CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Matthew Porter called the regular meeting to order at 6:06 p.m. The following City Council members were present: Councilman David R. Duke, Mayor *pro tem* Jeff Forrester, Councilman Scott Williams, Councilman Timothy T. Wallis, and Councilman Garrett Mize. Councilman Dave Strang was absent.

Staff present included: Interim City Manager Brent Parker; Assistant City Manager Renae Ollie; Assistant Police Chief Tommy Walters; Budget Manager Debbie Przyby; Fire Chief Brandon Blythe; Parks and Recreation Director Rob Diaz; Public Information Officer Craig Kelly; Planning Manager Jasen Haskins; Project Engineer Jenneen Elkhalid; Purchasing Manager Glenna Hayes; Public Works Director Tommy Weir; City Secretary Stephanie Storm; and various support staff.

INVOCATION & PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor pro tem Forrester led the invocation, and Mayor Porter led the Pledge of Allegiance.

PRESENTATIONS & RECOGNITIONS

PR1. Recognition of Public Procurement Month - March 2022

Mayor Porter presented a proclamation proclaiming March 2022 as Public Procurement Month in Wylie, Texas. Purchasing Manager Glenna Hayes was present to accept the Proclamation.

Council Action

A motion was made by Councilman Mize, seconded by Councilman Duke, to approve Consent Agenda Items A and C as presented. A vote was taken and motion passed 6-0 with Councilman Strang absent.

REGULAR AGENDA

B. Consider, and act upon, Ordinance No. 2022-24 an ordinance of the City Council of the City of Wylie, Texas, declaring unopposed candidates in the May 7, 2022 General City Election, elected to office; canceling the election; providing a severability clause; and providing an effective date.

Council Comments

Mayor Porter requested staff give additional information on the cancelation of the May election. City Secretary Storm reported that the candidate filing and write-in period had passed, and there was an uncontested race for both Places 1 and 3. Mayor *pro tem* Forrester asked what the cost savings is. Storm replied roughly \$40,000-\$50,000.

Council Action

A motion was made by Councilman Williams, seconded by Councilman Duke, to approve Items B as presented. A vote was taken and motion passed 6-0 with Councilman Strang absent.

D. Review, and place on file, the Wylie Police Department 2021 Racial Profiling Analysis.

Council Comments

Mayor Porter asked staff to summarize if there were any negative findings in the report. Assistant Police Chief Walters responded there were no negative findings and that the City was in compliance. Councilman Williams asked what type of data is collected. Walters explained the data entered from each traffic stop.

Council Action

A motion was made by Mayor *pro tem* Forrester, seconded by Councilman Wallis, to approve Items D as presented. A vote was taken and motion passed 6-0 with Councilman Strang absent.

E. Consider, and act upon, Ordinance No. 2022-26 of the City of Wylie, Texas, altering the prima facie speed limits established for vehicles under the provisions of Transportation Code, Section 545.356 upon East Farm to Market Highway No. 544 or parts thereof, within the incorporate limits of the City of Wylie, as set out in this ordinance; and providing a penalty of a fine not to exceed \$200.00 for the violation of this ordinance; providing for repealing, savings and severability clauses; providing for an effective date of this ordinance.

Council Comments

Mayor Porter asked for staff to give information on the location of the speed limit change. Project Engineer Elkhalid described the location is on FM 544 from Collins to County Line Road of the speed limit change, which will be 45 mph. Mayor *pro tem* Forrester asked what the current speed limit is. Elkhalid replied 55 mph. Councilman Williams commended staff on the study and lowering the speed limit and asked how the City is going to address the concerns from citizens regarding the condition and speed. Elkhalid reported they have spoken with some of the citizens and hope that once the speed limit is lowered it will give some comfort and once the roadway is reconstructed will result in a better roadway condition.

Council Action

A motion was made by Mayor *pro tem* Forrester, seconded by Councilman Williams, to approve Items E as presented. A vote was taken and motion passed 6-0 with Councilman Strang absent.

REGULAR AGENDA

1. Hold a Public Hearing to consider, and act upon, a request from the North Texas Municipal Water District for the use of parkland in Meadowview Park for a waterline easement.

Staff Comments

Parks and Recreation Director Diaz addressed Council stating The North Texas Municipal Water District (NTMWD) has requested an additional easement in Meadowview Park to relocate a 42-inch water line that is in direct conflict with the upcoming construction of FM 2514 by the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT). This easement will overlay an existing NTMWD water line easement in the same area. The reason for the additional easement is due to the limitations of the current easement only allowing up to two water lines. The proposed 42-inch main would be a third line in the easement area. To align with the direction of our City Attorney and comply with Chapter 26 of the Texas Parks and Wildlife Code, staff has initiated this Public Hearing. Diaz stated the City Council approved an Interlocal Agreement with the NTMWD on January 25, 2022 that relates to this easement.

Meadowview Park is located at 406 Carver Drive in the Meadowview Subdivision. The park consists mainly of a concrete trail and landscape located within a majority of the current NTMWD easement. Due to the nature of this trail being located within a utility easement, there is always potential for construction. NTMWD staff have been working with City staff to coordinate the construction of the additional water lines and to minimize the impact to the park. Construction is expected to start on this project in the spring of 2022 and be completed in the summer of 2022. Any landscape and trail affected by the construction in the easement will be restored as part of the project by the NTMWD and their contractor.

Council Comments

Mayor *pro tem* Forrester asked what the short-term solution for the trail that will be torn out will be, and also stated he did notice there were no benches for people to sit on along the trail. Diaz stated staff can look at some benches. Forrester stated maybe it could be a partnership with NTMWD and they could add some benches. Diaz stated he will speak with NTMWD. Councilman Mize agreed with Forrester. Parker stated as part of the swap for the easement, NTMWD is giving property on Eubanks for the widening project.

Public Hearing

Mayor Porter opened the public hearing on Item 1 at 7:05 p.m. asking anyone present wishing to address Council to come forward.

There were no persons present to address Council.

Mayor Porter closed the public hearing at 7:05 p.m.

Council Comments

Councilman Wallis confirmed that the individual present at the meeting representing NTMWD heard Mayor *pro tem* Forrester's request about the benches. The Deputy Director of Engineering and Construction from NTMWD addressed Council stating he heard the request and will take it back to staff to see if the request can be accommodated.

Council Action

A motion was made by Councilman Williams, seconded by Mayor *pro tem* Forrester, to approve Item 1 as presented. A vote was taken and the motion passed 6-0 with Councilman Strang absent.

2. Hold a Public Hearing to consider, and act upon, a change in zoning from Agricultural District (AG/30) to Planned Development - Single Family (PD-SF) to allow for single family residential development on 47.2995 acres generally located on Country Club Road approximately 2000' south of Parker Road (ZC 2022-02).

Staff Comments

Planning Manager Haskins addressed Council stating the applicant and staff are requesting to table this item to allow additional time for changes based on P&Z and Council feedback at previous meetings.

Public Hearing

Mayor Porter opened the public hearing on Item 2 at 7:09 p.m. asking anyone present wishing to address Council to come forward.

There were no persons present to address Council.

Mayor Porter closed the public hearing at 7:09 p.m.

Council Action

A motion was made by Mayor *pro tem* Forrester, seconded by Councilman Williams, to accept the request to table Item 2 until the April 26, 2022 City Council meeting. A vote was taken and the motion passed 6-0 with Councilman Strang absent.

3. Consider, and act upon, Ordinance No. 2022-27 for a change in zoning from Neighborhood Services (NS) to Planned Development - Multi-Family (PD-MF) to allow for an income adjusted multi-family social services development on 2.472 acres located at 511 West Brown Street (ZC2022-01).

Staff Comments

Planning Manager Haskins addressed Council stating on February 22, 2022, City Council approved a zoning change with four stipulations (reduce the total number of allowed units from 40 to 38, require 1.5 parking spaces per residential unit, allow the Community Center to be parked at 1:500, and landscaping buffer on south side to be consistent in PD Conditions and Zoning Exhibit). The stipulations were integrated into both the Zoning Exhibit and PD Conditions.

Council Action

A motion was made by Mayor *pro tem* Forrester, seconded by Councilman Williams, to approve Item 3 as presented. A vote was taken and the motion passed 6-0 with Councilman Strang absent.

4. Consider, and act upon, Ordinance No. 2022-28 amending Ordinance No. 2021-43, which established the budget for fiscal year 2021-2022; providing for repealing, savings and severability clauses; and providing for an effective date of this ordinance.

Staff Comments

Interim City Manager Parker addressed Council stating City Council authorized the expenditures of \$1,300,000 for two splash pads and \$700,000 for a dog park from the General Fund fund balance.

Council Comments

Mayor *pro tem* Forrester asked if this item is approved, how will this affect the fund balance requirement. Budget Manager Przyby replied the fund balance requirement is 25% of sales tax revenue which is less than one million dollars, and the City has a healthy fund balance with around \$4.8mm after this expense. Councilman Williams confirmed 4B funds can only be used for specific things. Pryzby confirmed that is correct.

Council Action

A motion was made by Councilman Williams, seconded by Councilman Wallis, to approve Item 4 as presented. A vote was taken and the motion passed 6-0 with Councilman Strang absent.

5. Consider, and act upon, the award of a Professional Services Project Order (PSPO) #W2022-40-E for the Site Evaluation, Design and Bid Plans for a Dog Park and two (2) Splash Pads to Dunaway Associates, LLC in the amount of \$301,615.00 and authorizing the Interim City Manager to execute any necessary documents.

Staff Comments

Purchasing Manager Hayes addressed Council stating staff contacted all five firms who were awarded a master agreement (MAPES) in the Landscape Architecture category, and requested their specific qualifications and work experience for the design and development of dog parks and splash pads. The City received three responses, evaluated each response and entered into negotiations with Dunaway Associates, LLC as the most qualified firm. Hayes stated this amount is a maximum amount because the proposal is based on three separate sites and could be less if less sites are utilized for the projects.

Council Comments

Councilman Wallis asked if staff has reached out to businesses in the community for dog park sponsors. Parks and Recreation Director Diaz replied staff can look into that. Mayor Porter agreed with Wallis and added there are multiple businesses in town that are part of large chains that have charity networks within them that will associate their names with a project and encouraged staff to look at those opportunities.

Council Action

A motion was made by Councilman Duke, seconded by Councilman Williams, to approve Item 5 as presented. A vote was taken and the motion passed 6-0 with Councilman Strang absent.

6. Consider, and act upon, the acceptance of the resignation of Cemetery Advisory Board member Sandra Mondy and appointment of Jami Lindquist to fill the unexpired term of March 2022 to June 2023.

Council Comments

Mayor Porter confirmed with Board and Commission Interview Panel Chair Forrester that this was still the panel's recommendation. Forrester confirmed it is.

Council Action

A motion was made by Mayor *pro tem* Forrester, seconded by Councilman Duke, to accept the resignation of Cemetery Advisory Board member Sandra Mondy and appoint Jami Lindquist to fill the unexpired term of March 2022 to June 2023. A vote was taken and the motion passed 6-0 with Councilman Strang absent.

7. Consider, and act upon, the approval of Amendment #6 to Wylie Agreement #W2009-3-E for Engineering Services for the Reconstruction of McMillen Road from McCreary Road to Country Club Road in the amount of \$261,500.00 with Binkley & Barfield, Inc., and authorizing the Interim City Manager to execute any and all necessary documents.

Staff Comments

Purchasing Manager Hayes addressed Council stating the original design contract with Binkley & Barfield, Inc. was signed in 2010. As the design of McMillen Road continues to evolve, several items need to be addressed by Binkley & Barfield, Inc., and the plans were revised.

Council Comments

Councilman Williams highlighted the last change in cost was in 2012 and the increase requested is a small increase since that time, and commended Binkley & Barfield, Inc. for keeping their fees reasonable.

Council Action

A motion was made by Councilman Williams, seconded by Councilman Duke, to approve Item 7 as presented. A vote was taken and the motion passed 6-0 with Councilman Strang absent.

A. Property Tax Collections for FY21-22 as of February 28, 2022 are 97%, in comparison to FY20-21 for the same time period of 99%. Sales tax is on a 2 month lag and only three months have been received. Sales tax is down 8.5% from February 2021 and up 5.6% fiscal YTD.

- B. Franchise Fees: The majority of franchise fees are recognized in the third and fourth quarter with electric fees making up the majority.
- C. Licenses and Permits: New Dwelling Permits are up 200% from February YTD 2021 due to the new fee structure.
- D. Intergovernmental Rev: The majority of intergovernmental revenues come from WISD reimbursements and Fire Services which are billed quarterly.
- E. Service Fees: Trash fees are on a one month lag and only four months have been received. The remaining fees are from other seasonal fees.
- F. Court Fees are up 56% from February YTD 2021 which is a continuation of the increasing trend in fines.
- G.Yearly transfer from Utility Fund and \$3 million from sale of 802 Kirby.
- H. Largest Carry Forward items: Department Software Solution \$220,870, Rowlett Creek Dam Improvements \$110,000. Stone Road Rehab Project \$615,000
- I. Annual Audit expense
- J. Employee Award Banquet
- K. \$6.2 million transfer to Community Investment Fund.

Recommendation

Discussion

In order for construction to commence on two (2) Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) projects, Country Club & FM 544 Improvements and FM 2514 Improvements, the City has to relocate our utilities (water mains) out of the way to avoid conflicts with the new paving section. Advanced Funding Agreements (AFAs) have been developed with TxDOT to construct the new appurtenances in the amounts of \$536,744.27 and \$575,110.83 respectively. These amounts were based on construction cost estimates generated by our consulting engineer on both projects, Grantham & Associates, Inc.

City staff requests additional funds in the amount of \$1,200,000 to cover the contracted amounts outlined in the AFAs, as well as possible project overruns.

Financial Summary/Strategic Goals

The overall effect of this amendment is to increase the Utility Fund budget by \$1,200,000 which will reduce the fund balance by the same amount.

ORDINANCE NO. 2022-29

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WYLIE, TEXAS, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2021-43, WHICH ESTABLISHED THE BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2021-2022; REPEALING ALL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council heretofore adopted Ordinance No. 2021-43 setting forth the Budget for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 beginning October 1, 2021, and ending September 30, 2022; and,

WHEREAS, the City Departments and Divisions routinely review their budget appropriations to determine if any changes are necessary; and

WHEREAS, based upon said review the City staff now recommends that certain amendments to the Budget be considered by the City Council; see Exhibit A; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council has the authority to make amendments to the City Budget under Article VII, Section 4 of the City Charter, as well as State law; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that the proposed amendments to the FY 2021-2022 Budget; see Exhibit A, with the revenues and expenditures therein contained, is in the best interest of the City; and therefore, desires to adopt the same by formal action.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF WYLIE, TEXAS:

SECTION I: The proposed amendments to the FY 2021-2022 Budget of the City of Wylie; Exhibit A, as heretofore adopted by Ordinance No. 2022-29, are completely adopted and approved as amendments to the said FY 2021-2022 Budget.

SECTION II: All portions of the existing FY 2021-2022 Budget and Ordinance No. 2021-43, except as specifically herein amended, shall remain in full force and effect, and not be otherwise affected by the adoption of the amendatory ordinance.

SECTION III: Should any paragraph, sentence, sub-division, clause, phrase or section of this ordinance be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any part or provision thereof, other than the part or parts as declared to be invalid, illegal, or unconstitutional.

SECTION IV: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption by the City Council and publication of its caption as the law and the City Charter provide in such cases.

SECTION V: That all other ordinances and code provisions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of any such conflict or inconsistency and all other provisions of the Wylie City Code not in conflict herewith shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION VI: The repeal of any ordinance, or parts thereof, by the enactment of the Ordinance, shall not be construed as abandoning any action now pending under or by virtue of such ordinance; nor shall it have the effect of discontinuing, abating, modifying or altering any penalty accruing or to accrue,

ADVANCE FUNDING AGREEMENT FOR VOLUNTARY UTILITY RELOCATION CONTRIBUTIONS ON STATE HIGHWAY IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

THIS AGREEMENT is made by and between the State of Texas, acting through the Texas Department of Transportation ("State") and The City of Wylie ("Utility"),

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, Transportation Code, Chapters 201, 221, and 361, authorize the State to lay out, construct, maintain, and operate a system of streets, roads and highways that comprise the State Highway System; and,

WHEREAS, Transportation Code, Chapter 203, Subchapter E, Transportation Code §203.092 authorizes the State to regulate the placement of public utility facilities along a state highway; and,

WHEREAS, Texas Transportation Commission Minute Order Number <u>116073</u> authorizes the State to undertake and complete a highway improvement generally described as: roadway widening ("Project"); and,

WHEREAS, Utility possesses facilities that are affected by the above mentioned highway improvement and Utility, and the State agrees that it is more economical or efficient for such relocation to be effected by including said contract in the State's highway construction contract;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and of the mutual covenants and agreements of the parties hereto, to be by them kept and performed as hereafter set forth, the State and Utility do agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

1. Time Period Covered

This agreement becomes effective when signed by the last party whose signing makes the agreement fully executed, and the State and Utility will consider it to be in full force and effect until the Project described in this agreement has been completed and accepted by all parties or unless terminated, as provided.

2. Project Funding and Work Responsibilities

A. The State will authorize the performance of only those Project items of work which are eligible for relocation reimbursements or for which Utility has requested and has agreed to pay for as described in Attachment A - Payment Provision and Work Responsibilities, which is attached to and made a part of this contract. In addition to identifying those items of work to be paid for by payments to the State, Attachment A - Payment Provision and Work Responsibilities, also specifies those Project items of work that are the responsibility of Utility and will be carried out and completed by Utility, at no cost to the State. The Utility

shall be responsible for costs that are shown on Attachment B, Estimated Utility Costs, which is attached to and made a part of this agreement.

- **B.** If the Utility will perform any work under this contract for which reimbursement will be provided by or through the State, the Utility must complete training before a letter of authority is issued. Training is complete when at least one individual who is working actively and directly on the Project successfully completes and receives a certificate for the course entitled *Local Government Project Procedures and Qualification for the Texas Department of Transportation*. The Utility shall provide the certificate of qualification to the State. The individual who receives the training certificate may be an employee of the Utility or an employee of a firm that has been contracted by the Utility to perform oversight of the Project. The State in its discretion may deny reimbursement if the Utility has not designated a qualified individual to oversee the Project.
- **C.** Payment under this contract beyond the end of the current fiscal biennium is subject to availability of appropriated funds. If funds are not appropriated, this contract shall be terminated immediately with no liability to either party.

3. Termination

- **A.** This agreement may be terminated in the following manner:
 - 1. By mutual written agreement and consent of both parties;
 - 2. By either party upon the failure of the other party to fulfill the obligations set forth in this agreement; or
 - 3. By the State if it determines that the performance of the Project or utility work is not in the best interest of the State.
- **B.** If the agreement is terminated in accordance with the above provisions, Utility will be responsible for the payment of Project costs incurred by the State on behalf of Utility up to the time of termination.

4. Right of Access

If Utility is the owner of any part of the Project site, Utility shall permit the State or its authorized representative access to the site to perform any activities required to execute the work.

5. Adjustments Outside the Project Site

Utility will provide for all necessary right of way and utility adjustments needed for performance of the work on sites not owned or to be acquired by the State.

6. Responsibilities of the Parties and Indemnity

Utility acknowledges that it is not an agent, servant, employee of the State, nor is it engaged in a joint enterprise, and it is responsible for its own acts and deeds and for those of its agents or employees during the performance of the work on the Project. To the extent permitted by law, Utility agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the State, its agents and employees, from all suits, actions, or claims and from all liability and damages for any and all injuries or damages sustained by any person or property in consequence with the performance of design, construction, maintenance, or operation of the Utility facility. Such indemnity includes but is not limited to any claims or amounts arising or recovered under the "Worker's Compensation Law",

the Texas Tort Claims Act, Chapter 101, Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code; or any other applicable laws or regulations, all as time to time may be amended.

7. Sole Agreement

In the event the terms of the agreement are in conflict with the provisions of any other existing agreements between Utility and the State, the latest agreement shall take precedence over the other agreements in matters related to the Project.

8. Successors and Assigns

The State and Utility each binds itself, its successors, executors, assigns, and administrators to the other party to this agreement and to the successors, executors, assigns, and administrators of such other party in respect to all covenants of this agreement.

9. Amendments

By mutual written consent of the parties, the scope of work and payment provisions of this agreement may be amended prior to its expiration.

10. Inspection and Conduct of Work

Unless otherwise specifically stated in Attachment A - Payment Provision and Work Responsibilities, to this contract, the State will supervise and inspect all work performed hereunder and provide such engineering inspection and testing services as may be required to ensure that the Project is accomplished in accordance with the approved plans and specifications. All correspondence and instructions to the contractor performing the work will be the sole responsibility of the State. Unless otherwise specifically stated in Attachment A to this contract, all work will be performed in accordance with the Utility Accommodation Rules as set forth in 43 Texas Administrative Code §21.31 et. seq. adopted by the State and incorporated in this agreement by reference, or special specifications approved by the State.

11. Maintenance

Upon completion of the Project, Utility will assume responsibility for the maintenance of the completed Utility facility unless otherwise specified in Attachment A to this agreement.

12. Notices

All notices to either party by the other required under this agreement shall be delivered personally or sent by certified or U.S. mail, postage prepaid, addressed to such party at the following addresses:

Either party may change the above address by sending written notice of the change to the other party. Either party may request in writing that such notices shall be delivered personally or by certified U.S. mail and such request shall be honored and carried out by the other party.

13. State Auditor

The state auditor may conduct an audit or investigation of any entity receiving funds from the State directly under this contract or indirectly through a subcontract under this contract. Acceptance of funds directly under this contract or indirectly through a subcontract under this contract acts as acceptance of the authority of the state auditor, under the direction of the legislative audit committee, to conduct an audit or investigation in connection with those funds. An entity that is the subject of an audit or investigation must provide the state auditor with access to any information the state auditor considers relevant to the investigation or audit.

14. Signatory Warranty

Each signatory warrants that the signatory has necessary authority to execute this agreement on behalf of the entity represented.

15. Access to Information

The Utility is required to make any information created or exchanged with the state pursuant to this contract, and not otherwise excepted from disclosure under the Texas Public Information Act, available in a format that is accessible by the public at no additional charge to the state.

ATTACHMENT A PAYMENT PROVISION AND WORK RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Description of the Work Items

The parties agree that the existing <u>water mains and associated appurtenances</u> shall be relocated and adjustments shall be made along <u>FM 2514 from Brown Street to Paul Wilson Road in the City of Wylie, Collin County</u>. The <u>water mains and associated appurtenances</u> facilities shall be owned, operated, and maintained by Utility from and after completion and final acceptance by the State and Utility. The estimated total construction cost for the relocated and adjusted facilities is <u>\$575,110.83</u>. The parties agree that it is their intent to complete the relocation improvements within this estimate of cost.

2. Actual Cost Agreement

Utility will be responsible for paying all costs associated with the planning, specification, and estimate (PS&E) development, and construction of the proposed utility work to the extent such is not reimbursed pursuant to state law. - viii. Assume all responsibility for the maintenance of the existing <u>water mains and</u> <u>associated appurtenances</u> during and upon completion of the construction contract.
- ix. Ensure all Texas Commission on Environmental Quality and all other regulatory rules, regulations and laws are strictly adhered to.
- x. Prepare and submit both a certificate of substantial completion and a list of observed items requiring completion or correction for the relocations and adjustments to the Project Engineer for concurrence.
- xi. Coordinate all construction activities performed by Utility's staff for the relocations and adjustments through the Project Engineer.
- **B.** The **State** shall provide the following services under this contract:
 - i. Combine the <u>water mains and associated appurtenances</u> relocation and adjustment plans with the plans being prepared for the Project.
 - ii. Review and approve the final construction plans prior to any construction-related activities. In order to ensure federal and/or state funding eligibility, projects must be authorized by the State prior to advertising for construction.
 - iii. Advertise for construction bids, issue bid proposals, receive and tabulate the bids, and award and administer the contract for construction of the Project.
 - iv. Negotiate and administer all field changes and change orders required for the Project. All change orders increasing construction costs for Utility's Project shall be submitted to Utility for review and approval together with an evaluation. Utility agrees to review and either approve or disapprove all change orders within five (5) business days after receipt of such order unless Utility Board's approval is necessary in which case Utility shall bring the item to Utility Board as soon as reasonably possible.
 - v. Provide overall project management to supervise the day-to-day activities of the construction and monitor the activities of the contractor to promote the timely and efficient completion of the Project in accordance with the approved Plans and Specifications and construction schedule.
 - vi. Conduct field observations and coordinate with Utility's inspectors and the contractor to cure defects and deficiencies in the construction prior to final acceptance.
 - vii. Make timely payment to the contractor for work performed in connection with the Project.

ADVANCE FUNDING AGREEMENT FOR VOLUNTARY UTILITY RELOCATION CONTRIBUTIONS ON STATE HIGHWAY IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

THIS AGREEMENT is made by and between the State of Texas, acting through the Texas Department of Transportation ("State") and The City of Wylie ("Utility"),

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, Transportation Code, Chapters 201, 221, and 361, authorize the State to lay out, construct, maintain, and operate a system of streets, roads and highways that comprise the State Highway System; and,

WHEREAS, Texas Transportation Commission Minute Order Numbers 116073 and 115291 authorizes the State to undertake and complete a highway improvement generally described as: the construction of intersection improvements to include left and right turn lanes ("Project"); and,

WHEREAS, Utility possesses facilities that are affected by the above mentioned highway improvement and Utility, and the State agrees that it is more economical or efficient for such relocation to be effected by including said contract in the State's highway construction contract;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and of the mutual covenants and agreements of the parties hereto, to be by them kept and performed as hereafter set forth, the State and Utility do agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

1. Time Period Covered

This agreement becomes effective when signed by the last party whose signing makes the agreement fully executed, and the State and Utility will consider it to be in full force and effect until the Project described in this agreement has been completed and accepted by all parties or unless terminated, as provided.

In addition to identifying those items of work to be paid for by payments to the State, Attachment A - Payment Provision and Work Responsibilities, also specifies those Project items of work that are the responsibility of Utility and will be carried out and completed by Utility, at no cost to the State. shall be responsible for costs that are shown on Attachment B, Estimated Utility Costs, which is attached to and made a part of this agreement.

- **B.** If the Utility will perform any work under this contract for which reimbursement will be provided by or through the State, the Utility must complete training before a letter of authority is issued. Training is complete when at least one individual who is working actively and directly on the Project successfully completes and receives a certificate for the course entitled *Local Government Project Procedures and Qualification for the Texas Department of Transportation*. The Utility shall provide the certificate of qualification to the State. The individual who receives the training certificate may be an employee of the Utility or an employee of a firm that has been contracted by the Utility to perform oversight of the Project. The State in its discretion may deny reimbursement if the Utility has not designated a qualified individual to oversee the Project.
- **C.** Payment under this contract beyond the end of the current fiscal biennium is subject to availability of appropriated funds. If funds are not appropriated, this contract shall be terminated immediately with no liability to either party.

3. Termination

- **A.** This agreement may be terminated in the following manner:
 - 1. By mutual written agreement and consent of both parties;
 - 2. By either party upon the failure of the other party to fulfill the obligations set forth in this agreement; or
 - 3. By the State if it determines that the performance of the Project or utility work is not in the best interest of the State.
- **B.** If the agreement is terminated in accordance with the above provisions, Utility will be responsible for the payment of Project costs incurred by the State on behalf of Utility up to the time of termination.

4. Right of Access

If Utility is the owner of any part of the Project site, Utility shall permit the State or its authorized representative access to the site to perform any activities required to execute the work.

5. Adjustments Outside the Project Site

Utility will provide for all necessary right of way and utility adjustments needed for performance of the work on sites not owned or to be acquired by the State.

6. Responsibilities of the Parties and Indemnity

Utility acknowledges that it is not an agent, servant, employee of the State, nor is it engaged in a joint enterprise, and it is responsible for its own acts and deeds and for those of its agents or employees during the performance of the work on the Project. To the extent permitted by law, Utility agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the State, its agents and employees, from all suits, actions, or claims and from all liability and damages for any and all injuries or damages sustained by any person or property in consequence with the performance of design, construction, maintenance, or operation of the Utility facility. Such indemnity includes but is not limited to any claims or amounts arising or recovered under the "Worker's Compensation Law", the Texas Tort Claims Act, Chapter 101, Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code; or any other applicable laws or regulations, all as time to time may be amended.

7. Sole Agreement

8. Successors and Assigns

The State and Utility each binds itself, its successors, executors, assigns, and administrators to the other party to this agreement and to the successors, executors, assigns, and administrators of such other party in respect to all covenants of this agreement.

9. Amendments

By mutual written consent of the parties, the scope of work and payment provisions of this agreement may be amended prior to its expiration.

10. Inspection and Conduct of Work

Unless otherwise specifically stated in Attachment A - Payment Provision and Work Responsibilities, to this contract, the State will supervise and inspect all work performed hereunder and provide such engineering inspection and testing services as may be required to ensure that the Project is accomplished in accordance with the approved plans and specifications. All correspondence and instructions to the contractor performing the work will be the sole responsibility of the State. Unless otherwise specifically stated in Attachment A to this contract, all work will be performed in accordance with the Utility Accommodation Rules as set forth in 43 Texas Administrative Code §21.31 et. seq. adopted by the State and incorporated in this agreement by reference, or special specifications approved by the State.

11. Maintenance

Upon completion of the Project, Utility will assume responsibility for the maintenance of the completed Utility facility unless otherwise specified in Attachment A to this agreement.

- x. Prepare and submit both a certificate of substantial completion and a list of observed items requiring completion or correction for the relocations and adjustments to the Project Engineer for concurrence.
- xi. Coordinate all construction activities performed by Utility's staff for the relocations and adjustments through the Project Engineer.
- **B.** The **State** shall provide the following services under this contract:
 - i. Combine the <u>water mains and associated appurtenances</u> relocation and adjustment plans with the plans being prepared for the Project.
 - ii. Review and approve the final construction plans prior to any construction-related activities. In order to ensure federal and/or state funding eligibility, projects must be authorized by the State prior to advertising for construction.
 - iii. Advertise for construction bids, issue bid proposals, receive and tabulate the bids, and award and administer the contract for construction of the Project.
 - iv. Negotiate and administer all field changes and change orders required for the Project. All change orders increasing construction costs for Utility's Project shall be submitted to Utility for review and approval together with an evaluation. Utility agrees to review and either approve or disapprove all change orders within five (5) business days after receipt of such order unless Utility Board's approval is necessary in which case Utility shall bring the item to Utility Board as soon as reasonably possible.
 - v. Provide overall project management to supervise the day-to-day activities of the construction and monitor the activities of the contractor to promote the timely and efficient completion of the Project in accordance with the approved Plans and Specifications and construction schedule.

Discussion

OWNER: Great American Storage Partners LLC

The applicant is requesting a Special Use Permit (SUP) to allow for the continued use and expansion of a self-storage business on 4.282 acres generally located at 3475 W. FM 544.

The original site plan for Right Space Storage was approved in October of 2003. Any expansion to the development requires a Special Use Permit as the use is currently legally non-conforming due to the use no longer being allowed by-right in the Commercial Corridor (CC) zoning district.

The Special Use Permit request proposes to add one building that measures 3,155 sq. ft. and a second building which measures 7,440 sq. ft.

The conditions allow for the site to have a minimum of 15% of landscaping. The site currently has approximately 16% of landscaping. The site provides five parking spaces with one being an ADA space.

The new structures are proposed to match the existing self-storage buildings by providing a brick exterior. At the recommendation of the Planning and Zoning Commission, the site has been limited to a maximum of one story or 15' in height for the entirety of the use (Section III.2).

The site is mostly screened from FM 544 by commercial properties to the south and east. The railroad is to the north and McCreary Road is to the west. Both are screened with a brick wall and landscape buffers. See Staff Exhibit "A."

The proposed additions are not altering any of the existing fire lane or vehicular access throughout the site.

A site plan review and approval shall be required prior to any building permits being applied for.

Notifications/Responses: 11 notifications were mailed with no responses received in favor or in opposition of the request.

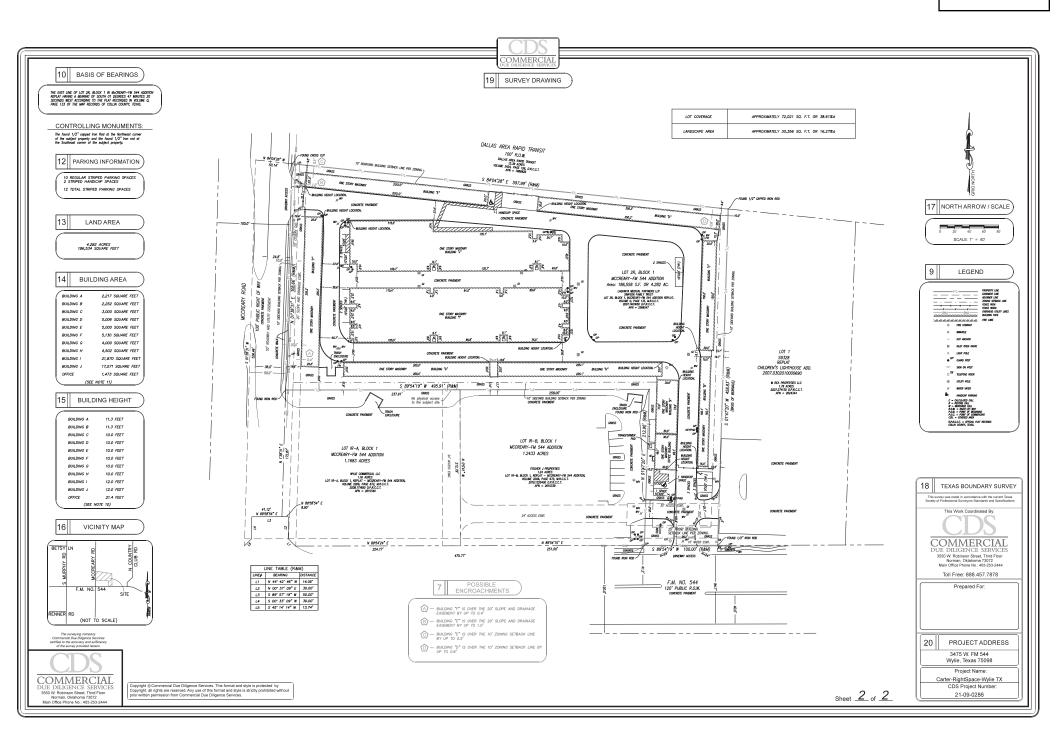
- The site shall be developed and uses allowed shall be in accordance with Commercial Corridor (CC) design standards, as provided in Article 4 and 5 of the City of Wylie Zoning Ordinance as adopted April 2021, except as specifically provided herein.
- 2. This Special Use Permit shall not affect any regulations within the Zoning Ordinance (adopted as of April 2021), except as specifically provided herein.
- The design and development of the Mccreary FM 544 Addition, Lot 2R Block 1 development shall take place in general accordance with the Zoning Exhibit (Exhibit C).

III. SPECIAL CONDITIONS:

- 1. The mini-warehouse (self-storage) use shall be allowed as a condition of the SUP and as generally depicted on the zoning exhibit.
- 2. The self-storage use shall be limited to a maximum of one story or 15' in height even in the event of sale, remodel, or rebuild for any reason.
- Section 4.3.E of the Zoning Ordinance (Landscaping) shall not apply. Required landscaping shall be generally as currently exists, being a minimum of 15% of the site.

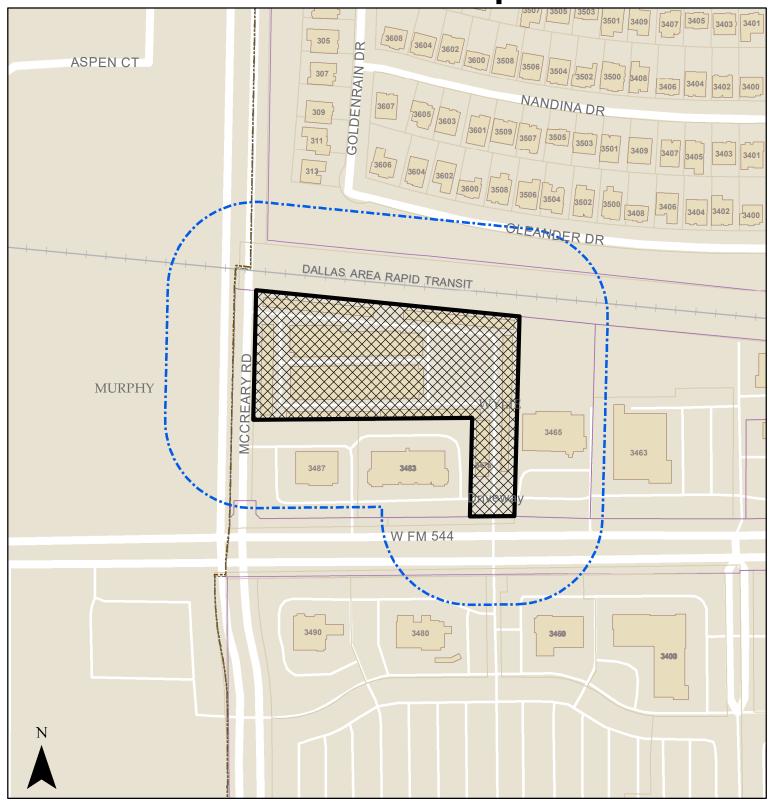

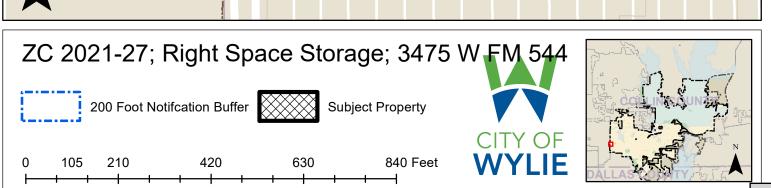

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WYLIE, TEXAS, AUTHORIZING THE TEXAS HOUSING FOUNDATION TO EXERCISE ITS POWERS ON PROPERTY KNOWN AS WYLIE SENIOR APARTMENTS, LOCATED AT 2310 WEST FM 544, WYLIE, TEXAS 75098, WITHIN THE TERRITORIAL BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY OF WYLIE, TEXAS; AND AUTHORIZING THE INTERIM CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE THE COOPERATION AGREEMENT ATTACHED HERETO.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Wylie, Texas finds that there exists in the City of Wylie ("City") a shortage of safe and sanitary housing available to lower income residents at rents they can afford; and

WHEREAS, Texas Housing Foundation, a Texas regional housing authority (the "Foundation"), has represented to the City that it has significant experience and expertise in successfully providing, developing, financing, and managing housing projects that are affordable to lower income residents and are assets to the community; and

WHEREAS, Texas Local Government Code, Section 392.017(d) requires that the governing body of a municipality adopt a resolution declaring a need for a regional housing authority to exercise its powers in another jurisdiction, and authorizing a cooperation agreement under Section 392.059; and

WHEREAS, it is contemplated that THF Public Facility Corporation, a Texas public facility corporation duly organized by the Foundation (the "PFC") may issue tax-exempt bonds in order to finance a portion of the costs financing of the property and development known as the Wylie Senior Apartments, located at 2310 West FM 544, Wylie, Collin County, Texas 75098 (the "Development"); and

WHEREAS, it is further contemplated that a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Foundation will serve as the Applicant's general partner; and

WHEREAS, the City has conducted a public hearing to take testimony with regard to the Development and Cooperation Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WYLIE:

- **Section 1.** That the facts and recitations contained in the preamble of this Resolution are hereby found and declared to be true and correct.
- **Section 2.** Pursuant to Texas Local Government Code, Section 392.017(d)(1), the City Council declares that there is a need for the Foundation to exercise its powers at the Development in the territorial boundaries of the City to provide decent, safe, and sanitary housing that is affordable for lower income residents of the City. The Foundation is hereby authorized to exercise its powers at the Development in the territorial boundaries of the City as set forth in the Cooperation Agreement attached hereto.
- **Section 3.** Pursuant to Texas Local Government Code, Section 392.017(d)(2) and the Cooperation Agreement between the Foundation and the City, attached hereto and incorporated herein, the Foundation is hereby authorized under Texas Local Government Code Section 392.059(a) to exercise its powers at the Development within the City. The City agrees to cooperate with the Foundation to allow the Foundation to provide housing for low and moderate income residents at the Development in the territorial boundaries

of the City consistent with the terms of the Cooperation Agreement. The Foundation and the PFC are authorized to exercise its powers under the Texas Housing Authorities Law, Texas Local Government Code Chapter 392 and the Texas Public Facility Corporation Act, Texas Local Government Code Chapter 303, respectively, to finance, plan, undertake, construct, or operate the housing project at the Development in the City, consistent with the terms of the Cooperation Agreement. The Cooperation Agreement only authorizes the Foundation and the PFC to take action in connection with the Development in the City. The City Manager is hereby authorized to execute the Cooperation Agreement on behalf of the City.

Section 4. The Interim City Manager is authorized to take any reasonable and necessary action to effectuate the direction and intention of this Resolution and the Cooperation Agreement.

Section 5. This Resolution shall become effective upon its passage. The City Secretary is hereby authorized, directed and empowered to certify this Resolution to TDHCA and the Foundation.

COOPERATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF WYLIE, TEXAS AND THE TEXAS HOUSING FOUNDATION

WHEREAS, on _______, 2022 under provisions of the Texas Local Government Code, Section 392.017(d), the City of Wylie ("City"), declared that there is a need for the Texas Housing Foundation, a Texas regional housing authority (the "Foundation"), to exercise its powers on property known as Wylie Senior Apartments, located at 2310 West FM 544, Wylie, Collin County, Texas 75098 ("Development"), within the territorial boundaries of the City, subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, because there exists in the City a shortage of safe and sanitary housing available to lower income persons at rentals they can afford; and

WHEREAS, Tex. Local Gov't. Code, Section 392.017(d), requires that the City Council adopt a resolution authorizing the Texas Housing Foundation to exercise its powers in the City, at the Development, subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, and authorizing a cooperation agreement under Section 392.059(a); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the Foundation also adopted a resolution to exercise its powers in the City at the Development and authorized a cooperation agreement under Section 392.059(a); and

WHEREAS, the Foundation has formed THF Public Facility Corporation, a public facility corporation under Chapter 303 of the Tex. Local Gov't Code ("PFC"), for purposes of, among other things (a) acquiring, constructing, rehabilitating, renovating, repairing, equipping, furnishing and placing in service public facilities at the Development; and (b) issuing bonds on the behalf of the Foundation to finance the costs of such public facilities;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto, the City, and the Foundation agree as follows:

Section 1: Cooperation Agreement. The City and the Foundation agree to cooperate to allow the Foundation, or the PFC acting on behalf of the Foundation, to provide housing for lower income persons at the Development in the City, consistent with the provisions below.

Section 2: Housing Development Authorization; Bond Issuance. The Foundation, is authorized to exercise its powers under the Tex. Local Gov't. Code, Chapter 392, to finance, plan undertake, or operate the housing development at the Development in the City as provided in this Agreement. The PFC is hereby authorized to exercise any powers under Tex. Local Gov't Code, Chapter 303 on behalf of the Foundation in connection with the financing and operation of the housing development at the Development in the City, including but not limited to, issuing tax-exempt or taxable bonds to finance the costs of such housing development. This Cooperation Agreement only authorizes the Foundation or PFC to take action in connection with the Development. Additional authority would be required for the Foundation or PFC to participate in

any other development within the territorial boundaries of the City.

Section 3: Ownership. The Foundation, or the PFC acting on behalf of the Foundation, is authorized to acquire land, develop site improvements, and construct buildings for the housing development at the Development within the territorial boundaries of the City, and to operate and manage such development for the benefit of lower income residents of the City over the age of 55.

Section 4. Annual Reports. The Foundation shall submit within 120 days after the end of its fiscal year a report to the Mayor of the City describing the housing and services operation undertaken for the benefit of lower income residents of the City and other activities of the Foundation and PFC in the City.

Section 5. Preservation of Authority. No applicable provision or intention in this cooperation agreement limits the authority or power of the City or other housing authorities operating in the City to exercise its respective powers under any law. No provision or intention in this cooperation agreement limits the authority or power of the Foundation to exercise its powers under the Texas Housing Authorities Law, Tex. Local Govt. Code, Chapter 392, to finance, plan, undertake, construct, or operate the housing development at the Development under this Cooperation Agreement.

Section 6. Implementation. The City Manager of the City and the President of the Foundation are authorized to take any reasonable and necessary action to effectuate and implement the direction and intention of this cooperation agreement and the authorizing resolutions.

Section 7. Termination. This Agreement may be terminated by either party for any reason by giving written notice to the other party at least 30 calendar days before the date of termination of its intent to terminate.

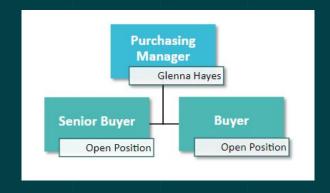

PURCHASING DEPARTMENT RESPONSIBILITIES

- Set and implement procurement policies for the City, complying with Federal, State and local laws as well as the Financial Policies.
- Assist departments with specification writing, product and service searches
- Process quotes, bids, proposals and qualification requests for the departments
- Approval authority for requisitions and contract signature authority
- Emergency Operations Center (EOC) purchasing functions
- Set up and administer City wide programs (P-cards, office supplies, copiers, water coolers, other major accounts)
- Assist departments in vendor negotiations
- Generate and maintain City contracts for goods and services.
- Provide Tier 2 Contract Management, resolving vendor and invoicing disputes
- Risk Services (Liability, Property, Vehicles and Equipment)
 - Set and implement insurance types and amounts of coverage for vendors and special events
 - Process claims for damages to City assets (2021 ICE Storm, 2016 Hail
 Storm) and claims received from citizens
 - Maintain property, vehicle and mobile equipment inventories

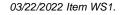
