shared district boundaries may not exceed eight feet height from grade." The variance is to request a fence that will be eight feet high.

a. Staff Briefing.

City Manager Rule read the third paragraph in the Staff Memorandum:

Before voting on whether or not to grant the Variance Request, The Board of Adjustments must hold a public hearing. The Public hearing was published at least 15 days prior to September 13th and letters were mailed to property owners within 200 feet of the property 10 days prior to September 13th. At this time, Staff has not received any objection to the request.

City Manager Rule stated that the City had not received any objections and made the recommendation that the Board of Adjustments approve the Variance.

CDPP grants are awarded twice a year for capital projects for volunteer fire departments, emergency responders, cities and counties, schools, libraries, civic groups, museums and other tax-exempt nonprofit organizations. The projects must benefit or be available to an entire community and must improve the value of a capital asset by building, renovating or purchasing equipment.

Examples of recent awards include funding for emergency equipment for first responders; improvements to fire stations, parks, libraries and community centers; energy-efficient lighting and electrical upgrades for museums and community sports fields; air conditioning units for convention centers; rainwater catchment systems; and roof repairs and handicapped-accessible ramps for local museums and community halls.

Online grant applications are available in January and July.

Applicants requesting more than \$5,000 in grant funding must supply matching funds of at least 20 percent of the total project cost. Grants larger than \$25,000 are intended for particularly impressive and noteworthy projects with a far-reaching impact on a broad community. The larger grant category is extremely competitive, as funding in the \$25,000+ category is limited to 30 percent of the grants awarded. There is a minimum request of \$1,000.

The CDPP program places emphasis on projects for volunteer fire departments and those that address needs caused by wildfires or drought conditions, or include water conservation, energy efficiency or educational components.

Upon written application, submitted at least seventy-two (72) hours prior to the start of the proposed exempted construction, landscaping or construction-related activities, the City Administrator may issue a temporary waiver of these regulations for a period of up to seventy-two (72) hours to allow for time sensitive construction, landscaping, or construction-related activities. (§ 151.10)

The City's Water Quality Protection Ordinance provides a maximum limitation of 30% impervious cover (§ 50.37).

All construction shall begin within 30 days of permit. Residential Structure Additions must be completed within 2 months of the issuance of the permit. (§151.10 (E)) Residential Accessory Building construction must be completed within 3 months of the issuance of the permit. (§ 151.10 (D))



§ 156.057 FENCES.

- (A) No wall, fence, planter or hedge in excess of two feet high shall be erected or maintained nearer to the front lot line than the front building setback line, nor on corner lots nearer to the street side lot line than the building setback line parallel to the side street. No rear fence, wall or hedge and no side fence, wall or hedge located between the side building line and the interior lot line (or located on the interior lot line) shall be more than six feet high. For multifamily districts (MF-1 and MF-2) adjacent and contiguous to single-family districts (SF-1 through SF-6), perimeter fences along shared district boundaries may not exceed eight feet height from grade.
- (B) No object or thing which obstructs sight lines at elevations between two and six feet above the roadways and within the triangular area formed by intersecting street property lines and a line connecting them at points 25 feet from the intersection of the street lines (or extensions thereof) shall be placed, planted or permitted to remain on corner lots. Wood fences are prohibited on lot lines contiguous or abutting a golf course where the wood fence would be visible from the golf course. All fences contiguous or abutting a golf course shall not obstruct sight lines of the golf course and shall be constructed of panels of a metal product manufactured for the purpose of residential fencing and shall be a minimum of four feet and a maximum of six feet in height.
- (C) Fencing materials not allowed are chain link, hog wire, barbed wire, vinyl, rebar, rolled wire, cable, mesh netting, rolled picket or similar materials; except that, Small-Animal Fencing, as that term is defined herein, may be used if its principal fencing support structure consists of metal. Small-animal fencing means metal fencing with opening spacing between the wires no more than two inches by three inches that matches the color and architecture of the principal fencing to which it is attached. Approved small-animal fencing may not exceed 50 percent of the height of the approved or existing principal fencing.
- (D) Should a non-conforming fence or non-conforming portion of a fence be damaged by any means to an extent of more than 50 percent of its replacement cost at the time of destruction, it shall not be reconstructed, except in conformity with this chapter.
- (E) A fence permit will be issued by the City upon completion of a Type II Residential Permit Application and submittal of required fees in accordance with the Master Rate Schedule as adopted by resolution of the City of Woodcreek. A copy of an approved Type II Residential Fence Permit must be visibly displayed during active construction and until completion of any fence permitted by the City. This permit will expire 60 days from date of issuance.
- (F) Penalty. Any person violating any provision of this section shall be subject to the penalties and provisions set forth in § 10.99 of this Code of Ordinances.

ORDINANCE NO. 20230720-156

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING CITY CODE SECTION 9-4-41 RELATING TO BARBED WIRE FENCES; AMENDING CITY CODE SECTION 25-2-899 RELATING TO FENCE DESIGN; AND CREATING AN OFFENSE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

PART 1. City Code Section 9-4-41(*Restriction on Use of Barbed Wire Fences*) is repealed.

PART 2. Code Section 25-2-899 (*Fences as Accessory Uses*) is amended to read as follows:

- (A) Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, a fence:
 - (1) is permitted as an accessory use in any zoning district; and
 - (2) must comply with the requirements of this section.
- (B) In this section:
 - (1) an ornamental fence is a fence with an open design that has a ratio of solid material to open space of not more than one to four; and
 - (2) a solid fence is a fence other than an ornamental fence.
- (C) The height restrictions of this section do not apply to an ornamental fence.
- (D) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a solid fence constructed along a property line may not exceed a [an average] height of six feet measured from the natural grade up [or a maximum height of seven feet].
- (E) If there is a change in grade of at least one foot measured along any run of a solid fence along a property line, then the portion of the fence where the grade change occurs may be constructed to a maximum height of seven feet.
- $(\underline{F})[\underline{E}]$ A solid fence along a property line may be constructed to a maximum height of eight feet if each owner of property that adjoins a section of the

fence that exceeds a height of six feet files a written consent to the construction of the fence with the building official, and:

- (1) there is a change in grade of at least two feet within 50 feet of the boundary between adjoining properties; or
- (2) a structure, including a telephone junction box, exists that is reasonably likely to enable a child to climb over a six foot fence and gain access to a hazardous situation, including a swimming pool.
- (G)[F] A solid fence may be constructed to a maximum of eight feet in height if the fence is located on or within the building setback lines.
- (<u>H</u>)[G] <u>A[a]</u> solid fence may be constructed to a height of eight feet if the fence is located between a residential use and:
 - (1) property zoned as a commercial or industrial base district;
 - (2) property used for a commercial or industrial use; or
 - (3) an alley that separates a residential use and:
 - (a) property zoned as a commercial or industrial base district; or
 - (b) property used for a commercial or industrial use.
- (I) Except as provided in Paragraph (1), a fence shall be constructed in accordance with this subsection.
 - (1) This subsection does not apply to a fence that:
 - (a) was constructed before July 31, 2023; or
 - (b) is more than six feet in height and located on a property with a non-residential use.
 - (2) When more than 50 percent of the total linear distance of an existing fence is replaced, the entire fence must comply with this subsection.

- (3) For new or replacement fences that follow historic design standards, this subsection will control if there is a conflict with the historic design standards.
- (4) A fence may not include:
 - (a) spiked pickets, spiked bars, or other spiked decorative elements above the top horizontal backer rail;
 - (b) vertical pickets above the top horizontal backer rail if the vertical pickets are separated by more than two inches and less than nine inches;
 - (c) razor-like wire; or
 - (d) barbed wire unless the fence is enclosing an airport or other landing area for aircraft and the use of barbed wire is required by Federal Aviation Administration regulation.
- (5) A fence that creates a substantial risk of entrapment or impalement is prohibited.
- (6) A solid chain link fence shall use knuckle selvage.
- (J) A fence used as a swimming pool barrier shall comply with Chapter 25-12, Article 14 (Swimming Pool and Spa Code).

PART 3. This ordinance takes effect on July 31, 2023.

§156.057 (A) No wall, fence, planter or hedge in excess of two feet high shall be erected or maintained nearer to the front lot line than the front building setback line, nor on corner lots nearer to the street side lot line than the building setback line parallel to the side street. Brookmeadow Street Designation Sign Proposal for Recommendation to Move

- The street designation sign for Brookmeadow at RR12 is set back off the corner of the road and placed on the speed limit sign.
- This is NOT typical nor appropriate placement.
- It is causing issues for the businesses located in that area. They have requested this move.





Information for placement of road name signs:

- In residential areas, at least one Street Name sign should be mounted at each intersection.
- Signs naming both streets should be installed at each intersection.
- They should be mounted with their faces parallel to the streets they name.
- Street Name signs may also be placed above a regulatory or STOP or YIELD sign with no required vertical separation.
