Resolution #600 re: Selling off Surplus Items

In addition to the items on the Appendix to Resolution #600, Public Works Director Esteb added that he would also like to sell the 2 oldest of the 3 big water pumps at the Public Works Shop, since their need has been all but alleviated. He suggested that they should sell for in the \$250-

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300 price range. Mayor Listek asked that we keep the old brown folding chairs with yellow seats, and said that she may want to sell some of the items with prices reduced more.

Developing a Park around the Town Tree

Mayor Listek presented her vision for creating a park on the property adjacent to the Town Christmas Tree. The Town already owns the land, and it is rarely used; yet it is in the perfect central location for a Town Square and gathering place, with log benches, an embankment slide and community garden, and perhaps later add some shipping containers with a western-style façade for Market vendors to use. The cost of developing the ground will be minimal and at least the first phase is within this year's budget. The square itself would be an Arts and Culture project, with Townspeople being able to participate by decorating some of the bricks for the square, and a local artist creating the Town Seal in the center. Attorney Ridenour advised that once final costs are determined, we follow reasonable policies regarding costs and procurement by using competitive bidding.

Public Works Report

Tom Esteb said it was fantastic how much was accomplished at tonight's meeting.

- They should be able to start on the new Tree Park this week, and shortly thereafter, begin work on the Cemetery.
- Great news: Terry was able to mow the entire Rec Park with the new wing-mower in 3-4 hours today. In the past, it used to take more like 24-32 man-hours to get that done!

Attorney's Comments

- The Town can put weight restrictions on its streets by ordinance if they so desire. (With
 exemptions for firetrucks and the like.) The signage can be expensive, but it must be in
 place before any restrictions may be enforced.
- In regard to relaxing COVID rules on meetings, he advised that although Governor Inslee initially established the restrictions, they have since been authorized by state legislature to continue.

Citizens' Communication

- Ron Homola mentioned that when he goes to the Rec Park, he notices a lot of dog poop all over. He wishes people would clean up after their dogs.
- Mary Rowe referred once again to the log trucks on Town roads, asking if they might
 possibly break water lines? Also, regarding the Town Tree Park, can people buy bricks
 to possibly help fund the park? Mayor Listek explained that we will be re-purposing
 bricks which were "rescued" from vandalism at the Rec park, and that they will be used
 as an art project in the new Tree park.
- Kim Shealy wanted to let everyone know that she will be on the map for the Community Yard Sale, and that her restrooms will be open to the public during this event and all Market events.
- Vince Myers wanted to tease all geocachers by saying that there is a hidden geocache at the Veterans' Memorial.
- Josh Beck said he noticed the 5th-wheel travel trailer has re-appeared at Tallman's.
 Mayor Listek said she will be sending a letter to the owners of Tallman's.

Council's Comments

- Noted that in the past, log trucks have broken water mains on streets in Town.
- Thanks to Vince for the Veterans' Memorial project.

- Perhaps we can lure some vendors from Saturday Markets in other areas? (Mayor Listek will supply her with Market fliers.)

Mayor's Comments

- Thanks to all who helped with the Easter Egg Hunt; it was a great success, but she
 realized that we really need a megaphone for events. Thanks to all who donated,
 namely Sam Fox who donated 21 (!) baskets, Council Member Amy Boget who donated
 a gorgeous basket, and Betsy who donated 2 great baskets. The Market and Kids' Craft
 were very successful as well.
- She has created separate binders for each Town event, which will facilitate better organization not only this year, but for the years to come.
- Benches for the new park will be made out of some big logs.
- Additional light poles are in the plans for this year, for the darker locations along Yacolt, Amboy, and Railroad
- Condensing seasonal items and storing them in the attic
- Preparing for the Sale on April 24 and Town Clean Up and Market on May 1.
- If you see any vandalism, please call the police. Because of citizens calling in and documentation, we have had some success catching vandals recently.
